## TEAM NOTES

### ABOUT WISCONSIN

- Wisconsin, ranked No. 9 and No. 11 in the AP and coaches polls\*, respectively, is off to a 21-1 start this season with a win over Central Arkansas and a loss at No. 22 Creighton. The Badgers host Chicago State on Thursday before departing for Maui.
- \*Polls will be updated Monday before tipoff
- Wisconsin made a run to the Sweet Sixteen last season under the direction of first-year head coach **Greg Gard**. The Badgers finished 22-13 (12-6 BIG).
- The Badgers received a huge boost in late May when last year's leading scorer **Nigel Hayes** (15.7 ppg, 5.8 rpg) announced that he was returning for this, his senior year. He is the Big Ten preseason POY.
- The All-Big Ten Freshman of the Year and Big Ten All-Defensive Team selection **Ethan Happ** (12.4 ppg, 7.9 rpg). Also back for the Badgers are starting guard **Zak Showalter** (7.5 ppg, .346 3FG) and starting forward **Vitto Brown** (9.7 ppg, 5.0 rpg, .400 3FG).
- The Vols and Badgers have met just three times previously, with UT owning a 2-1 edge and a win in the series' only neutral-site clash (a 79-67 victory in the 1981 Far West Classic in Portland, Oregon).
- Tennessee is 22-33 all-time against current members of the Big Ten Conference. The Vols' last triumph over a Big Ten foe was a come-from-behind win over Iowa in the "First Four" of the 2014 NCAA Tournament.
- Vols head coach **Rick Barnes** owns a .500 career record against Big Ten teams (28-28) and is 1-3 against Wisconsin.

## FAST BREAK

Three members of Tennessee's 2014 Sweet Sixteen team are on NBA rosters: **Jordan McRae** (Cavs), **Josh Richardson** (Heat) and **Jarnell Stokes** (Nuggets).

### SCHOFIELD'S BROTHER WAS FOOTBALL STANDOUT FOR BADGERS

- Tennessee sophomore forward **Admiral Schofield** is the younger brother of former Wisconsin and NFL defensive standout **O'Brien Schofield**.
- O'Brien Schofield played college football at Wisconsin and then played seven years as a defensive end in the NFL. He was drafted by Arizona in 2010 and most recently played for Atlanta last season. He also was a member of Seattle's 2014 Super Bowl XLVII championship team.
- As a senior at Wisconsin in 2009, O'Brien Schofield was a midseason semifinalist for the Bednarik Award, and he was selected by Scout.com as a second-team All-American. He finished his college career with 17 sacks and 33 tackles for loss.
- Admiral Schofield also has another connection to the Badgers, as he is a longtime opponent of Wisconsin redshirt freshman **Brevin Pritzl**. The two played against one another in AAU basketball from eighth grade through high school.

### LAST MEETING WITH WISCONSIN

- Tennessee had a chance to send the game against the Badgers into overtime if **Thaydeus Holden's** 3-pointer would have fallen. But his last-second attempt rimmed out, and the Vols fell, 65-62, at Wisconsin's Kohl Center on Dec. 29, 2001.
- UT trailed 61-53 with 4:15 to play but rallied to have two chances to tie the score.
- Vols guard **Jon Higgins** drove into the lane and sank a short jumper with 32 seconds to play to pull the Vols to within two, 64-62.
- Wisconsin threw the ball long over the Vols' press on the inbounds play, and UW's **Freddie Owens** appeared to have a clear path to the basket. But **Marcus Haislip** was there to block Owens' shot, and **Vincent Yarbrough** recovered the rebound with 23 seconds to play. UT ultimately couldn't capitalize.
- The game got away from the Vols at the free-throw line. The Badgers went to the line 26 times and made 22 of them. Tennessee was 6-of-12 at the line.
- Haislip and fellow forward **Ron Slay** led the Vols with 13 points apiece. Haislip added four blocks.
- **Kirk Penney** (16 points) and **Mike Wilkinson** (15 points) led the way for Wisconsin.

### VOLS, BADGERS AMONG FEW PROGRAMS WITH FEMALE DOBOS

- Tennessee and Wisconsin are two of only three schools in "power five" conferences (or the Big East) to employ a female director of operations in its men's basketball program.
- **Mary-Carter Kniffen** is in her second season as DOBO for the Vols, while **Kat Vosters** is in her third year in the same role at Wisconsin.
- Washington is the other "power five" program with a female director of basketball ops (**Tiffani Lambie**).

### MADISON NATIVE BIG FOR VOLS IN MAUI

- The last time Tennessee played in Maui, a Vol from Madison, Wisconsin, made national headlines.
- In UT's double-overtime loss to No. 8 Memphis in on Nov. 22, 2011, Vols sophomore forward **Jeronne Maymon** (pronounced: juhr-ON) exploded for 32 points and a tournament-record 20 rebounds; it was just the sixth 30-20 game in UT history.
- Maymon is UT's only all-time letterman from the state of Wisconsin.

### HOW THE VOLS GOT HERE

- Tennessee departed for Maui Thursday morning—in four groups, the first of which lifted off at 5:50 a.m. ET—and convened at The Maui Westin between 6-11 p.m. HT Thursday night (approximate total travel time for the group was approximately 17 hours).
- Group 1: Knoxville - Atlanta - Seattle - Maui
- Group 2: Knoxville - Chicago - Phoenix - Maui
- Group 3: Knoxville - Chicago - Los Angeles - Maui  
All players were in Group 3
- Group 4: Knoxville - Atlanta - Maui

### MILEAGE TO MAUI

- The aerial distance between Tennessee's Thompson-Boling Arena and the Lahaina Civic Center is 4,442.83 miles. Not many folks make that drive.

### "QUOTABLE"

#### #0 Lamonté Turner

"Kyle stayed here all summer with me and worked and got a lot stronger. He added probably 15 pounds. So with him scoring, I'm not surprised, because he's worked so hard at it, and I feel like he deserves it. We need that on this team."

### MAUI NO KA OI

- We'll save you the trouble of Googling that. It means "Maui is the best," in the Polynesian language of 'Ōlelo.
- Tennessee joins Chaminade (host school), UConn, Georgetown, North Carolina, Oklahoma State, Oregon and Wisconsin in the 2016 Maui Jim Maui Invitational field.
- This is UT's third all-time appearance at the Maui Invitational. Tennessee owns a 2-4 record in Maui, with wins over Stanford (2004) and Chaminade (2011). The Vols claimed fourth place in 2004 and seventh place in 2011.
- **Rick Barnes** is making history as the first head coach ever to take three different schools to the tournament, as his Providence (1991) and Texas (2004, 2008, 2012) teams also played in Maui.
- Barnes' teams are 6-6 in this tournament.
- Barnes' 2004 Longhorns squad handed Tennessee a 95-70 loss in that year's third-place game. He also led Texas to a third-place finish in 2008.

### VOLS JUNIOR MOSTELLA HAS HOOPED IN HAWAII BEFORE

- Vols junior **Detrick Mostella** is making his second trip to Hawaii this week. He previously traveled to Honolulu with La Lumiere School (La Porte, Indiana) to compete in the 2012 'Iolani Prep Classic Championship. La Lumiere lost in the title game to Findlay Prep, but Mostella was selected as the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.
- Mostella also won the event's dunk contest. Check out the highlight's [HERE](#).
- Mostella initially signed with Maui participant Oklahoma State and then-head coach **Travis Ford** in November 2012 prior to his senior season of high school. He was later granted a release from that Oklahoma State NLI, and he spent the 2013-14 academic year at Notre Dame Preparatory School in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, before signing with the Vols on May 8, 2014.

### FOUR VOLS HAVE BEEN TO HAWAII

- In addition to **Detrick Mostella** (see previous note), three other Vols have previously been to Hawaii.
- Freshman walk-on **Jacob Fleschman** accompanied the Texas Longhorns to the Maui Invitational in 2012, when he was a freshman in high school. His family has close ties to Vols head coach **Rick Barnes**.
- Graduate transfer **Lew Evans** hails from Utah, and he has been to Hawaii on a family vacation when he was younger.
- Freshman forward **Grant Williams** also traveled to Hawaii during a family vacation, visiting Maui with his parents.

## PARKER STILL DAY-TO-DAY

- Freshman point guard **Kwe Parker** has yet to make his official Tennessee debut, as the true freshman point guard has been held out of UT's first two games due to soreness in his left ankle.
- The ankle began giving Parker trouble on Nov. 10, the day before UT's season-opener.
- The defensive-minded Parker played 12 minutes off the bench in UT's exhibition win vs. Division II Slippery Rock, logging two points, two rebounds, four assists (one turnover) and three steals.

## JOHNSON, FLESCHEMAN TO REDSHIRT

- Tennessee coach **Rick Barnes** announced during his postgame press conference on Nov. 15 that true freshmen **Jalen Johnson** and Jacob **Fleschman** will redshirt this season.
- Johnson is swingman with great length and athleticism, but he needs to add strength. Fleschman is a walk-on guard whose strength is his shooting.
- Barnes said of Johnson: "**Lamonté Turner** told me he thought the best thing that happened to him was to sit out (last season). So we think it's going to be a good thing for Jalen because we think he has a great future."

## BOWDEN'S BIG DAY

- In just his second college game, Vols freshman wing **Jordan Bowden** earned a spot in the starting lineup when UT hosted Appalachian State last Tuesday.
- In front of his hometown crowd, the Knoxville native and graduate of Carter High School wasted no time heating up. Just four seconds after the opening tip, he drilled a catch-and-shoot 3-pointer from the left corner. That was the first of four triples for Bowden in the first half.
- In 22 total minutes vs. the Mountaineers, he totaled 14 points, one rebound and a pair of assists.

- Prior to Friday, the last Vol *freshman* to record 10 or more rebounds in his Tennessee debut was **C.J. Black** on Nov. 24, 1996, vs. Morehead State.

## YOUNGEST UT TEAM IN 20 YEARS

- In terms of under- and upperclassmen, this is the youngest Tennessee team in 20 years.
- Kevin O'Neill's** 1996-97 Vols had only three upperclassmen, just like this current UT squad.

- With greater depth from top to bottom this season, head coach **Rick Barnes** has begun challenging his Vols to play with maximum effort for two-and-a-half minute shifts during game action. The concept requires not only mental and physical tenacity, but also a teamwide trust that after playing to exhaustion, the next man can come in and maintain the intensity and production.
- Said Barnes: "(One of the most important things this team is learning), if you ask these guys, is understanding how hard it is to play two-and-a-half minutes as hard as you can play, knowing that if you do that, there's somebody waiting to come in and try to keep it going. I think that's probably (the challenge) for the majority of the younger guys—understanding just how hard it is to play two-and-a-half minutes really hard."

## HUBBS, MOSTELLA

## FINISHED 2016 AS POTENT COMBO

- Returning wings **Robert Hubbs III** and **Detrick Mostella** finished last season as a potent scoring duo, combining to average 30 points per game over Tennessee's season-ending, three-game run at the SEC Tournament.
- Tennessee's frontcourt also returns sophomore **Shembari Phillips**, who scored in double figures in seven SEC games as a freshman last year, along with **Lamonté Turner**, who redshirted last season while practicing with the Vols and establishing chemistry with his teammates.

VOLS PICKED 13<sup>th</sup> IN SEC

- Tennessee was predicted to finish 13th in the 2017 SEC race by an SEC and national media voting panel.
- The Volunteers posted a 6-12 SEC record to finish 12th a season ago.

## FAST BREAK

Tennessee has produced four of the top 10 all-time scorers in SEC history: **Allan Houston** (No. 2; 2,801 points), **Ernie Grunfeld** (No. 5; 2,249 points), **Tony White** (No. 6; 2,219 points) and **Chris Lofton** (No. 10; 2,131 points).

## COACHING STABILITY, FINALLY, FOR HUBBS

- For the first time in his collegiate career, Vols senior **Robert Hubbs III** has the same coach for consecutive seasons.
- As a freshman in 2013-14, Hubbs played for the head coach who recruited him, **Cuonzo Martin**. After Martin accepted the head coaching job at Cal following that season, Hubbs played his sophomore campaign under **Donnie Tyndall**. That 2014-15 season was Tyndall's lone year at UT.
- Last year, as a junior, Hubbs was proving himself to **Rick Barnes**, his third head coach in three years. Now, finally, as a senior, Hubbs can play without the burden of acclimating to a new system and style.
- "You could say it has been an experience, and not too many people can say they have had three different coaches their first three years," Hubbs said. "But everything happens for a reason, and I feel blessed to be with Coach Barnes."

## ALEXANDER GIVES VOLS CANADIAN CONNECTION

- Forward **Kyle Alexander** last season became just the second Canadian ever to letter for the Vols (joining Hamilton, Ontario, native **Bobby Croft**, 1967-70).
- Alexander appeared in 32 games for the Vols last season, with 11 starts. He ranked second on the team with 31 total blocked shots.
- This season, Alexander has started both games and leads the Vols in rebounds (7.5 rpg) and blocks (3.0 bpg). And he has set new career-highs for scoring in each game this season, with seven against Chattanooga (11/11) and 13 vs. App State (11/15).
- Tennessee head coach **Rick Barnes** boasts an impressive history of signing and developing Canadian standouts, including **Cory Joseph** (Toronto; now plays for the Toronto Raptors), **Myck Kabongo** (Toronto; now plays in the NBA D-League) and **Tristan Thompson** (Brampton, Ontario; now plays for the Cleveland Cavaliers).

## EVANS BRINGS NCAA EXPERIENCE

- The summer addition of graduate transfer forward **Low Evans** not only gave this Tennessee roster a much-needed boost in size, it also gave the Vols' locker room a presence with some NCAA Tournament experience.
- As a sophomore in 2013-14, Evans started 22 games for a Tulsa squad that exceeded 20 wins, captured the Conference USA crown and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where it fell to UCLA.
- "That experience was awesome," Evans said. "The game before ours was Stephen F. Austin against VCU. When SFA hit a buzzer-beater to go into overtime, that place was rocking. Right after that, we played UCLA in San Diego, so the whole crowd of 10,000 was against us. The whole thing from start to finish was awesome."
- Vols senior **Robert Hubbs III** was a true freshman when UT advanced all the way from the First Four to the Sweet Sixteen in 2014. But he had season-ending shoulder surgery in January and was unable to play in any of UT's four NCAA Tournament games.

## TENNESSEE ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vols' 2016-17 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) representing six states as well as Ontario, Canada.
- There are five Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, three from North Carolina, and a pair of players are from Alabama, Georgia, Illinois, Texas and Utah also are represented.
- Tennessee has two seniors, one junior, five sophomores and eight freshmen (including one redshirt freshman).
- Thirteen Vols stand 6-5 or shorter, and three players are 6-6 or taller.
- For the second straight season, UT has just three players listed at 6-7 or taller.

## CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

- Tennessee's roster features six players who won at least one state championship during their respective high school careers. And those six Vols combine to boast a total of eight state championship rings.
- Freshmen **Jordan Bone** and **Jalen Johnson** each won a pair of state titles during their prep careers. Vols with a single state title under their belt are: **Low Evans**, **Kwe Parker**, **Shembari Phillips** and **Grant Williams**.
- Robert Hubbs III** and **Lamonté Turner** each played in at least one state championship game during their prep career, but neither player's team captured a title.





# SALUTE TO THE PAST

Outstanding Tennessee teams in the 1970s featuring Vol greats **Bernad King** and **Ernie Grunfeld** (pictured below), made the candy-striped pants popular, wearing them prior to packed games at old Stokely Athletics Center.

The pants made some intermittent appearances in the last decade but will be worn for all games this season.

## SCHOFIELD LISTED AMONG SI's BREAKOUT SOPHOMORES

- *Sports Illustrated's* **Luke Winn** listed Tennessee forward **Admiral Schofield** as No. 3 on his "Breakout Sophomore Formula" preseason breakdown.
- The formula identifies scoring potential in players who didn't put up significant points as freshmen, yet had promising advanced-statistical profiles.
- Winn wrote: Tennessee's version of smallball was to use the 6-4 Schofield as its starting power forward for portions of 2015-16. He's built like an NFL linebacker—his brother is former Falcons and Seahawks linebacker **O'Brien Schofield**—and he reportedly dropped 30 pounds as a freshman to get to his playing weight of 240. The sorta-slimmed-down Schofield was the Vols' best interior finisher (making 53.6% of his twos), best free-throw shooter (at 88.0%), and a threat to make an occasional three. The offensive load he handled during SEC play—using 23.4% of Tennessee's possessions with an offensive rating of 111.3—was well above the typical projection for a three-star recruit debuting in a major conference, and it sets him up to emerge as Vols' No. 2 scorer as a sophomore.

## 6-9 FORWARD ZACH KENT SIGNS

- 6-9 forward **Zach Kent** signed with the Vols Nov. 9. He plans to enroll at UT next summer and pursue a degree in Communications. He will be a freshman for the Volunteers in 2017-18.
- A native of Magnolia, Delaware, Kent is currently a senior at Blair Academy in Blairstown, New Jersey.
- Prior to this year, Kent attended St. Andrew's School in Middleton, Delaware. As a junior there in 2015-16, Kent earned All-Conference and third-team All-State honors after averaging 17 points and nine rebounds per game.
- He will become the first Delaware native ever to suit up for the Vols.

## TENNESSEE RETURNS TO BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS IN 2017

- Tennessee will make its second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament next season. The 2017 field includes the Vols, Arizona, NC State, Northern Iowa, Purdue, SMU, Villanova and Western Kentucky.
- The Battle 4 Atlantis takes place at the Atlantis Resort on Paradise Island, Bahamas.
- In Atlantis in 2013, Tennessee dropped its opening game to UTEP before bouncing back to defeat Xavier and Wake Forest.

## BARNES BUILDING AMBITIOUS NATIONAL SCHEDULE

- Anyone. Anytime. Anywhere. That is **Rick Barnes'** approach to building Tennessee's non-conference schedule. Barnes believes that if you want to be considered an elite, national program, you have to play an ambitious national schedule.
- Last season—his first with the Vols—Barnes took UT on the road to face Gonzaga in Seattle, Georgia Tech in Atlanta and Butler in Indianapolis. Tennessee also played two games at the Barclays Center Classic in Brooklyn, New York, at Thanksgiving.
- Gonzaga (in Nashville) and Georgia Tech (in Knoxville) also appear on this year's schedule, which is also highlighted by a game at North Carolina and a trip to the Maui Invitational.

## BARNES BEAT THREE MAJOR RIVALS IN FIRST SEASON WITH VOLS

- Last season, **Rick Barnes** led Tennessee to wins over three of its biggest rivals, as his Vols bested SEC Eastern Division foes Florida, Kentucky and Vanderbilt. UT's wins over the Gators and Wildcats came in Knoxville, while the win over the Commodores came in the SEC Tournament in Nashville.
- Barnes last season also became one of only five Tennessee basketball coaches to defeat both Florida and Kentucky in his first try with the Big Orange. In doing so, Barnes joined **John Sines** (1959-60), **Don DeVoe** (1978-79), **Wade Houston** (1989-90) and **Bruce Pearl** (2005-06).

## WINS OVER CLOSE TO 200 SCHOOLS

- **Rick Barnes** has recorded at least one win over 173 different schools during his career as a head coach.
- His next opportunity to beat a school for the first time in his career comes Dec. 6 when the Vols host Presbyterian.

## VOLS IN THE NBA

- Tennessee alums enjoyed a noteworthy presence in the NBA during the 2015-16 season—highlighted by **Jordan McRae** (2010-14) winning an NBA Championship with the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- McRae made 17 appearances for the Cavs and also played in seven games with the Phoenix Suns last season. His regular-season averages included 4.5 points and 1.1 assists in 8.9 minutes per game. He shot .436 overall and .455 from 3-point range.
- Miami Heat guard **Josh Richardson** had a spectacular rookie campaign, playing a key role on Miami's run to the Eastern Conference semifinals. In 52 regular-season appearances, Richardson averaged 6.6 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 21.3 minutes per game. After the All-Star break, he led the entire NBA in 3-point percentage (.589), and he was named the NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for March.
- Midway through his fifth NBA season, forward **Tobias Harris** was traded from the Orlando Magic to the Detroit Pistons, playing a starting role as Detroit surged into the playoffs. In 76 regular-season appearances (with both Orlando and Detroit), Harris averaged 14.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 33.1 minutes per game.
- Point guard **C.J. Watson** completed his ninth NBA season as a member of the Orlando Magic. An injury limited him to just 33 appearances, during which he averaged 4.3 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists in 19.9 minutes per game.

- A pair of Tennessee alums continue lengthy tenures as NBA front-office executives in 2016-17. Washington Wizards President **Ernie Grunfeld** completed his 13th season as the team's top executive. And New York Knicks Assistant General Manager **Allan Houston** continues to play a key insider's role in the resurgence of that storied franchise.

### Hoops a Priority on Rocky Top

The University of Tennessee has invested more than \$40 million into its basketball facilities since the end of the 2006-07 campaign.

Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility and began the first phase of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena.

The \$19 million first phase of renovations included the addition of 32 luxury suites that are located in the existing north balcony, a loge area just below the luxury suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.

The Vols' state-of-the-art basketball practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, houses two full-size gymnasiums, one for each of the men's and women's basketball teams, as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.

The athletic department renovated the men's and women's basketball offices at the arena during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for the basketball programs.

New to Thompson-Boling Arena in 2013-14 was the 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.

And in March of 2014, TBA became the third college arena to install an LED lighting system (joining Arizona State and Notre Dame).

"Rick Barnes always told me I would be a franchise player, a go-to guy. I can't say that I always believed him, but he was right. He told me if I kept working hard and stayed with it, then I would be a go-to guy in the NBA, and it worked out. He kept me positive and kept me going in the right direction when I could have stopped believing in myself. That was a key to my development as a player."

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- **Rick Barnes'** commitment to his players' academic achievement cannot be overstated. His teams have posted a perfect 1,000 score in five of the last six multi-year APR reports as well as perfect single-year APR scores every year from 2005-06 through 2014-15.
- A total of 31 Tennessee men's basketball players have graduated in the last eight years. Those players are: **Devon Baulkman, Josh Bone, Galen Campbell, Quinn Cannington, Quinton Chievous, Ryan Childress, Wayne Chism, D'Montre Edwards, John Fields, Melvin Goins, Kenny Hall, Tony Harris, Michael Hubert, Justin Jackson, Chris Lofton, Brandon Lopez, Jeronne Maymon, Skylar McBee, Jordan McRae, Dwight Miller, Armani Moore, Rob Murphy, Steven Pearl, J.P. Prince, Kevin Punter Jr., Josh Richardson, Tyler Summitt, Cameron Tatum, C.J. Watson, Tanner Wild and Renaldo Woolridge.**
- Of those 31 graduates in the last eight years, 19 went on to sign professional basketball contracts and two have gone into coaching.

## FOUR WEARING VOLSCHOLAR PATCH

- Four Vols have earned the privilege of wearing a "VOLScholar" patch on their game jersey: **Kyle Alexander, Shembari Phillips, Lamonté Turner and Brad Woodson**
- To be eligible to wear the patch, Tennessee student-athletes must achieve a 3.0 GPA in either of the two previous semesters, or they must own a cumulative 3.0 GPA (freshmen are not eligible for the patch).

## LANIER GIVES VOLS ADDITIONAL HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

- **Rick Barnes** isn't the only person on Tennessee's bench with Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach **Rob Lanier** was the head coach at Siena from 2001-05.
- During that span, the Saints posted a 58-70 mark, and advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.
- Under Lanier, Siena also won the 2002 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship.

## USELESS (BUT INTERESTING) INFO

- Junior guard **Detrick Mostella** has the smallest shoe size on the team, as he wears a 10.5.
- Tennessee's student manager team rose as high as No. 6 in last year's national KPI rankings (KPIsports.net) and advanced to the Final Four in Houston where it fell to Michigan State. Kansas and Iowa State were the other two Final Four participants.
- At the "real" Final Four in Houston in 2011, **Rick Barnes** received the USBWA's "Good Guy Award" for coaching excellence and for cooperation with the media.

## UPCOMING SCHEDULE NOTES

- **Georgia Tech (Dec. 3)** - There is plenty of history in this series, as these programs met annually from 1945-68 (Tech was a member of the SEC from 1932-64).
- After spending the last seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, **Josh Pastner** was hired to lead the Georgia Tech program in April. Pastner twice brought his Tigers to Knoxville, but the in-state series with the Vols was not renewed following the 2012-13 campaign, which marked his last visit to Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Tennessee signed its current series contract with the Yellow Jackets prior to last season. This year's meeting is the second of the four-game contract that spans four seasons. The Big Orange fell to Georgia Tech 69-67 last November. When the series is contested in Knoxville, UT owns a 25-9 advantage.
- **at UNC (Dec. 11)** - Despite Tennessee and North Carolina sharing a border, these programs have only met nine times on the hardwood, with the Tar Heels holding a clear advantage in the series (8-1).
- UNC will make a return trip to Knoxville in 2017-18.
- In addition to UT head coach **Rick Barnes** hailing from North Carolina (Hickory), three Tennessee freshmen also hail from the Tar Heel State in **Jalen Johnson (Durham), Kwe Parker (Fayetteville) and Grant Williams (Charlotte).**
- The Tar Heels are ranked fifth in the AP top-25 poll.
- **vs. Gonzaga (Dec. 18)** - Tennessee treats its midstate fans to a high-profile, regular-season clash against perennial powerhouse Gonzaga on a Sunday at Bridgestone Arena in downtown Nashville.
- The Vols journeyed west for a showdown with the Bulldogs in Seattle last season, and Gonzaga emerged with an 86-79 victory. This year's neutral-site meeting takes place in the Volunteer State.
- Veteran head coach **Mark Few** led the Zags to at least 24 wins in each of the last nine seasons. And with center **Przemek Karnowski** set to return for a fifth year (he missed most of last season—including the Tennessee game—with a back injury), Gonzaga appears set for another strong season in 2016-17.
- As a junior in 2014-15, Karnowski (10.9 ppg, 5.8 rpg) earned first-team All-West Coast Conference and WCC All-Tournament Team honors. The Bulldogs 2016-17 roster also will be bolstered by the additions of incoming transfers **Nigel Williams-Goss (Washington)** and **Jonathan Williams III (Missouri).**
- The Zags are ranked 14th in the AP top-25 poll.

- Tennessee Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics **Dave Hart** is a true "basketball man," as he played collegiately at Alabama.

## LAST MEETING WITH GEORGETOWN

- Neither team scored for the final 4:09 of game as No. 20 Georgetown fended off Tennessee, 37-36, Nov. 30, 2012, in the SEC/Big East Challenge at the Verizon Center. No player scored more than eight points for either team.
- Georgetown's game-winning basket—the final one of the game—came with 4:09 left in regulation as **Markel Starks** hit a jumper for the 37-36 lead, and eventual final score.
- Against the taller Hoyas, the Vols owned the glass, out-rebounding Georgetown, 37-29, with **Jarnell Stokes** leading the way with nine boards. **Trae Golden** grabbed a career-high eight rebounds to go with eight points. **Skylar McBees** also scored eight.
- Tennessee took possession for the final shot after Georgetown threw the ball out of bounds with 20.9 seconds left in regulation. McBees missed a 3-pointer with 3.4 seconds left, and **Jordan McRae** then missed one as time expired.
- Tennessee's 36 points were the second-lowest in the shot-clock era and the lowest since the Vols had 35 vs. Auburn on Jan. 15, 1997 (a 43-35 loss).

## LAST MEETING WITH OREGON

- Tennessee, under the direction of legendary head coach **Ray Mears**, defeated Oregon by a score of 70-63 in the semifinals of the Far West Classic in Portland on Dec. 29, 1964.
- Only seven Vols played in the game. Starting forwards **A.W. Davis** (team captain) and **Ron Widby** each logged a double-double, as Davis tallied 18 points and 11 rebounds and Widby posted 13 points and 14 boards.
- Guard **Larry McIntosh** scored 16 points for Tennessee, and center **Austin "Red" Robbins** added 16.
- Oregon, which held a 37-35 lead at halftime, was led by forward **Bill Jennings** (17 points) and guard **Nick Jones** (15 points).
- Tennessee went on to finish second in the SEC with a 12-4 league record. UT's final overall record stood at 20-5.
- Three Vols who played in the game went on to be named first-team All-Americans: Davis (1965, Helms, USBWA), Robbins (1966, Helms) and Widby (1967, Helms).
- Widby went on to win play in two Super Bowls.



## BETTER KNOW A FOE

### THE GEORGETOWN SERIES

- Tennessee owns a 28-24 all-time record against current members of the Big East Conference.
- Tennessee head coach **Rick Barnes** was a Big East head coach for six years, guiding Providence to a 108-76 record from 1988-94.
- Barnes is 33-37 as a head coach against current members of the Big East Conference.
- Barnes was 7-8 against legendary Hoyas head coach **John Thompson Jr.**
- Four players who played in the most recent Tennessee-Georgetown clash are now active on NBA rosters, including UT's **Jordan McRae** (Cavs), **Josh Richardson** (Heat) and **Jarnell Stokes** (Nuggets).
- The Vols won the only neutral-site meeting in this series, and that game took place at a Thanksgiving-week holiday tournament, as UT defeated the Hoyas, 90-78, at the 2008 Old Spice Classic in Orlando, Florida.

### GEORGETOWN CONNECTIONS

- UT assistant coach **Desmond Oliver** coached first-year Georgetown assistant **Akbar Waheed** at Niagara in the late 1990s. Waheed also is close friends with Vols associate head coach **Rob Lanier**, who attended Waheed's wedding.
- The Tennessee basketball program has had four lettermen who have hailed from Washington D.C. and/or Maryland: **Antonio Barton** (2014, Baltimore), **Tariq Owens** (2015, Odenton), **Bobby Maze** (2008-10, Suitland) and **James Ratliff** (1978, D.C.).
- Tennessee's second all-time leading scorer, **Ernie Grunfeld** (1973-77), is in his 14th season as the Washington Wizards top executive.

### THE OREGON SERIES

- Tennessee is 18-10 all-time against current members of the Pac 12 Conference.
- The Vols have not faced a current Pac 12 team since Dec. 21, 2010, when USC posted a 65-64 win in Knoxville.
- Rick Barnes** is 30-21 in his career against current members of the Pac 12. Seventeen of those games came against former Big 12 member Colorado (13-4) when Barnes was at Texas.

### OREGON CONNECTIONS

- Tennessee sophomore **Kyle Alexander** (Milton, Ontario) and Oregon junior **Dillon Brooks** (Missauga, Ontario) are both from Canada and have played together. They were AAU teammates with the CIA Bounce program, and they both also played on Team Canada at the prestigious 2014 Adidas Nations event in Los Angeles.
- Tennessee has never had a letterman from the state of Oregon. But three current Lady Vols basketball players hail from Oregon: **Jaime Nared** (Portland), **Jordan Reynolds** (Portland) and **Mercedes Russell** (Springfield). And on Nov. 10, Lady Vols head coach **Holly Warlick** signed Salem, Oregon, native **Evina Westbrook**, a guard who is rated by scouting services as the first- or second-best women's hoops prospect in the country.
