WISCONSIN MAKES SUNSHINE STATE RETURN

- No. 19 Wisconsin (9-3 overall, 6-2 Big Ten) makes its return to the Sunshine State to face No. 8 South Carolina (10-2, 6-2 SEC) in the Capital One Bowl on Wednesday, Jan. 1 at Florida Citrus Bowl Stadium in Orlando.
- The Badgers are back in the Capital One Bowl for the first time since the 2006 season and look to improve to 3-0 all-time in the game.
- UW was victorious in its last game in Orlando, scoring a 20-14 win over Miami in the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl, and is 3-1 all-time at Florida Citrus Bowl Stadium.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- The Badgers seek their ninth 10-win season in school history and the fourth in five years.
- With 39 wins since the start of the 2010 season, Wisconsin's senior class can match the school record for most wins in a four-year span (40) with a victory over South Carolina. The Badgers' 2007 and 2012 senior classes hold the record.
- The Badgers are 8-2 following a loss since the beginning of the 2010 season.
- Wisconsin enters bowl season ranked in a tie for fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and sixth in total defense (294.0 ypg).
- Offensively, Wisconsin ranks eighth nationally in rushing at 283.0 yards per game and is the lone team in the FBS to boast multiple running backs averaging at least 100.0 yards per game in sophomore Melvin Gordon (122.2) and senior James White (111.4).
- For the first time in school history, Wisconsin has two 1,000-yard rushers (Gordon and White) and a 1,000-yard receiver (Jared Abbrederis) in the same season. Since 1996, only five other teams have accomplished that (USC in 2005, Oklahoma and Nevada in 2008, Georgia Tech in 2009 and Alabama in 2012).



Senior Chris Borland was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and is just the second LB in school history to earn first-team All-America honors.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

12 In accepting a bid in the Capital One Bowl, Wisconsin extended its bowl game streak to 12 consecutive seasons. That's the longest active streak by a Big Ten team and ranks in a tie for the seventh longest in the country. The Badgers are playing in a Jan. 1 bowl for the eighth time in the last 10 seasons.

202 With a combined 2,803 rushing yards on the season, sophomore RB Melvin Gordon and senior RB James White need a total of 202 yards to break the NCAA's single-season record for rushing yards by teammates of 3,004 set by Nevada's Cody Fajardo and Steffhon Jefferson in 2012.

GET TO KNOW GARY

■ In scoring a 45-0 win over UMass and a 48-0 victory over Tennessee Tech, Andersen became the seventh head coach since World War II to open his career at a school with back-to-back shutouts (among "Power Five" conference schools), and the first since Fred Akers at Texas in 1977.

■ The 10th head coach to take the reins of the UW program in the modern era, Andersen became just the second to win his Big Ten debut. With the Badgers' 41-10 victory over Purdue, he joined Dave McClain, who guided UW to a 34-7 win over Indiana in the 1978 Big Ten opener.

■ Andersen became the 21st coach to win his UW debut and joined Ivy Williamson (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1949) and Milt Bruhn (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1956) as the only modern-era UW coaches to score a shutout in their first game at the helm

■ Andersen, in his sixth season as a head coach, owns a career record of 39-34 (.534).

■ Andersen is 25-6 (.807) in his last 31 games as a head coach, dating back to his time at Utah State. One of those losses is the 16-14 setback his Utah State team endured at the hands of the Badgers last season at Camp Randall Stadium.

■ Andersen, 50, is in his first season as Wisconsin's head coach after being hired on Dec. 20, 2012. He spent the last four seasons at Utah State, leading the Aggies to a school-record 11 wins in 2012 and a No. 16 ranking in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll.

■ Andersen has brought in seven new assistant coaches to join running backs coach **Thomas Hammock** and cornerbacks coach **Ben Strickland**, who were retained from the previous staff. New to the staff are offensive coordinator **Andy Ludwig** (QB), defensive coordinator **Dave Aranda** (LB) and assistants **Chris Beatty** (WR), **Bill Busch** (S), **Jeff Genyk** (TE), **Chad Kauha'aha'a** (DL) and **T.J. Woods** (OL).



WINNING WAYS

■ Dating back to the Badgers' 37-26 win over UTEP on Sept. 22, 2012, each of Wisconsin's last 15 victories have come by a double-digit margin. The last time UW won a game by single digits was a 16-14 triumph over Gary Andersen's Utah State team on Sept. 15, 2012.

■ The Badgers are 49-17 (.742) since the start of the 2009 season. That is the 11th-best record in the nation over that five-year span. Alabama (60-6, .909) has the nation's best record in that timeframe. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (53-11, .828) has a better record than UW over the last five years.

■ Wisconsin is 35-13 in its last 48 games (.729), with 23 of those wins coming by at least 20 points and all 13 losses coming by seven points or less.

■ At 9-3 overall, Gary Andersen's first season has been among the most successful by a first-year head coach this season in the FBS. Of the 31 coaches that took over

a new program in 2013, only five have posted at least nine wins:

BEST OF BOTH WORLDS

■ Few teams have been able to combine as effective units on both offense and defense this season than Wisconsin. The Badgers rank fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.8) while ranking 25th in scoring offense (35.8). That average scoring margin of +21.0 points is seventh-best among FBS teams:

- Wisconsin and Florida State are the only FBS teams averaging more than 475 yards per game on offense and holding opponents to less than 300 yards per game on defense.

FOR STARTERS: DEFENSE

- Running the new 3-4 scheme installed by first-year defensive coordinator Dave Aranda, Wisconsin's defense has been nothing short of dominant in 2013, ranking in the top 12 of all four major defensive statistics:

- The recipe for the Badgers' defensive success? Get off the field on third down, keep teams out of the red zone and, if they do get inside the 20, keep them out of the end zone:

- Wisconsin's defense has held 5 of its 12 opponents without a touchdown. Among FBS teams, only Michigan State (6) has held more opponents without an offensive TD this season.

- The Badgers have also held 7 opponents to 10 points or fewer. Only Alabama (9) has limited more opponents to 10 or fewer points.

- On average, the Badgers have held FBS opponents 14.9 points below their scoring average in their other games:

- Of Wisconsin's 12 opponents, 7 have been held to their lowest scoring output of the season by the Badgers.

- Wisconsin held a Minnesota offense averaging 366.4 total yards and 30.7 points per game to 185 yards and zero offensive points.

- Indiana entered its game vs. UW ranked among the nation's top 10 in both scoring offense (43.1 points per game) and total offense (527.1 yards per game). The Badgers held IU to 3 points and 224 yards.

- On its way to ranking sixth nationally in total defense (294.0 yards per game), the Badgers have held 6 of their 12 opponents under 250 offensive yards: UMass (212), Tennessee Tech (113), Purdue (180), Northwestern (241), Indiana (224) and Minnesota (185). Only Michigan State (8) has kept more opponents under 250 total yards this season among FBS teams.

- The Badgers (1,216 rushing and 2,312 passing) are one of just five teams that have allowed less than 1,300 rushing yards and less than 2,400 passing yards this season, joining Michigan State, Louisville and Virginia Tech.

- Wisconsin has limited opponents to an average of just 4.53 yards per play, tied for the fifth-best average of any FBS defense. That trails only Michigan State (3.94), Florida State (3.95), Louisville (4.27) and Virginia Tech (4.34).

- The Badgers have allowed just 33 plays of 20 yards or longer, the fifth-fewest given up by an FBS team. Florida State and Iowa lead the nation with 30 plays of 20-plus yards allowed.

- Wisconsin also ranks second nationally with 111 plays of 10-plus yards allowed. Only Alabama (110) has allowed fewer.

- For the season, UW has forced three-and-outs on 45.1% of its opponents' drives — the best percentage of any FBS defense:

- Wisconsin ranks No. 5 nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage at 29.9%. Michigan State leads the nation at a rate of just 27.8%.

- Wisconsin has allowed opponents past its 20 yard line just 30 times in 12 games. That ranks in a tie for the seventh-fewest red-zone trips allowed by an FBS team. Alabama has allowed the fewest at 22.

- Wisconsin leads the nation in touchdown percentage in the red zone, allowing TDs on just 36.7% of opponents' red-zone trips (11 of 30). The Badgers' 11 red-zone TDs allowed this season match Alabama for the fewest by an FBS team.

- This is the second-consecutive season a Dave Aranda-led defense has led the nation in red-zone TD percentage. Utah State allowed opponents to score TDs on just 29.6% of their red-zone trips in 2012.
- Wisconsin was one of the nation's leaders in keeping opponents out of the red zone in 2012, as well, but the Badgers' ability to keep foes out of the end zone has been a major improvement over last season:

- The Badgers have surrendered just three touchdowns in their opponents' last 13 red-zone trips, with Iowa going 0-for-4, BYU 1-for-2, Indiana 0-for-1, Minnesota 0-for-1 and Penn State 2-for-5 in scoring TDs.

ONE-WAY TRAFFIC

- Not only has Wisconsin been one of the nation's best at running the ball this season, the Badgers have been among the best at stopping the run, as well:
- Wisconsin and Ohio State are the only FBS teams to average at least 280 rushing yards per game while allowing fewer than 105 rushing yards on defense.
- Wisconsin has held each of its 12 opponents under their rushing average for the season. On average, the Badgers have limited their opponents to just 50.5% of their per-game rushing output.
- UW has allowed opponents an average of just 3.20 yards per rushing attempt, the 11th-best mark of any FBS team. Michigan State leads the nation at 2.70 yards allowed per rushing attempt.
- The Badgers have held 9 of their 12 opponents to less than 3.5 rushing yards per attempt.
- Of the 380 rushing attempts by UW opponents this season, just 4 (1.05%) have gone for 20 or more yards. That's the fewest 20-yard runs allowed by an FBS team this season.
- The Badgers held a Northwestern offense that entered the game averaging 218.4 rushing yards per game to just 44 yards on Oct. 12. It was the Wildcats' lowest rushing output since Sept. 22, 2007.
- Wisconsin limited Ohio State to a season-low 192 rushing yards and 0 rushing touchdowns. The Buckeyes have averaged 328.0 yards and 3.5 rushing TDs in their other 12 games.
- UW has held five of its 12 opponents to 100 rushing yards or fewer — and three to less than 50 yards: UMass (100), Tennessee Tech (44), Purdue (45), Northwestern (44), Illinois (72).
- Through 12 games, Wisconsin's offense has produced 18 100-yard rushing performances — a school record for 100-yard games. Conversely, UW's defense has



THE 'U DUB STEP'

Senior RB James White and sophomore RB Melvin Gordon have combined for 26 touchdowns this season and their post-TD celebration, a dance known as the "U Dub Step" has become a trademark of their scores.

allowed just one 100-yard rusher in 2013 (Penn State's Zach Zwinak - 115).

- Since the beginning of the 2012 season (26 games), the Badgers have allowed only four 100-yard rushing performances while racking up 34 100-yard games of their own.

NO PASSING ZONE

- UW ranks No. 7 nationally and second in the Big Ten in pass efficiency defense at 105.22. Florida State leads the nation at 90.90.
- The Badgers also rank in a tie for sixth in the FBS in yards allowed per passing attempt at 5.8. Florida State leads the nation at 4.9.
- Wisconsin has allowed 12 touchdown passes in 12 games, ranking in a tie for the 10th-fewest surrendered by an FBS team. Louisville leads the nation with 8 TD passes allowed.
- The Badgers held an Indiana team that entered its game with UW with a pass efficiency rating of 151.86 and a yards per attempt average of 8.5 to a rating of 67.49 and an average of 4.1 yards per throw.
- Overall, the Hoosiers' passing attack was held to season lows in completions (12), completion percentage (40.0) and yards (122) and was held without a passing touchdown for the first time this season.
- The Badgers have been the nation's best defense against the pass on third down, leading the FBS in completion percentage defense (38.5%) and yards allowed per attempt (4.17) on third down. UW also ranks third among FBS teams in pass efficiency defense on third down (75.7).
- Opponents have converted just 24.8% of their third-down attempts (29 of 117) through the air against UW's defense, the best mark of any FBS team. Florida International ranks No. 2 nationally at 25.0%.

- True freshman CB **Sojourn Shelton** is tied for second in the Big Ten in interceptions with four. Nationally, the only freshmen with more interceptions this season are Virginia Tech teammates Brandon Facyson (5) and Kendall Fuller (5).
- Shelton's four INTs are the second-most ever by a UW freshman (Jamar Fletcher had 7 as a redshirt freshman in 1998) and the most by a true freshman in school history.

BORLAND BEARS DOWN

- A first-team All-American and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, senior ILB **Chris Borland** was also finalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy and Senior CLASS Award and a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award and Butkus Award.
- Borland is just the second Badgers' line-backer to be named first-team All-America joining Hal Faverty, an anchor of UW's famed "Hard Rocks" defense, in 1951.
- Borland has forced 14 fumbles in his career, matching the most in Big Ten history and the second-most by an FBS player. He has also recovered eight fumbles, tying him for second on UW's all-time list in that category.
- After missing most of UW's game vs. Illinois and entire contest vs. Iowa with an injury, Borland has posted four straight double-digit tackle games vs. BYU, Indiana, Minnesota and Penn State. He posted a game-high 13 stops and matched his career high with two sacks vs. BYU (he also had a QB hurry that resulted in another sack). Borland then added 10 tackles and 1.5 TFLs vs. Indiana.
- Borland made just shy of one-fourth of the Badgers' stops at Minnesota. He finished with 12 of the team's 49 tackles (UW's next-leading tackler had four), 1.0 TFL, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.
- In his last six full games, Borland has averaged 11.8 tackles and 1.0 tackles for loss and recorded three sacks. He posted double-digit tackles in all six of those games.
- Borland's 16 tackles vs. Ohio State (which included a career-high 10 solo stops) are the second-most tackles by a Big Ten player in a game this season (OSU's Ryan Shazier had 20 vs. Indiana on Nov. 23).
- Borland has had 10-plus tackles seven times this season and 19 times in his career. That career total ties Borland for the second-most double-digit tackle games of any Big Ten player since at least 2000. Michigan State's Greg Jones had double-digit stops in 20 games from 2007 to 2010.
- Borland ranks sixth all-time in tackles at UW with 410 for his career and needs 18

stops to pass Dave Lokanc (1970-72) and Dave Crossen (1975-78) for fourth (427).

FOR STARTERS: OFFENSE

- UW has racked up more than 500 yards of total offense in five of its 12 games and is averaging 486.8 total yards per game. Wisconsin's school record for total offense is 469.9 yards per game, set in 2011.
 - Wisconsin (3,396/2,445) is one of just 10 FBS teams with 3,000 rushing yards and 2,000 passing yards this season.
 - Wisconsin's efficient offense has averaged 6.93 yards per play this season, the 11th-best average in the nation and the second-best by a Big Ten team. Florida State leads all FBS teams at 7.81 yards per play, while Ohio State leads the Big Ten (and ranks No. 5 nationally) at 7.24.
 - The Badgers have tallied 15 offensive plays of 50-plus yards, which ranks in a tie for No. 2 nationally and trails only Baylor's nation-leading total of 19.
 - Of Wisconsin's 15 plays of 50-plus yards, 10 have gone for touchdowns. Wisconsin tied for second nationally last season with 15 offensive plays of at least 50 yards (trailing only Utah State's 18).
 - The Badgers also rank second nationally in plays of 60-plus yards (11) and are tied for the national lead in plays of 70-plus yards (6) and 80-plus yards (3).
 - Remarkably, despite its ability to quickly move the ball with big plays, Wisconsin has still managed to keep the ball away from opponents and ranks No. 2 nationally in time of possession at an average of 33:54 per game. Bowling Green leads the nation in time of possession at 34:16.
- ## RUNNING MEN
- The Badgers rank eighth nationally in rushing at 283.0 yards per game, an average that trails only Ohio State (314.5) among Big Ten teams.
 - Wisconsin's 554 rushing yards vs. Indiana marked the second-highest total in school history (trailing only the school-record 564 yards UW racked up vs. Indiana in 2012) and the highest rushing output by an FBS team this season.
 - The Badgers rank No. 2 nationally in average yards per carry at 6.61 yards per rush. Ohio State (7.03) leads the FBS. Wisconsin's school record is 5.52 yards per carry, a mark set in 1996.
 - No team has featured a more explosive running game than Wisconsin's in 2013. The Badgers lead the nation (or are tied for the national lead) in runs of 40-plus yards (14), 50-plus yards (9), 60-plus yards (7), 70-plus yards (6) and 80-plus yards (2).
 - The Badgers racked up seven runs of at least 30 yards vs. Indiana. That's more runs of 30-plus yards than 53 FBS teams have recorded this SEASON.
 - Wisconsin's total of 35 rushing touchdowns ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten and

TWO DECADES OF SUCCESS

In 1990, Barry Alvarez took over a Wisconsin football program that was struggling both competitively and financially. The Badgers had managed a winning record in just five of the previous 20 seasons and hadn't won the Big Ten since 1962.

Just three years later, however, Alvarez's 1993 team changed the game in Madison. Three seasons after a 1-10 mark in Alvarez's 1990 debut, the Badgers went 10-1-1, hoisted the Big Ten trophy and scored UW's first-ever Rose Bowl win.

Over the 20 seasons that have followed that magical season, UW has become one of the Big Ten's most consistent winners:

- Only Ohio State (10) has claimed a share of more Big Ten titles over the past 20 years than the six won by UW. The Buckeyes are also the only team to boast more wins (212) and a better winning percentage (.802) in that span than the Badgers, who have gone 184-79-4 (.699).
- Wisconsin claimed the first two Western Conference titles in 1896 and 1897. Over the next 95 seasons, however, UW won or shared just six conference championships. The Badgers have matched that output in just 20 seasons by winning at least a share of six Big Ten crowns since 1993, including three in a row from 2010-12.

10th nationally. Navy leads the nation with 47 rushing TDs, while Ohio State paces the Big Ten with 42.

- Over the last four years (since the start of the 2010 season), the Badgers have rushed for 169 touchdowns, which ties Navy for the second-most in the nation and trails only Oregon (174) in that span.
- With 3,396 yards through 12 games, the Badgers have already broken their school record for rushing yards in a season, topping the mark of 3,309 set last year (in 14 games) and the 12-game school record of 3,305 from 1999.
- UW also has a chance to break its school record for rushing yards per game of 287.5, set in 1974:

- With senior RB **James White** and sophomore RB **Melvin Gordon** both eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark for the season, Wisconsin has produced a 1,000-yard rusher for the ninth-consecutive year and 19th time in the last 21 seasons.
- After rushing for 1,052 yards as a freshman in 2010 and 1,337 already this year, White is the eighth player in UW history to have multiple 1,000-yard seasons. He went over the 1,000-yard mark on the first play of the Badgers' win over Indiana, a school-record 93-yard touchdown run.
- This year marks just the second season in which the Badgers have boasted a pair of 1,000-yard rushers. White and RB John Clay (1,012) achieved the feat in 2010,

with RB Montee Ball also finishing that season with 996 rushing yards.

- UW's run of nine consecutive seasons with at least one 1,000-yard rusher is the longest such streak in the nation. Penn State (8), Oklahoma State (6) and Oregon (6) have the next-longest active streaks and have yet to produce a 1,000-yard rusher in 2013.
- The Badgers have totaled 18 100-yard rushing performances in 12 games (James White - 8, Melvin Gordon - 7, Corey Clement - 3) — the most in school history and the most of any FBS team this season. Auburn ranks second nationally with 15.

TWO BETTER THAN ONE

- With sophomore RB **Melvin Gordon** (1,466) and senior RB **James White** (1,337), Wisconsin is one of just five FBS teams to boast a pair of 1,000-yard rushers in 2013 — and the only team with two running backs over 1,000 yards each.
- With a combined 2,803 rushing yards, Gordon and White need a combined total of 202 yards against South Carolina to break the NCAA's single-season record for rushing yards by two players on the same team. Nevada's Steffhon Jefferson (1,883) and Cody Fajardo (1,121) set the mark of 3,004 yards in 2012.
- White and Gordon are believed to be just the third pair of teammates in FBS history to rush for 1,300 yards in the same season. USC's Reggie Bush (1,740) and LenDale White (1,302) accomplished the feat in 2005, while Kent State's Dri Archer (1,429) and Trayion Durham (1,316) did so in 2012.
- White needs 63 yards to make the duo the first pair of teammates to each rush for 1,400 yards in the same season.
- In Gordon (122.2) and White (111.4), UW is one of just two teams nationally with

BEST OF THE BCS

- Since the start of the Bowl Championship Series in the 1998 season, the Badgers have won 146 games, the 12th-most of any FBS team.
- The Badgers are one of just 13 programs to have won at least 70 percent of their games during the BCS era. Among Big Ten programs, only Ohio State has more wins (161) and a better winning percentage (.797) since the start of the 1998 season.

- UW's 12-year bowl streak is the longest active streak in the Big Ten and tied for the seventh-longest streak in the country. The Badgers became bowl-eligible for a 12th-consecutive season with their win over Iowa on Nov. 2, and will play South Carolina in the 2014 Capital One Bowl on Jan. 1 in Orlando.

- Wisconsin's five Rose Bowl trips in the BCS era match USC for the most appearances in Pasadena by any team since 1998. No other Big Ten team has played in more than three Rose Bowls in that span.

multiple players averaging 100.0 rushing yards per game, joining BYU (RB Jamaal Williams 109.2; QB Taysom Hill, 100.9).

- Gordon, who ranks No. 12 nationally at 122.2 yards per game, and White (17th, 111.4) rank third and fourth in the Big Ten in rushing. Ohio State's Carlos Hyde (140.8) leads the league.
- With a combined 25 rushing touchdowns, White (13) and Gordon (12) are the third-most prolific scoring duo of running backs in the country, trailing only RBs from Colorado State and Auburn.
- Gordon and White are one of two running back tandems in the nation to have each scored double-digit touchdowns, joining Bowling Green's Travis Greene (11) and William Houston (11).
- After doing so against Indiana, Gordon and White have each rushed for 100 yards in the same game six times, including five times this season.
- Despite the fact that Gordon has just 263 carries, White and Gordon are one of two active FBS running back tandems to combine for 6,000 career rushing yards:

WHITE HOT

- Senior RB **James White** is third among active FBS players in rushing touchdowns with 45, which is the third-best total in UW history (see list, page 12). He trails only Northern Illinois QB Jordan Lynch (47) and Arizona RB Ka'Deem Carey (46). White is also tied with Carey for No. 2 among active FBS players with 48 total touchdowns, trailing only Lynch (50).
- White has scored multiple rushing touchdowns in a game 13 times in his career. That's the most of any active FBS player, with Tulane's Orleans Darkwa (11) ranking second.
- Wisconsin is 25-2 in games in which White has scored a TD (rushing or receiving).
- White ranks third among active FBS running backs with 3,908 career rushing yards despite the fact that he has made just 11 starts at running back in his career. Arizona RB Ka'Deem Carey leads active FBS running backs at 4,070 career rushing yards, while Buffalo RB Branden Oliver is second with 3,935.
- White is fifth in UW history with 3,908 career rushing yards and needs 34 yards to pass P.J. Hill (3,942 - 2006-08) for fourth all-time.
- White broke UW's 50-year-old school record with a 93-yard touchdown run on the Badgers' first play from scrimmage vs.



HONORING 'OTIS'

The Badgers carry the memory of a fallen friend with them when they take the field this season. The players wear a special decal on their helmets in memory of former team manager Kevin Green, who was better known as "Otis" to his friends inside and outside the UW football program.

Otis, 22, was killed in a car accident on June 15, shortly after graduating from UW. The Otis Green Foundation is up and running, while the UW equipment staff hopes to begin an annual golf outing to raise funds for a student manager scholarship in his honor.

Indiana. The longest run in school history had been a 91-yard TD run by Tom Brigham vs. Western Michigan on Sept. 21, 1963. White's run is the second-longest by an FBS player this season.

- White's school-record average of 6.19 rushing yards per attempt ties him with Ohio State RB Carlos Hyde for second among all active FBS running backs with at least 400 career carries, trailing only Tulsa RB Ja'Terian Douglas (6.25). It is easily the best mark in UW history and ranks No. 6 all-time among Big Ten players.
- White owns 17 career 100-yard games, which ranks in a tie for the seventh-most in school history.
- Of White's 17 career 100-yard games, 14 have come in games in which the Badgers boasted multiple 100-yard rushers. That includes all four games in school history in which three running backs topped the century mark — all four of which have come in UW's last 13 games.
- The Badgers are 17-0 when White rushes for 100 yards in a game.
- Also a reliable receiver, White's 662 career receiving yards are the most by a running back in UW history, breaking Joe Armentrout's (1983-86) school record for receiving yards by a running back (658).

GORDON GOES ... AND GOES

- Despite ranking just 64th nationally in attempts per game (15.1), sophomore RB **Melvin Gordon** ranks 12th nationally and third in the Big Ten in rushing at 122.2 yards per game and has scored 12 rushing TDs.
- Named honorable mention All-America by *Sports Illustrated*, Gordon was the Big Ten's lone semifinalist for the Maxwell Award, presented annually to the nation's top player, this season. He was also a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award, presented annually to the nation's top running back.

■ After leading all FBS players by averaging 10.0 yards per carry last season, Gordon is averaging a nation-leading 8.10 yards per attempt in 2013 (min. 100 carries). Army's Terry Baggett ranks No. 2 nationally at 7.89 yards per carry.

■ Gordon is the FBS's active career leader in yards per rushing attempt at 8.31. Baylor RB Lache Seastrunk ranks No. 2 at 7.61 yards per carry.

■ Gordon has rushed for at least 140 yards in 7 of Wisconsin's 12 games this season. That trails only Boston College's Andre Williams (8) and Washington's Bishop Sankey (8) for the most games of 140-plus rushing yards by an FBS player.

■ Gordon leads the nation (or is tied for the lead) in runs of 60-plus (4) and 70-plus (3) yards.

■ Gordon also ranks in the top five nationally in runs of 30-plus (T-3rd, 9), 40-plus (T-3rd, 6) and 50-plus (T-5th, 4) yards.

■ For his career, 68 of Gordon's 263 carries have gone for at least 10 yards (25.9 percent).

■ Gordon owns more runs of 20-plus yards (23) than negative yards (17) for his career.

■ Gordon's 17 career rushing touchdowns have covered an average of 29.8 yards.

■ Gordon reached the 1,000-yard plateau for his career faster than anyone in UW history, hitting 1,003 career yards on his 104th carry, a 7-yard tote in the second quarter vs. Tennessee Tech. James White previously held UW's school record for the fewest carries to reach 1,000 career yards with 138 attempts.

■ Gordon also set UW's school record for the fastest to 1,000 yards in a season by doing so on his 105th carry of the year. James White previously held the record by reaching 1,000 yards on the 138th attempt of his freshman season in 2010.

HOLD ON TIGHT

■ Since the start of the 2010 season, no team has valued possession of the ball better than the Badgers. UW leads all FBS programs with just 46 turnovers over the course of the last four seasons:

■ The Badgers have gone without losing a fumble in 36 of their 53 games since the start of the 2010 season.

■ **Melvin Gordon** has never lost a fumble, spanning his 263 career rushing attempts, 3 career receptions and 8 career kickoff returns (274 total touches).

■ **James White** has lost just two fumbles in his career, which includes 737 total touches (631 rushing attempts, 68 receptions

and 38 kickoff returns). That's an average of one lost fumble every 368.5 touches (or every 315.5 rushing attempts).

■ The first of White's lost fumbles came in his second career game (vs. San Jose State on Sept. 11, 2010). The second came as a sophomore vs. Penn State on Nov. 26, 2011. White has amassed 362 total touches since the last lost fumble (319 rushing attempts, 36 receptions, 7 kickoff returns).

DOWNTOWN ABBY

■ Senior WR **Jared Abbrederis** was honored on Dec. 9 with the Burlsworth Trophy, presented annually to the nation's top player that began his career as a walk-on.

■ A former walk-on QB, Abbrederis ranks second in school history with 3,110 career receiving yards, in a tie for second with 23 receiving touchdowns and second with 197 career receptions.

■ Abbrederis — who has accepted an invitation to play in the Senior Bowl — ranks fifth in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game (87.6) and third in receptions per game (6.1) despite not having a catch in the Badgers' game vs. Indiana.

■ With 1,051 receiving yards this season, Abbrederis is just the third player in school history to rack up 1,000 receiving yards in a season and the first player at UW to record at least 800 yards in three seasons. He also had 933 as a sophomore (2011) and 837 as a junior (2012).

■ Abbrederis ranks third among active FBS players in yards per reception (min. 150 receptions) at 15.8 yards per catch. Baylor WR Tevin Reese (16.8) is the leader, followed by Michigan WR Jeremy Gallon (15.9).

■ While he went without a reception vs. Indiana, Abbrederis had three carries for a career-high 86 rushing yards and the first two rushing touchdowns of his career.

■ Also an accomplished returner, Abbrederis ranks seventh all-time at UW with 4,788 all-purpose yards.

■ Abbrederis had 10 receptions for 207 yards at Ohio State (Sept. 28), both career highs. He became UW's first 200-yard receiver since Lee Evans had a school-record 258 yards vs. Michigan State in 2003.

■ Abbrederis has 10 100-yard receiving games in his career, seven of which have come over the last two seasons in games in which QB Joel Stave has started.

PEDERSEN PULLS 'EM IN

■ Senior TE **Jacob Pedersen** — who has accepted an invitation to play in the East-West Shrine Game — ranks third among active FBS tight ends with 17 career touchdown receptions. Marshall's Gator Hoskins leads active tight ends with 26 TD receptions, with Washington's Austin Seferian-Jenkins ranking second with 20 TD grabs.

BADGERS IN THE DRAFT

- Wisconsin had three players taken in the 2013 NFL Draft, including C Travis Frederick, who was selected by Dallas in the first round. RB Montee Ball was a second-round pick of the Denver Broncos, while OL Rick Wagner went in the fifth round to the Baltimore Ravens.
- With the selection of Frederick and Wagner, the Badgers have had seven offensive linemen selected over the past three NFL drafts, easily the highest total of any college program. Alabama and Georgia rank in a tie for second in that span, with each producing four draft picks on the offensive line.
- Among its 14 NFL draft picks over the past three years, UW has produced nine top-75 selections, matching North Carolina for the third-highest total of any team. Only Alabama (13) and LSU (12) have produced more top-75 picks in that span.
- Wisconsin's nine top-75 picks represent one-third of the Big Ten's total over the past three years. The Badgers have had as many top-75 picks over that span as Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State and Penn State COMBINED:

- Pedersen's 17 career TD grabs are the most by a Big Ten tight end since at least 1996 and are the most by a tight end in Wisconsin history, ranking him No. 7 overall on UW's all-time receiving touchdowns list.
- Pedersen also ranks second among active tight ends, averaging 13.3 yards per reception for his career, and trails only North Carolina TE Eric Ebron (16.4).

STAVE STEPS UP

- Sophomore QB **Joel Stave** has shined in the red zone, completing 63.3% percent of his passes for 246 yards, 15 touchdowns and no interceptions. His pass efficiency rating of 180.3 in the red zone ranks ninth nationally (min. 50 attempts).
- Stave has completed 61.6% of his passes this season, which ranks as the sixth-best single-season mark in UW history. Scott Tolzien set the Badgers' single-season record at 72.9% in 2010.
- For his career, Stave ranks No. 4 in UW history in passing efficiency at 140.3, trailing only Russell Wilson (191.8, 2011), Tolzien (153.2, 2008-10) and Jim Sorgi (141.2, 2000-03).
- Stave's career completion percentage of 60.9% also ranks No. 4 all-time and trails only Wilson (72.8%), Tolzien (68.1%) and Darrell Bevell (61.4%).
- With 26 touchdown passes for his career, Stave ranks eighth all-time at UW and needs seven to pass Tolzien (2008-10) for seventh (32).
- With 3,518 passing yards for his career, Stave ranks No. 10 all-time at UW and needs 182 yards to pass Neil Graff (1969-71) for ninth (3,699). Stave became the 14th Badgers QB to throw for 3,000 yards at UW, surpassing that mark in just 16 career starts.

WALK-ON WAY

- Since the conclusion of the 2011 season, six current Badgers have been awarded a scholarship after beginning their careers as walk-ons: senior S **Kyle Zuleger**, senior WR **Jared Abbrederis**, senior TE **Brock DeCicco**, senior DE **Ethan Hemer**, senior OLB **Ethan Armstrong** and sophomore QB **Joel Stave** as former walk-ons who have earned scholarships.
- In all, eight scholarship players on the Badgers' current roster began their careers as walk-ons: Abbrederis, Armstrong, DeCicco, K **Kyle French**, Hemer, Stave, ILB **Marcus Trotter**, and Zuleger.
- Of those eight, six have started games for UW, while another (French) has served as the Badgers' starting placekicker.
- Since Barry Alvarez took over the Wisconsin program in 1990:
 - 136 walk-ons have earned a letter for the Badgers.
 - 74 walk-ons have been awarded a scholarship during their career.

CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

- One of the nation’s most historic college football venues, Camp Randall Stadium also happens to be one of the intimidating for opposing teams, and Wisconsin has made the most of the home-field advantage that the raucous atmosphere provides.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, the Badgers have compiled a 61-6 record (.910) at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State in 2010 Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- Including its unblemished home records in 2010 and 2011, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium four times (2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011).
- Wisconsin won 21 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Oct. 31, 2009 to Oct. 27, 2012. That is the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- The Badgers have allowed 10 or fewer points at home on 22 occasions over the last 10 seasons.
- Wisconsin’s six shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009, 35-0 vs. Oregon State in 2011 and 45-0 vs. UMass and 48-0 vs. Tennessee Tech in 2013) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as “soldiers rest” is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- Though it has only been a tradition at Camp Randall Stadium since 1998, “Jump Around” is now a defining part of UW game day. Between the third and fourth quarters, “Jump Around” by House of Pain is played and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs. “Jump Around” was crowned the winner of *Sports Illustrated’s* “Greatest College Football Traditions” bracket in 2012.

HEAD COACH GARY ANDERSEN

FIRST SEASON

Gary Andersen, 50, was introduced as the 29th head coach in Wisconsin football history on Dec. 20, 2012. He comes to Madison after four seasons as the head coach at Utah State, where he led a program that had just six wins in the previous three seasons to a 26-24 record in his four years at the helm and was named 2012 Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Aggies to the WAC championship and a win in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

- With a 45-0 win over UMass and 48-0 victory over Tennessee Tech, Andersen became the seventh head coach since World War II to open his career at a school with back-to-back shutouts (among “Power Five” conference schools), the first since Fred Akers at Texas in 1977.
- The 10th head coach to take the reins of the UW program in the modern era, Andersen became just the second to win his Big Ten debut. With the Badgers’ 41-10 victory over Purdue, he joined Dave McClain, who guided UW to a 34-7 win over Indiana in the 1978 Big Ten opener.
- Andersen became the 21st coach to win his UW debut and joined Ivy Williamson (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1949) and Milt Bruhn (41-0 vs. Marquette in 1956) as the only modern-era UW coaches to score a shutout in their first game at the helm
- Andersen, in his sixth season as a head coach, owns a career record of 39-34 (.534).
- Andersen is 25-6 (.807) in his last 31 games as a head coach, dating back to his time at Utah State.
- Andersen guided Utah State to its most successful season in history in 2012. The Aggies won a school-record 11 games, went undefeated in the WAC and captured their first outright league title since 1936. To cap the season, USU defeated Toledo, 41-15, to win the 2012 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- For guiding Utah State to double-digit victories for the first time in history, Andersen was named WAC Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award.
- In addition to their first bowl win since 1993, the Aggies defeated three teams that finished the season with at least nine wins, with all of those victories coming away from home. That included a win at No. 20 Louisiana Tech, the first road win over a ranked team in the program’s history. Utah State also defeated in-state rival Utah for the first time since 1997.
- With consecutive appearances in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Utah State was bowl eligible in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1960-61.
- Utah State finished the season ranked No. 16 in the Associated Press Top 25 and was ranked in the AP poll in the each of the last three weeks of the regular season. The Aggies also made their first-ever appearance in the BCS standings, checking in at No. 22 in the final edition of the season.
