KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- No. 16 Wisconsin (4-2-0, 0-0-0-0 B1G) travels to No. 14 North Dakota (2-2-1, 0-0-0-0 NCHC) for the first time since November 2015 for a Friday-Saturday series. Puck drops on Friday at 7:30 p.m. and Saturday at 7 p.m.
- Both games stream online on NCHC.TV. The games air on the radio on 1310 WIBA and across the Badger Sports Network. The audio stream can be found at Badgersportsnetwork.com and the iHeart Radio app.
- Wisconsin split a pair of 6-2 decisions with Michigan Tech last weekend, falling on Friday, but returning the favor for a 6-2 victory on Saturday.
- North Dakota skated to a 3-1 victory over fifth-ranked Minnesota in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game in Las Vegas last Saturday.
- Senior forward Seamus Malone has a pair of three-point games in his last three contests, matching the number of three-point games he produced over the first 109 games of his career. Malone had a goal and two assists last Saturday in UW's 6-2 victory over Michigan Tech.
- Freshman goaltender Daniel Lebedeff has allowed just three goals over his two starts this season and owns victories in both appearances. He has a 1.50 goals-against average and .936 save percentage in 120 minutes played. Those numbers rank 12th and 18th in the nation, respectively.
- Freshman forward Roman Ahcan became the fifth Badger rookie to score this year when he tallied last Friday against Michigan Tech. He then became the third Badger freshman to tally a game-winning goal this year when he scored on Saturday.
- Ahcan's game-winning goal was also UW's first short-handed goal of the season.
- Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk already has more goals through six games this year (four), than he scored his entire freshman season (three) in 37 games played.
- Sophomore forward Linus Weissbach has points in each of his last five games and collected two goals, six assists and eight points during the stretch. He had a six-game scoring streak from Nov. 17 through Dec. 8, 2017, to set his own personal standard.
- The Badgers play six of their next eight games on the road, before playing seven consecutive games, plus an exhibition contest, at the Kohl Center.



Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk has points in each of his last five games for a career-high point streak. His four goals give him a share of the national goal-scoring lead among rear guards, while his nine points have him tied for fifth in the country among blue liners.

Wisconsin's power play has eight goals, with at least one in each of the last four games, after posting none in the first two contests. That helped the Badgers climb to eighth in the nation on the power play at 27.6 percent (8-for-29). UW scored three power-play goals in two of its last three contests.

Wisconsin is averaging 4.50 goals per game through six contests, which is tied for fifth in the country among all schools, and third in the nation among schools who have played more than one game. UW has 27 goals in six games played, including three games with at least six goals scored.

Wisconsin's next 10 contests will take place against teams currently ranked in the USCHO.com Poll. That starts this week with No. 14 North Dakota. Only one opponent on UW's schedule the rest of the season is currently unranked (Michigan State).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Five of Wisconsin's top six scorers are made up of four sophomores and a freshman, as well as four forwards and two defensemen. Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk paces the team with nine points on four goals and five assists, while sophomore forwards Tarek Baker and Linus Weissbach each share second on the team along with senior forward Seamus Malone at eight points. Sophomore forward Sean Dhooghe shares fifth on the team with freshman defenseman K'Andre Miller at seven points. Dhooghe leads the team with five goals.
- Wisconsin's freshmen and sophomore classes are second and tied for third in the nation among their peers in scoring.
- Wisconsin has played eight of its nine freshmen through the first six games. So far, five of the seven skaters have scored goals, while the goaltender boasts a pair of victories. The freshmen have combined for seven goals, 13 assists and 20 points.
- The sophomore class boasts 13 goals through six games, which ranks second in the nation. The class has 33 points, which shares third, while its 5.50 points-per-game scoring mark shares second, behind only Bowling Green (6.14 points per game).
- UW entered the season with 16 of its 25 players as either freshmen or sophomores.
- UW's seven-member sophomore class was its highest scoring group last year with 98 points, which ranked sixth among the nation's freshman classes.
- Three of Wisconsin's top scorers returning for 2018-19, and four of its top six scorers returning are sophomores (Weissbach, Kalynuk, Baker, Sean Dhooghe).
- Forward Linus Weissbach and defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk are the UW's top returning scorers after posting 26 and 25 points last year, respectively. Both were named to the 2018 All-Big Ten Freshman Team, while Kalynuk also earned 2018 Honorable Mention All-Big Ten squad.
- Sophomore forward Linus Weissbach returns as UW's leading scorer heading into 2018-19. Weissbach posted 10 goals and 26 points in 34 games played.
- Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk, UW's lone representative on the Big Ten Preseason Watch List, paced UW rear guards last season with 25 points (3 goals, 22 assists). His 22 assists led all skaters on last year's squad. The 25 points made him just the eighth frosh defenseman at UW to reach 25 points in his first season.
- Kalynuk's 25 points had him ranked fourth in the country among the nation's rookie rear guards, behind Minnesota Duluth defenseman Scott Perunovich (36), Denver's Ian Mitchell and Michigan's Quinn Hughes (29).
- Weissbach, sophomore Tarek Baker and senior Seamus Malone each return as the leading goal-scorers as all three struck for 10 goals last year.

DEFENSE A STRENGTH

- Wisconsin is one of four schools in the country to boast five NHL draft picks on defense (Minnesota, Notre Dame, Boston University). The Badgers five drafted defensemen include freshmen K'Andre Miller (New York Rangers) and Ty Emberson (Arizona), as well as sophomores Wyatt Kalynuk (Philadelphia), Josh Ess (Chicago) and Tyler Inamoto (Florida).
- The five Badgers' defensemen drafted on the roster is the most for UW since the 2009-10 team had five drafted defensemen on the roster (Justin Schultz, Brendan Smith, Ryan McDonagh, Jake Gardiner, Cody Goloubef). That year, the Badgers had a sixth rear guard, John Ramage, who was drafted following the season.
- Senior captain and two-time honorable mention All-Big Ten defenseman Peter Tischke is undrafted.
- Sophomore defenseman Wyatt Kalynuk has four goals through six games, eclipsing his 2017-18 season total. The 2018 All-Big Ten Honorable Mention and Freshman All-Big Ten selection had three goals last year and currently shares the national lead among rear guards with his four goals.
- Kalynuk's nine points rank fifth in the country among defenseman and lead all Badger skaters.
- The Badgers have six goals and 19 points from their blue line. The six goals are tied for the fifth in the country, one off the national pace, while the 19 points share eighth among the country's defensive corps. UW's 3.17 points per game from its defensemen share seventh in the nation.
- Wyatt Kalynuk (nine points) and K'Andre Miller (seven points) rank second and third among Big Ten defensemen in scoring.
- Miller shares the national lead with a plus-9.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- After going the first weekend of the season without a power-play tally, UW is 8-for-23 with the man advantage over the last four games, including two games with three power play goals.
- Prior to those two games, UW's power play hadn't connected three times in a game since going 3-for-7 at Denver on Nov. 26, 2016.
- The Badgers have at least one power-play goal in four consecutive games.
- The Badgers rank eighth in the nation with a 27.6 percent power play (8-for-29).
- Senior forward Seamus Malone and sophomore forward Sean Dhooghe share the team lead with two power-play goals each.
- Wisconsin's penalty kill has not been as successful with the Badgers killing 18 of 28 chances (64.3 percent).
- UW allowed five power-play goals and eight chances in last Friday's 6-2 loss to Michigan Tech. That marked the first time an opponent struck five times with the man advantage since Minnesota went 5-for-8 against UW on March 7, 2010.

ROMAN CANDLE

■ Freshman forward Roman Ahcan (Savage, Minnesota) broke through with the first two goals of his career last weekend to give him two goals and five points, which ranks second among Badgers' and Big Ten rookies.

■ Ahcan's goal last Saturday broke a 2-2 tie just 25 seconds into the second period and proved to be the game-winning score in UW's 6-2 victory.

■ The goal marked the first short-handed goal of the season for the Badgers and the first for UW since Ryan Wagner scored short-handed on Jan. 27, 2018, against Penn State.

■ The short-handed, game-winning score was the first of its kind for UW since then-freshman Trent Frederic broke a 2-2 tie at 2:53 of the third period at St. Lawrence on Oct. 28, 2016 in a game the Badgers went on to win, 5-2.

SIMMERING ZIMMER

■ Junior forward Max Zimmer (Medina, Minnesota), a fourth-round draft pick of the Carolina Hurricanes in 2016, posted his first career two-goal game last Saturday with the first and last goals of the game. He scored a power-play goal at 2:25 of the first period, and closed out the scoring at 16:33 of the third period.

■ The goals ended a 13-game, goal-scoring drought for Zimmer, who last scored on Jan. 27, 2018, against Penn State.

■ Zimmer, who has two goals and six points through the first six games this year, recorded seven points in 25 games played last season and nine points in 37 games as a rookie.

■ With two goals through six games, he is one shy of the three goals he scored in both his freshman and sophomore seasons.

GOALTENDING

■ Who will get the majority of the playing time in goal was a question entering the season, and both Jack Berry and Daniel Lebedeff made statements so far this season.

■ Berry made 29 saves for his fourth career shutout against Boston College in a 3-0 season-opening win on Oct. 12.

■ It marked the sixth time in the modern era (since 1963) that UW opened a season with a shutout.

■ Berry's fourth career shutout moved him into a tie for 10th on UW's career list with 1981 and 1983 NCAA Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player Marc Behrend. Behrend was inducted into the UW Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006.

■ Freshman Daniel Lebedeff has two games played and two victories. He's the second consecutive freshman goaltender to win his first two career starts. Jack Berry did the same, starting his career with a shutout on Nov. 5, 2016, before posting a 3-2 win against Merrimack on Nov. 18, 2016. Berry won his first three career starts before dropping a game.

KALYNUK ONE OF THE BEST

■ As a freshman defenseman, Wyatt Kalynuk produced one of the best offensive seasons for a rookie defenseman in Wisconsin hockey history.

■ There have been eight UW freshmen defenseman all-time who have scored at least 25 points.

head coach Tony Granato, associate head coaches Mark Osiecki and Mark Strobel, volunteer assistant coach Brad Winchester, and operations director Shane Connelly. No other program in the nation boasts having alumni as its head coach and associate/assistant coaches.

- Osiecki won the 1990 NCAA title as a Badger defenseman and was an assistant coach for the team's 2006 NCAA title. He assisted the team during its run to the 2010 NCAA title game, as well.
- Connelly was a goaltender on the 2006 NCAA championships team.

CAPTAINS

- Senior defenseman Peter Tischke serve as team captain for the Badgers, while senior forward Seamus Malone serves as alternate captain.
- This marks the first season since 2008-09 that Wisconsin will enter this year with only two players as captains or alternate captains. That year, Ben Street and Blake Geoffrion spent the season as co-captains.

THE NHL DRAFT

- Three Badgers were drafted in the first four rounds of the 2018 NHL Draft.
- This marks the third consecutive season in which at least three Wisconsin skaters have been drafted.
- Freshman K'Andre Miller became the 13th Badger to be drafted in the first round when he was selected 22nd by the New York Rangers.

- The Badgers have ranked among the top three schools in national attendance average every year dating back to the

1969-70 season, leading the country 38 times over that 49-year span.

- Wisconsin will play 15 of its first 16 games against teams ranked in the pre-season polls, and 29 of 34 regular season games against preseason ranked teams.

NHL NOTES

- With a goal against the New Jersey Devils on Oct. 14, the 2006 NCAA champion for the Badgers and current San Jose Sharks captain Joe Pavelski scored his 700th career NHL point.
- Pavelski is the 28th American in NHL history to hit the 700 point mark. Pavelski is also only the fifth player to be drafted 200th or later to reach that mark, joining Dave Taylor, Pavol Demitra, Henrik Zetterberg, and Steve Sullivan.
- Joe Pavelski also joins Patrick Marleau and Joe Thornton as the only players to score 700 points with the Sharks.
- Pavelski played in his 900th career NHL game on Tuesday, Oct. 30 when his Sharks took on the New York Rangers.
- Former Badger defenseman Ryan Suter play in his 1000th career contest on Oct. 25 when his Minnesota Wild played the Los Angeles Kings in St. Paul, Minnesota.
- Suter is one of 11 American-born defensemen all-time to score 500 points.
- Including Suter, four of the 11 all played at Wisconsin (Chris Chelios, Gary Suter, Brian Rafalski).
- Philadelphia Flyers goaltender Brian Elliott sits three shutouts shy of 40 for his career. Only 43 goaltenders in NHL history have reached the mark.
- Anaheim Ducks' forward Ben Street (31 years, 239 days) became the oldest player in franchise history to score his first career goal when he did so on Oct. 10 against Arizona.
- Arizona forward Derek Stepan played in his 600th career game on Oct. 10, the same game of Street's first career score. That made Stepan the first player selected outside the first round of the 2008 NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

HEAD COACH TONY GRANATO

THIRD SEASON

Tony Granato, Wisconsin's fifth head coach since 1966, began a new era for Wisconsin hockey upon his hiring in 2016.

Granato led the Badgers to a 20-15-1 record in his first season at the helm after the program won just 12 of 70 games the previous two seasons. Named the 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year and a finalist for national coach of the year, he saw his team reach the Big Ten Tournament championship game and finish second overall in the conference. Six Wisconsin players received All-Big Ten honors, including Big Ten Freshman of the Year Trent Frederic, while sophomore captain Luke Kunin became a second-team All-American during his season under Granato's tutelage.

Granato accepted a new challenge for the 2017-18 season and served as head coach of the U.S. Olympic Team that finished seventh in the 2018 Olympic Winter Games in PyeongChang, South Korea, falling a shootout short of reaching the medal round.

Having come to Madison directly from an assistant coach position for the Detroit Red Wings, Granato spent 13 NHL seasons as either a head coach or assistant coach, a year after retiring from a 13-year NHL playing career.

The Wisconsin alum was 72-33-17 during his first head coaching stint with the Colorado Avalanche, which included the Northwest Division title in 2002-03 and a runner-up finish in 2003. He owns a 102-78-17 coaching record with the Avalanche when including his 2008-09 season at the helm of Colorado.

The Downers Grove, Illinois, native spent three-plus seasons as an assistant coach with the Avalanche, before five seasons with the Pittsburgh Penguins (2009-14). During his time in Pittsburgh, the Penguins collected at least 101 points in each of his seasons and won a league-best 36 games during the 48-game campaign in 2012-13. The run included three division titles.

Teams Granato served as head or assistant coach posted winning records in 12 of his 13 seasons in the NHL.

Granato also served as an assistant coach for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Team, where he coached former Badgers Ryan McDonagh, Joe Pavelski, Derek Stepan and Ryan Suter, among other of the world's star skaters. The team finished fourth.

A four-time 30-goal scorer in the NHL, Granato was originally picked in the sixth round, 120th overall by the New York Rangers in the 1982 draft. In his first season in the NHL, during the 1988-89 campaign, Granato put up 36 goals, which still stand as New York's record for rookie goal scoring. His 63-point effort that season got him a spot on the 1988-89 NHL All-Rookie Team.

Granato skated for the New York Rangers, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks during his 13-year playing career. He helped the Kings reach the 1993 Stanley Cup Final, playing alongside Wayne Gretzky. He tallied six goals and 17 points in 24 playoff games during the run. That same year, he recorded a career-high with 82 points (37 goals, 45 assists), one season after posting a career-high 39 goals.

After a serious on-ice injury early in 1996, Granato returned to the ice the following season after a trade to San Jose and played in the 1997 NHL All-Star Game. He went on to win the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy following that season in 1997 for his dedication to hockey.

A member of Team USA at the 1988 Olympic Winter Games, Granato tied for second on the team with eight points, including seven assists for the seventh-place Americans. The seven assists are tied for third all-time for Team USA at one single Olympics. His three assists in a game on Feb. 13, 1988 against Austria are tied for second on the all-time list, one off the team single-game record.

The 1988 Olympics marked Granato's sixth appearance at a major international event for Team USA. He played for the Americans at the 1983 and 1984 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships, and skated at the 1985, '86 and '87 IIHF World Championships. He skated in a seventh major international event for Team USA at the 1991 Canada Cup.

A two-time All-American for the Badgers, Granato was a finalist for the 1987 Hobey Baker Memorial Award after his 73-point senior season. In addition to serving as the Badgers' captain during the 1986-87 campaign, Granato was named the WCHA Student-Athlete of the Year and the team's Spike Carlson MVP award winner. A member of the UW Athletics Hall of Fame, he finished his Badger career as the school's fourth-leading scorer with 220 points, ranking third with 100 career goals.

Granato and his family have strong ties to Wisconsin as his brother and former UW associate head coach, Don, skated for the Badgers (1987-91). A second brother, Rob, also skated for UW (1992-94), as did cousin Kevin (1997-2001). Granato's sister, Cammi, is in the Hockey Hall of Fame as one of the greatest women's hockey players in history. She was recruited to play soccer at Wisconsin before Badger women's hockey began, but instead went on to star with the Providence women's hockey program in the early 1990s. She dropped the ceremonial first puck before the inaugural game of Wisconsin women's hockey in 1999 at the Kohl Center.

Tony and his wife, Linda, reside in Madison. They are the parents of four grown children, including Michael, Nicholas, Dominic and Gabriella.

Granato completed his degree during his first year as UW head coach, graduating in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in human development and family studies.

KOHL CENTER

- The Kohl Center, which opened in 1998, is the second largest on-campus rink in the nation (15,359). The only on-campus facility with a larger capacity is Value City Arena (17,500) in Columbus, Ohio
- Wisconsin has won at least 11 games in a season at the Kohl Center on 10 occasions.
- The Kohl Center played host to NCAA regional action for the first time in 2008 when the NCAA Midwest Regional took place on March 29-30. The building had previously played host to the 1998 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, a 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Regional and a 2007 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Quarterfinal contest.
- The Kohl Center cost \$76.4 million to construct and is named after U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW graduate who donated \$25 million towards the project.
- The Kohl Center ice sheet is 200 feet long by 97 feet wide.
- Some of the names of players from opposing teams who have played in the building include Patrick Kane, Jonathan Toews, David Backes, Duncan Keith, Ryan Miller, Carl Hagelin, T.J. Oshie, Paul Stastny, Matt Carle, Kyle Okposo, Jack Eichel and Auston Matthews, among others.

- The teams meet for the 172nd time in the third-most played rivalry in UW history.
- UW is 87-70-13 all-time against MTU.
- UW's 87 victories over UND are the fifth-most it has against any opponent (112 vs. Colorado College is the most).
- Wisconsin and North Dakota have combined to win 14 NCAA titles. UND is tied for second with eight, while UW is fourth with six.
- The Badgers last sweep in Grand Forks came Dec. 8-9, 2006, in the form of 4-3 and 4-2 victories. There have been five series there since.

- UW associate head coach Mark Osiecki spent one year as an assistant coach at North Dakota and won the 1997 NCAA championships with UND.
- UW sophomores Tyler Inamoto and Sean Dhooche were teammates with UND sophomore Grant Mismash with the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team.
- UW senior Seamus Malone and UND senior Hayden Shaw both graduated from Dubuque Senior High School and played the 2014-15 season with the Dubuque Saints (USHL)
- Junior Max Zimmer and UND sophomore Matt Kiersted played together for the Chicago Steel (USHL) from 2014-16
- Freshmen K'Andre Miller and Ty Emberson were teammates with UND rookie forward Gavin Hain with the U.S. Under-18 Team.
- UW head coach Tony Granato went 7-8-1 against North Dakota as a player at Wisconsin, while associate head coach Mark Osiecki was 10-2-1 and associate head coach Mark Strobel went 12-6-0.

WISCONSIN 2, NORTH DAKOTA 2 (OT)

NOV. 4, 2017

The No. 7 Wisconsin men's hockey team saw goals from freshman brothers Sean and Jason Dhooghe in the Badgers 2-2 overtime tie with No. 4/5 North Dakota (6-2-2, 1-1-0 NCHC) on Saturday night at the Kohl Center.

The goals marked the first time in UW history brothers scored their first career goals in the same game.

Wisconsin (6-4-1, 1-1-0 Big Ten) was outshot by the Fighting Hawks, 32-24, but the Badgers held a 1-0 lead for most of the contest.

Freshman forward Sean Dhooghe opened the scoring at the 16 minute, 43-second mark, successfully converting on a penalty shot to put the Badgers up, 1-0.

The 1-0 lead would stand until the 4:00 mark of the third frame, when the Fighting Hawks tied the game up after a scramble that had UW goaltender Kyle Hayton trying to recover from the ice.

Jason Dhooghe got in on the scoring 4:39 later, putting Wisconsin back in the lead, 2-1, on his first career goal.

North Dakota tied the game late in the third, sneaking a puck between Hayton's pad and the pipe.

The teams competed in an exhibition shootout, and the Badgers coming away with a 2-0 win on goals from Ryan Wagner and Linus Weissbach.

Senior Kyle Hayton saw just one shot in the overtime frame and made 30 saves in the contest.

WISCONSIN 2, NORTH DAKOTA 2 (OT)

NOV. 3, 2017

Despite the No. 7 Wisconsin men's hockey team holding a lead early in the contest, the Badgers fell, 3-2, to fourth-ranked North Dakota (6-2-1, 1-1-0 NCHC) on Friday night at the Kohl Center.

The Badgers (6-4-0, 1-1-0 Big Ten) outshot the Fighting Hawks 38-32 through the game and saw a two-goal performance from junior Matthew Freytag, but a late UND goal on the man-advantage sealed the series opener.

Freytag put the Badgers up 1-0 midway through the first, with freshman Sean Dhooghe recording the primary assist, earning his first career point.

The Fighting Hawks responded to tie the game at 7:41 when Collin Adams sent a shot through traffic over senior goaltender Kyle Hayton's glove.

Freytag tallied his second of the evening nine minutes after his first, giving Wisconsin a 2-1 lead at the 15:57 mark of the first.

North Dakota would knot the game up 1:25 into the second frame on a goal from Austin Poganski.

UND scored the eventual winning goal midway through the third stanza on a power-play opportunity, tipping a shot from the point under Hayton.
