## UW HOSTS CHICAGO STATE BEFORE TRIP TO MAUI

- No. 9 Wisconsin plays its second game in 48 hours by hosting Chicago State on Nov. 17. The game tips at 7:01 p.m. (CT) on ESPN3.
- Up next, the Badgers will travel to the Maui Jim Maui Invitational for three games, beginning with Tennessee on Nov. 21 on ESPN2.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT WISCONSIN

- **HAPPY NEW YEAR:** Wisconsin begins its 118th season of men's basketball in 2016-17 and the first full season under Greg Gard, who took over for the final 23 games of the 2015-16 season.
- **QUITE A DEBUT:** In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led Wisconsin to wins in 11 of the final 13 regular-season games and a trip to the 2016 Sweet 16, winning the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.
- **GANG'S ALL HERE:** Wisconsin returns each of the top 9 scorers from last season. In fact, the Badgers bring back all but 20 minutes played (99.8%) and all but 6 points (99.7%) from a year ago. UW returns all 5 starters for the first time since the 1988-89 season.
- **TERRIFIC TRIO:** Senior Nigel Hayes was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year as well as a consensus member of the Preseason All-Big Ten Team. Fellow senior Bronson Koenig and sophomore Ethan Happ were also selected for the Preseason All-Big Ten team.
- **POLL POSITION:** Wisconsin opened the year ranked No. 9 in the preseason AP Top 25, the second-highest debut in program history (UW was ranked third in the 2014-15 preseason poll).
- **PRO OR (NON)CON:** The Badgers have won 37 of their last 44 (.841) regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012. Of those 7 losses, 5 came last season.
- **BENCHMARKS:** Nigel Hayes already ranks 15th in school history with 1,370 career points, while fellow senior Bronson Koenig needs just 26 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau.
- **WRECKING THE RANKED:** Even with UW's 79-67 setback at No. 22 Creighton on Tuesday, UW is 20-11 against teams ranked in the AP Top 25 over the last 3 seasons. Under Greg Gard, the Badgers are 6-6 in such games, with a quartet of top-10 wins.
- **KOENIG COMES OUT FIRING:** Bronson Koenig appears to be making his final year count. The senior has led UW in scoring in both games this season, averaging 18.5 ppg.
- **WINS RECORD:** The Badgers' senior class has been a part of 89 wins already in their UW career, averaging 29.3 wins per season. The winningest class graduated in 2015 with a total of 115 victories.



**Preseason All-Big Ten selection Bronson Koenig is averaging a team-high 18.5 ppg and is just 26 points from reaching 1,000 for his career.**

**ALL-TIME VS. CHICAGO STATE**

Thursday's game will mark the 2nd-ever meeting between Wisconsin and Chicago State. In the only other meeting, the Badgers rolled to a 73-45 win on Jan. 4, 2003. In that contest, Devin Harris led UW with 19 points.

**NON-CON, NO-CONTEST**

▶ UW has won 37 of its last 44 (.841) regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012.

▶ Since 2001-02, UW is 152-37 (.804) in non-conference games, including a mark of 111-11 (.910) at the Kohl Center.

▶ Over the last 15 seasons, the Badgers have gone 21-19 (.525) in non-conference road games. That includes wins in 6 of last 8 true road games.

▶ Since 2003-04, Wisconsin is 93-5 (.949) vs. unranked non-con opponents, with 3 such setbacks last season.

▶ Last season, Wisconsin dropped 5 non-conference games for just the 2nd time since 1997-98 and the first time since starting the 2001-02 season with a record of 7-6 in Bo Ryan's first season in Madison.

**NOTES FROM UW'S LAST GAME**

**#22 Creighton 79, #9 UW 67 | Nov. 15 | Omaha, Neb.**

▶ The game featured 8 lead changes and 5 ties before No. 22 Creighton pulled out the 79-67 win over No. 9 Wisconsin at the sold out CenturyLink Center in Omaha, Neb. on Tuesday.

▶ With the game tied 50-50 with 9:09 remaining, the Blue Jays ripped off a 13-2 run to seize control. UW would pull within 5 with 1:36 left, but would get no closer.

▶ Senior **Bronson Koenig** led all scorers with 21 points, his 5th-career game with 20+ points. Fellow senior **Nigel Hayes** tallied 16 points and 5 assists, while sophomore **Ethan Happ** posted 7 points and 10 rebounds.

▶ UW went 11-for-39 (28.2%) from 3-point range, attempting the 2nd-most triples in the school's single-game history.

▶ Wisconsin out-rebounded Creighton, 42-28 and 16 to 6 on the offensive glass. However, the Blue Jays shot 50.0% (28-56 FGs) both overall and from 3-point range (8-16 3FGs).

▶ The Badgers turned the ball over 16 times, leading to 26 CU points off turnovers and a 13-0 margin in fast break points. UW's 16 TOs were the team's highest regular-season total since giving it up 16 times in a 82-79 overtime win over Indiana on Jan. 26, 2016.

**POLL POSITION**

▶ Wisconsin opened the season and remains ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press Top 25, the second-highest ranking in school history (UW was No. 3 prior to the 2014-15 season).

▶ UW has been ranked in the AP preseason poll for 6 years in a row and 8 of the last 11 seasons.

▶ Wisconsin has made a habit of out-producing its preseason ranking. In 6 of the past 7 seasons, Wisconsin has finished the season equal or higher than its preseason ranking.

## RETURNING FRONTCOURT STARTERS

► The Badgers welcome back 2016 first-team All-Big Ten selection **Nigel Hayes**, who averaged 15.7 ppg and 5.8 rpg while leading UW with 104 assists. The 2016-17 *Blue Ribbon Magazine* preseason National Player of the Year and preseason Big Ten Player of the Year, Hayes joins Michael Finley as the only Badgers to tally at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 200 assists by their junior season. If he just matches his junior year totals he would finish 3rd in school history in points (currently 1,340), 7th in rebounds (currently 557) and 7th in career assists (currently 219).

► Sophomore **Ethan Happ** looks to build off his 2016 Big Ten Freshman of the Year campaign during which he averaged 12.4 ppg, ranked 6th in the Big Ten with 7.9 rpg and became the first freshman to lead the Big Ten in steals (63 steals) since OSU's Aaron Craft (2010). Happ became just the third NCAA freshman over the last 15 seasons to score 400 points, while recording 60 steals and 30 blocks (also Kevin Durant and DuJuan Blair).

► Senior **Vitto Brown** finished 4th on the team in scoring, averaging 9.7 ppg with 5.0 rpg. He enjoyed the third-largest scoring increase in the Big Ten a year ago, going from 1.8 ppg to 9.7 ppg in 2015-16. Brown did not attempt a 3-pointer in his first two seasons at UW, but led the team last year, shooting 40% (38-95) from deep.

## RETURNING BACKCOURT STARTERS

► Third-team All-Big Ten junior **Bronson Koenig** returns as the team's lead guard after averaging 13.1 ppg and shooting 39.0% (83-213) from 3-point range. The moniker "Klutch Koenig" was born in 2015-16 after his game-winning shots against VCU and Xavier. In fact, over the final 5:00 and overtime of games last season, Koenig shot 54.8% (17-for-31) from 3-point range. Koenig enters the season needing just 71 points and 27 assists to become the 14th player in UW history with at least 1,000 points and 250 assists.

► Senior guard **Zak Showalter** made just four 3-pointers in his first two seasons, but knocked down 35 percent (37-107) from long range as a junior. Showalter averaged 7.5 ppg and 3.8 rpg while ranking third on UW with 36 steals.

► The Badgers also return key reserves **Jordan Hill** (junior guard - 15.6 mpg), **Khalil Iverson** (soph. guard - 13.0 mpg), **Alex Illikainen** (soph. forward - 9.8 mpg) and **Charles Thomas, IV** (soph. forward - 9.1 mpg). Wisconsin will also regain the services of redshirt freshman guard **Brevin Pritzl**, who missed all but one game of his freshman year with a foot injury and sophomore forward **Andy Van Vliet**, who was forced to sit out the 2015-16 season after the NCAA ruled him ineligible for not enrolling in college within a year of high school graduation.

► Wisconsin also welcome a three-man freshman class that features guard **D'Mitrik Trice** (6-0, Huber Heights, Ohio) as well as forward **Aleem Ford** (6-8, Lawrenceville, Ga.) and walk-on guard **Michael Ballard** (6-4, Oak Park, Ill.) who have both chosen to redshirt the 2016-17 season.

## WRECKING THE RANKED

Even with a 79-67 loss at No. 22 Creighton on Tuesday, the Badgers have been very good against teams in the AP Top 25 recently.

► The Badgers were 6-5 against ranked opponents last season and are 20-11 against the AP Top 25 over the last 4 seasons.

► Under Greg Gard, UW is now 5-5 against ranked teams including wins over No. 4 Michigan State, at No. 2 Maryland, at No. 8 Iowa and vs. No. 8 Xavier in the NCAA tournament.

## KINGS OF THE ROAD

UW is renowned for its incredible home success, but it has been almost as good on the road lately.

► Wisconsin is 46-17 (.730) away from home over the last 4 seasons. Last season, the Badgers went 9-8 away from the Kohl Center, going 6-5 in true road games and 3-3 in neutral settings.

► In 2015-16, Wisconsin posted 3 road wins over ranked opponents for the first time in school history. UW and Kansas (3) were the nation's only schools with at least 3 ranked road wins.

Last season also marked the first time the Badgers had multiple top-10 road wins since 1955.

► Among major conference teams, UW ranks 3rd in both wins and win percentage away from home over the last 4 seasons.

## WHAT'S TRENDING

► Wisconsin went 18-for-23 at the free throw line in the opener vs. Central Arkansas, but just 4-for-5 at Creighton. Last season the Badgers led the Big Ten with 20.8 FTAs per game. **Nigel Hayes** led the Big Ten in FTAs (258) and was second in made FTs (190).

► The Badgers have out-rebounded both of their first two opponents by an average of 43.5 to 28.0, including a 31 to 19 edge on the offensive glass.

► The Badgers held Central Arkansas to just 47 points. Last season UW led the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing 63.8 ppg. Wisconsin held 10 opponents to season-low point totals.

Wisconsin has led the conference in scoring defense in 10 of the last 14 seasons.

► UW is 1-0 this season when leading or tied with 5:00 remaining continuing a Mariano Rivera-like string of closing games. Dating back to February of 2011, UW is 139-5 (.965) when leading or tied with 5:00 left, including a mark of 21-1 last season.

## PRESEASON NOTES

► UW finished last season in a tie for third place in the 2016 Big Ten standings — extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season — with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).

► The Badgers are currently enjoying a streak of 18 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances, tied for the fifth-longest streak in tournament history. Last season, Wisconsin reached the Sweet 16, becoming the nation's only team to reach the Sweet 16 in five of the last six years.

Gard became the first coach to take his team to the Sweet 16 in his inaugural head coaching season since Chris Mack led Xavier in 2010.

► Wisconsin is enjoying a streak of at least 20 wins for 10 consecutive seasons and has tallied at least 12 Big Ten wins in 7 straight (longest in conference).

► Including **Nigel Hayes** last season, a total of 9 different Badgers have been named first-team All-Big Ten over the last 15 years, combining for 13 first-team all-conference honors. No other Big Ten program has more during that era.

► The Badgers have recorded at least 30 wins in four of the last 10 seasons, the most of any team in the Big Ten. In fact, Ohio State (3), Michigan State (1) and Michigan (1) are the only other Big Ten schools to win 30 games in a season over that span.

Nationally, only Kansas (7), Duke (5) and North Carolina (5) have more 30-win seasons than Wisconsin over the last 10 years.

► Wisconsin will play a minimum of 11 games vs. teams in the 2016 NCAA Tournament field, with 7 of those coming at home and 4 on the road. During the non-conference schedule, the Badgers will host 2016 Final Four participants Oklahoma and Syracuse, as well as Green Bay. UW could also face national runner-up North Carolina, Elite Eight qualifier Oregon or UConn at the Maui Invitational.

## KLUTCH KOENIG

A preseason All-Big Ten pick, senior **Bronson Koenig** earned the nickname "Klutch Koenig" a year ago with his late-game heroics and has been a steady force in the Wisconsin backcourt his entire career.

► Koenig has led UW in scoring in each of the first 2 games, averaging 18.5 ppg. He scored a game-high 21 points at Creighton, his 5th-career game with 20+ points.

► The La Crosse, Wis., native is now just 26 points away from becoming Wisconsin's 43rd member of the 1,000-point club.

► Koenig hit the game-winning 3-pointer to beat Xavier and advance to the Sweet 16 of the 2016 NCAA Tournament (3/20/16). He also made the game-winning shot on a spinning, left-handed lay-in with 5.9 seconds remaining in UW's 74-73 win over VCU (11/22/16) at Madison Square Garden.

► An the final 5:00 (and overtime) of games last season, Koenig shot 54.8% (17-31) from 3-point range.

► Koenig went 83-for-213 from 3-point range last season, tallying the second-most triples in school history. For his career, Koenig's 174 3-pointers are good for 10th in UW annals. Ben Brust holds the school record with 235 treys.

► Last season, Koenig set a Wisconsin record by hitting at least one 3-pointer in 43 straight games. It was snapped with an 0-for-2 effort vs. Pitt in the 2016 NCAA Tournament.

## HAYES MAKES PLAYS

The preseason Big Ten Player of the Year, **Nigel Hayes** returned for his senior season after testing the NBA Draft waters and is poised to leave a legacy as one of the best players in Wisconsin history.

► With 1,370 career points, Hayes passed Sam Dekker (1,363) to move into 15th place on Wisconsin's all-time scoring list. He is 7 points away from passing Jon Leuer (2008-11) for 14th place in UW annals.

► Hayes also owns 565 career rebounds and 229 career assists, becoming just the 4th player in UW history to accumulate 1,300 points, 500 rebounds and 200 assists.

For his career, Hayes ranks 4th in school history for made FTs (414) and 3rd in FTAs (594).

Hayes also equaled UW's single-game record with 17 made FTs when he went 17-for-22 against Indiana (1/26/16).

► Among the Big Ten, Hayes leads all active players in career points and rebounds, while ranking 7th in assists, 2nd in steals and 8th in blocks.

► A 2016 First-Team All-Big Ten selection, Hayes was one of just 3 players in the Big Ten to average 15.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 3.0 apg, joining Denzel Valentine (MSU) and Malcolm Hill (ILL).

### ETHAN HAPP 2.0

Coming off a breakout freshman campaign, preseason All-Big Ten pick **Ethan Happ** has his sights set on even bigger things in 2016-17.

► Through 2 games, Happ is filling the box score averaging 7.5 ppg, 9.5 rpg, 3.5 apg, 2.0 spg and 0.5 blg in 24.0 minutes per game.

► At Creighton, Happ produced his 12th-career double-digit rebound game, finishing with a game-high 10 boards.

► Happ was named consensus 2016 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. He is Wisconsin's first FOY winner since Sam Okey in 1996. Happ was also named to the Big Ten's All-Defensive Team and third-team All-Conference.

► An all-around talent, Happ was the only player in the Big Ten to average at least 11.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 1.0 apg, 1.0 spg and 0.5 bpg.

► Over the last 15 years, Happ is just the 3rd NCAA freshman to score 400 points, have 60 steals and 30 blocks, joining Texas' Kevin Durant and Pitt's DuJuan Blair.

► The Milan ("MY-lin"), Ill. native ranked 4th in the Big Ten with 9 double-doubles last season.

► A 2016 Big Ten All-Defensive Team selection, Happ led the Big Ten averaging 1.8 steals per game, and raised that during conference play averaging a league-best 2.4 per game in Big Ten affairs. He was the first freshman to lead the conference in steals since Ohio State's Aaron Craft did it in 2011.

## 2015-16 LOOK BACK

**Record: 22-13, Big Ten: 12-6 (T-3rd)**

► Wisconsin reached the NCAA tournament for the 18th-consecutive season in 2015-16, the 5th-longest streak in NCAA history. The Badgers have won 15 NCAA tournament games since 2011. Only Kentucky (20) has won more games in the Big Dance over that time frame.

► On Jan. 13, 2016, Wisconsin was 9-9 overall and 1-4 in the Big Ten with an RPI of 110. Since then, the Badgers won 13 of their final 17 games, climbed to 3rd place in the league, into the RPI top 40 and reached the Sweet 16 for the 5th time in the last 6 seasons.

► With wins over Maryland (2), Michigan St. (4), Iowa (8) and Xavier (9), the Badgers were 1 of 4 teams to own 4 top-10 wins last season (with Texas, Kansas and Villanova). UW and Villanova were the only teams to tally 3 of those away from home.

► With a Big Ten record of 12-6, the Badgers secured a top-4 conference finish for the 16th-consecutive season, the longest such streak in Big Ten history. Wisconsin won at least 12 Big Ten games for the 7th-consecutive season (the longest active streak in the league).

► **Ethan Happ** became the second Big Ten Freshman of the Year in UW history, joining Sam Okey (1996). Happ was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and All-Defensive team, as well as taking home third-team All-Big Ten honors.

► With **Nigel Hayes** earning first-team All-Big Ten honors, a total of nine different UW players have been named first-team All-Big Ten over the past 15 seasons, combining for 13 first-team all-conference honors. No other Big Ten program has more during that era.

Junior **Bronson Koenig** was named to the All-Big Ten third team.

► UW also had 5 players earn 2016 Academic All-Big Ten honors: **Vitto Brown** (2x honoree), **Matt Ferris**, **Nigel Hayes** (2x honoree), **Aaron Moesch** (2x honoree) and **Zak Showalter**.

► Wisconsin led the Big Ten in scoring defense (63.8 ppg) and TO percentage (forcing more than one TO per every 5 possessions), having held a total of 10 teams to their season-low point total.

► UW led the Big Ten, averaging 20.8 FTAs per game last season. That mark ranked as the Badgers' 2nd-highest average in the last 9 years.

► No team in the nation had more freshmen than Wisconsin (8) last season and that group played 29.0% of UW's minutes. The quartet of **Ethan Happ**, **Alex Illikainen**, **Khalil Iverson** and **Charles Thomas, IV** averaged 19.5 ppg and 13.3 rpg.

► The Badgers won a school-record 36 games in 2014-15, reaching 30 wins for the 4th time in school history. All 4 have come in the last 10 years. Each of the top 11 spots in the UW record book for single-season wins have come in the last 15 years.

## BIG TEN, BIG RESULTS

► Since 2002, UW has won 7 Big Ten championships (4 regular season and 3 tourn.). Only OSU (10; 5 regular season, 5 tourn.) has won more titles during Ryan's tenure. MSU has 6 and ILL has 5, but no other school has more than 3 over that span.

► Bo Ryan's teams posted a 172-68 (.717) Big Ten record, the best mark in the conference over his 14 seasons. Michigan St. was second at 161-79 (.671) and Ohio St. was third at 156-84 (.650).

► Last season, Wisconsin finished 3rd in the Big Ten with a record of 12-6. The Badgers have notched double-digit conference wins in 14 of the last 15 years and have never finished lower than 4th place in the Big Ten standings over that span.

► UW has posted a winning conference record in each of the last 15 seasons. Among the 6 major conferences, only Kansas (23 seasons) has a longer active streak of finishing above .500 in league play.

## ALL WE DO IS WIN, WIN, WIN

During the Bo Ryan/Greg Gard era, Wisconsin has accumulated an overall record of 379-138 (.733) heading into 2016-17. That win total and percentage put the Badgers in pretty exclusive company.

Wisconsin's .733 win percentage ranks 9th among all NCAA Div. I teams in that span.

## NCAA TOURNEY REGULARS

► UW has made 18 consecutive NCAA tourneys - the 5th-longest streak in NCAA history.

► UW has reached the Sweet 16 or better in 4 of the last 5 years. No team in the nation has gone more frequently over that span.

► Since 2002, Wisconsin has won 27 NCAA tournament games. Among Big Ten teams, only MSU (28) has won more NCAA tourney games than UW since 2001-02.

► Wisconsin advanced to the Final Four in both 2014 and 2015, becoming one of 8 Big Ten teams to reach back-to-back Final Fours. The Badgers have advanced to the Final Four a total of 4 times, winning the national championship in 1941 and reaching the national semifinals in 2000.

## BADGERS' ATTENDANCE IS BIG

► In 2015-16, the Badgers ranked 2nd in the Big Ten and finished 6th nationally by averaging a sellout capacity of 17,287 per game.

► Wisconsin has led the Big Ten in attendance in 10 of the last 14 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 16 years.

► Including the 2015-16 home finale vs. Michigan, the Badgers are currently enjoying a streak of 40 consecutive sellouts dating back to Jan. of 2014.

► Since the 2001-02 season when Greg Gard first joined the staff, the Badgers have compiled a 224-27 (.892) record at the Kohl Center, the 4th-highest mark in the nation.

► Over the last 15 seasons, UW is 113-16 (.876) in Big Ten home games, the best mark in the conference.

► Four of the 8 longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened in the last 15 years, including the school-record 38-game winning streak from 2002 to 2005.

► Over the last 15 seasons, 165 of the Badgers' 224 home wins have come by at least 10 points (73.7 percent).

► Wisconsin has trailed at halftime in only 46 of 251 home games since the 2001-02 season. UW has come back to win 29 of those 46 games.

► In 2015-16, the Badgers ranked 2nd in the Big Ten and 7th nationally in attendance, selling out every game (17,287 per game). UW has led the Big Ten in attendance in 10 of the last 14 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 16 years.

► This season, the Badgers sold out the 2,100-person Grateful Red (third-largest student section in the Big Ten) in exactly 3 minutes.

► Including the 2016-17 season opener vs. Central Arkansas, the Badgers are currently enjoying a streak of 41 consecutive sellouts dating back to Jan. of 2014.

► UW had a streak of 143 consecutive sellouts at the Kohl Center snapped in 2011 (vs. Green Bay). Wisconsin sold out every game from 2003 until midway through the 2011-12 season.

## HEAD COACH GREG GARD

Long considered one of the best assistant coaches in all of college basketball, Greg Gard was named head coach at the University of Wisconsin on March 7, 2016. A coaching veteran of more than 20 years, Gard is in his 15th season on the Badgers basketball staff, having served as the team's associate head coach since July of 2008.

"It's an honor and a privilege to be named the head coach at the University of Wisconsin," Gard said. "I'm extremely thankful for this incredible opportunity to lead my home-state program into the future. It's a role and a responsibility that I cherish and take extremely seriously."

"I'm looking forward to building on the great tradition at Wisconsin and representing my home state in a manner that can make Badger fans proud."

In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award.

Gard, 45, took over as the Badgers' interim head coach following the retirement of longtime head coach Bo Ryan on Dec. 15. A week later, having begun installation of the Swing offense that had brought UW much success in the past, Gard led the Badgers to an 84-79 win over Green Bay in his head coaching debut.

The transition to Gard's leadership began with a 1-4 start to the Big Ten Conference season, leaving UW at 9-9 overall, but it didn't take long for the Badgers to adjust. Wisconsin proceeded on a run that saw them become one of the nation's hottest teams down the stretch of the regular season, winning 11 of their final 13 games.

A 77-76 victory over fourth-ranked Michigan State at the Kohl Center on Jan. 17 was the beginning of a seven-game win streak that also featured a home win over No. 19 Indiana and an impressive road triumph at No. 2 Maryland. The Badgers later added another road win over No. 8 Iowa on Feb. 24.

Over the season's final seven weeks, Wisconsin lost just twice — on the road at the hands of No. 8 Michigan State and No. 15 Purdue.

"It became clear to me as the season wore on and I was able to observe Greg both on and off the court that he was the right person to lead our men's basketball team," UW Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez said. "I was extremely excited to be able to offer him the job and fully believe that the program is in good hands for years to come."

UW finished the regular season in a tie for third place in the Big Ten standings — extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season — with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).



In 15 total seasons on the Badgers' bench, Gard has never seen the Badgers finish lower than fourth while amassing a mark of 184-74 (.713) in Big Ten play.

As associate head coach, Gard served as the Badgers' recruiting coordinator in addition to on-floor coaching duties, opponent scouting and game preparation, and the constructing of future game schedules. He was also the director of the Badger Boys Basketball Summer Camps.

In November of 2015, Gard was ranked as the fourth-best "X&O" assistant coach in college basketball by coachstat.net. The rankings were made upon receipt of votes from a panel of national college basketball media, scouts and coaches.

In 2012, Gard was named No. 3 on the list of top assistant coaches in college basketball according to Bleacher Report. Fox Sports also listed Gard No. 10 on its list of the nation's top 25 assistant coaches.

Gard's 13th and 14th seasons in Madison were some of the program's most memorable. He helped guide the Badgers to back-to-back Final Four appearances in 2014 and 2015, and in 2015 UW reached its first national championship game since 1941. Wisconsin shattered the school's single-season wins record (36) in 2015 and became one of just 10 teams with at least 36 wins in Division I history. In 2014, UW finished 30-8 and won at least 30 games for just the third time in school history.

In fact, Gard has been on the bench for each of the top 11 winningest seasons at Wisconsin.

Gard helped pilot the Badgers to four Big Ten regular season titles and three Big Ten tournament championships, most recently winning both crowns in 2015. UW has made the NCAA tournament in each of Gard's first 14 seasons, advancing to seven Sweet 16s three Elite Eights and two Final Fours.

Gard came to the Badgers after spending

the previous two seasons as Ryan's assistant at UW-Milwaukee, where he had responsibilities in scouting, summer basketball camp operations and on-floor coaching, as well as involvement with recruiting.

Previously, Gard served as an assistant coach to Ryan at UW-Platteville from 1993-99. During Gard's years on the Pioneer staff, UW-Platteville compiled a 161-13 (.925) record and won three NCAA Division III titles, five straight Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) championships and appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments. In his final year at UW-Platteville, Gard served as Ryan's top assistant in charge of recruiting, camp operations and scouting. He also worked as an advisor in the university's admissions office.

Prior to joining Ryan's staff in Platteville, Gard spent three seasons at Southwestern High School and one at Platteville High School, where he served in junior high and assistant varsity coaching capacities.

Gard is a 1995 graduate of UW-Platteville with a degree in physical and health education. He received a master's degree in counselor education from Platteville in 2007. Gard and his wife, Michelle, have two daughters Mackenzie and Peyton and a son, Isaac.
