Starting Five, Plus One

• Thad Matta will become Ohio State's record holder for most games coached in a career when the game tips off vs. Wisconsin. His teams have played in 456 games to date (335-121). Matta tied Fred Taylor (455) for the No. 2 spot all time in the game vs. Michigan State Feb. 14 and Harold G. Olsen's 456 games (259-197) the last time out vs. Nebraska (Feb. 18). Taylor was on the sidelines from 1959-76 (297-158).

• In Thad Matta's 13 seasons at Ohio State, the Buckeyes have been swept in a regular season home-and-home series with a Big Ten foe just 10 times. Ohio State has played 85 home-and-home series in Matta's tenure to date. The Buckeyes have swept 35 and split 40 series with Big Ten foes in Matta's tenure. When the Buckeyes fall in the first game of a home-and-home Big Ten regular season series, Ohio State is 24-9 in the second game of the series under Matta.

• Thad Matta is among the final 16 coaches who advanced to the third round of the Infiniti Coaches' Charity Challenge. Third-round voting to advance to final round of four coaches is open now and runs through Feb. 26. Vote daily for Coach Matta and Ronald McDonald House Charities of Central Ohio at www.ESPN.com/Infiniti.

• Senior Marc Loving became the 53rd Buckeye all-time to reach 1,000 career points. He is the 12th player in the Thad Matta era to reach 1,000. His point total of 1,297 is 30th on the all-time Ohio State scoring list. No. 29 is Jamar Butler with 1,313. Against Maryland Feb. 11, junior Jae'Sean Tate became the 54th Buckeye to reach 1,000 career points and the 13th in the Matta era. He passed Jason Singleton (1,022) and Bill Andreas (1,023) on the Ohio State all-time scoring list with 14 points vs. Nebraska to move into the No. 49 spot all time. Buckeyes Have Most Home Wins Since 2010

Ohio State has the most home wins nationally with a 133-21 (.869) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 15 with 118-21 record. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes also own the national lead in home victories with 148 wins over 172 games (148-24). The Buckeyes also have played the third-most ranked teams in the country during the Thad Matta era (2005-present). Ohio State has played 126 opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 since Matta became head coach. That total trails only Michigan State (134) and West Virginia (133) during that span (*see page 7 for more information*).

- Thad Matta is No. 13 all-time in career Big Ten regular-season victories ... Matta owns 148 career league triumphs. He passed Harold "Bud" Foster (WIS 1935-59) who won 143 league encounters with the win over Michigan State (72-67/Jan. 15 in Columbus). The No. 12 spot is held by former Ohio State coach Harold Olsen (1923-46). He won 154 league games over his tenure.
- Marc Loving is working on becoming Ohio State's 27th player with 1,000 career points and 500 career boards...Jae'Sean Tate became the 26th to accomplish the feat with 20 points at Maryland Feb. 11. He has 1,029 points (11.3 ppg.) and 526 caroms (5.8 rpg.) over 91 career appearances...Tate reached 500 rebounds with five at Michigan Feb. 4...Loving has 1,297 career points (10.0 ppg.) and 496 career rebounds (3.8 rpg.).

- Since Thad Matta took over the Ohio State program the Buckeyes have competed against 126 opponents ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25, the third-most games against ranked foes in all of NCAA Division I men's basketball. The Buckeyes are 54-72 in those games with a winning percentage of .429. That win total ranks No. 11 nationally for victories vs. ranked opponents since 2004-05.
- The Buckeyes are 6-6 on the year in games decided by five or fewer points. Wins have come against Michigan (70-66), Providence (72-67), Connecticut (64-60), UNC Asheville (79-77), Michigan State (72-67), and at Nebraska (67-66). Losses have been to Virginia (63-61) on the road, Florida Atlantic (79-77), at Illinois (75-70), Purdue (76-75), Northwestern (74-72) and Nebraska (58-57)
- Jae'Sean Tate is one of two Power 5 Conference players 6-4 or shorter averaging more than six rebounds per game (Markelle Fultz of Washington is averaging 6.0). Overall, Tate is 18th nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 6.1 rebounds per game ... he also is tied for 16th nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 1.8 offensive rebounds per game.

• Trevor Thompson has the second-most double-doubles (10) nationally among players averaging fewer than 24 minutes per game. In games where Thompson comes off the bench, he is averaging the second-most rebounds per game nationally at 8.5.

Buckeyes Balanced on Offense

Through 28 games, Ohio State has five players contributing 10 or more points a game. Junior Jae'Sean Tate leads the way with 14.0 ppg. He is followed by senior Marc Loving (12.6), sophomore JaQuan Lyle (11.0), junior Trevor Thompson (10.7) and junior Kam Williams (10.1). Junior Keita Bates-Diop, who is out for the remainder of the season (stress fracture, left leg) averaged 9.7 ppg. in nine appearances this year. Thompson's 9.4 rebounds a game leads the team.

Thompson's Effort on the Glass vs. UConn One of Best in Matta Era

Since Thad Matta took over at Ohio State in 2004-05, there have been eight games in which a Buckeye recorded 17 or more rebounds. Trevor Thompson recorded a career-best with 17 boards vs. Connecticut. He also tallied a career-high 17 points in the 64-60 win. Both Greg Oden (vs. Purdue, 3/10/07) and Jared Sullinger (vs. South Carolina Dec. 18, 2010) recorded 19-rebound games. Sullinger also had a pair of games with 18 boards (both vs. Northwestern 3/11/11, 2/29/12). Evan Turner recorded two games with 17 caroms (vs. Alcorn State 11/9/09; and James Madison 11/12/09). Turner's effort vs. Alcorn State was part of triple-double in which he scored 14 points and handed out 10 assists. Terence Dials also grabbed 17 boards in a game vs. Illinois (12/12/06).

Ohio State vs. Wisconsin

Ohio State leads the all-time series with the Badgers 86-70. Ohio State owns a 53-23 advantage in Columbus while Wisconsin is 46-29 in Madison. The teams have met five times on neutral courts in the Big Ten Tournament with the Buckeyes owning a 4-1 edge in those games. Ohio State is 11-13 all-time against Badger teams ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25. Thad Matta teams are 12-14 overall vs. Wisconsin, which includes a win each while coaching Butler and Xavier. Matta's Ohio State teams are 5-4 in Columbus and 2-9 in Madison. Jae'Sean Tate averages 10.7 points and 4.3 rebounds

Ohio State plays host to the No. 16 Badgers, who enter the game with an overall record of 22-5 and 11-3 in the Big Ten. Sophomore Ethan Happ leads the team in scoring with 14.7 points and a team high 6.0 rebounds per game. Senior Bronson Koenig adds 13.3 points per game. Classmate Nigel Hayes chips in with 13.6 ppg.

Ohio State, playing its third straight game without Keita Bates-Diop, who's out for the season with a stress fracture in his leg, allowed Wisconsin to turn 21 offensive rebounds into 28 second-chance points. JaQuan Lyle led the Buckeyes with 13 points while Trevor Thompson added 11 points, nine boards and four blocks. Kam Williams and Jae'Sean Tate also scored in double-figures for the Buckeyes with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

Ohio State is competing in its 105th season as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 2016-17. The Buckeyes own an overall record of 800-711 against current league members. Thad Matta, in 17 seasons as a head coach, owns an overall record of 175-88 vs. league members, including a mark of 171-85 while coaching the Buckeyes.

Ohio State Opponents Highly Ranked

Thad Matta's Buckeyes have faced the third-most ranked (AP) opponents nationally (125) since he became head coach at Ohio State in 2005. The 2016-17 season will be no different. Six Ohio State opponents are currently ranked among the Top 25 in the *Associated Press* poll. No. 14 Virginia and No. 6 UCLA along with Big Ten Conference foes Wisconsin (11), Maryland (23) and Purdue (16) are ranked opponents on Ohio State's 2016-17 schedule. The Buckeyes play a total of seven games vs. opponents currently ranked in the AP poll.

Matta Streak vs. Non-Conference Foes

Thad Matta has directed Ohio State to at least 10 wins during non-conference play in 12 of his 13 full seasons in Columbus. Matta is 164-36 vs. non-conference competition at Ohio State and 171-85 vs. Big Ten foes (regular season and Big Ten tournament games) for an overall record of 335-121. In 17 seasons as a head coach (1 at Butler, 3 at Xavier and 13 at Ohio State) Matta is 175-88 vs. the current roster of Big Ten teams. He has winning records vs. 10-of-13 league opponents: ILL (17-6), IND (12-10), IOWA (13-8), MICH (20-7), MINN (15-7), NW (19-2), PSU (21-2), PUR (18-9), NEB (10-2) and RUT (4-0). He is three games under .500 vs. Michigan State (12-16) and is two under vs. Wisconsin (12-14) and Maryland (2-5).

Rookie Starters in Matta Era

Thad Matta has started seven freshmen in their first game at Ohio State during his tenure (2005-present). Four of those rookies did so from 2005-06 to 2006-07. Rookie Micah Potter, a freshman center from Mentor, Ohio, started his first game as a Buckeye at Navy Nov. 14. The two most recent freshman starters were Jared Sullinger at center in 2010-11 and rookie guard D'Angelo Russell in 2014-15. David Lighty and Mike Conley Jr. were the first freshmen starters in the Matta era in 2006. Jon Diebler and Kosta Koufos got the starting nod in 2007-08.

Tate on Erving Watch List

Junior forward Jae'Sean Tate is one of 20 players nationally to earn a spot on the 2017 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award preseason watch list, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced Oct. 19. Tate is among the Buckeyes' top six returning scorers from last season at 11.7 points per game. He is tied with classmate Keita Bates-Diop as the top returning rebounder as well with 6.4 boards a contest. After sustaining a shoulder injury late in the 2015-16 campaign, Tate missed the final seven games to concentrate in rehabilitation.

Matta Among Top 50 Active Coaches in Wins

Among active NCAA Division I coaches entering this season, Thad Matta ranked No. 43 in total wins in 16 years as a head coach. His 422 career victories entering 2016-17 are just behind Gregg Marshall of Wichita State with 424. Matta has coached the fewest number of seasons among the Top 50 coaches by wins in the country. Mark Few is the next closest with 17 full seasons and 466 career wins at Gonzaga. He is ranked No. 34 among active coaches in victories entering the 2016-17 season. Matta entered 2016-17 with a career win percentage of .752 (422-139). Among active Division I coaches, that win percentage ranks No. 7 nationally. Among all-time NCAA Division I coaches, Matta ranks No. 20 by win percentage at .752 (422-139).

Buckeyes to Play in 2017 PK80 Event in Portland

Ohio State has been selected to play in the PK80-Phil Knight Invitational Nov. 23-26, 2017 in Portland, Oregon. The event honors Nike founder Phil Knight, who will turn 80 years old next year. Sixteen Nike schools will participate in the event. The participating schools are: Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State, Stanford and Texas. Two eight-team events -- consisting of three games per team -- will run simultaneously in the two buildings (the Rose Quarter's Moda Center and Veterans Memorial Coliseum) with the crowning of two bracket champions. All games from Portland will be televised on ESPN networks.

The Buckeyes travelled to open the season to play in the Veterans Classic at Navy (W, 78-68, Nov. 11).

Matta Owns 11 Wins vs. Top 5 Foes at OSU

Over Thad Matta's tenure in Columbus (2005-present), the Buckeyes have defeated 11 opponents ranked among the Top 5 in the weekly *Associated Press* Poll. The most recent win was a 74-67 win over No. 4 Kentucky at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015. That game marked the second time an unranked Matta team knocked off a Top 5 foe. The other was his first win over a Top 5 foe while coaching the Buckeyes, a 65-64 win over No. 1 and previously undefeated Illinois March 6, 2005 in the regular season finale for both teams in Columbus. Matta's Buckeyes have knocked off the nation's No. 1 team twice, No. 2 three times, No. 3 twice, No. 4 twice and No. 5 twice. Ohio State has four home wins vs. Top 5 in the Matta era, two true road wins and five neutral site victories.

Matta Reaches Career, Ohio State History

Thad Matta has made a habit of achieving records and milestones over his coaching career, which spans 17 years. After a season at Butler, three at Xavier and the last 13 in Columbus, Matta coached his 500th career game as a head coach Dec. 13 vs. Morehead State. As an Ohio State head coach, the 13th in the history of the program, Matta set the all-time wins record, surpassing Fred Taylor's 297 career victories over 18 seasons from 1959-1976, with a 79-73 win vs. Minnesota March 12, 2015 in Chicago. The Minnesota victory also gave him his 400th career win (437-152). Matta teams have never failed to win at least 20 games. His Ohio State teams have averaged 26.7 victories over his 12 full years in Columbus. He coached in his 400th career game (335-121) at Ohio State when the Buckeyes defeated VMI Dec. 5, 2016 (89-62).

Since Thad Matta took over the Ohio State program the Buckeyes have competed against 126 opponents ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25, the third-most games against ranked foes in all of NCAA Division I men's basketball. Matta Continues to Build Impressive Ohio State Resume

Thad Matta has accomplished a remarkable list of accomplishments in 13 years as head coach of the Buckeyes. Matta's teams have never failed to win 20 games, a record streak (12 seasons) in Ohio State history. In fact, Matta has never failed to reach the 20-win plateau in 16 years as a head coach. The Buckeyes finished 24-11 in 2014-15, advancing to their seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament. Ohio State has reached 30 or more wins three times, all with Matta at the helm. Back-to-back seasons with 30 wins in 2010-11 (34) and 2011-12 (31) only trail the 35 wins recorded in 2006-07, the Ohio State record for single-season victories. In addition, Matta has five Big Ten regular-season titles, including three of the last six (2010-12), four Big Ten postseason tournament crowns in seven title game opportunities, nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including four-consecutive runs to the "Sweet 16," from 2010-13, a pair of Final Four trips (2007, 2012) and a title game appearance in 2007. Throw in a National Invitation Tournament title in 2009 and another appearance in 2016 and Matta has guided the Buckeyes to postseason play in 11-consecutive attempts and in every year in which Ohio State was eligible.

Matta's Big Ten Tenure

Thad Matta took over the head coaching duties at Ohio State in July of 2004. His 13 years in Columbus have been a successful stint, both nationally and in the Big Ten Conference.

Matta vs. the Big Ten: Matta's Buckeyes have played in the second most games (456) with more victories (335) than any other Big Ten program in the last 13 years. Michigan State and Wisconsin are next in victories (333). Michigan State is the leader in total games (459).

Matta in the B1G Regular Season: The Buckeyes have won 148 Big Ten regular-season games, with 11-consecutive years winning at least 10 conference games. The Buckeyes have won 76 percent of league games decided by 10 or more points (83-27) in the Matta era. In games decided by less than 10 points, Ohio State is 65-50 (.565).

B1G Titles in the Matta Era: Ohio State has more overall conference titles (9) than any other league school over the last 12 years. Five of those are regular-season titles while four are conference tournament crowns. Michigan State is the next closest with six titles, three in the regular season and three conference tournament titles.

Defending the 3 in Matta Era

Over the 13 years with Thad Matta as the head coach in Columbus, Ohio State is 100-23 (.813) when holding opponents to less than five made 3s. When foes make between 5-9 from distance, Ohio State is 185-71 (.723) and when opponents make 10 or more, the Buckeyes are 51-27 (.654). Ohio State is 266-86 (.756) when making at least five 3-pointers, 67-12 when making 10 or more (.848) and 69-35 (.663) when connecting on four or fewer.

Matta Perfect at Home vs. Big Ten Rookies

Since joining the Big Ten in 2004-05, Thad Matta has taken on 17 Big Ten rookie coaches. Matta is 23-6 overall in games vs. the league newcomers, including a 16-0 record at Value City Arena in Columbus. 105 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 104 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2016. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 104 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 27 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 51 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Evan Turner Elected to Athletics Hall of Fame

Evan Turner was once again recognized for his accomplishments at Ohio State when he was inducted into the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during ceremonies Sept. 9 in Columbus. Turner is the 38th men's basketball player to earn a spot in the Ohio State Athletics HOF. Turner had his No. 21 jersey honored Feb. 16, 2016 during a halftime ceremony when the Buckeyes played Michigan (W, 76-66) at Value City Arena. Turner, the 2010 National Player of the Year, had a banner unveiled baring his jersey No. 21 alongside Ohio State's three other national players of the year.

Buckeyes Win Global Sports Invitational

The game vs. Marshall (W, 111-70, Nov. 25) gave Ohio State the 2016 Global Sports Invitational title. The Buckeyes also defeated North Carolina Central (69-63, Nov. 14), Western Carolina (66-38, Nov. 21) and Jackson State (78-47, Nov. 23) in the event.

CBS Sports Classic-Extended Through 2019

Ohio State will once again participate in the CBS Sports Classic when the event is renewed next season. The Buckeyes, Kentucky, North Carolina and UCLA will once again comprise the field. Ohio State will take on North Carolina Dec. 23, 2017 in New Orleans. The dates and locations for the 2018 and 2019 games have not been determined. The Buckeyes are 1-2 in the event to date with a

Matta Has Faced, Defeated Top Active Coaches

Ohio State's Thad Matta has faced 18 of the Top 25 active coaches by wins entering the 2016-17 season and has wins against all 18. Of the Top 10 coaches, Matta has faced and defeated eight. Matta entered the season No. 6 among active coaches in win percentage at .752 (422-139). In addition to owning wins vs. the top active coaches, Matta has a victory vs Coach Bob Knight, the No. 5 all-time winningest coach in NCAA history. Ohio State defeated Texas Tech, where Knight finished his coaching career, 77-71 Dec. 16, 2004 in Dallas. That game was Matta's ninth as Ohio State's head coach.

This is Matta's 17th year as a head coach and the 13th at Ohio State. He spent three seasons at Xavier (2002-2004) and one season at Butler (2001).

In the 18 most recent wins vs. the Top 24 active coaches by wins, Matta teams have been ranked among the Top 10 in nine of the wins, were unranked in eight, faced Top 25 teams seven times and matched up against unranked opponents on 10 occasions. Opponents were ranked among the Top 10 four times.

Matta Has Best Record Since 2004-05

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 74 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the second-most regular-season Big Ten Conference wins with 148 and most overall wins with 335. Ohio State's 215 home wins in the Matta era rates No. 1 nationally and his home win percentage of .881 (215-30) also is No. 4 among all Division I programs.

Buckeyes Own Four 1-Loss/Perfect Home Seasons Under Matta

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his 12 full seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07 squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (18-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 215-30 overall in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools, during his tenure after finishing the 2013-14 season 17-3 at home and finishing 2014-15 at 18-2. The Buckeyes finished 15-6 at home in 2015-16. Ohio State was 16-2 in 2012-13. Ohio State is 126-8 at home vs. non-conference opponents and 89-22 vs. Big Ten competition.

Matta Owns Top Win Percentage Among Ohio State Coaches

Thad Matta, now in his 13th season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 73.5 (335-121) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 148-77 (225 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.658) also has produced the highest winning percentage in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. Fred Taylor (1959-76) is second in both overall win percentage (.653/297-158) and Big Ten win percentage (.608/158-102) in 18 seasons.

The Buckeyes vs. Unranked (AP) Opponents - Matta Era

- Thad Matta is 191-10 in Columbus vs. unranked opponents. The Buckeyes have lost just five times to an unranked non-conference opponent during his 13 years at Ohio State. The losses were at the hands of West Virginia Dec. 27, 2008, UT Arlington Nov. 21, 2015, Louisiana Tech Nov. 24, 2015, Florida March 20, 2016 and Florida Atlantic Dec. 6, 2016.
- The Buckeyes are 121-5 vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home under Matta.
- Ohio State is 70-5 in Columbus with Matta at the helm vs. unranked Big Ten opponents.
- Ohio State had won 62-consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the loss to UT Arlington Nov. 20.
- Matta began his career with a 45-game win streak vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the lone loss to WVU in 2008.

MATTA REACHES 400 GAMES COACHED AT OHIO STATE, OWNS OSU CAREER GAMES COACHED RECORD

The Buckeyes defeated VMI Dec. 5, 2015 in the 400th game for Thad Matta as head coach of the Buckeyes. He is the third coach to reach 400 (456) or more games at Ohio State's helm. Against Wisconsin Feb. 23, 2017, Matta will claim the record for most games coached in Ohio State history with 457 (game 29 of season 13). In the seventh game of his 12th season, Matta reached game No. 400. When Ohio State played at Illinois Jan. 5, 2013, Matta coached in game No. 300 at Ohio State. Only two previous coaches, Harold G. Olsen (1923-46) and Fred Taylor (1959-76), have reached 400 or more games at Ohio State. Olsen coached 456 (259-197) and Taylor 455 (297-158). Matta's winning percentage after 100 games was second only to Taylor. At 200 games, Matta tied Taylor for best winning percentage to that point in OSU history. Matta's winning mean of .773 at 300 games topped Taylor and Olsen at the 300-game plateau. Ohio State's 75.5 winning percentage after 400 games under Matta is the best in school history.

Game 1 Ohio State 78, Navy 68 Nov. 11, 2016, Annapolis

ANNAPOLIS, Md. -- Kam Williams scored 23 points to lead Ohio State past Navy 78-68 in the nightcap of the Veterans Classic. Keita Bates-Diop had 14 points and 14 rebounds, while Trevor Thompson added 11 points for the Buckeyes, who shot 27 of 47 (57.4 percent) from the field. Ohio State has all five starters back from last season and that experience was vital against the Midshipmen. Navy tied the game, 35-35, on a dunk by Aaron Briggs with 18:20 left. From there, Ohio State gradually pulled away and a layup by Trevor Thompson, who scored 11 points, provided the first double-digit lead, 47-37, midway through the second half. The Buckeyes picked up the pace and consecutive dunks by Jae'Sean Tate and Marc Loving boosted the margin to 12 with 10:50 left. The Midshipmen did not threaten the rest of the way. Loving, an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection last season, finished with 13 points. Hasan Abdullah scored 22 points in his first career start for Navy.

COLUMBUS, Ohio. -- JaQuan Lyle scored 17 and Jae'Sean Tate added 14 and 11 rebounds as Ohio State routed Western Carolina 66-38 Monday. Kam Williams added 13 points and Trevor Thompson had 10 for Ohio State. The Buckeyes shot just 41.8 percent from the floor, but outbounded Western Carolina 44-33. The Buckeyes trailed 4-2 early before opening up the game with a 9-0 run and cruising from there. Western Carolina shot just 27.5 percent from the floor and committed 20 turnovers. Haboubacar Mutombo led the Southern Conference team with 11 points, and Marc Gosselin had nine points and 14 rebounds. The Buckeyes dominated inside, scoring 36 points in the paint, compared with just 10 for Western Carolina. Marc Loving and Kam Williams led the Buckeyes in scoring with 19 and 15 points, respectively. Paris Collins led the Tigers with 19 points, 14 in the first half. After going down 15-9 following a 13-2 run by JSU, the Buckeyes went on a 14-0 run, and then capped off the final 6:14 of the first half with a 17-3 run. Lyle found Jae'Sean Tate for three and-one opportunities and went to Trevor Thompson on back-to-back alley oops at the end of the first half. Williams was 5 for 5 in the first half, and Loving went 3 for 5 from 3 in the second 20 minutes. The Tigers had a 37-32 edge on the boards, but OSU had 20 assists compared to JSU's nine. Ohio State shot 55 percent from the field while holding the Tigers to just 30 percent.

Game 6

Ohio State 111, Marshall 70

Nov. 25, 2016, Columbus

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Marc Loving scored 20 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead Ohio State to a 111-70 win over Marshall on Friday night. Loving's offensive effort moved him over 1,000 career points at Ohio State, the 53rd Buckeye in history to accomplish the feat. Jae'Sean Tate added 20 points, and Kam Williams made five 3-pointers and finished with 17 points for the Buckeyes. Trevor Thompson scored a season-high 15 points, and Micah Potter had 12 points and 12 rebounds for Ohio State. The Buckeyes outbounded Marshall 61-32. Jon Elmore scored 14 of his season-high 25 points in the first half for Marshall (4-1). Austin Loop had 15 points. Ohio State trailed briefly after Loop hit a quick shot to start the game before stretching out to a 12-7 lead four minutes into the first half. A 13-0 run gave the Buckeyes a 38-14 lead with nine minutes left in the half. The Buckeyes shot 55 percent from the floor but only 11 of 23 from the free-throw line.

- This matchup marks the second meeting between Ohio State and Marshall. The Buckeyes are 2-0 against the Herd all-time.
- Ohio State is 8-4 against teams that currently make up Conference USA.
- The Buckeyes started the season 6-0 for the first time since 2013.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- London Perrantes scored 15 of his 19 points in the second half and No. 6 Virginia rallied past Ohio State 63-61 Wednesday in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Devon Hall added 12 points for the Cavaliers, who trailed by as many as 16 points in the first half and didn't take the lead for good until Marial Shayok's baseline runner made it 59-57 with 1:58 remaining. The Buckeyes trailed 63-61 when Shayok missed two free throws with 10.5 seconds left. Coach Thad Matta called a timeout with 6.5 seconds to play, but JaQuan Lyle couldn't find an open teammate as the clock ran down and launched a 3-point try that missed. Jae'Sean Tate led Ohio State with 14 points and Lyle had 12. The loss was just the second for a Matta team at Ohio State when it lead by 15 or more points at any point in a game (214-2). The Buckeyes connected on 60 percent of their shots in the first half (15-25) while holding Virginia to just 29 percent shooting (8-28). Ohio State led 36-24 at the break.

Jae'Sean Tate and Trevor Thompson each had double-doubles for OSU, combining for 22 points and 25 rebounds. Williams, getting his fifth-consecutive start for the injured Keita Bates-Diop, shot 7 for 13 from the field, hitting 3 of 6 from long range. Fairleigh Dickinson trailed by just one point heading into halftime, but OSU opened the second half with an 18-2 run to stretch its advantage to 51-34 with 14:34 to go. Later, leading by just six points, OSU's JaQuan Lyle iced the game with two free throws. COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Jae'Sean Tate and JaQuan Lyle led Ohio State with 17 points each and Kam Williams made two free throws with four seconds left to ice the Buckeyes' 79-77 win over UNC Asheville. Ohio State continued to hold off the Spartans until a Kyle Ahrens 3-pointer put the Spartans on top 48-46 with 14:45 remaining in the contest. The teams continued to go back and forth until a 10-0 Buckeye run, including five points from Lyle, a corner 3-pointer from Tate and a Thompson layup pushed the Ohio State lead to 66-58 with 5:33 left to play. Michigan State then cut the Buckeye advantage to 70-67 on a Bridges free throw with 20 seconds remaining but free throws from Williams and Tate iced the game as the Buckeyes picked up their first Big Ten win of 2017.

The Huskers hit 50 percent from the field in the first half but just 29.2 percent in the second. Webster had 18 points to lead the Huskers.

Lyle missed two foul shots with 32 seconds left, but Minnesota fouled him again and he converted both to make it 77-72.

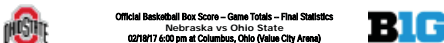
Nebraska 58, Ohio State 57

Feb. 18, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Tai Webster scored 17 points and Nebraska rallied in the last minute to edge Ohio State 58-57. The Huskers chipped away in the second half, and Glynn Watson Jr. tied the score at 57 with a layup with 12 seconds left, then went to the line to convert a free-throw for the one-point lead. A desperation shot just before the buzzer by Ohio State's Jae'Sean Tate was off the mark as Nebraska won its second straight game. Watson had 14 points and Jack McVeigh added 11 for the Huskers, who won despite shooting 38 percent. Tate had 14 points and 10 rebounds, and Marc Loving and Trevor Thompson both added 13 for Ohio State. The Buckeyes shot 41 percent. Ohio State led by 11 with 5 1/2 minutes left, but a 7-2 run in the last 4 1/2 half minutes allowed the Huskers to close it to 30-24 at the break. Nebraska shot 33 percent from the floor, including 2 for 9 from beyond the arc, and didn't have a basket in the last 2:54.

Notes:

- The Buckeyes lead the all-time series 14-4.
- Ohio State is 7-1 in games played in Columbus.
- Nebraska shot 38.3 percent from the field in the contest.
- Ohio State has held 26 of its 28 opponents to under 50 percent shooting from the field this season.
- Ohio State is 13-3 this season when leading at half time.
- The Buckeyes are 15-3 this season when leading with five minutes left to play.
- Ohio State has had eight games decided by one or two points on the season (3-5).
- Ohio State is 1-2 in games decided by one point this season.
- Thad Matta tied the all-time record in career games coached at Ohio State with his 456th Columbus outing in the game vs. the Cornhuskers. Harold G. Olsen (1923-1946) coached 456 games during his career as Ohio State's head coach (259-197).
- Matta is 10-2 versus Nebraska during his tenure at Ohio State.
- Matta is 171-85 against Big Ten opponents while coaching the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State is now 65-49 against Big Ten teams when the game is decided by 10 or fewer points under Matta.
- The Buckeyes are 291-20 when leading by 10+ points at any point in a contest since Matta's arrival.
- Ohio State is 8-4 in one-point games under Matta.
- Jae'Sean Tate led the Buckeyes in scoring, putting up 14 points while adding 10 rebounds.
- Tate has four double-doubles on the season and nine for his career.
- He has now scored in double figures 25 of the 28 games this season.
- Marc Loving scored 13 points to go along with four rebounds, three steals and an assist in the contest.
- Loving is now four rebounds away from becoming the 27th Buckeye to record 1,000 points and 500 rebounds.
- Trevor Thompson scored 13 points and grabbed eight boards for the Buckeyes.
- Thompson has scored in double figures in four of the last five games.
