## SEASON OPENS FRIDAY VS. CENTRAL ARKANSAS

- Wisconsin opens the 2016-17 season Friday against Central Arkansas for the first-ever meeting between the Badgers and Bears. The game will tip off at 7 p.m. (CT) and will be streamed live on BTN Plus.
- Up next, the Badgers will travel to Omaha, Neb. to take on Creighton on Nov. 15 as part of the Gavitt Games. Tip is at 7:30 p.m. on FS1.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT WISCONSIN

- **HAPPY NEW YEAR:** Wisconsin begins its 118th season of men's basketball in 2016-17 and the first full season under Greg Gard, who took over for the final 23 games of the 2015-16 season.
- **QUITE A DEBUT:** In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led Wisconsin to wins in 11 of the final 13 regular-season games and a trip to the 2016 Sweet 16, winning the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.
- **GANG'S ALL HERE:** Wisconsin returns each of the top 9 scorers from last season. In fact, the Badgers bring back all but 20 minutes played (99.8%) and all but 6 points (99.7%) from a year ago. UW returns all 5 starters for the first time since the 1988-89 season.
- **TERRIFIC TRIO:** Senior Nigel Hayes was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year as well as a consensus member of the Preseason All-Big Ten Team. Fellow senior Bronson Koenig and sophomore Ethan Happ were also selected for the Preseason All-Big Ten team.
- **POLL POSITION:** Wisconsin opens the year ranked No. 9 in the preseason AP Top 25, the second-highest debut in program history (UW was ranked third in the 2014-15 preseason poll).
- **PRO OR (NON)CON:** The Badgers have won 36 of their last 42 (.857) regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012. Of those six losses, five came last season.
- **BENCHMARKS:** Nigel Hayes already ranks 16 in school history with 1,340 career points, while fellow senior Bronson Koenig needs just 71 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau.
- **20/20 VISION:** Wisconsin posted a 22-13 record last season, reaching at least 20 wins for the 10th straight season (2nd-longest active streak in the Big Ten behind Ohio State's 11).
- **ROLLING DEEP:** The Badgers' roster features 9 different players who have tallied double-digit scoring games in their career, including 5 players who have scored at least 20 points in a game.
- **WINS RECORD:** The Badgers' senior class has been a part of 88 wins already in their UW career, averaging 29.3 wins per season. The winningest class graduated in 2015 with a total of 115 victories.



Led by preseason Big Ten Player of the Year Nigel Hayes, UW returns all but 20 minutes and 6 points from last season's team.

ALL-TIME VS. CENTRAL ARKANSAS

Wisconsin will take on Central Arkansas for the first time in history. The Badgers are 5-0 against teams from the Southland Conference, most recently topping Texas A&M Corpus-Christi, 64-49, last season in Bo Ryan's final game.

UW IN SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ Friday will mark the first season opener for Greg Gard, who assumed the head coaching duties midway through last season.
▶ Wisconsin lost its season opener last year, a 69-67 setback to Western Illinois, snapping a streak of 13 consecutive wins in regular-season openers.
▶ Prior to last year's loss to W. Illinois, UW's last 13 openers were won by an average of 27.5 ppg.

NON-CON, NO-CONTEST

- ▶ UW has won 36 of its last 42 (.857) regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012.
▶ Since 2001-02, UW is 151-36 (.807) in non-conference games, including a mark of 110-11 (.909) at the Kohl Center.
▶ Over the last 15 seasons, the Badgers have gone 21-18 (.538) in non-conference road games. That includes wins in 6 of last 7 true road games.
▶ Since 2003-04, Wisconsin is 92-5 (.948) vs. unranked non-con opponents, including 3 such setbacks last season.
▶ Last season, Wisconsin dropped 5 non-conference games for just the 2nd time since 1997-98 and the first time since starting the 2001-02 season with a record of 7-6 in Bo Ryan's first season in Madison.

EXHIBITION RECAP

- ▶ Wisconsin hosted Div. 3 UW-Platteville in its lone exhibition contest, posting an 86-58 win on Oct. 30. The Badgers also scrimmaged Northern Iowa in Dubuque, Iowa, on Nov. 3, winning all three periods by a combined score of 78-48.
▶ Against UWP, senior Bronson Koenig led three Badgers in double figures, finishing with 12 points. Senior Nigel Hayes and junior Jordan Hill each added 10 points. Sophomore Ethan Happ tallied 6 points and 9 rebounds. Off the bench, a trio of sophomores stood out as Charles Thomas, IV, had 5 points with 10 boards, Khalil Iverson scored 9 points on 4-for-4 shooting and Andy Van Vliet posted 8 points and 8 rebounds.
▶ In the scrimmage vs. UNI, senior Zak Showalter led UW in scoring with 18 points (4-4 3FGs) in 25 minutes. Senior Vitto Brown tallied 15 points (4-5 3FGs) in 23 minutes.
▶ Illikainen chipped in 14 points in 16 minutes off the bench on 4-for-5 shooting from 3-point range. Junior Jordan Hill also chipped in 13 points (3-5 3FGs) in 18 minutes off the bench.
▶ As a team, UW shot 44.7% (17-for-38) from 3-point range in the 44-minute scrimmage.

- ▶ Throughout the 2016-17 season, Wisconsin will wear a special patch on their jerseys in memory of three family members who have passed away in the last year:
Ab Nicholas - former Badger player and generous benefactor, who passed in August
Glen Gard - father of head coach Greg Gard, who passed in October of 2015
Kathy Gutierrez - mother of associate head coach Lamont Paris, who passed in June

POLL POSITION

- ▶ Wisconsin opens the season ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press Top 25, the second-highest ranking in school history (UW was No. 3 prior to the 2014-15 season).
▶ The Badgers have now been ranked in the AP preseason poll in each of the last six seasons and 8 of the last 11.
▶ Wisconsin has made a habit of out-producing its preseason ranking. In 6 of the past 7 seasons, Wisconsin has finished the season equal or higher than its preseason ranking.

## 2016-17 TEAM INFO

### RETURNING FRONTCOURT STARTERS

► The Badgers welcome back 2016 first-team All-Big Ten selection **Nigel Hayes**, who averaged 15.7 ppg and 5.8 rpg while leading UW with 104 assists. The 2016-17 *Blue Ribbon Magazine* preseason National Player of the Year and preseason Big Ten Player of the Year, Hayes joins Michael Finley as the only Badgers to tally at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 200 assists by their junior season. If he just matches his junior year totals he would finish 3rd in school history in points (currently 1,340), 7th in rebounds (currently 557) and 7th in career assists (currently 219).

► Sophomore **Ethan Happ** looks to build off his 2016 Big Ten Freshman of the Year campaign during which he averaged 12.4 ppg, ranked 6th in the Big Ten with 7.9 rpg and became the first freshman to lead the Big Ten in steals (63 steals) since OSU's Aaron Craft (2010). Happ became just the third NCAA freshman over the last 15 seasons to score 400 points, while recording 60 steals and 30 blocks (also Kevin Durant and DuJuan Blair).

► Senior **Vitto Brown** finished 4th on the team in scoring, averaging 9.7 ppg with 5.0 rpg. He enjoyed the third-largest scoring increase in the Big Ten a year ago, going from 1.8 ppg to 9.7 ppg in 2015-16. Brown did not attempt a 3-pointer in his first two seasons at UW, but led the team last year, shooting 40% (38-95) from deep.

### RETURNING BACKCOURT STARTERS

► Third-team All-Big Ten junior **Bronson Koenig** returns as the team's lead guard after averaging 13.1 ppg and shooting 39.0% (83-213) from 3-point range. The moniker "Klutch Koenig" was born in 2015-16 after his game-winning shots against VCU and Xavier. In fact, over the final 5:00 and overtime of games last season, Koenig shot 54.8% (17-for-31) from 3-point range. Koenig needs just 71 points and 27 assists to become the 14th player in UW history with at least 1,000 points and 250 assists.

► Senior guard **Zak Showalter** made just four 3-pointers in his first two seasons, but knocked down 35 percent (37-107) from long range as a junior. Showalter averaged 7.5 ppg and 3.8 rpg while ranking third on UW with 36 steals.

► The Badgers also return key reserves **Jordan Hill** (junior guard - 15.6 mpg), **Khalil Iverson** (soph. guard - 13.0 mpg), **Alex Illikainen** (soph. forward - 9.8 mpg) and **Charles Thomas, IV** (soph. forward - 9.1 mpg). Wisconsin will also regain the services of redshirt freshman guard **Brevin Pritzl**, who missed all but one game of his freshman year with a foot injury and sophomore forward **Andy Van Vliet**, who was forced to sit out the 2015-16 season after the NCAA ruled him ineligible for not enrolling in college within a year of high school graduation.

► Wisconsin will also welcome a three-man freshman class that features guard **D'Mitrik Trice** (6-0, Huber Heights, Ohio), forward **Aleem Ford** (6-8, Lawrenceville, Ga.) and walk-on guard **Michael Ballard** (6-4, Oak Park, Ill.).

PRESEASON NOTES

- ▶ UW finished last season in a tie for third place in the 2016 Big Ten standings – extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season – with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).
- ▶ The Badgers are currently enjoying a streak of 18 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances, tied for the fifth-longest streak in tournament history. Last season, Wisconsin reached the Sweet 16, becoming the nation's only team to reach the Sweet 16 in five of the last six years.  
Gard became the first coach to take his team to the Sweet 16 in his inaugural head coaching season since Chris Mack led Xavier in 2010.
- ▶ Wisconsin is enjoying a streak of at least 20 wins for 10 consecutive seasons and have tallied at least 12 Big Ten wins in 7 straight (longest in conference).
- ▶ Including **Nigel Hayes** last season, a total of 9 different Badgers have been named first-team All-Big Ten over the last 15 years, combining for 13 first-team all-conference honors. No other Big Ten program has more during that era.
- ▶ The Badgers have recorded at least 30 wins in four of the last 10 seasons, the most of any team in the Big Ten. In fact, Ohio State (3), Michigan State (1) and Michigan (1) are the only other Big Ten schools to win 30 games in a season over that span.  
Nationally, only Kansas (7), Duke (5) and North Carolina (5) have more 30-win seasons than Wisconsin over the last 10 years.
- ▶ Wisconsin will play a minimum of 11 games vs. teams in the 2016 NCAA Tournament field, with 7 of those coming at home and 4 on the road. During the non-conference schedule, the Badgers will host 2016 Final Four participants Oklahoma and Syracuse as well as Green Bay. UW could also face national runner-up North Carolina, Elite Eight qualifier Oregon or UConn at the Maui Invitational.

2015-16 LOOK BACK

Record: 22-13, Big Ten: 12-6 (T-3rd)

- ▶ Wisconsin reached the NCAA tournament for the 18th-consecutive season in 2015-16, the 5th-longest streak in NCAA history. The Badgers have won 15 NCAA tournament games since 2011. Only Kentucky (20) has won more games in the Big Dance over that time frame.
- ▶ On Jan. 13, 2016, Wisconsin was 9-9 overall and 1-4 in the Big Ten with an RPI of 110. Since then, the Badgers won 13 of their final 17 games, climbed to 3rd place in the league, into the RPI top 40 and reached the Sweet 16 for the 5th time in the last 6 seasons.
- ▶ With wins over Maryland (2), Michigan St. (4), Iowa (8) and Xavier (9), the Badgers were 1 of 4 teams to own 4 top-10 wins last season (with Texas, Kansas and Villanova). UW and Villanova were the only teams to tally 3 of those away from home.
- ▶ With a Big Ten record of 12-6, the Badgers secured a top-4 conference finish for the 16th-consecutive season, the longest such streak in Big Ten history. Wisconsin won at least 12 Big Ten games for the 7th-consecutive season (the longest active streak in the league).
- ▶ **Ethan Happ** became the second Big Ten Freshman of the Year in UW history, joining Sam Okey (1996). Happ was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and All-Defensive team, as well as taking home third-team All-Big Ten honors.
- ▶ With **Nigel Hayes** earning first-team All-Big Ten honors, a total of nine different UW players have been named first-team All-Big Ten over the past 15 seasons, combining for 13 first-team all-conference honors. No other Big Ten program has more during that era.  
Junior **Bronson Koenig** was named to the All-Big Ten third team.
- ▶ UW also had 5 players earn 2016 Academic All-Big Ten honors: **Vitto Brown** (2x honoree), **Matt Ferris**, **Nigel Hayes** (2x honoree), **Aaron Moesch** (2x honoree) and **Zak Showalter**.
- ▶ Wisconsin led the Big Ten in scoring defense (63.8 ppg) and TO percentage (forcing more than one TO per every 5 possessions), having held a total of 10 teams to their season-low point total.
- ▶ UW led the Big Ten, averaging 20.8 FTAs per game last season. That mark ranked as the Badgers' 2nd-highest average in the last 9 years.
- ▶ No team in the nation had more freshmen than Wisconsin (8) last season and that group played 29.0% of UW's minutes. The quartet of **Ethan Happ**, **Alex Illikainen**, **Khalil Iverson** and **Charles Thomas, IV** averaged 19.5 ppg and 13.3 rpg.

- ▶ Since the 2001-02 season, the Badgers have compiled a 223-27 (.892) record at the Kohl Center, the fourth-highest mark in the nation.
- ▶ Over the last 15 seasons, UW is 113-16 (.876) in Big Ten home games, the best mark in the conference.
- ▶ Four of the 8 longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened in the last 15 years, including the school-record 38-game winning streak from 2002 to 2005.
- ▶ Over the last 15 seasons, 164 of the Badgers' 223 home wins have come by at least 10 points (73.5 percent).

## HEAD COACH GREG GARD

Long considered one of the best assistant coaches in all of college basketball, Greg Gard was named head coach at the University of Wisconsin on March 7, 2016. A coaching veteran of more than 20 years, Gard is in his 15th season on the Badgers basketball staff, having served as the team's associate head coach since July of 2008.

"It's an honor and a privilege to be named the head coach at the University of Wisconsin," Gard said. "I'm extremely thankful for this incredible opportunity to lead my home-state program into the future. It's a role and a responsibility that I cherish and take extremely seriously.

"I'm looking forward to building on the great tradition at Wisconsin and representing my home state in a manner that can make Badger fans proud."

In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award.

Gard, 45, took over as the Badgers' interim head coach following the retirement of longtime head coach Bo Ryan on Dec. 15. A week later, having begun installation of the Swing offense that had brought UW much success in the past, Gard led the Badgers to an 84-79 win over Green Bay in his head coaching debut.

The transition to Gard's leadership began with a 1-4 start to the Big Ten Conference season, leaving UW at 9-9 overall, but it didn't take long for the Badgers to adjust. Wisconsin proceeded on a run that saw them become one of the nation's hottest teams down the stretch of the regular season, winning 11 of their final 13 games.

A 77-76 victory over fourth-ranked Michigan State at the Kohl Center on Jan. 17 was the beginning of a seven-game win streak that also featured a home win over No. 19 Indiana and an impressive road triumph at No. 2 Maryland. The Badgers later added another road win over No. 8 Iowa on Feb. 24.

Over the season's final seven weeks, Wisconsin lost just twice — on the road at the hands of No. 8 Michigan State and No. 15 Purdue.

"It became clear to me as the season wore on and I was able to observe Greg both on and off the court that he was the right person to lead our men's basketball team," UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez said. "I was extremely excited to be able to offer him the job and fully believe that the program is in good hands for years to come."

UW finished the regular season in a tie for third place in the Big Ten standings — extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season — with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most



Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).

In 15 total seasons on the Badgers' bench, Gard has never seen the Badgers finish lower than fourth while amassing a mark of 184-74 (.713) in Big Ten play.

As associate head coach, Gard served as the Badgers' recruiting coordinator in addition to on-floor coaching duties, opponent scouting and game preparation, and the constructing of future game schedules. He was also the director of the Badger Boys Basketball Summer Camps.

In November of 2015, Gard was ranked as the fourth-best "X&O" assistant coach in college basketball by coachstat.net. The rankings were made upon receipt of votes from a panel of national college basketball media, scouts and coaches.

In 2012, Gard was named No. 3 on the list of top assistant coaches in college basketball according to Bleacher Report. Fox Sports also listed Gard No. 10 on its list of the nation's top 25 assistant coaches.

Gard's 13th and 14th seasons in Madison were some of the program's most memorable. He helped guide the Badgers to back-to-back Final Four appearances in 2014 and 2015, and in 2015 UW reached its first national championship game since 1941. Wisconsin shattered the school's single-season wins record (36) in 2015 and became one of just 10 teams with at least 36 wins in Division I history. In 2014, UW finished 30-8 and won at least 30 games for just the third time in school history.

In fact, Gard has been on the bench for each of the top 11 winningest seasons at Wisconsin.

Gard helped pilot the Badgers to four Big Ten regular season titles and three Big Ten tournament championships, most recently winning both crowns in 2015. UW has made the NCAA tournament in each of Gard's first 14 seasons, advancing to seven Sweet 16s three Elite Eights and two Final Fours.

Gard came to the Badgers after spending the previous two seasons as Ryan's assistant at UW-Milwaukee, where he had responsibilities in scouting, summer basketball camp operations and on-floor coaching, as well as involvement with recruiting.

Previously, Gard served as an assistant coach to Ryan at UW-Platteville from 1993-99. During Gard's years on the Pioneer staff, UW-Platteville compiled a 161-13 (.925) record and won three NCAA Division III titles, five straight Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) championships and appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments.
