Storylines

• The No. 3 Maryland men's basketball team travels to Wisconsin Saturday for a battle with the Badgers at 1 p.m. EST on ESPN.

• **Diamond Stone** - the reigning Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week - racked up his second career double-double, posting 15 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Rutgers Wednesday. Stone is averaging a league-high 21.3 points per game and is fourth in rebounding (8.3 rpg) and field goal percentage (.690) in conference play. He has scored in double figures in eight consecutive games and 10 of his past 11 contests.

• This is Stone's first trip to Madison as a member of the Maryland men's basketball team. Stone won four state championships at the Kohl Center while starring at Dominican High School in Milwaukee. He set a Wisconsin state record with 14 blocked shots in the 2012 state semifinal and also finished the game with a triple-double, notching 15 points, 15 rebounds and 14 blocks.

• Seniors **Rasheed Sulaimon** and **Jake Layman** have made a big impact on the Terps the last two games. The two have combined for 58 points, 23 rebounds and 11 assists in wins over Northwestern and Rutgers. The duo is a combined 15-of-24 from the beyond the arc (.625). Maryland is 14-0 the past two seasons when Layman scores 15 or more points.

• Maryland has won 11 consecutive conference regular season games dating back to last season (Feb. 11, 2015). This marks the longest such streak since the 2001-02 team posted 13 wins en route to winning 32 games and a national championship. With the win over Rutgers, Maryland opened up conference play with three consecutive wins for the first time since 2001-02 season (win at NC State, 72-65, win at North Carolina, 112-79 and win at Georgia Tech, 92-87).

• The Terps (14-1) moved up a spot to No. 3 in the Associated Press and USA Today Top 25 after recording wins over Penn State and at Northwestern last week. Maryland has been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 25 straight weeks.

Wisconsin (9-7, 1-2) dropped a close decision to Indiana, 59-58, in Bloomington its last time out

Nigel Hayes (15.7 ppg), Bronson Koenig (13.9 ppg) and Ethan Happ (11.1 ppg) lead the Badgers - who advanced to the national title game a year ago.

Wisconsin leads the all-time series, 5-3, but the Terps won the only meeting between the two programs as members of the Big Ten Conference, downing the then-No. 4 ranked Badgers, 59-53, at XFINITY Center on Feb. 24.

Maryland routed Wisconsin, 87-57, on March 17, 2002 en route to the national championship. Current special assistant to the head coach **Juan Dixon** scored 29 points against the Badgers to break Len Bias' team record for career points.

Spreading the Love vs. Rutgers

A total of 11 players scored at least one point against Rutgers on Wednesday. Four Terps notched double-figure scoring. **Jared Nickens** racked up a career-high 10 rebounds while **Varun Ram** posted a career-best five points.

All 14 active players played at least three minutes in the contest.

Big Game Melo

Melo Trimble has been stellar in the Terps' three biggest matchups this season. The Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year scored 24 points against Georgetown, 23 at North Carolina and 25 versus UConn at Madison Square Garden. He also netted 24 points against a then-13-1 Northwestern squad.

The Terps are 17-1 when Trimble gets to the charity stripe at least seven times.

Stone Named Big Ten Player, Freshman of the Week

Diamond Stone was named Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week on Monday after averaging 24.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game in leading the Terrapins to wins over Penn State and Northwestern.

For the week, he shot 73.7 percent (14-of-19) from the floor and 77.8 percent (21-of-27) from the free throw line. Stone poured in a season-high and Maryland single-game freshman record 39 points, pulled down a season-best 12 rebounds and recorded a pair of blocks in the Terrapins' come-from-behind win over the Nittany Lions.

Big Ten Notes

- Seven Big Ten teams were selected to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, marking the eighth time in the last 10 years that six or more conference teams advanced to the tournament.

- Big Ten teams have won 54 NCAA Tournament games since 2011, the most among the ACC, Big East, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC.

- The Big Ten led the nation in men's basketball attendance for the 39th consecutive season.

- The Big Ten welcomes back 17 players that have earned All-Big Ten distinction, including Trimble and Indiana's Yogi Ferrell, who were first-team selections last year.

Terps Capture Cancun Challenge Title

Melo Trimble scored 17 points on a perfect 7-for-7 shooting performance, and No. 2 Maryland beat Rhode Island 86-63 on Nov. 25 to win the Cancun Challenge.

Trimble, who was named tournament MVP, also went 3-for-3 at the line and grabbed six rebounds. **Rasheed Sulaimon** also scored 17 points on 6-for-7 shooting, and **Robert Carter** had 15. Sulaimon joined backcourt mate Trimble on the all-tournament team.

The championship is the Terps' 31st holiday tournament title and their third consecutive after winning the Paradise Jam in 2013 and the CBE Classic in 2014.

Sharing the Rock

Maryland is the only team in the Big Ten to have five players averaging 10 or more points per game. **Melo Trimble** (14.4), **Diamond Stone** (13.2), **Robert Carter** (12.5), **Jake Layman** (11.1), and **Rasheed Sulaimon** (10.8) are all averaging double-figure scoring this season.

MELO-V-P!

Melo Trimble has been sensational in holiday tournament action in his first two years at Maryland.

In four games, Trimble averaged 14.3 points per game and shot 65 percent from the floor (24-for-37). The sophomore was 21-22 from the charity stripe and recorded a career-high 31 points against Arizona State in the CBE Classic in 2014.

He was named Most Valuable Player at both the Cancun Challenge and the CBE Classic while leading the Terps to both titles.

Terps Drop UConn in Jimmy V Classic

Melo Trimble scored a season-high 25 points and freshman **Diamond Stone** had 16 as No. 6 Maryland took a 20-point lead in the first half and went on to beat Connecticut 76-66 Dec. 8 in the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden.

The Terrapins used their size up front to dominate the rebounding, 45-24, including 23-9 on the offensive end. **Robert Carter** had 11 rebounds and Stone grabbed nine for the Terps.

Layman, Trimble Named to Wooden List

Maryland men's basketball forward **Jake Layman** and guard **Melo Trimble** have been named to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's Preseason Top-50 as announced on ESPN's SportsCenter and on ESPN.com.

Chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts, the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious individual honor. Maryland is one of 12 schools in the country with multiple players in the top-50.

The Top 50 nominees represent 10 conferences. The Big Ten leads all conferences with 10 selections, followed by the ACC (9), and the Big 12 (7), SEC (7), Pac-12 (5), Big East (4) and WCC (3).

#Rivarly-Renewed - Terps Down Georgetown

Rasheed Sulaimon hit a 3-pointer with 1:18 left to break a tie, and No. 3 Maryland got 24 points from Melo Trimble in a rousing 75-71 victory over neighborhood rival Georgetown on Nov. 17.

Maryland was stretched to the finish against Georgetown, which led by seven in the second half before wilting. With the score tied at 68, Sulaimon made his only basket of the second half to put the Terrapins ahead to stay. Two free throws by Trimble upped the margin to five points with 12 seconds left, assuring Maryland a victory.

Jake Layman scored 15 for the Terrapins and **Robert Carter** added 12.

Layman's Terms

Senior forward **Jake Layman** is the lone four-year Terrapin on head coach Mark Turgeon's roster in 2015-16.

Layman appeared in all 35 games last season, averaging 12.5 points and a team-high 5.8 rebounds per game. He scored his 1,000th point at Maryland against Indiana in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten tournament.

The Wrentham, Mass., native became the 40th member of Maryland's 500-rebound club against Rider on Nov. 20. Layman is now 34th all-time with 1,187 points.

Trimble Named B1G Preseason Player of the Year

Sophomore point guard **Melo Trimble** has been named the 2015-16 Preseason Big Ten Conference Player of the Year. In addition, Trimble joined senior forward **Jake Layman** on the Preseason All-Big Ten Team.

Trimble, who is the first Terrapin to nab conference preseason player of the year honors since Terence Morris in 1999-00, started in all 35 games for the Terps, leading Maryland in scoring (16.2 ppg), assists (106) and steals (44). The Upper Marlboro, Md., product was also a Sporting News Second Team All-American and USBWA Freshman All-American. Trimble was one of four unanimous selections on the Preseason All-Big Ten Team.

Layman was named an All-Big Ten Third Team selection a year ago. The Wrentham, Mass., native boasted 29 double-figure scoring games a year ago while ranking in the top 25 in the conference in scoring (12.5 ppg), field goal percentage (.470) and rebounding (5.8 rpg). He scored his 1,000th point at Maryland last March and notched his 500th career rebound this season.

Four Terps Land on National Watch Lists

Senior forward **Jake Layman**, senior guard **Rasheed Sulaimon**, sophomore guard **Melo Trimble** and freshman center **Diamond Stone** have been named to a trio of national watch lists at their respective positions, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced.

Layman was tabbed to the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year list after being named an All-Big Ten selection in 2015. The Wrentham, Mass., native boasted 29 double-figure scoring games a year ago while ranking in the top 25 in the conference in scoring (12.5 ppg), field goal percentage (.470) and rebounding (5.8 rpg).

Sulaimon is one of 20 candidates for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award. The Houston, Texas, native averaged 10 points and 2.7 rebounds per game during his three-year stint at Duke prior to transferring to the University of Maryland for his senior campaign.

For the second straight season, Trimble landed on the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year watch list. A First Team All-Big pick as a freshman last season, Trimble started in all 35 games for the Terps, leading the squad in scoring (16.2 ppg), assists (106) and steals (44). The Upper Marlboro, Md., product was also a Sporting News Second Team All-American and USBWA Freshman All-American.

Stone has been named to the 2015-16 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award watch list. A McDonald's All-American, Stone is rated as a consensus top 10 player by a myriad of national recruiting services and is arguably one of the highest-rated recruits to join Maryland. Stone starred at Dominican High School in Milwaukee, Wisc., where he led his high school team to four straight state championships and as a senior averaged 24.4 points, 11.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game.

Turgeon Named Big Ten Coach of the Year

Maryland head coach **Mark Turgeon** was named the 2015 Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year after guiding Maryland to a school-record 26 wins in the regular season a year ago.

The Terps' 28 wins in 2014-15 were an 11-game improvement from its 17 victories in the 2013-14 season, a mark that ranked second among schools in the Power Five conferences.

Maryland – which finished second in the Big Ten – cracked the Associated Press poll Top 10 for first time since Feb. 3, 2003 – a span of 12 seasons and was ranked among the Associated Press Top 25 poll for 15 consecutive weeks, the longest such streak since 2002-03.

Wiley Expected to Miss Four Months

Maryland men's basketball coach **Mark Turgeon** announced sophomore guard **Dion Wiley** had successful surgery to repair a torn right meniscus on Nov. 10. Wiley is expected to miss four months.

A native of Oxon Hill, Md., Wiley appeared in all 35 games as a freshman last season, averaging 4.1 points and 1.5 rebounds per game for the Terps. He scored a career-high 19 points and six rebounds against VMI. The 6-foot-4 guard helped guide Maryland to a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Tough Slate

Maryland's 2015-16 schedule currently features four ranked teams in the Associated Press Top 25 (No. 5 Michigan State, No. 6 North Carolina, No. 20 Purdue (twice), No. 19 Iowa and No. 23 UConn). The Terps have posted non-conference wins over previously ranked Georgetown.

Maryland's schedule also features a pair of games against Northwestern, who received votes in last week's poll and contests against previously-ranked opponents (Indiana, Wisconsin (twice) and Michigan (twice)). Indiana and Michigan are both receiving votes in this week's AP poll.

► 351-210 (18TH SEASON) / 101-51 (5TH SEASON AT MARYLAND)

Mark Turgeon is entering his fifth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and notched 28 total, an eight-game improvement from its 17 victories during the 2013-14 season. The 11-game win difference was the second-highest improvement among all Power Five schools. Maryland also advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

Maryland cracked the Associated Press poll Top 10 for first time since Feb. 3, 2003 – a span of 12 seasons – and has been ranked in the AP poll for 14 consecutive weeks, the longest streak since 2002-03.

The Terps finished their inaugural season in the Big Ten with a perfect 9-0 home record, which included victories against then-No. 5 Wisconsin, Michigan State and Indiana. Overall, Maryland concluded the 2014-15 campaign with an 18-1 home mark at XFINITY Center.

Maryland's 14-1 record in 2014-15 marked its best start in 18 years (1996-97). Turgeon posted 25 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his career.

Turgeon has led the Terps to an impressive start in 2015-16. Maryland, currently ranked No. 3 in the Associated Press poll, is off to a 14-1 start and posted wins against UConn and Georgetown. The win against the Hoyas, marked the first time these two neighborhood rivals played on the College Park campus for more than four decades (1973).

Since arriving in College Park, Turgeon has signed four consecutive nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including the ninth-ranked class in 2014. He played a lead role in signing center Diamond Stone (Milwaukee, Wisc.) – a McDonald's All-American who was rated as a consensus top 10 player by a myriad of national recruiting services.

In 2013, he captured his 300th career victory with an 85-74 defeat of Tulsa on Dec. 29, before leading the Terps to a thrilling overtime win against No. 5 Virginia in Maryland's final ACC regular season game.

Turgeon's winning percentage of .600 (42-28) was the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons, ahead of Bud Millikan (.592) and Gary Williams (.574). After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, he led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 14 of his 17 seasons, including a current streak of 13 consecutive winning seasons.

Turgeon directed Maryland to three wins over a ranked team in 2012-13 after Maryland had gone two seasons without one. The Terps were the only team in the nation to beat Duke twice, while also knocking off then-14th ranked NC State at home in January. Maryland's win over Duke at home on Feb. 16 was its first over a No. 1 ranked opponent in five years.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

Turgeon is 337-209 through 18 seasons overall as a head coach. In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

Four of Turgeon's former players are currently playing in the NBA: Donald Sloan (Brooklyn Nets), Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers) and Alex Len (Phoenix Suns). In addition, Len was selected in the first round (fifth overall) by the Suns in the 2013 NBA Draft.

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the



1986 NCAA Final Four.

As a student-athlete, he was selected to the Big Eight All-Academic Team in 1986 and was a Big Eight All-Freshman pick in 1984. He earned a bachelor of science degree in personnel administration from Kansas in 1987.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

In the summer of 2008, Turgeon was inducted into the Topeka Sports Hall of Fame. He was honored as the 2015 Kansan of the Year in June, 2015.

Turgeon is active in the College Park community and has hosted the Coaches vs. Cancer Season Tip-Off Breakfast in conjunction with the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches the past four years. Over the past two seasons, Turgeon worked with the Infiniti Coaches Charity Challenge to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill. and they have two sons - William Harris and Leo - and a daughter, Ella.

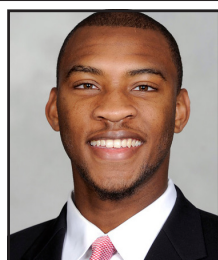

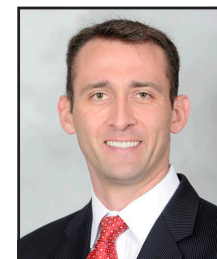
