Coach – **John Thompson III** is in his 13th season at the helm of the Hoyas ... In 12 years at Georgetown, Thompson has led the Hoyas to the 2007 NCAA Final Four, the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament Championship and to three BIG EAST Regular Season crowns (2006-07, 2007-08 and 2012-13) ... Georgetown has been to the postseason in 11 of his 12 seasons, including eight NCAA Tournament appearances ... The Hoyas have won at least 20 games eight times in the last 11 seasons ... He has a record of 266-135 (.663) at Georgetown and a 16-year record of 334-177 (.654), including a 68-42 record at Princeton.

FOR STARTERS

- The Georgetown University men's basketball team will play No. 16 Wisconsin in the semifinals of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Tuesday, Nov. 22 at Lahaina Civic Center ... Tipoff is slated for 8 p.m. ET.
- The Hoyas are coming off a thrilling 65-61 win over No. 13 Oregon in the first round on Monday afternoon Georgetown opened up a 17-point lead at the half, fell behind in the second half and then used a late run in the second half to take the lead back and hit key free throws in the final two minutes en route to the 65-61 win.

ABOUT THE HOYAS

- Graduate student Rodney Pryor scored a game-high 26 points, including 18 in the first half, and had 10 rebounds and four blocks to lead the Hoyas against Oregon ... He is only the second player under 13th-year Head Coach John Thompson III to record at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks in a game, joining former All-American Greg Monroe.
- Junior guard L.J. Peak added 17 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals ... Dating back to last season, Peak has scored in double figures in 19-straight games.
- Sophomore center Jessie Govan added nine points, eight rebounds and two blocks ... He has scored in double figures in all four games this season.
- Seven different players scored at least one point for the Hoyas and eight players had at least one rebound.
- Pryor made an impressive debut in his first game as a Hoya on Nov. 12, scoring 26 points in the first half and finishing with 32 in a 105-60 win over USC Upstate ... Pryor, who was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, hit six 3-pointers in the win ... His game-high 32 points were the most in a debut game under John Thompson III and he is the ninth player to score at least 30 points and it was the 16th 30-plus point game under Thompson ... Pryor's 32 points were also the most in a debut game for a Georgetown player since Brian Sheehan scored 30 points on Dec. 4, 1958 against Kentucky Wesleyan.
- Pryor led five players in double figures, as Peak added 14 points, four assists and three rebounds, Govan had 11 points and six rebounds, junior guard Tre Campbell chipped in 10 points and three assists and Copeland added 10 points.
- Through four games, Pryor leads the team in scoring with 19.8 points per game, which ranks sixth in the BIG EAST ... Peak is second on the in scoring with 17.5 points per game, which ranks 10th in the BIG EAST Govan is third on the team with 13.0 points and leads the team with 6.3 rebounds, while Copeland is fourth on

GEORGETOWN OFFICIALLY DEDICATES JOHN R. THOMPSON JR. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETIC CENTER

Standing outside the building that bears his father's name, the John R. Thompson Jr. Intercollegiate Athletic Center was officially opened in a ceremony on the Hilltop on Thursday, Oct. 6.

A public dedication ceremony for the Thompson Athletic Center was held in the plaza area outside the new facility and adjacent to McDonough Arena. More than 600 people were in attendance as Thompson cut the ribbon for the facility that bears the name of the coach who guided the Georgetown men's basketball team to the 1984 NCAA Championship, three Final Fours and 596 wins in 27 years on the sidelines.

"It's a pleasure to be together with all of you as we dedicate the John R. Thompson Jr. Intercollegiate Athletic Center and recognize John for the profound impact he has had – here, in our community, on the game of basketball and to larger questions of racial justice, equity, equality and opportunity in our nation."

Following the dedication ceremony, a Celebration Dinner was held in McDonough Arena, with many greats from Georgetown Basketball – former National Football League commissioner Paul Tagliabue, Alonzo Mourning and Allen Iverson among them – in attendance.

"My name's not on that building just because of me," Thompson Jr. said. "There's a lot of people who I can say contributed to that, and unfortunately you just don't recall all their names at one time, but you certainly don't forget them."

The Thompson Center will transform the athletics experience at Georgetown with a facility that supports the demands our student-athletes face on a daily basis. It was built adjacent to McDonough Arena and, with roughly 144,000 square feet of newly-constructed space, will house:

- New practice courts, locker rooms, team meeting rooms, lounge areas and coaches' offices for men's and women's basketball.
- Sports performance/weight training facility and sports medicine/training room areas for all varsity student-athletes.
- A student-athlete academic center, auditorium and team meeting facilities for all varsity sports programs.
- Team-dedicated locker rooms for men's & women's basketball, men's & women's soccer and men's & women's lacrosse.
- A new equipment room – more than 4,000 square feet – that will service all 29 intercollegiate sports and more than 750 student-athletes.
- Hoyas Forever Hallway to honor the University's rich athletic tradition and history.
- A courtyard for student-athletes that has a comfortable meditation area with a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary.



"Our facilities have been used against us, and now they'll be used for us," Thompson III said during a tour following the dedication. "I don't think there's a place in the country as nice as this. Today's kids, they want all the bells and whistles, and this has a lot of that."

Thompson III said that it means a lot to him to know that he comes to work in the building bearing his father's name. "Proud happy, glad that it's named after Pops," Thompson III said. "I think if anything, that makes you emotional. It makes him emotional knowing that and appreciating that and seeing the great representation that you see as you walk through the building. It was important to us to recognize as much as we could the history of every sport and also men's basketball."

Near the main entrance of the building is a bronze statue of Thompson Jr., designed and created by Hanlon Sculptures, and an interactive photo wall chronicling the history of Georgetown Athletics. Also included are several quotes from Thompson Jr., including a famous line from an on-campus celebration following the 1984 NCAA Championship win, saying "When I'm gone, if I can't go to Heaven, take me back to Georgetown."

"I never thought it would happen in my lifetime because I've seen about four or five blueprints that had come out," Thompson Jr. said of having a building named for him. "It's way beyond what I thought it would be. It's spectacular."

"It's very hard to express what you really feel. I've sat out there and just looked at it, and said, "Can you believe this?"

- Pryor's 32 points were also the most in a debut game for a Georgetown player since Brian Sheehan scored 30 points on Dec. 4, 1958 against Kentucky Wesleyan.
- Pryor's 13 made field goals were also the most in a single game by a Georgetown player since Allen Iverson hit 15 against St. John's on January 27, 1996.

THE SERIES WITH WISCONSIN

- This is the fifth meeting all-time between Georgetown and Wisconsin and the third-straight year the teams have played.
- The all-time series is tied at two wins apiece, with the Hoyas winning two of the last three games.
- The last time the teams played was a 71-61 Georgetown win last year in the 2K Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York City ... The Badgers posted a 68-65 win over the Hoyas in the second round of the Battle4Atlantis in 2014.

HAYES SELECTED TEAM CAPTAIN

- Head Men's Basketball Coach John Thompson III announced that fifth-year senior center Bradley Hayes would serve as the team's captain for the 2016-17 season.
- Hayes was granted a fifth year of eligibility by the NCAA in April.
- Hayes led the Hoyas in rebounding with 6.7 boards per game last year, while averaging 8.7 points and ranking among the BIG EAST Conference leaders in field goal percentage, connecting on 54.1 percent of his shots from the field.

AGAINST THE BIG 10 CONFERENCE

- Georgetown has an all-time record of 31-39 against teams from the Big Ten Conference ... The Hoyas split a pair of games last year against teams from the Big Ten, falling to Maryland and beating Wisconsin in the 2K Classic, 71-61, at Madison Square Garden ... GU lost to Maryland, 76-75, on Nov. 15 in the Gavitt Tipoff Games.

WHAT'S BACK

- While Georgetown will seek to replace the void left by the graduation of D'Vauntes Smith-Rivera, who left the Hilltop ranked No. 5 all-time in scoring at Georgetown, the Hoyas have a lot coming back, with four starters and 10 letterwinners returning to the lineup ... The Blue & Gray return 77.0 percent of team's scoring (1,870 of 2,430 points), 84.3 percent of its rebounding (729 of 865) and 66.1 percent of its assists (327 of 492).

ABOUT THE BADGERS

- Wisconsin enters today's game with a 3-1 record following a 74-62 win over Tennessee in the first round of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
- The Badgers are ranked No. 16 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll and No. 14 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- Against Tennessee, Bronson Koenig scored 21 points to lead three players in double figures, while Nigel Hayes added 17 points and 10 rebounds and Ethan Happ scored 16 points and had five rebounds.

HOYAS IN MAUI

- This is Georgetown's third time playing in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational, the second under Head Coach John Thompson III.
- The Hoyas last played in Maui in 2011, losing a close contest to Kansas (67-63) in the first round, before coming back to beat Chaminade in the second round and then a thrilling win over Memphis in the fifth place game.
- The Blue & Gray went 1-2 during a visit to the island in 1999, beating Memphis (71-55) and then losing to North Carolina (85-79) and Florida (72-62).

HAYES TO MISS FIRST FOUR GAMES OF SEASON

- Georgetown University men's basketball player Bradley Hayes missed the first four games of the 2016-17 season due to restrictions by the NCAA for his additional year of eligibility.
- Hayes was granted a fifth year of eligibility by the NCAA in April ... He is expected to play Georgetown's second game in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Nov. 22.
- Hayes led the Hoyas in rebounding with 6.7 boards per game last year, while averaging 8.7 points and ranking among the BIG EAST Conference leaders in field goal percentage, connecting on 54.1 percent of his shots from the field.

GEORGETOWN IN HAWAII

- Georgetown has a long history of playing in Hawaii, dating back to Hall of Fame Coach John Thompson Jr., who had his team play on the Islands several times.
- Between 1982-83 and 1991-92, the Hoyas played every year in Hawaii, appearing in the Hawaii-Loa Classic on Oahu.
- Under JT3, this is Georgetown's third trip to Hawaii ... The Hoyas have played twice in Maui (also in 2010-11) and also played in the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu in 2004-05.
- Georgetown has an all-time record of 28-4 in games played in Hawaii.

FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Georgetown has gone to the free throw line early and often this season, averaging 33.6 trips to the line after four games ... The Hoyas have taken advantage as well, connecting on 78.9 percent of their shots.
- GU has scored 31.9 percent of its points this season from the free throw line (101 of 317).
- In the game against Maryland, the Hoyas connected on 37-of-42 shots from the sin stripe ... The 37 made free throws were the most since the Hoyas hit 39 in a win over Villanova on February 6, 2010.

PRYOR SHINES IN DEBUT

- Graduate transfer Rodney Pryor made an impressive debut in his first game as a Hoya, scoring 26 points in the first half and finishing with 32 ... Pryor, who was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, hit six 3-pointers in the win.
- His game-high 32 points were the most in a debut game under John Thompson III and he is the ninth player to score at least 30 points and it was the 16th 30-plus point game under Thompson.

INDICATORS

Since John Thompson III took over at the helm of the Hoya program, when the team has scored at least 69 points, good things happen ... In 12 years, Georgetown is 159-35 when scoring at least 69 points, including a 14-4 mark in 2014-15 ... The team was 18-1 during the 2006-07 season when scoring at least 69 points ... In his 15-plus years of head coaching, JTIII-led teams (Princeton, 2000-04; Georgetown, 2004-present) are 186-41 when





scoring at least 69 points.

GEORGETOWN PICKED FOURTH IN BIG EAST

- The Georgetown University men's basketball team was picked to finish tied for fourth place in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' poll, announced on Oct. 11 at BIG EAST Media Day on Tuesday at Madison Square Garden.
- Villanova, the defending national champion, was the preseason pick by the coaches to win the BIG EAST, for the third-straight year ... Xavier (one first place vote) was selected second, with Creighton third and the Hoyas were tied for fourth place with Seton Hall.
- Butler was selected sixth, with Marquette seventh, DePaul was tabbed eighth, Providence was voted ninth and St. John's in 10th place.

COPELAND, PEAK EARN ALL-LEAGUE HONORS

- Junior forward Isaac Copeland was selected to the All-BIG EAST Pre-season Second Team and junior guard L.J. Peak was an All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention selection.
- Copeland, an All-BIG EAST Rookie Team selection as a freshman in 2014-15, was a starter in all 33 games last season and finished second on the team in minutes played (32.0 mpg) ... He finished the season third on the team in scoring with 11.1 points per game, second in rebounding with 5.4 boards and averaged 2.0 assists ... He scored in double figures 20 times, including a career-high 32 points against Marquette.
- Peak, who started 12 times and appeared in 33 games last season, finished second on the team in scoring with 12.3 points per game, while averaging 3.3 rebounds and 1.7 assists per game ... He ranked 18th in the BIG EAST in scoring ... Peak, an All-BIG EAST Rookie Team selection in 2014-15, connected on 49.1 percent of his field goals last year ... He scored in double figures 24 times, including the last 15 games of the season, when he averaged 15.5 points and 3.9 rebounds per game.

THE NAME IS THE SAME

- Georgetown has several recognizable names on its roster this season, starting with the obvious in Head Coach John Thompson III, the son of Hall of Fame Coach John Thompson Jr.
- On his staff is Patrick Ewing Jr., the son of former Georgetown All-American and Hall of Famer Patrick Ewing ... Ewing Jr., who graduated from Georgetown in 2008 and was part of JT3's 2007 Final Four team, joined returned to the Hilltop in 2015 as the Director of Basketball Operations.
- On the roster, fans will also see a pair of familiar names too ... Junior forward Alonzo "Trey" Mourning is the son of former Georgetown All-American and Hall of Famer Alonzo Mourning ... His father, who also wore #33 on the Hilltop, is a member of the Board of Trustees at Georgetown ... And freshman George Muresan is the son of former Washington Bullets and NBA standout Gheorge Muresan ... The younger Muresan, who grew up in the D.C. area, joined the team as a walk-on this year.

HOYAS SIGN 2 TO NATIONAL LETTERS-OF-INTENT

- Georgetown signed a pair of student-athletes to National-Letters-of-Intent in the early signing period, with guard Tremont Waters and forward Antwan Walker set to join the program.
- Waters, a 5-foot-11 prospect from Notre Dame High School (West Haven, Connecticut), is ranked No. 32 in the ESPN 100 and No. 7 among point guards ... Waters averaged 13.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.1 steals during the spring and summer with Expressions Elite on the Nike EYBL circuit 2015 ... Waters is Georgetown's highest-ranked commitment since Copeland signed in 2014 (No. 16).
- Walker, a 6-7 forward from Washington, D.C., is currently ranked as

ALLEN IVERSON ENSHRINED INTO NAISMITH BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

- Since it was announced last year that former Georgetown All-American Allen Iverson ('96) would be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, it was said in many different ways that the guard was one of the most unique and electrifying players to ever step foot on the hardwood.
- During NBATV's Red Carpet Show leading up to the Hall of Fame Ceremonies, former Georgetown All-American Alonzo Mourning (C'91), himself a member of the Hall of Fame, said "I can put it in its simplest terms – pound for pound, the best player to ever play the game."
- On Sept. 10 in Springfield, Mass., Iverson joined the best in the history of the game as he was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, alongside other basketball luminaries as Shaquille O'Neal, Yao Ming and John McLendon.
- As he was introduced to the crowd before his speech, NBATV host Ahmad Rashad said – with the crowd interrupting him with cheers – "Consider the willingness, the tenacity, the toughness to compete at the highest level, the mesmerizing handle, the breathtaking speed...and you will find The Answer."
- Iverson was joined on stage by his coach, legendary Georgetown Hall of Fame Coach John Thompson Jr., along with his coach with the Philadelphia 76ers, Larry Brown, and Julius Erving.
- His coach at Georgetown was one of his first mentions.
- "I want to thank Coach Thompson ... for saving my life, for giving me the opportunity," Iverson said. "I was recruited by every school in the country for football and basketball. All of that was taken away. No other teams, no other schools were recruiting me. My mom went to Georgetown and begged him to give me a chance and he did. And that's crazy to think that you're the best football player in the world, which I did, and to be sitting up here as a Hall of Famer in basketball. You tell me God ain't good."
- Iverson thanks many people throughout his career, but came back to Georgetown again.
- "I love Miss (Lorry) Michel so much," he said. "And Miss (Mary) Fenlon, if you're watching, I love y'all."
- This is the third-straight year a former Hoya has been enshrined into the Hall of Fame, following in the footsteps of Mourning and Dikembe Mutombo (C'91).
- Iverson is the fourth former Georgetown standout to play under Thompson Jr. to enter the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, along with Mourning, Mutombo and Patrick Ewing (C'84).
- Iverson ranks 13th all-time in scoring at Georgetown with 1,539 points, a 23.0 per game average that is the best mark in school history. His 925 points during the 1995-96 season were the most by a Hoya in a single season. In addition, he ranks 14th all-time in assists with 307, is fourth all-time in steals with 213 and his 124 steals during the 1995-96 season are the most by a player in one year.
- Iverson retired from the National Basketball Association in 2013, ending a career that spanned 15 years, during which he won the 2001 MVP award and four scoring titles. He retired in Philadelphia, where he had his greatest successes and led the franchise to the 2001 NBA Finals. Iverson, who also played for Denver, Detroit and Memphis, scored 24,368 points in his career and was an 11-time All-Star selection.





a three-star recruit by 247 Sports and a four-star recruit by ESPN ... Named the D.C. Interscholastic Athletic Association Player of the Year in consecutive seasons after leading H.D. Woodson to the city title in 2015 and 2016 ... Currently enrolled at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

AGAU TAKES PART IN BIG EAST CONFERENCE SUMMER MEETING IN CHICAGO

- Georgetown men's basketball player Akoy Agau was among a group of representatives from the 10 BIG EAST member institutions who traveled to Chicago during the last weekend of June as part of the Conference's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) summer meeting.
- Student-athletes met to discuss important NCAA and BIG EAST Conference matters, while also hearing from various speakers, which included former student-athletes ... The SAAC representatives also participated in a service activity with the Special Olympics of Chicago.
- On Friday night, the student-athletes had a Welcome to Chicago dinner with BIG EAST Commissioner Val Ackerman, who shared her personal and professional experiences with the group from her former student-athlete days to her different executive positions in the work force.
- Saturday began with meetings at DePaul's Lincoln Park campus. Topics discussed included national issues that affect student-athletes today, such as time demands and NCAA governance; BIG EAST-centric issues that included SAAC's structure, various initiatives, the BIG EAST Health and Safety Working Group, the BIG EAST's position on the NCAA Autonomy Proposals, BIG EAST Championship feedback and review of the Athletic Director, SWA and Faculty Athletic Representative reports.
- "It was a good experience to be able to speak to and listen to some of our conference SAAC leaders," Agau said. "I was glad to have the chance to represent Georgetown and my team and to share my input on some of the topics that were discussed."

FORMER HOYA JONATHAN WALLACE JOINS MEN'S BASKETBALL STAFF

- Former Georgetown University men's basketball standout Jonathan Wallace has come back to the Hilltop, joining the coaching staff as a special assistant to Head Coach John Thompson III.
- Wallace, an All-BIG EAST guard who hit a game-tying 3-pointer in the 2007 NCAA Regionals to help lift the Hoyas past North Carolina and to the Final Four, finished his eighth season in the professional ranks this past season, playing for a team in Angola.
- Wallace ended up starting every game of his career (136), was part of four teams that went to the postseason, including three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08) and a BIG EAST Tournament Championship (2006-07) ... He ranks third all-time in career starts at Georgetown and the Hoyas won 100 games during his four-year career.
- Wallace earned All-BIG EAST honors in 2007-08 as a senior, when he was a co-captain and averaged 10.7 points, 2.6 assists and led the team with 71 3-point field goals ... As a junior in 2006-07, when the Hoyas went to the Final Four, he finished third on the team in scoring with 11.4 points and led the team with 73 3-pointers.
- For his career, Wallace averaged 9.2 points and 2.8 assists and hit 240 3-point field goals, the latter mark which stood as the school record until the 2015-16 season ... He ranks No. 24 all-time in scoring (1,256 points), third in 3-point field goal percentage (43.4%), fifth in free throw percentage (82.1%) and ninth all-time in assists (378).
- Following his graduation Wallace, who had been accepted in the Georgetown University School of Law, embarked on a professional career that took him from the NBA Developmental League to Germany,

- The Georgetown University men's basketball team will be among 16 schools to play in PK80, the Phil Knight Invitational, during Thanksgiving of 2017 ... The 16-team, early-season college basketball tournament will honor the Nike co-founder and 2012 Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Phil Knight in advance of his 80th birthday.
- The PK80, one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history, will be held from Thursday, Nov. 23 to Saturday, Nov. 26 in Portland, Ore., at the Rose Quarter's Moda Center and Veterans Memorial Coliseum.
- In addition to the Hoyas, participating schools include Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State, Stanford and Texas.
- "It's exciting to be a part of this tournament," Georgetown Head Coach John Thompson III said. "It is a privilege to be involved in an event that honors Phil Knight. Mr. Knight has not only been pivotal figure in college





athletics, but he has been a driving force in the entire sports industry. We are proud to participate in an event that celebrates him."

RECRUITING CLASS BRINGS EXPERIENCE

- The Georgetown recruiting class for the 2016-17 season featured four players, but more than anything, it brought experience, with one a graduate transfer and another a junior college transfer.
- Joining the team this season are graduate student Rodney Pryor, junior college transfer Jonathan Mulmore and freshman Jagan Mosely ... Another freshman, George Muresan, joined the team as a walk-on.
- Pryor, who transfers to Georgetown from Robert Morris University, was an All-Northeast Conference First Team selection in 2015-16, and was selected to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 18 Second Team ... He finished his senior year at Robert Morris leading the Colonials in scoring and rebounding, averaging 18.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game ... He ranked second and sixth, respectively, in the NEC in those categories.
- Pryor also ranked third in the conference in free-throw percentage (.863), eighth in steals (1.43 per game), ninth in three-point field goals made per game (1.75) and tied for 14th in blocks (0.79) ... He had eight double-doubles last year ... In addition, he was named the 2015 NEC Tournament Most Valuable Player after leading RMU to the championship and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.
- Mulmore comes to Georgetown after spending two years at Allegany College in Maryland ... He capped off a stellar two years by being named to the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I All-American Second Team.
- Behind the play of Mulmore, Allegany went 17-10 this season and earned berths in the Maryland Junior College Tournament, as well as a runner-up showing in the Region XX Tournament ... He earned first team honors to the All-Maryland JUCO and All-Region XX teams, and is the first player from Allegany to earn All-American honors since 2010.
- Mulmore set a new school record, averaging 26.1 points per game, while adding 5.9 assists and 4.3 rebounds ... His 26.1 scoring average, as well as his 254 free throws made, ranked second in the country for all of Division I.
- Mosely was named the New Jersey Player of the Year by NJ.com after leading St. Anthony's to a 32-0 record, the state title and a No. 4 ranking nationally ... He averaged 14.2 points per game, along with five assists and seven rebounds per game ... Mosely played for Team East in the Jordan Brand Classic and was a member of the U.S. All-Stars in the Capital Classic.

FOR OPENERS

- After the win over USC Upstate, Georgetown is 10-3 all-time in season openers under Head Coach John Thompson III, who is in his 13th year at the helm of the program ... The Hoyas are now 7-2 in season-opening games played at home.

JOHN THOMPSON III

HEAD COACH | 13TH SEASON
266-135 AT GEORGETOWN | 334-177 OVERALL

In 12 seasons as the head coach of the program he has been around since his youth, John Thompson III has made his mark not only on the Georgetown men's basketball program, but in the elite circles of college basketball. Thompson, who has been a collegiate head coach for 16 seasons, has compiled several coaching milestones:

- Since his arrival on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have reached the postseason in 11 of his 12 seasons on the sidelines.
- Including an appearance in 2015, Georgetown has been selected to the NCAA Tournament in eight of the last 12 seasons.
- In six of the team's eight NCAA Tournament appearances, the Blue & Gray have been seeded among the top four teams, earning three No. 2 seeds (2007, 2008, 2013), two No. 3 seeds (2010, 2012) and a No. 4 seed (2015).
- In 2006-07, Thompson led the program to a 30-7 record as the Hoyas won the BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the NCAA East Regional and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since 1985.
- In 2007-08, the Hoyas won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08), posting a two-year record of 28-6 against conference opponents.
- In 2012-13, the Blue & Gray won the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, winning 11-straight games at one point, and Thompson was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year.
- He has led the Hoyas to three appearances in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game.
- He has twice been named the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

An outstanding talent evaluator who has been nationally recognized for his in-game coaching, tremendous vision and character, outstanding recruiting and his ability to connect with players, John Thompson III was introduced as Georgetown University's 17th head coach on April 20, 2004.

Thompson arrived on the Hilltop in 2004 with a tremendous pedigree. The second head coach at Georgetown named John Thompson, he is the child of one Hall of Fame coach and the student of another, having played for the legendary Pete Carril as an undergraduate at Princeton.

In 12 years at Georgetown, Thompson has guided the Hoyas to a 266-135 overall record (.663 win percentage) and to a 126-84 record in conference play.

Overall in 16 years as a head coach, including four at his alma mater, Princeton, Thompson has compiled a 334-177 (.654) overall record, with a 171-95 record in conference play (BIG EAST and Ivy League combined), won six league championships and guided his teams to 12 postseason appearances.

Since arriving on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have advanced to one Final Four (2006-07), won a BIG EAST Tournament title (2006-07), won three BIG EAST regular season titles including back-to-back league titles (2006-07, 2007-08, 2012-13), reached the NCAA Tournament eight times (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2014-15), been invited to the National Invitation Tournament three times (2004-05, 2008-09 and 2013-14) and played in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game three times.

In 12 seasons as the head coach of the program he has been around since his youth, John Thompson III has made his mark not only on the Georgetown men's basketball program, but in the elite circles of college basketball. Thompson, who has been a collegiate head coach for 16 seasons, has compiled several coaching milestones:

- Since his arrival on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have reached the postseason in 11 of his 12 seasons on the sidelines.

- In 2006-07, Thompson led the program to a 30-7 record as the Hoyas won the BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the NCAA East Regional and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since 1985.
- In 2007-08, the Hoyas won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08), posting a two-year record of 28-6 against conference opponents.
- In 2012-13, the Blue & Gray won the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, winning 11-straight games at one point, and Thompson was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year.
- He has led the Hoyas to three appearances in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game.
- He has twice been named the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

During that time, Georgetown has been ranked among the top 25 teams in the country for 38-straight weeks and is among the winningest programs in the BIG EAST. In addition, in a span of four years (2006-07 – 2009-10), more Georgetown players (5) were selected in the NBA Draft than any other school in the BIG EAST Conference. He has coached two BIG EAST Players of the Year, five All-Americans, nine First Team All-BIG EAST selections and 30 players who have earned All-BIG EAST accolades. Thompson is also a two-time winner of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year Award and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

Georgetown finished the 2014-15 season with a 22-11 record, the eighth time the team has won at least 20 games under his direction and the fifth time in the last six years. A win over Florida in the Battle 4 Atlantis, one over Indiana at Madison Square Garden and a win at home against Villanova were among the highlights as Georgetown earned the No. 2 seed in the BIG EAST Tournament. Junior guard D'Vaunte Smith-Rivera, the preseason BIG EAST Player of the Year, was an All-BIG EAST First Team selection.

The Hoyas finished the 2013-14 season with an 18-15 record and advanced to the second round of the NIT. Senior guard Markel Starks was named All-BIG EAST First Team, the eighth player to earn first team honors under Thompson.

Georgetown won its third BIG EAST Regular Season title under Thompson during the 2012-13 season, when the team posted a 14-4 conference record to finish atop the league standings. Along the way, the Hoyas won 11-straight games against conference opponents, including a regular season sweep of long-time rival Syracuse. The Hoyas were a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished the year with a 25-7 overall record. Sophomore forward Otto Porter Jr. was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year and earned First Team All-America honors while also being a finalist for the Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy.

One of his best coaching seasons came during the 2011-12 season, when he guided a young Hoya team that was picked to finish in 10th place in the BIG EAST to a tie for fourth place. Georgetown finished the season with a 24-9 record and was seeded No. 3 in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the second round. Highlight wins included a 91-88 overtime thriller against then-No. 8 Memphis in the Maui Invitational and an impressive road win at then-No. 4 Louisville to start BIG EAST play. Senior guard Jason Clark was a First Team All-BIG EAST selection and received the league's Sportsmanship Award, while senior center Henry Sims was a Third Team All-BIG EAST selection and Hollis Thompson earned honorable mention accolades.

Georgetown finished the 2010-11 season with a 21-11 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in seven years. The Blue & Gray started the season with eight-straight wins, with victories at Old Dominion, winning the Charleston Classic and beating then-No. 9 Missouri, 111-102 in overtime, in one of the best college basketball games of the season. The Hoyas, who earned a first round bye in the BIG EAST Tournament with a 10-8 regular season record in league play, played against a schedule rated No. 1 in the country and were among the top 20 teams in the RPI Ratings. Senior guard Austin Freeman was a First Team All-BIG EAST selection and earned

honorable mention All-America honors, while fellow senior Chris Wright was named Third Team All-BIG EAST.

In 2009-10, the Hoyas finished the season with a 23-11 overall record, made a thrilling run to the championship game of the BIG EAST Tournament and were selected as a No.3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Georgetown was the only school in the country to defeat 2010's NCAA Finalists (Duke and Butler) and was the only school to play three teams that reached the Final Four (Duke, Butler, West Virginia). The team was challenged by a schedule that ranked No. 1 in the country by strength of schedule for much of the season and responded to that with signature wins, including non-conference wins over Temple during ESPN's "24 Hours of College Basketball," Butler at the Jimmy V Classic, Washington during the John Wooden Classic and Duke, in front of a sold-out crowd wearing gray and an audience that included the President and Vice President of the United States. The Hoyas, who finished the season No. 2 in strength of schedule and No. 13 in the RPI ratings, also had impressive conference wins, including a come-from-behind win at home against Connecticut when Austin Freeman scored 28 of his 33 points in the second half and a stirring rout of Villanova in front of a crowd of nearly 10,000 on the day the District was hit with more than two feet of snow. Sophomore center Greg Monroe, who declared for the NBA Draft at the conclusion of the season, was named First Team All-BIG EAST, earned Third Team Associated Press All-America honors and was named the Pete Newell Big Man of the Year by the NABC.

In 2008-09, Georgetown made its fifth-straight postseason appearance under Thompson, advancing to the NIT where the team lost to eventual runner-up Baylor in the first round. Freshman center Greg Monroe was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, becoming the sixth Georgetown player in history to earn the award.

The Hoyas made their third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance during the 2007-08 season, tabbed as the No. 2 seed before losing in the second round. Thompson's team earned a 28-6 (.823) mark, going 15-3 in BIG EAST play to garner its second-consecutive regular season championship, a feat previously unmatched in Hoya history. His team appeared in the national polls all 20 weeks of the season, never dropping lower than 12th and senior Patrick Ewing Jr. earned the inaugural BIG EAST Sixth Man Award.

During his third season as Georgetown's head coach, in 2006-07, Thompson saw his Hoyas win the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, the BIG EAST Tournament Championship as well as the NCAA East Regional Championship while compiling a 30-7 record. The Hoyas appeared in the national polls 18 times, defeated seven nationally-ranked opponents and compiled a conference record of 13-3. Thompson saw junior Jeff Green named BIG EAST Player of the Year, MVP of the BIG EAST Tournament and MVP of the NCAA East Regional. Green was the fifth player selected in the 2007 NBA Draft.

In his second season at the helm, Thompson's Hoyas made their presence felt with a thrilling run to the Sweet 16. This was his fifth trip to the postseason in six years as a head coach. A first-round victory over Northern Iowa and a second-round defeat of Ohio State advanced Georgetown to its first Regional Semifinal since 2001. The Hoyas, who fell just three points shy of a victory over the eventual national champion Florida Gators, ended the year with a 23-10 overall record, earning Thompson the Black Coaches Association's Fritz Pollard Male Coach of the Year Award.

In his inaugural season as GU's head coach, Thompson's approach took a giant leap when he became one of only three coaches in BIG EAST history to defeat a nationally-ranked team in the conference opener. The Hoyas ended up winning 19 games and advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals.

Off the court, Thompson has been an active member of Georgetown University and a presence in the Washington, D.C. community. He speaks at a variety of alumni events throughout the year and has annually joined the members of the Georgetown University Wall Street Alliance in New York City each October. Through his work with his self-named foundation, the JTIII Foundation (which was founded in 2007), Thompson and his wife, Monica, have worked to aid community-based charities that serve at-risk children and families.

Thompson also has international experience, serving as an assistant coach on the USA Basketball Men's Under-18 National team that competed in the 2008 FIBA Americas U-18 Championship in Argentina.

In addition, Thompson is also very active with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and serves on that organization's Board of Directors.

Prior to coaching at Georgetown, Thompson guided Princeton to three Ivy League Championships, two NCAA tournaments and an NIT appearance over his four years as head coach. He amassed a 68-42 record as

Princeton's head coach after serving as an assistant coach at Princeton from 1995-2000. As assistant coach, he helped lead the team to a top 10 national ranking and five-consecutive postseason appearances.

Princeton not only made the postseason eight of nine years during Thompson's tenure, but he helped recruit and coach three All-Americans, three Ivy League Players of the Year, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year and 12 First Team All-Ivy League players.

Thompson also played basketball as an undergraduate for the Tigers while majoring in politics. As a forward, he ranks third on Princeton's all-time assist leader list with 358. Playing for legendary coach Pete Carril, Thompson produced with amazing proficiency with 103 assists and just 34 turnovers as a senior. He was co-captain of the 1988 team and shared the B.F. Bunn trophy that year as one of the Tigers' Most Valuable Players.

Thompson, 49, grew up in Washington, D.C., where he graduated from Gonzaga College High School. As a high school senior he was named First Team All-Met by the Washington Post.

Thompson's wife, Monica, is also a Princeton grad (Class of '89). They have three children: Morgan, John Wallace and Matthew.
