KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- GOOD START: Wisconsin began its 115th season of men's basketball and the 13th season under Bo Ryan with an 86-75 win over St. John's last Friday in Sioux Falls, S.D. The Badgers have now won each of their last 12 season openers.
- **2 POLL POSITION:** The Badgers are ranked No. 20 in the preseason AP Top 25 and No. 21 in the Coaches Poll. UW has been ranked in the AP's preseason poll in seven of the last 11 years and finished 2012-13 ranked No. 18 in the final AP Top 25.
- **3 TOP-RANKED TAKEDOWNS:** Wisconsin tallied 7 wins over teams ranked in the AP Top-15 a year ago - tied with Indiana for the most in the country. Over the last four seasons, the Badgers have gone 11-3 at the Kohl Center against teams ranked in the AP top 15. Florida comes in Tuesday ranked 11th.
- 4 WELCOME BACK: UW returns two starters from last season senior Ben Brust and junior Traevon Jackson - and three other veterans who averaged at least 10 minutes per game a year ago in sophomores Sam Dekker and George Marshall and iunior Frank Kaminsky. Josh Gasser, who started all 36 games in 2011-12, is also back after missing all of last season with a knee injury.
- **5 HOME DOMINANCE:** The Badgers are 181-18 (.910) at home under Bo Ryan, including a mark of 90-7 (.928) in non-conference games. Against teams ranked in the AP Top 25, Ryan's Badgers are an impressive 30-11 (.732) at the Kohl Center.

The 2013 Big Ten Coach of the Year, Bo Rvan enters his 30th year as a head coach and 13th at UW. The Badgers are ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 for the 7th time in the last 11 seasons.

UP NEXT: BADGERS HOST NO. 11 FLORIDA IN REMATCH

- In the second game of a two-year home-and-home series, Wisconsin will host No. 11 Florida on Tuesday, Nov. 12 in its home opener at 8 p.m. (CT) on ESPN. The Badgers lost at Florida, 74-56, in last season's second game. The last time UW faced a ranked foe in its home opener was a 67-62 win over No. 4 Kansas on Dec. 3, 1968.
- On Saturday, Nov. 15, the Badgers will play at intrastate rival Green Bay. Wisconsin plays GB every season, but has not visited the Phoenix since an 88-84 overtime loss in 2009. Tip off is set for 7 p.m. (CT) and will be televised locally and in Madison on WISC-TV as well as streamed on HorizonLeague.org.





SERIES VS. FLORIDA

► Tuesday's match-up with Florida marks the return trip of a two-year home-and-home contract with the Gators. UW is 1-2 all-time vs. Florida, including a 74-56 loss in Gainsville, Fla. in the second game of the season last year.

The Badgers only previous match-up with UF in Madison was an 86-81 win at the UW Field House on Dec. 20, 1967.

▶ UW is 23-17 all-time against members of the SEC, going 1-2 against the conference a year ago. In addition to UF, the Badgers topped Arkansas, 77-70, and lost to Ole Miss, 57-46, in the NCAA tournament.

SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ Wisconsin won its season opener last Friday with an 86-75 win over St. John's. The Badgers have now won each of their last 12 regular-season openers. UW's last loss in the opener came in Bo Ryan's first game as head coach when the Badgers dropped a 74-69 contest at UNLV.
- ► Including this season's 11-point win, the Badgers have won their last 12 openers by an average of 28.0 points per game.
- ► Wisconsin has also won 15 consecutive home openers, a streak that began with a 66-29 win over Lovola Chicago in 1998.
- ► The Badgers have not faced a team ranked in the AP Top 25 in their home opener since a 67-62 win over No. 4 Kansas in 1968.
- ▶ UW opened the season against a team from the "Power 6" conferences for the first time since starting the 2000-01 season at Tennessee with a 66-58 loss in the season prior to Bo Ryan's arrival at UW.
- ► This marks the first time UW has opened the season away from home since beginning the 2005-06 season against Norfolk State at the Paradise Jam Tournament in St. Thomas. The Badgers took home the tournament championship with three wins.

NOTES FROM UW'S LAST GAME

#20 WIS 86, SJU 75 - 11/8/13 - Sioux Falls, S.D.

- ► The Badgers' 86 points were their most since an 87-51 win over Samford on Dec. 29. 2012.
- ► The Badgers had five players score in double figures for the first time since five players reached double digits against Samford on Dec. 29, 2012.
- ► Wisconsin shot 46.3 percent from the field. The Badgers have now won 43 of their last 44 games when shooting 45 percent or better from the floor.
- ► The Badgers went 11-of-23 (.478) from 3-point range, their most 3-pointers since going 12-for-25 at Nebraska on Feb. 26. 2013.
- ▶ UW went 25-for-30 at the free throw line, making each of its final 14 attempts. That was Wisconsin's most attempts and makes since making 28-of-42 at Illinois on Feb. 3, 2013.
- ► In his first game back since a torn ACL that cost him the entire 2012-13 season, junior **Josh Gasser** posted a team-high 19 points and 8 rebounds in 35 minutes. Gasser went 8-for-8 at the free throw line and 3-for-5 from 3-point range.

- ► Gasser's 8 made free throws was his most since going 9-for-10 in his first-ever college game, a 85-31 win over Kennesaw State on Nov. 12, 2011.
- ▶ **Sam Dekker** finished with 16 points (2-for-3 from 3-point range) and 7 rebounds, including 5 on the offensive glass. The 7 rebounds marked the second-highest total in his career (high is 8). Dekker has now scored in double figures in 10 of his last 13 games dating back to last season.
- ▶ Ben Brust (15), Duje Dukan (15) and Traevon Jackson (13) rounded out UW's balanced effort.
- ► Brust went 3-for-8 from 3-point range and has now hit multiple triples in 17 of his last 18 games.
- Dukan posted career highs in nearly every statistical category, tallying 15 points and 5 rebounds in 21 minutes. Dukan went 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 5-for-6 at the FT line. Entering the game, Dukan had a total of 11 career points and career highs of 4 points, 2 rebounds and 11 min.

AIMING TO SHOOT BETTER

- ► Last season Wisconsin ranked last in the Big Ten shooting just 63.4% at the free throw line. In the Badgers first game of the 2013-14 season, they made 25-of-30 free throws (83.3%), including each of their final 14 attempts.
- ▶ UW's 25 made free throws was the third-highest single-game total of any Big Ten team and the Badgers mark of 83.3% from the charity stripe ranks second in the conference.

Wisconsin averaged 16.6 FT attempts last season.

- ► Since Bo Ryan joined the Badgers in 2001, UW is 93-19 (.894) when attempting 25 or more free throws in a game, including 6-0 last season.
- ► The Badgers shot a blistering 47.8% from 3-point range (11-for-23) in their opening win over St. John's, the 2nd-highest mark in the Big Ten.

UW shot 33.0% from 3-point range a year ago, good for 7th in the Big Ten. $\label{eq:condition}$

► Wisconsin's 11.0 made 3-pointers per game is tied with Ohio State for the best mark in the Big Ten.

WRECKING THE RANKED

- ► Wisconsin posted seven wins over teams ranked in the AP Top-25 last year (7-6 overall), with all 7 wins coming vs. teams ranked in the top 15.
- ► UW's 7 victories against teams ranked in the top 15 was the most in the country, tied with Indiana.
- ► In 12 seasons under Bo Ryan, the Badgers are 20-6 against AP Top-15 teams at the Kohl Center, including an 11-3 mark over the last 4 seasons.

TRENDS TO TRACK

- ▶ Dating back to Feb. of 2011, UW has won 57 of its last 58 games when leading or tied with 5:00 left.
- ► UW has won 90 of its last 91 games when shooting a higher FG% than its opponents, including a mark of 18-0 last season.
- ▶ UW has won 43 of its last 44 games when shooting 45% or better from the field, including its opening win over St. John's (46.3%) and a perfect mark of 13-0 in 2012-13.

KOHL CENTER AMONG TOUGHEST

Wisconsin has only lost a TOTAL of 18 home games in the Bo Ryan era.

In 12 seasons under Ryan, the Badgers are an incredible 181-18 (.910) at the Kohl Center. UW's .910 winning percentage since 2001-02 is good for 4th in the nation. Only Duke, Kansas and Gonzaga have better home records in that span (pg 8).

- ► Three of UW's 5 longest home win streaks have come under Bo Ryan, including the school-record 38 straight from 12/7/2002 to 1/25/2005.
- Over the last 12 years, 135 of the Badgers' 181 home wins have come by at least 10 points (74.6%).

2013-14 SCHEDULE

▶ Wisconsin's non-conference schedule features three teams in the preseason AP Top 25, including No. 10 Florida, No. 17 Marquette and No. 24 Virginia. The Badgers opening opponent St. John's and their foe in the Cancun Challenge, Saint Louis, also received votes in the preseason poll.

Including Big Ten play, the Badgers are scheduled to play seven games against teams in the preseason AP Top 25.

▶ UW's schedule will feature at least 13 games against teams who qualified for the 2013 NCAA Tournament field. Overall, the Badgers schedule will have 23 games against teams that competed in the 2013 postseason.

UW IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- ► Under Bo Ryan (since 2001-02), Wisconsin owns an overall record of 119-30 (.799) in non-conference games, including a mark of 89-7 (.926) at the Kohl Center.
- ► The Badgers reached 9 non-conference wins in 2012-13 for the 11th-consecutive season. UW has averaged 10.5 non-conference wins under Bo Ryan.
- ► Under Ryan (since 2001-02), the Badgers are 16-7 (.696) in neutral site games during the non-conference portion of the schedule.

OH, CANADA

- ► The Badgers played a 5-game exhibition tour of Canada in August, visiting Ottawa and Toronto. UW went 4-1 on the trip with wins over Ryerson, Ottawa and two of pro team A-Game Hoops. Wisconsin's set-back came in the first game of the trip to Carleton, who has won 9 of the last 11 national championships.
- ➤ Sophomore **Sam Dekker** led the Badgers, averaging 19.4 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game, while shooting 60.0 percent (9-for-15) from 3-point range. Junior **Frank Kaminsky** averaged 15.0 points and 5.0 rebounds.
- ► Senior **Ben Brust** and junior **Traevon Jackson** averaged 10.4 points apiece, while sophomore **George Marshall** chipped in 9.0 ppg and junior **Duje Dukan** averaged 8.8 ppg off the bench.
- ► UW shot 51.0% overall from the field and 73.7% from the free throw line (73-for-99).

NEW LEVELS OF WINNING AT UW

- ► The Badgers won 23 games in 2012-13, the 9th-highest single-season win total in school history. Ryan-led teams own each of the top 9 spots in the UW record book for single-season wins.
- ► Ryan's teams have won at least 20 games in 10 of his 12 seasons, including each of the last 7. Illinois (10) is the only other Big Ten team with 10 20-win seasons since 2001-02.

Prior to Ryan's arrival, the Badgers had just four 20-win seasons in 103 years of basketball.

▶ Under Ryan, Wisconsin has <u>never</u> finished lower than 4th in the Big Ten standings. UW's active streak of 12 consecutive seasons in the Big Ten's top 4 is the 2nd-longest in league history and the longest since Purdue had a run of 13 in a row 80 years ago.

- ▶ Wisconsin returns 58.0% of its minutes played from last season. The Badgers will bring back 57.7% of their scoring, 40.3% of their rebounding and 65.2% of their assists.
- ▶ UW returns a pair of players that earned 2013 honorable mention accolades in senior **Ben Brust** and sophomore **Sam Dekker**. Brust, who started all 35 games a year ago, led the Badgers in scoring (11.1 ppg), finished fourth in rebounds (5.1 rpg) and second on the team with 79 assists.

Dekker led all Big Ten reserves in scoring, averaging 9.6 points per game in 22.3 minutes per game. A 2013 Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection last season, Dekker scored in double figures in 9 of UW's final 12 games, including a team-high 14 points in the team's NCAA tournament loss to Ole Miss.

Junior **Traevon Jackson** is UW's other returning starter, having opened 29 games for the Badgers last season. A 2013 All-Big Ten Tournament selection, Jackson led the Badgers with 99 assists and 35 steals.

► With the graduation of 3 front court starters
- Jared Berggren, Mike Bruesewitz and Ryan Evans junior **Frank Kaminsky** will anchor UW's front court.
Kaminsky averaged 10.3 minutes and 4.2 points a
year ago.

Sophomore guard **George Marshall** is also back after averaging 15.8 minutes and 4.1 points per game as a redshirt freshman last season.

THREE TO REDSHIRT IN 2013-14

► Junior **Jordan Smith** (17 career games), sophomore **Zak Showalter** (22 career games) and freshman **Aaron Moesch** have all elected to redshirt the 2013-14 season.

ROSTER ADDITIONS IN 2013-14

- ▶ UW will also return a pair of players who sat out all of last season in juniors **Josh Gasser** and **Duje Dukan**. A 2012 Big Ten All-Defensive Team honoree,
 Gasser started 66 games over his first two seasons at UW but missed all of 2012-13 with a torn ACL.
- ► The Badgers welcome a 6-man freshman class in 2013-14, highlighted by ESPN Top-100 recruits guard **Bronson Koenig** (La Crosse, Wis.) and forward **Nigel Hayes** (Toledo, Ohio).

Wisconsin's roster will also feature forwards Vitto Brown (Bowling Green, Ohio) and Aaron Moesch (Green Bay, Wis.) as well as guards Riley Dearring (Minnetonka, Minn.) and Jordan Hill (Pasadena, Calif.).

▶ UW's six-man freshman class is the school's largest freshman class since 2005-06 (Devin Barry, Morris Cain, Kevin Gullikson, Joe Krabbenhoft, Marcus Landry and Mickey Perry). The last time the Badgers had five scholarship true freshmen was in 2008-09 (Jared Berggren, Ryan Evans, Ian Markolf, Jordan Taylor and Rob Wilson).

SEASON PREVIEW

- ▶ Wisconsin begins its 115th season of men's basketball in 2013-14 and the 13th season under head coach Bo Ryan.
- ► Ryan is the second-longest tenured head coach in the Big Ten (Tom Izzo, 19th season) and ranks 12th in conference history with 144 career Big Ten wins. With a career record of 144-60 (.706), Ryan owns the highest Big Ten winning percentage among coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- ▶ Ryan enters his 30th season overall as a head coach, boasting a career record of 674-216 (.757). He currently ranks 35th on the NCAA's all-time wins ledger. Among active Div. 1 coaches with at least 400 career wins, Ryan's .757 win percentage ranks fourth, trailing only Roy Williams (.795), Mike Krzyzewski (.763) and John Calipari (.762).
- ▶ In 2012-13, the Badgers ranked second in the Big Ten and finished 7th nationally by averaging 16,843 per game. Wisconsin has led the Big Ten in attendance in 9 of the last 11 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 13 years.
- ► This seasons, the Badgers sold out the 2,100-person Grateful Red (the third-largest student section in the Big Ten) in under two hours.

2012-13 LOOK BACK

Record: 23-12 | **Big Ten:** 12-6 (T4th)

- ► Wisconsin advanced to the 2013 NCAA Tournament, finishing with a 23-12 record, including a 12-6 mark (fourth place) in the Big Ten.
- ► The Badgers made their 15th consecutive NCAA tournament appearance. UW is one of just five schools with an active NCAA tournament streak of at least 15 years, joining: Kansas (24), Duke (18), Michigan State (16) and Gonzaga (15). UW's 15 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances is the third-longest streak in Big Ten history.
- ▶ Wisconsin head coach Bo Ryan was named consensus 2013 Big Ten Coach of the Year for the third time in his career (also 2002 and 2003). Only Gene Keady (7) and Bob Knight (5) have won the honor more times than Ryan.

ZACH BOHANNON

5th-Sr. | F | 6-6 | 206 | Marion, Iowa

- ► Has appeared in 56 career games, with 39 coming at Air Force. Transferred to UW in the summer of 2011 and played a total of 80 minutes scoring 17 points in 17 games for UW last season.
- ► Fifth-year walk-on has already earned undergraduate and graduate degrees and is currently pursuing his MBA. Younger brother of former Badger 1,000-point scorer Jason Bohannon (2007-10).

BEN BRUST

Sr. | G | 6-1 | 196 | Hawthorn Woods, III.

► Scored 15 points with 4 rebounds (3 offensive) and 2 assists in 33 minutes against St. John's. Went 3-for-8 from 3-point range and has now hit multiple treys in 17 of his last 18 games.

Brust has made 142 career 3-pointers and needs 24 more to crack UW's all-time top-10 list.

- ▶ One of the most prolific 3-point shooters in UW history, Brust earned honorable mention All-Big Ten in 2012-13. Set single-season record with 79 treys last season and ranked 8th in the Big Ten shooting .389 from deep in 2012-13. Also tied single-game record with 7 made 3-pointers on two occasions.
- ▶ Developed into all-around player for UW last season, posting 5 double-doubles and ranking among the team leaders in points (11.1, 1st), rebounds (5.1, 4th), assists (79, 2nd), steals (34, 2nd), ast-to-TO ratio (1st, 2.0) and charges drawn (2nd with 10).
- ► A NASCAR enthusiast, Brust served as a spotter on Brendan Gaughan's team at Road America and was a social media correspondent at the Brickyard 400 this past summer.

DUJE DUKAN

R-Jr. | F | 6-9 | 220 | Deerfield, III.

- ▶ Dukan set career highs in points (15), rebounds (5) and minutes played (21) against St. John's. Dukan also made his first-career 3-pointer, finishing 2-for-3 from long range and going 5-for-6 at the line.
- ► Redshirted in 2012-13 after suffering from mono in the fall. He has appeared in 22 total games and had scored 11 career points entering 2013-14.
- ▶ Born in Split, Croatia and raised in the Chicago area, Dukan grew up in the Bulls locker room as his father, Ivica Dukan, has worked in the team's scouting department since 1992.

EVAN ANDERSON

R-Jr. | C | 6-10 | 245 | Stanley, Wis.

- ► Has appeared in 26 career games, including 12 last season, totaling 73 minutes and 15 career points.
- ► Got engaged in the summer of 2013 and restores old cars as a hobby.

JOSH GASSER

R-Jr. | G | 6-3 | 190 | Port Washington, Wis.

- ▶ Led the Badgers with 19 points and 8 rebounds in 35 minutes of action vs. St. John's. Gasser made his first shot attempt in 2 years (a 3-pointer) and finished 3-for-5 from behind the arc and a perfect 8-for-8 at the free throw line.
- ► Returns after missing all of last season with a torn left ACL suffered during practice on Oct. 27, 2012. A 2012 Big Ten All-Defensive Team selection, he started 66 games in his first two seasons, including 30 as a true freshman.
- ▶ Owns the only triple-double in school history and first Big Ten freshman to do it since Magic Johnson in 1977 with 10 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists at Northwestern (1/23/11). Shot .452 from 3-point range in 2011-12, which ranked 3rd in the Big Ten.
- ► A former high school quarterback, Gasser has earned a reputation as one of the toughest players on the team. During the 2012 NCAA Tournament, Gasser held SEC leading scorer, John Jenkins, to 3-of-13 shooting while battling a flu that kept him out of practice and awake the night before.

TRAEVON JACKSON

Jr. | G | 6-2 | 208 | Westerville, Ohio

- ► Started against St. John's and scored 13 points, while adding 3 rebounds, a team-high 4 assists (2 turnovers) and 2 steals.
- ► A converted 2-guard, Jackson took over the point guard role after Gasser was lost last season. Led the Badgers with 99 assists and 35 steals, earning 2013 All-Big Ten Tournament Team after averaging 11.0 ppg and 3.0 apg during the three games.
- ► Connected on three game-winning or game-tying shots in the final minute last season: game-tying 3-pointer with 29 seconds left to force overtime in a win over Iowa, made game-winning jumper with 2.1 seconds left in win over Minnesota and drained a 25-foot 3-pointer as time expired to win at Penn St.
- ► The son of Ohio State and NBA All-Star Jimmy Jackson, Traevon has trained in each of the last few summers in Ohio with Trey Burke among others.

FRANK KAMINSKY

Jr. | F/C | 7-0 | 234 | Lisle, III.

- ► Made 3rd career start against St. John's and tallied 4 points, 3 rebounds, 3 assists, 1 block and 1 steal in 23 minutes.
- Averaged just 4.2 points and 10.3 minutes per game last season but should step into a feature role in the Badgers' front court. Showed potential with 19 points in 23 min. at Illinois (2/3/13) and a 16-point game (4-4 on 3FGs) against Samford (12/29/12).

► Father, Frank is 7th-leading scorer in Lewis Univ. history; mother, Mary, played volleyball at Northwestern; aunt & uncle also played hoops at NW.

GEORGE MARSHALL

R-So. | G | 5-11 | 182 | Chicago, III.

- ► Played 22 minutes off the bench vs. St. John's, finishing with 4 points and 1 assist.
- ► Redshirted as a true freshman before playing in 35 games (6 starts) in 2012-13. Just the second freshman to start the season opener under Bo Ryan (along with Devin Harris), he shot 38.% from 3-point range (11th in the Big Ten) and tallied a career-high 20 points in a loss at Iowa.
- ► Used friendship with Marty Nesbitt, one of President Obama's closest friends, to facilitate a private team meeting with Obama in 2012.

SAM DEKKER

So. | F | 6-7 | 220 | Sheboygan, Wis.

- ▶ Made 4th career start vs. St. John's and finished second on the team with 16 points and 7 rebounds (5 offensive). He also had an assist and a block while going 2-for-3 from 3-point range in 32 minutes.
- ► Earned 2013 Big Ten honorable mention and All-Freshman Team honors after leading all Big Ten reserves with 9.6 ppg. Scored double figures in 20 of 35 games while shooting 39.1% from 3-point range (7th in the Big Ten).
- ▶ Appeared in all 35 games (3 starts), becoming one of just three UW freshmen to score at least 335 points in a season in the last 17 years, joining Alando Tucker (2003) and Devin Harris (2002).

NIGEL HAYES

BRONSON KOENIG

Fr. | F | 6-3 | 190 | La Crosse, Wis.

- ► Saw first collegiate action, playing 1 minutes against St. John's.
- ► The 2013 Wisconsin High School Player of the Year, Koenig led Aquinas H.S. to state championships in both 2011 and 2013. Ranked No. 73 in the nation by Rivals.com, Koenig averaged 17.0 points and 4.4 assists per game while shooting 45.5% from 3-point range as a senior.

BIG TEN, BIG RESULTS

- Since Bo Ryan took over in 2001, Wisconsin has been arguably the best team in the Big Ten. Ryan's clubs have won five Big Ten championships (3 regular season and 2 tournament). Only Ohio State (10; 5 regular season, 5 tourney) has won more titles during Ryan's tenure. Illinois also has 5 titles, but no other Big Ten school has more than 3 rings over that span.
- Ryan's teams have posted a 144-60 (.706) Big Ten record, the best mark in the conference over the last 12 seasons. Michigan St. is second at 137-67 (.672) and Ohio St. is third at 135-69 (.662).
- ► Last season, Wisconsin posted a 12-6 record in the Big Ten, finishing in fourth place. The Badgers have notched double-digit conference wins in 11 of 12 years under Bo Ryan and have never finished lower than fourth place in the Big Ten standings.

UW has posted a winning conference record in each of the last 13 seasons. Among the 6 major conferences, only Kansas (23 seasons) has a longer active streak of finishing above .500 in league play.

ALL WE DO IS WIN, WIN, WIN

Over the last seven seasons (since 2006-07), Wisconsin has accumulated an overall record of 179-64 (.737). That win total and percentage puts the Badgers in pretty exclusive company.

Wisconsin's .737 win percentage ranks 15th among all NCAA Div. I teams in that span.

- ◆ Wisconsin had its 23-game home winning streak snapped last season (loss to Marquette on Dec. 3, 2011). The 23 straight wins was the 5th-longest in UW history and the 2nd-longest active streak in the Big Ten.

Four of the eight longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened with Bo Ryan on the sidelines.

- ◆ Over the last 12 seasons, 135 of the Badgers' 181 home wins have come by at least 10 points (74.6 percent).
- ◆ Wisconsin has trailed at halftime in only 37 of 199 home games under Ryan. UW has come back to win 24 of those 37 games.

HOME COOKING

In Bo Ryan's 12 years as head coach, the Badgers have amassed a 181-18 (.910) record at home, the 4th-best winning percentage in the country.

- ◆ UW had a streak of 143 consecutive sellouts at the Kohl Center snapped last season (vs. Green Bay). Wisconsin sold out every game from 2003 until midway through the 2011-12 season.
- ◆ With an average attendance of 17,181 last season, UW led the Big Ten for the 9th time in 10 years and ranked 5th nationally.

Ryan has taken UW to new heights

◆ With 291 wins, Bo Ryan has surpassed Hall of Famer Harold "Bud" Foster (265) to become UW's all-time career wins leader. Ryan needs 15 Big Ten wins to supplant Meanwell (158 wins) as the school's leader in conference wins.

- Ryan set the UW wins record in just 365 games and 11 seasons.
 Foster reached the milestone in 532 games and 25 seasons.
- ◆ Bo Ryan became the 56th NCAA coach to reach the 600-win plateau and is 1 of just 9 active Division I coaches to reach that hallowed ground. Ryan's career winning percentage of .757 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.797) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.763) among active coaches with 600 wins. Among all-time coaches with 600 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 10th.
- Ryan tied legendary Indiana coach Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest coach in conference history to record 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. Only Bob Knight did it faster (131 games).
- Ryan's .706 (144-60) win percentage in conference games is the 2nd-best mark in Big Ten history, trailing only OSU's Thad Matta (111-45, .712) and surpassing legend Indiana coach Bob Knight (353-151, .700).
- ◆ Indiana's Bob Knight (327) and Purdue's Ward Lambert (331) are the only coaches in Big Ten history to reach 250 wins faster than Bo Ryan, who did it in 343 games.
- ◆ Ryan won his third Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2013. Only Purdue's Gene Keady (7) and Indiana's Bob Knight (5) have won the honor more times than Ryan.

With 292 wins, Ryan is the all-time wins leader in Wisconsin history, surpassing Hall of Famer Bud Foster (265). Prior to Ryan's hire at UW in 2001-02, the Badgers had four 19-win seasons (high of 22) in 103 years.

Including last season, Ryan has now led the UW to at least 19 wins in each of his 12 seasons at UW and owns 10 seasons of 20+ wins. In fact, Ryan's teams have accounted for the 9 winningest seasons in school annals.

Wisconsin has averaged 24.3 wins per season during the Ryan era, including a school-record 31 wins in 2007-08.

Big Ten Record

UW pre-Bo Ryan: 607-757 (.445) UW with Bo Ryan: 144-61 (.706)

In the first 96 years of Big Ten play, Wisconsin won at least 11 Big Ten games 9 times (including just once since 1941). Including this season, Ryan has led the Badgers to at least 11 conference wins in 10 of his 12 seasons. He was the first Big Ten coach to win at least 11 league games in each of his first four years.

Ryan has led Wisconsin to a 144-60 (.706) record in Big Ten play, owning the 2nd-highest winning percentage of any coach in Big Ten history.

Ryan is the fastest coach in UW history to reach 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. That also ties Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest in conference history. Only Bob Knight (131 games) did it faster.

UW has finished among the top 4 in the Big Ten in each of Ryan's 11 seasons. That 11-year stretch of top-4 finishes is the 2nd-longest in Big Ten history, trailing only Purdue's run of 13 in a row from 1920-32.

NCAA Tournament Record

UW pre-Bo Ryan: 7 appearances / 9-6 UW with Ryan: 12 appearances / 16-12

Wisconsin made seven appearances in the first 63 years of the NCAA tournament. Since Bo Ryan took over as head coach, the Badgers have earned 12 consecutive tournament bids and advanced to the Sweet 16 five times.

UW has won 16 NCAA tournament games under Ryan, surpassing the Badgers' total of 9 in the 63 years prior to Ryan.

Wisconsin Coaching Staff

BO RYAN HEAD COACH

When Bo Ryan took over as head coach at Wisconsin in 2002, he was promptly dubbed Big Ten Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons. Last year, his 12th at UW, Ryan proved he is still



thought of in the same light, collecting the third Big Ten Coach of the Year award of his career.

Now as Ryan enters his 30th season as a head coach in 2013-14 - his 13th atop the Wisconsin program - it's difficult to decide which is more impressive, his incredible longevity or his unparalleled success. It is, however, safe to say that the combination of the two is what elevates Ryan among college basketball's elite.

Owning the most wins in UW annals (291 entering 2013-14), Ryan is also one of just 40 coaches in NCAA history to reach the 650-career win plateau. Ryan's career winning percentage of .757 (674-216) is seventh all-time among coaches with 600 career wins.

A member of five Halls of Fame, Ryan has been enshrined into the Wilkes College Athletic HOF (2003), the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2008), the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2011), the Wis. Basketball Coaches Assoc. HOF (2011) and the Wis. Intercollegiate Athletic Conference HOF (2012).
