BADGERS TRAVEL TO RUTGERS

- Wisconsin (5-7, 1-1 Big Ten) wraps up a two-game Big Ten road swing by traveling to Rutgers (10-4, 1-1) on Thursday. Tip time is 6 p.m. from The RAC in New Brunswick, New Jersey.
- The Badgers play at Rutgers for the first time since the Scarlet Knights joined the Big Ten Conference prior to the 2014-15 season.

FASTBREAK FACTS

- The Badgers are averaging just 10.7 turnovers per game the last three contests. Wisconsin tallied just nine give-aways against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16, nine turnovers against Indiana on Dec. 31 and 14 turnovers at Michigan State on Sunday. UW averages 16.3 turnovers per game on the season
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** has scored in double figures the last seven games, averaging 13.7 points per game over the

- After struggling from 3-point range the first three games of the season, the Badgers are shooting 34 percent or better from deep the last nine games. Wisconsin is shooting 42.6 percent (63-of-148) from behind the arc over the last nine games.
- Senior **Nicole Bauman** has 977 points in her career and needs just 23 points to become the 24th Badger to score 1,000 career points.
- Sophomore **Cayla McMorris** returned to the Badgers starting lineup the last two games and scored in double digits both contests. The 6-0 guard had 12 points against Indiana on Dec. 31 and 14 points at Michigan State on Sunday to average 13.0 points per game over the stretch.
- Redshirt freshman **Roichelle Marble** came off the bench to score 11 points against the Spartans on Sunday. The 5-7 guard went 3-of-7 from the field, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range in East Lansing. She is 7-of-10 (70 percent) from deep over the last three games.
- Wisconsin leads the Big Ten in conference-only games, shooting 40.7 percent (11-of-27) from 3-point range. Redshirt freshman **Roichelle Marble** ranks second in the league at 71.4 percent (5-of-7).

LAST TIME OUT

- A strong second quarter by No. 24 Michigan State led the Spartans to a 77-67 win over the Badgers on Sunday afternoon at the Breslin Center.
- MSU (10-3, 1-1 Big Ten) outscored the Badgers 19-9 in the second period to take a 39-24 lead at the half. Wisconsin (5-7, 1-1) outscored the Spartans 43-38 in the second half but it wasn't enough for the comeback.
- The Badgers played without senior **Tessa**Cichy for the second straight game as she is out with an illness. Senior point guard

 Dakota Whyte also got into foul trouble in the first period, picking up her second foul with 7:43 to play.
- Four Badgers scored in double figures behind 14 points from Whyte and McMorris. Redshirt freshman Roichelle Marble added 11 points while redshirt junior Avyanna Young added 10 points.
- Michigan State shot 50 percent (28-of-56) from the field, including 37.5 percent (6-of-16) from 3-point range, and 83.3 percent (15-of-18) from the line. Wisconsin hit 41 percent (25-of-61) from the field, including 40 percent (6-of-15) from 3-point range, and 68.8 percent (11-of-16) from the charity stripe.
- UW was outrebounded 37-33 but the Spartans entered the game with a plus-15 advantage on boards.
- McMorris led the Badgers with seven rebounds, including four offensive. Young added six boards for UW.
- Wisconsin outperformed the Spartans in nearly every other category, dishing off 16 assists, including seven from Whyte, while turning the ball over only 14 times. The Badgers had four blocks and seven steals, which led to 15 MSU turnovers.

SEEING DOUBLE

- Senior Nicole Bauman's eight-game double-digit scoring streak came to an end at Michigan State after the 5-10 guard scored just six points.
- Bauman is the only Badger to score 20-plus points this season, tallying 24 points at San Diego State on Nov. 29 and equaling that against Indiana on Thursday. Last season, she notched seven 20-plus scoring games and had a career-best streak of three 20-plus scoring games.
- Bauman has scored in double digits in 10 of 12 games this season, averaging a team-best 15.9 points per game. In 2014-15, she had a team-high 23 games in double figures.
- Senior Dakota Whyte has scored in double figures in the last seven games, averaging 13.7 points per game over the streak.
- Whyte ranks second on the team with 12.3 points per game, tallying 10-plus points in nine points this season.
- Seven Badgers have scored in double figures in at least one game this season.
- Senior **Michala Johnson** ranks third on the team with 10-or-more points in six games. She averages 10.2 points per game for third on the squad.

■ Sophomore Cayla McMorris has scored in double figures in five games, ranking fourth on the team with 9.1 points per game.

HITTING FROM 3-POINT RANGE

- After struggling from 3-point range the first three games of the season, the Badgers are shooting 34 percent or better from deep in the last nine games.
- Wisconsin is shooting 42.6 percent (63-of-148) from behind the arc over the last eight games.
- UW shot a season-best 75 percent (9-of-12) from deep against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16
- Senior **Tessa Cichy** leads the team and ranks 15th in the Big Ten at 39.4 percent (13-of-33) while senior **Nicole Bauman** ranks second on the squad at 36.1 percent (30-of-83).
- Bauman ties for seventh in the conference for 3-point field goals made (30) or 2.5 per game.
- Bauman's six 3-pointers against San Diego State is tied for the second most in a single game by any Big Ten player this season.

COUNT DOWN TO 1,000

- Senior Nicole Bauman has 977 points in her career and needs just 23 points to become the 24th Badger to score 1,000 career points.
- Bauman reached the 900-point mark in her career on Dec. 10 against Florida.
- In 2014-15, Bauman was the Big Ten's most improved scorer, more than doubling her sophomore season points by collecting 413 points compared to 171 in 2013-14. She averaged 6.1 ppg as a sophomore and upped that to 15.3 ppg as a junior, an improvement of 9.2 ppg. Bauman leads the Badgers with 16.1 points per game this season.

WISCONSIN LEADS THE BIG TEN

- The Badgers lead the Big Ten in conference-only stats, shooting 40.7 percent (11-of-27) from 3-point range.
- Redshirt freshman **Roichelle Marble** ranks second on the league, shooting 71.4 percent (5-of-7) from behind the arc.
- Senior **Nicole Bauman** shares the conference lead from the free-throw line, hitting 1.000 percent (7-of-7).

BADGERS IN THE BIG TEN

- Senior **Nicole Bauman** leads the team and ranks 16th in the Big Ten with 15.9 points per game. She has double-figure points in 10 of 12 games this season.
- Bauman also ties for seventh in the Big Ten in 3-pointers made (2.5), fourth in freethrow percentage (86.8), and ties for 12th in steals per game (1.8).
- Redshirt senior **Michala Johnson** ranks 12th in the Big Ten with 6.4 rebounds per game. She also ranks 15th in field goal percentage at .514.

- Johnson also ties for 11th in blocks per game (1.2) and ranks 17th in defensive rebounds per game (4.4).
- Senior **Tessa Cichy** ranks 15th in the Big Ten with a 3-point percentage of 39.4. The 5-10 guard is 13-of-33 from 3-point range this season, tying her season-best makes from deep.
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** ties for ninth in the league with 4.1 assists per game, averaging a season-best helpers.

ACTIVE LEADERS

- Senior Nicole Bauman ranks 14th among active scoring leaders in the Big Ten with 977 points.
- Bauman also ranks 14th among active players with 244 career assists, just behind teammate Dakota Whyte, who ranks 12th with 250 dimes.

I GOT THAT

- Redshirt junior Avyanna Young went over 600 career points against Indiana on Dec. 31.
 The 6-1 forward has 605 points in her third season.
- Senior Dakota Whyte picked up career point No. 700 at Michigan State on Sunday. She has 706 points in her fourth season.
- Redshirt senior Michala Johnson earned career rebound No. 400 against the Spartans on Sunday. She has 403 boards overall.

COUNTING DOWN

- Senior **Tessa Cichy** needs just 17 points to reach 500 points for her career. The 6-0 guard has 483 points in her career.
- Cichy totaled just 118 points in her freshman and sophomore campaigns and more than doubled that total with 279 points as a junior.
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** is five steals away from 100 takeaways.
- Three Badgers are counting down to 100 games. Whyte will play in her 100th game in three contests while **Nicole Bauman** needs four events for 100 contests. Cichy is down to six games for 100.

CAREER LIST UPDATES

- Senior Michala Johnson is shooting 54 percent (285-528) from the field for her Badger career, which would go down in the UW record books as the No. 1 best shooting percentage. The current mark is 53.1 percent set by Barb Franke (1991-96).
- Senior Nicole Bauman ranks fifth on the UW career record list with 190 made 3-pointers. She needs one more triple to move into fourth, currently held by Kyle Black (1998-2002) with 191.
- Bauman continues to lead the Badger career list in 3-point percentage at .406 (190-468).
- Bauman had 11 attempts from deep last week to move into eighth on the UW career record list with 468 attempts. She needs 12 more attempts to move into seventh, a position currently held by Dolly Rademaker (1990-94) with 480 attempts.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

- Senior Nicole Bauman has been the Badgers' leading scorer in eight of the 12 games this season
- Bauman has also been the team's assists leader in six games, including with four dimes against Indiana, and the blocks leader in four games. Bauman has had at least four assists in seven games this season.
- Sophomore Cayla McMorris has led the team in scoring in three games while Dakota Whyte has led the team in two games and Michala Johnson in one game.
- Johnson has led the Badgers in rebounding in a team-best five games while senior Tessa Cichy has been the top boarder in three games.
- Cichy and Bauman have also led UW in steals in four games while Whyte has been the leader in three games. Bauman has been the team leader in the last three games with four, three and two steals, respectively.
- Bauman and Whyte have both led the Badgers in assists in six games. Whyte had seven dimes at Michigan State on Sunday.

BADGER BOARDS

- Junior Tessa Cichy's had a career-high 16 rebounds against Louisiana Tech on Nov. 14. It is also a season high for a UW player.
- Redshirt junior **Avyanna Young** and freshman **Cayla McMorris** have also pulled down double-figure rebounds this season. Young had 12 rebounds at Wake Forest on Dec. 2 while McMorris has a career-high 10 boards at San Diego State on Nov. 29.
- Freshman Marsha Howard led the Badgers with a career-high nine rebounds against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16.
- Senior Michala Johnson leads the Badgers with 6.4 boards per game, which ranks 12th in the Big Ten. Junior Avyanna Young ranks second on the team with 5.7 rebounds per game while Cichy adds 5.3 boards per game.
- McMorris had a team-high seven rebounds at Michigan State on Sunday, including four offensive boards.

ROLLING WITH MARBLE

- Redshirt freshman Roichelle Marble has scored in double figures in two of the last three games.
- The 5-7 guard scored 12 points against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16 and added 11 points at Michigan State on Sunday.
- Marble is averaging 10.3 points per game the last three contests, shooting 47.6 percent (10-of-21) from the field, including 70 percent (7-of-10) from 3-point range.
- She is also 4-of-4 from the free throw line over the three-game stretch while adding 1.3 assists per game.
- On the season, Marble averages 4.3 points, 1.2 rebounds and 1.1 assists per game. She scored a career-high 13 points at San Diego State on Nov. 29.

NOTES FROM THE B1G

■ Eleven Big Ten players average at least 4.1 assists per game, led by Nebraska's Rachel Theriot with 7.0 assists through 13 games, ranking eighth in the nation. Northwestern's Deary has dished out 95 assists this season, averaging 6.8 per game, while Maryland's Brene Moseley (6.7), Minnesota's Shayne Mullaney (6.2) and Purdue's April Wilson (6.0) are averaging at least 6.0 assists per contest. Rutgers' Briyona Canty (4.6), Michigan's Siera Thompson (4.5), Penn State's Teniya Page (4.3), Wisconsin's Dakota Whyte (4.1), Michigan State's Tori Jankoska (4.1) and Nebraska's Natalie Romeo (4.1) round out the assist leaders in the Big Ten.

BADGER BLOCK

- Senior Michala Johnson leads the Badgers and ties for 11th in the Big Ten with 1.2 blocks per game. Senior Nicole Bauman ranks second on the team with 1.0 blocks per game.
- Johnson has led the team in blocks in five games, including tying her career best with four blocks against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16
- Bauman has tied her career high for blocks (3) twice this season. She has 12 blocks this season, equalling her junior season total and needs just three more to equal her freshmen year total.

CAREER MARKS

- Senior **Tessa Cichy** pulled down 16 rebounds and set a new career high vs. LA Tech on Nov. 14. Her previous mark of 10 was set on Jan. 6, 2015, against Penn State. The 6-0 guard also made a career-best three 3-point field goals against Delaware on Nov. 27, tying her career high with six triple attempts.
- Senior Nicole Bauman tied her career high with three blocks twice this season—against La Tech on Nov. 14 and against Delaware on Nov. 27. She also set a new career best, going 6-of-6 from the free throw line against Indiana on Dec. 31. The 5-10 guard had a career-best four steals against La Tech and tied a school record by going 5-for-5 from 3-point range against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16.
- Senior Michala Johnson had a career-high three steals against Florida on Dec. 10. She also took a career-high 14 field goal attempts at Marquette on Dec. 6 and tied her career high with four blocks against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16.
- Sophomore Cayla McMorris tied her career high with 17 points at Dayton on Nov. 22. She also pulled down a career best 10 rebounds at San Diego State while adding a career-high four assists. She also tied her career high with three 3-point field goals made at Wake Forest.
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** set a new career high after shooting a perfect 1.000 percent (6-of-6) from the free throw line against La Tech on Nov. 14. She also tied her career high with steals against Green Bay on Dec. 13.

MARSHA, MARSHA, MARSHA

- Freshman Marsha Howard had a breakout game against Northern Illinois on Dec. 16. The 6-0 guard/forward had a career-high eight points, shooting 3-of-5 from the field, and also led the team with nine rebounds.
- Howard also set career bests, shooting 2-of-5 from the free-throw line, and added her first career block while playing in a careerhigh 18 minutes.
- Howard has played in seven games this season, averaging 9.3 minutes per game. She adds 1.7 points and 3.0 rebounds per game.

WALK-ONS JOIN THE TEAM

- Redshirt junior Taylor Kuhn and redshirt freshman Lexy Richardson have been added to the Badger squad as walk-ons.
- Kuhn, a 5-10 guard, from Medford, Wisconsin, received all-conference honorable mention honors in 2009-10 and first-team all-conference in 2011-12, aiding her team to back-to-back Great Northern Conference championships. She was also named the team's most valuable player in 2011-12 on top of clinching all-state honorable mention status. In 2012, the two-time team captain was named the Medford Area Senior High Female Athlete of the Year.
- Richardson, a 5-9 guard, joins the Badgers after serving as a team manager the last year-and-a-half. The Verona, Wisconsin, native was a second-team all-conference selection as a junior and first-team all-conference pick as a senior for Verona Area High School. She was also a four-year letterwinner in track and field and dance team. Richardson was a participant in the 2014 WBCA All-Star game.

- Due to an illness to starter **Tessa Cichy**, sophomore **Cayla McMorris** has started the last two games.
- The Badgers are 1-1 with a starting lineup that consists of seniors **Nicole Bauman**, **Michala Johnson**, **Dakota Whyte**, junior **Avyanna Young** and McMorris.
- Wisconsin is 2-4 with the starting lineup of Bauman, Johnson, Young, Whyte and Cichy and 2-2 with the starters of Bauman, Johnson, Young, Cichy and McMorris.

ON THE MEND

- Redshirt sophomore **Michaela Crall** is out indefinitely with a lower leg injury.
- Senior **Tessa Cichy** is expected to be out for a couple of weeks due to illness.

NO SHOT AT THE LINE

- For the first time in Wisconsin women's basketball history, the Badgers were not sent to the free throw line one time in the game against San Diego State on Nov. 29.
- The Badgers have not made at least one free throw two other times in program history. The first time was against Iowa (0-4) on Jan. 22, 1984 and the second was against Ohio State (0-1) on Feb. 6, 2012.

MCBUCKET MAGIC

■ Three seconds left on the clock and tied 52-52, all eyes were on sophomore Cayla McMorris, nicknamed McBuckets, as she threw up a breathtaking jumper in Viejas Arena. The Badger bench and fan section absolutely exploded as the ball went through the hoop and Wisconsin clinched a 54-52 victory over Delaware in the opening round of the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 27.

WISCONSIN-RUTGERS SERIES

■ This game will be the fourth meeting between the two teams. Rutgers leads the all-time series 3-0 while the teams have met only once since the Scarlet Knights joined the Big Ten prior to the 204-15 season.

B1G PLAY

■ The Scarlet Knights opened the Big Ten season with a 66-55 win over Minnesota on Dec. 31 before losing at Iowa 69-65 on Monday night.

KNOW THE KNIGHTS

- Head coach C. Vivian Stringer is the second winnigest active coach in women's basketball and one of five current active coaches among all division with over 900 career victories. She is fourth all-time in career wins among women's basketball coaches.
- With a 75-51 victory over Tulane in the first game of the Paradise Jam over Thanksgiving Week, C. Vivian Stringer became Rutgers' all-time leader in basketball victories - men or women.
- Senior forward Kahleah Copper was one of 20 student-athletes from 16 schools to be named to the Ann Meyers Drysdale Watch List and one of 50 named to the Naismith Trophy Early Season Watch List for National Player of the Year.
- This season, Copper is currently averaging a team-leading 17.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game along with shooting 51.9 percent (94-of-181) from the field. She is a Preseason All-Big Ten honoree and was named the Paradise Jam's "Most Valuable Player" after guiding the Scarlet Knights to the Island Division Championship in St. Thomas over Thanksgiving weekend.

■ Redshirt senior guard Briyona Canty registered seven games with five or more assists this season and is currently averaging 4.6 assists per game. Most recently, Canty tied her career-high with 10 assists in RU's Big Ten opening win over the Golden Gophers. It marked the third time in her career she has recorded double figure assists

LAST TIME: RUTGERS VS. WISCONSIN

- Despite three players scoring in double figures, the Badgers (7-10 overall, 3-4 Big Ten) fell to No. 24 Rutgers, 73-63, at the Kohl Center on Jan. 18, 2015.
- Wisconsin turned the ball over 16 times as Rutgers had 12 steals. The Badgers had five steals while the Scarlet Knights has nine turnovers. UW dished off 10 assists, led by three apiece from Whyte and Nicole Bauman.
- Junior Dakota Whyte scored in double figures for the fourth straight game, sharing game-high honors with 17 points. The 5-8 guard was 7-of-13 (53.8 percent) from the field and 3-of-4 (75 percent) from the free throw line.
- The Badgers made a season-high 16 free throws and posted their highest free throw percentage of the season (.889), hitting 16-of-18.
- The Badgers struggled from 3-point range, hitting just 3-of-15 (20 percent) while Rutgers shot 66.7 percent (6-of-9) from deep. Junior Cynthia Hernandez came off the bench to hit 5-of-6 (83.3 percent) from behind the arc for Rutgers, tying a Kohl center record.
- UW shot better than the Scarlet Knights, hitting 42.2 percent (22-of-52) from the field, compared to 38 percent (27-of-71) from Rutgers.

HEAD COACH BOBBIE KELSEY

FIFTH SEASON

In her four seasons at Wisconsin, Bobbie Kelsey has been building a program the right way. By playing exciting basketball against some of the best teams in the nation, the Badgers are beginning to attract attention across the country.

Kelsey's Badgers have played some of the toughest schedules in the nation. Wisconsin played 14 teams that competed in post-season tournaments in 2013-14, finishing with the 28th toughest schedule. UW had the 15th toughest schedule in 2012-13, playing 18 games against post-season teams. Kelsey's team upset No. 8 Penn State at home in 2013 and also won a game in the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2010.

The Badgers have battled some of the nation's best teams, losing 11 games by single digits in 2012-13 and dropping 10 games in 2013-14 by 10-or-fewer points.

UW records have become a matter of fact under Kelsey as the Badgers set six school records in 2011-12, 13 UW single-game or season marks in 2012-13, including the school record for free throw percentage two straight seasons. Wisconsin also broke five single-game or season records in 2013-14

Individual awards have also come to the Badgers under Kelsey. Michala Johnson earned first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2014, becoming the first UW player named to that team since 2008. Taylor Wurtz and Anya Covington earned All-Big Ten honors in 2012 while Morgan Paige and Jacki Gulczynski were honored in 2013. Nicole Bauman earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in 2015.

Academic honors have also improved under Kelsey. After only one Academic All-Big Ten honoree in her first season, the Badgers had six honorees in 2013-14, including three-time honoree Morgan Paige. UW tied a school record with seven honorees in 2014-15.

Kelsey came to Wisconsin after four seasons as an assistant at top-ranked Stanford. The Cardinal compiled a 137-14 (.907) record, including a 69-3 (.958) mark in Pac-10 conference play, and advanced to the Final Four each year during her time there. Stanford's streak of four-straight Final Fours is tied for the second-longest streak in NCAA history. Prior to Kelsey's arrival, Stanford had not advanced to the Final Four since 1997.

In addition to coaching at Stanford under Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer for the last four seasons, Kelsey was a four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1992-96. She helped the Cardinal to three Final Four appearances in five years as a player, including the 1992 NCAA championship. Kelsey was a team co-captain in 1995 and 1996, voted the team's Most Inspirational Player in 1992 and 1996, and named the team's most improved player in 1993.

Kelsey graduated from Stanford in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in communications. She earned her master's degree from Duquesne University from the School of Leadership and Professional Advancement in Sports Leadership.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- The 2015-16 Badgers return six lettterwinners and four starters, including its top-three scorers from last season. UW returns 72.2 percent of its scoring and 53.9 percent of its rebounding for the upcoming season.
- Michala Johnson, a 2014 first-team All-Big Ten pick, was granted a sixth year by the NCAA and will return in 2015-16. The 6-3 forward played in six games last season before tearing her ACL. She was the Badgers leading scorer (16.6 ppg) and rebounder (7.3 rpg) in 2013-14.
- Wisconsin returns three of the Big Ten's most improved scorers. Senior Nicole Bauman was the league's most improved scorer in 2014-15, upping her scoring average by 9.2 points per game. Seniors Tessa Cichy and Dakota Whyte also ranked among the top-10 most improved scorers. Cichy ranked fourth at plus 7.8 while Whyte ranked 10th at plus 4.9 points per game.
- Junior Nicole Bauman earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors, leading the team and ranking 11th in the conference with 15.1 points per game. She is the sixth player to earn All-Big Ten honors under Coach Kelsey.

A LOOK BACK AT 2014-15

- Wisconsin ended the season 9-20 overall, 5-13 in the Big Ten. The Badgers five Big Ten wins were the most since 2011-12, head coach Bobbie Kelsey's first season. UW won three Big Ten road games last season, the most since winning four road games in 2010-11.
- Wisconsin ended the Big Ten season as the No. 1 3-point shooting team in the conference at 39.2 percent (130-of-332). Junior Nicole Bauman led the league individually at 50.8 percent (61-of-120) while senior Jacki Gulczynski was second at 44.9 percent (40-of-89).
- The Badgers went down in program history as one of the most proficient 3-point teams. In Big Ten-only play, Wisconsin set school records for most triples (130), triples per game (7.22) and percentage (.392). In all games, UW set a school record for percentage at .374.
- The Badgers improved in nearly every statistical category compared to the 2013-14 season. The largest improvement was in 3-point percentage where UW improved by 0.6 percentage

- points. Wisconsin trailed in only points per game and free throw percentage.
- UW had one of the toughest schedules in the nation, ranking 30th in strength of schedule according to RealTimeRPI.com. Wisconsin also ranked 40th for schedule strength by RPIRatings.com.
- In 14 losses, the Badgers led or trailed by single digits with under nine minutes to play.
- The Badgers shot 42.5 percent (708 of 1666) from the field, their best shooting percentage in five years, since hitting 43.2 percent in 2009-10. Wisconsin shot 40 percent or better from the field in 22 games, including the last 14 games of the year. UW hit 45 percent or better in nine games and 50 percent or better in three games.
- Seven Badgers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, tying the most in a single season for UW. Honorees were Nicole Bauman, AnnMarie Brown, Tessa Cichy, Jacki Gulczynski, Malayna Johnson, Michala Johnson and Carly Truesdale.

STARTERS

- Senior Nicole Bauman led the Big Ten overall and ranked second nationally with a 3-point percentage of .488. The 5-10 guard was 80-of-164 from beyond the arc this season. Bauman set the UW Big Ten-only season mark with 61 made 3-pointers while her .508 (61-of-120) shooting percentage from deep was also a record.
- Senior Dakota Whyte ranked second on the squad with 11.1 points per game, scoring in double figures in 19 games. She averaged 11.5 points per game in conference contests. Whyte had a team-high 110 assists (3.79/game) while Bauman added 103 assists (3.81/game), marking the first time since 2007-08 that two players recorded 100-or-more assists in the same
- Senior Tessa Cichy was one of UW's most improved players. The 5-10 guard picked up her play in Big Ten action, scoring in double figures in 13 of 18 games, including a careerhigh 20 points against Iowa on Feb. 1. Cichy also ranked second on the squad with 5.8 rebounds per game in conference play, recording her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 10 rebounds against Penn State on Jan. 6. On the year, Cichy averaged season bests of 9.6 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game.
- Sixth-year Michala Johnson returns after suffering a torn ACL last season. The 6-3 forward played and started six games last season before going out nine minutes into the game at Miami on Dec. 4. The 2014 first-team All-Big Ten selection averaged 28 minutes per game and 12.8 point per games last season while scoring in double figures in five games.

GUARDS

■ Coach Kelsey's first top-100 recruit, Cayla McMorris, played in all 29 games as a freshman, averaging 16.7 minutes per game and 4.8 points per game. The 6-0 guard scored in double figures in five games. She had a career-high 17 points on two occasions against Marquette (Dec. 6) and Oral Roberts (Dec. 20).

■ Roichelle Marble tore her Achilles tendon the summer before her freshman campaign and redshirted last season. The three-time all-state pick by the *Des Moines Register* was also a two-time Central Iowa Metro League first-team selection in high school.

FORWARDS/CENTERS

- Redshirt junior Rosie Gambino was set to be eligible to play second semester of this season but broke her foot in December and had surgery in early January. Led the Kishwaukee Kougars with 3.4 blocks per game in 2012-13.
- Junior **Avyanna Young** missed the entire 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules. The 6-1 forward transferred from Milwaukee after ranking 16th in the Horizon League with 13.3 points per game in 2013-14.
- Redshirt freshman Michaela Crall was recovering from a torn ACL suffered in April of 2014 during the 2014-15 season after taking a redshirt season as a freshman due to a foot injury. She averaged 9.4 points, 7.7 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game as a senior for Olathe Northwest high school.
- One of the two newest Badgers, **Elizabeth Toye** comes to UW after setting the Lindblom
 Academy school record for career points with
 1,142 points in three years.
- A three-star recruit by ESPN/Scouts, Marsha Howard starts her career as a Badger after being ranked as the No. 10 player in the state of Illinois for the class of 2015 by Midwest Recruiting Report. The 5-10 forward was a four-time all-conference honoree and two-time all-state honoree.

STAFF SNAPSHOT

- Several new faces have joined the Wisconsin staff this season including former Badger Anya Covington and former Syracuse assistant coach Sasha Palmer.
- In Bobbie Kelsey's first season at Wisconsin, Covington was a 2012 consensus honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, ranking second on the squad with 10.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. She played in 123 games in the Cardinal and White, averaging 5.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 47.9 percent from the field.
- Palmer comes to Wisconsin after serving as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the past two seasons at Syracuse University. The Orange were 45-20 in her two seasons, advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament both years. Syracuse also finished fifth both years in the Atlantic Coast Conference, going 21-11 in conference play.

OH CANADA

■ Senior Dakota Whyte helped make history as she led the Canada Development Women's National Basketball Team to its best finish at the World University Games and Canada's first medal since 1991. Team Canada was previously on the podium winning bronze in 1979 and 1991.
