## UW VS. XAVIER - ROUND THREE

- The Badgers hit the road for the first time in 2018-19 and will face a familiar foe on Nov. 13 when they take on Xavier as part of the Gavitt Tipoff Games. UW and XU have split a pair of recent meetings with the Badgers earning a 66-63 win in the 2016 NCAA Tournament and the Musketeers winning in Madison, 80-70, last season.
- Up next, Wisconsin returns home for one game against Houston Baptist on Nov. 17 before traveling to the Bahamas for three games at the 2018 Battle 4 Atlantis.



**Preseason All-American Ethan Happ opened the season with just the 2nd triple-double in school history, tallying 10 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists vs. Coppin St.**

## KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Wisconsin begins its 121st season of men's basketball in 2018-19 and the fourth under head coach Greg Gard. As head coach, Gard has led the Badgers to a mark of 58-36 (.617) overall in his first 4 seasons, the 3rd-highest win percentage in program history (min. 60 games).
- Wisconsin returns 94.9% (2,094 of 2,206 points) of its scoring in 2018-19, the 6th-highest mark in all of college basketball. Washington (95.9%) is the only major conference school with a higher percentage of returning points than Wisconsin.  
 The Badgers also bring back 92.6% of their minutes played (6,136 of 6,625).
- In Tuesday's win over Coppin State, senior **Ethan Happ** recorded just the 2nd triple-double in school history, posting 10 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high 12 assists (page 4).
- Preseason AP All-American **Ethan Happ** continues his assault on the UW record books. He currently ranks 7th in UW history in points (1,551), 2nd in rebounds (886), 14th in assists (282), 6th in blocks (114) and 3rd in steals (179) - more on page 7.
- UW welcomes back a pair of players who missed the final 23 games of last season with injury: sophomore guard **D'Mitrik Trice** (foot) and redshirt freshman guard **Kobe King** (knee). In Tuesday's season-opening win, Trice led all scorers with a career-high 21 points (5-9 3FGs) and King added 8 points and 4 rebounds off the bench.
- The Badgers demonstrated their improved depth in the opener as the UW bench combined for 30 points, including 16 from junior **Brevin Pritzl**. Last season, UW never had more than 25 bench points in any game and only topped 20 points twice in the final 18 games.
- In 4 seasons under Greg Gard, Wisconsin has a total of 6 wins over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll, going 6-7 in such games. Among Big Ten teams in that era, the Badgers own the 2nd-highest such win total and win percentage (Michigan 7-7, .500).
- The Badgers look to return to their usual place in the postseason in 2018-19. Wisconsin is 1 of just 5 teams to participate in at least 19 of the last 20 NCAA tournaments, joining Duke, Kansas, Michigan State and Gonzaga. UW and Kentucky are also the nation's only 2 teams to advance to 4 of the last 5 Sweet 16s or further.

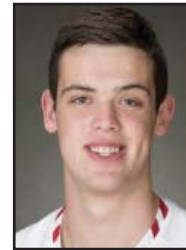

ALL-TIME VS. XAVIER

Tuesday's game will mark the 7th all-time meeting between Wisconsin and Xavier in a series that dates back to 1938. The Badgers and Musketeers are deadlocked at 3-3 in the all-time series.

The two teams have split a pair of meetings in Cincinnati with UW claiming a 27-26 win in 1938 and Xavier claiming a 57-48 win in 2001, Greg Gard's first year as an assistant coach at Wisconsin under first-year head coach Bo Ryan.

Tuesday will serve as a rubber match for a pair of recent meetings between UW and XU. The first of the 2 recent clashes came in one of the greatest games of the 2016 NCAA Tournament. In that thriller in St. Louis, UW trailed by 9 with 6:00 left, but stormed back to pull off a 66-63 win in the second round of the Big Dance.

Bronson Koenig hit back-to-back 3-pointers in the final 14 seconds -- including the game-winner on a fadeaway 3 from the corner as the final buzzer sounded.

The other meeting came in an 80-70 Xavier win in Madison last season (details at right).

A total of 4 current Badgers appeared in the 2016 meeting with Xavier. Then-freshman Ethan Happ posted 18 points and 7 rebounds, while Alex Illikainen (2 points), Khalil Iverson (2 points), and Charles Thomas (0 points) combined to play 26 minutes off the bench.

In 2 career games against Xavier, Ethan Happ has averaged 19.5 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 4.5 apg, going 14-for-23 (60.9%) from the field and 11-for-15 (73.3%) at the FT line.

The 2 teams also met in the second round of the 2009 NCAA tourney when XU claimed a 60-49 win in Boise, Idaho. UW assistant coach Joe Krabbenhoft started that game for the Badgers.

This is the Badgers' third appearance in the Gavitt Tipoff Games, having lost at Creighton, 79-67 in 2017 and vs. Xavier last season. UW is 98-88 all-time against teams in the Big East.

LAST TIME OUT

WISCONSIN 85, COPPIN STATE 63

Nov. 6, 2018 | Kohl Center | Madison, Wis.

Wisconsin opened the season with a runaway win over Coppin State last Tuesday.

The Badgers used a 22-2 first-half run to blow the game open. UW held CSU scoreless for a span of 6:59 during that span.

Senior Ethan Happ recorded the second triple-double in school history with 10 points (4-4 FTs), 11 rebounds and 12 assists.

Sophomore D'Mitrik Trice saw his first action since Dec. 6, 2017 and led all scorers with a career-high 21 points, going 5-for-9 on 3s.

Junior Brevin Pritzl chipped in 16 points, going 4-for-7 from long range. Redshirt freshman Kobe King also played for the first time since Dec. 6, 2017 by tallying 8 points and 4 rebounds.

The Badgers connected on 12 3-pointers, including 9 in the first half.

UW went 23-for-26 (.885) at the FT line, its highest percentage with at least 25 FTAs since going 28-for-31 (.903) vs. Indiana (2/3/15).

The Badgers recorded 17 assists on 25 made baskets while committing just 5 turnovers.

LAST MEETING: #15 XU 80, UW 70

Nov. 16, 2017 | Kohl Center, Madison, Wis.

The Badgers suffered their first loss of the 2017-18 season, 80-70, to No. 15 Xavier at the Kohl Center. The game was tied at 66-66 with 2:00 remaining, but XU closed on a 14-4 run to escape with a rare win in Madison.

Wisconsin erased a 9-point deficit in the first half and a 7-point deficit in the second half of a game that featured 6 ties and 10 lead changes.

Xavier out-scored UW 12-4 on second chance points, 36-26 in the paint and 13-3 in transition.

Ethan Happ posted 21 points and 8 assists, going 7-for-10 at the free throw line. Happ surpassed the 1,000-point threshold vs. XU.

Brevin Pritzl tallied 13 points (3-5 3FGs) and freshman Brad Davison notched then-career highs with 12 points and 4 steals in 28 minutes off the bench.

Trevon Bluiett (25 pts, 9 reb, 10-10 FTs) and J.P. Macura (20 pts, 8 reb.) led 4 XU players in double figures. Xavier went 20-for-23 (87.0%) at the foul line while UW was just 13-for-21 (61.9%).

## TRIPLE-DOUBLE HAPP-ENING

- With a pair of swishes at the free throw line with 6:32 remaining in UW's win over Coppin State, **Ethan Happ** authored the second triple-double in UW history. Happ finished with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists in 26:33 of action. Josh Gasser is the only other Badger to record a triple-double, posting 10 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists as a freshman at Northwestern on Jan. 23, 2011.



### RAREST OF FEATS

**Ethan Happ** is the NCAA's first player 6-10 or taller to record a triple-double with points, rebounds and assists since Northwestern's Evan Eschmeyer (27p, 14r, 10a) did it against Indiana in 1999.

- Happ's is the first triple-double by a Big Ten player since Ohio State's JaQuan Lyle had 16 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists vs. Rutgers on Jan. 13, 2016.
- Happ's 12 assists signifies a new career high and equals the 3rd-highest total in school history. His 12 assists are the most by a Badger since Mike Kelley dished out 12 vs. Maryland on Nov. 29, 2000.
- Over the last 20 years, Happ is 1 of just 2 players 6-10 or taller to dish out at least 12 assists in a game along with Georgetown's Greg Monroe (12 assists against Providence in 2010).
- Happ is the NCAA's first player to post at least 10p, 11r, 11a and 4b since Dwyane Wade in the 2003 Elite Eight vs. Kentucky (20p, 11r, 11a, 4b).

## BADGERS WILL BE ROAD-TESTED

- For the first time since the 2001-02 season, Wisconsin will play a total of 7 games away from home prior New Year's Day. In addition to 3 games at the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament, the Badgers will play road games at Xavier (Nov. 13), at Iowa (Nov. 30), at Marquette (Dec. 8) and at Western Kentucky (Dec. 29).
- Over the last 16 seasons, UW has played more than 5 games away from home in Nov./Dec. just twice, playing 6 in 2014 and 2008.
- UW has not played 4 or more true road games before New Year's in any season since 2001, when the Badgers played 5 true road games.

## FORD OUT WITH LEG INJURY

- Wisconsin will open the season without the services of sophomore forward **Aleem Ford**, who is out indefinitely after suffering a leg injury on Oct. 29. Ford is expected to return to action later this season. Ford appeared in all 33 games last season, starting 20. He averaged 5.8 points and 2.8 rebounds, shooting a team-high 40.9% (45-110) from 3-point range. A native of Lawrenceville, Georgia, Ford's 45 3FGs ranked as the fifth-highest freshman total in UW history.

## EXHIBITION EXTRACTS

- Wisconsin posted a pair of exhibition victories over Iowa State, 85-69, in a closed scrimmage and an 82-70 win over Div. III national runner-up UW-Oshkosh at the Kohl Center.
- Against Iowa State, sophomore **Aleem Ford** led the Badgers with 19 points on 7-for-9 shooting (3-3 3FGs). Sophomore **D'Mitrik Trice** poured in 16 points (4-9 3FGs) and senior **Ethan Happ** tallied 14 points, 7 rebounds, 6 assists, 2 blocks and 3 steals in 25 minutes. UW shot 47.6% compared to 40.4% for the Cyclones and out-rebounded ISU, 10-4, on the offensive glass.
- Against UW-Oshkosh, the Badgers built a 27-point lead late in the first half, before cruising to the win. Sophomore **Brad Davison** was 1 of 6 players to tally at least 9 points, leading the Badgers with 16 points. **Happ** (13), **Khalil Iverson** (13), **Nate Reuvers** (11), **Trice** (9) and **Kobe King** (9) balanced out the scoring.

## HOME ON THE ROAD

- UW is renowned for its incredible home success, but it has also been quite good on the road lately.
- Wisconsin is 62-35 (.642) away from home (road and neutral) over the last 5 seasons. That figure ranks 9th in the NCAA for most wins away from home.

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

**■ Ethan Happ - Senior - Forward**

Already one of the most-accomplished players in school history, Ethan Happ returns for his senior season looking to cement his status as one of the Big Ten's all-time greats. A two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection, two-time Big Ten All-Defensive Team pick and 2017 All-American, Happ enters the 2018-19 season with a chance to finish his career ranked in UW's top three of nearly every category. The Milan, Illinois' versatility was on display last season as he became the first Big Ten player to lead his team in points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals since 1995-96. Known for his hard work and durability (has started all 105 games in his career), Happ finds himself in an exclusive club as one of just five Big Ten players owning at least 1,500 career points, 800 rebounds and 250 assists over the last 20 years. Happ earned his bachelor's degree in May of 2018 and will spend his final year of eligibility pursuing a master's degree in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis.

Trevor Anderson is set to make his Wisconsin debut in 2018-19 after sitting out last season as a transfer from Green Bay. In one year with the Phoenix, Anderson started the first 20 games as a true freshman before suffering a back injury that cost him the remainder of the season. A physical point guard who led Stevens Point Area Senior High to back-to-back state championships, Anderson averaged 9.8 points and 2.7 assists per game for Green Bay in 2016-17.

**■ Brad Davison - Sophomore - Guard**

A relentless competitor and natural-born leader, Brad Davison put together one of the best freshman seasons in recent UW history in 2017-18. A Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection, Davison started the final 29 games of the season and flourished after taking over the point guard reins when D'Mitrik Trice was lost to a season-ending injury. The physical, combo guard scored in double figures 20 times in his debut season, demonstrating the ability to attack the rim and get to the foul line while setting UW's freshman 3-point field goal record (60). A two-sport prep standout on the hardwood and gridiron in Maple Grove, Minnesota, Davison enters his sophomore season healthy after playing 2017-18 with a left shoulder injury that included 8 dislocations during the season.

Ford sustained a leg injury on Oct. 29 and is out indefinitely, but is expected to return later this season. A native of Lawrenceville, Georgia, Ford spent a season at IMG Academy before joining the Badgers. A lengthy wing, Ford combines a soft-shooting touch with a slashing ability to get to the rim.

Even in the short sample size, the former Wisconsin Mr. Basketball showed off a versatile skill set equally adept at attacking the rim and stretching the floor.

### ■ Khalil Iverson - Senior - Forward

One of the most explosive athletes in the Big Ten, Khalil Iverson broke into Wisconsin's starting lineup last year as a junior and enjoyed the best season of his career. Now entering his senior season in 2018-19, Iverson has expanded his game from above-the-rim athlete to all-around player. In addition to highlight-reel dunks, Iverson has shown a knack for scoring in the lane and getting to the free throw line and embraced the role of defensive stopper last season. The Delaware, Ohio, native has scored 506 career points in 102 games at UW, including 33 starts.

### ■ Brevin Pritzl - Junior - Guard

After emerging as a starter in 2017-18, junior Brevin Pritzl returns for his fourth year at Wisconsin. The hot-shooting guard began his career with a medical hardship when a broken left foot cost him nearly the entire 2015-16 season. He bounced back to appear in 24 games as a redshirt freshman in 2016-17 before averaging over 29 minutes per game last season. Lethal from long range, Pritzl hit multiple 3-pointers in 13 games last season, including a career-high six triples and 20 points vs. Minnesota. The all-time leading scorer in De Pere High School history, Pritzl has rounded out his game since arriving in Madison, ranking third on the team in rebounds and tops in assist-turnover in 2017-18.

### ■ Nate Reuvers - Sophomore - Forward

Nate Reuvers enters year number two after a season of growth both on and off the court as a freshman. At 6-foot-11, Reuvers brings size to the UW frontcourt and now he has added 25 pounds to that frame. An inside-outside threat, Reuvers started 15 of the final 18 games as a true freshman in 2017-18 and finished the season averaging 5.3 ppg and 2.0 rpg in 16.6 mpg.

### ■ D'Mitrik Trice - Sophomore - Guard

D'Mitrik Trice returns as a third-year sophomore in 2018-19 after missing the final 23 games and receiving a medical hardship last season with a foot injury. Trice, who debuted with a strong freshman campaign in a sixth-man role in 2016-17, took over the starting point guard reins a year ago for Wisconsin. Starting the first 10 games of the season, Trice averaged a team-high 31.5 minutes per game and responded by ranking third on the team with 9.4 points per game and second with 2.3 assists per game before the injury. A sturdy ball handler and sharp-shooter, Trice shot a team-high 41.8 percent from 3-point range in 37 games as a freshman in 2016-17. The Huber Heights, Ohio, native has earned a reputation as a natural leader after a successful prep career in basketball and quarterbacking his high school football team to a state championship.

► UW has reached the Sweet 16 or better in 4 of the last 5 seasons. No team in the nation has gone more frequently over that span. Kentucky is the only other team with 4 appearances in the last 5 seasons.

# HEAD COACH GREG GARD

## 2016 JIM PHELAN NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

**A** coaching veteran of more than 20 years, Greg Gard has expertly made the jump from assistant coach to head coach at Wisconsin. After assuming the head coaching reins on Dec. 15, 2015, Gard promptly led the team to the Sweet 16 in each of his first two seasons at the helm and will begin his fourth season as the head coach of the Badgers in 2018-19.

Initially an interim head coach, Gard proved quickly he was worthy of the head coaching position and was officially named as such on March 7, 2016. In three seasons, he owns the third-highest winning percentage in UW history, piloting the Badgers to a record of 57-36 (.613).

In his first two seasons with the head coaching title, Gard maintained a level of success that has become synonymous with Wisconsin Basketball. In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. He followed that up by leading UW to the fifth-highest single-season win total in school history (27-10) and making a second-consecutive visit to the Sweet 16.

Gard is just the third coach in the last 20 years to pilot his team to the Sweet 16 in each of his first two seasons, joining UCLA's Steve Lavin (1996-97) and Gonzaga's Mark Few (2000-01).

Wisconsin maintained its place among the top of the Big Ten during the transition to Gard as well. In his first season, the Badgers finished the regular season in a tie for third place in the Big Ten standings – extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season – with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).

Gard's Badgers would follow that up with another 12-6 conference campaign in 2017, finishing second in both the regular season and the Big Ten tournament. Wisconsin would cap off its 27-win season with a signature win in the NCAA tournament, knocking off the nation's No. 1 team Villanova, 65-62, to advance to the Sweet 16.

Gard's first two seasons as head coach at Wisconsin continued a trend of lofty academic success, placing 15 players on the Academic All-Big Ten list. Over his 17 years in Madison, UW has boasted a total of 63 Academic All-Big Ten honors, trailing only Purdue and Northwestern over that span.

Long considered one of the top assistant coaches in the game, Gard served as an assistant at Wisconsin for 14-plus seasons, including the final seven as the associate head coach. In 2015, Gard was ranked as the fourth-best "X&O" assistant coach in college basketball by coachstat.net. In 2012, Gard was named No. 3 on the list of top assistant coaches in college basketball according to Bleacher Report. FOX Sports also listed Gard No. 10 on its list of the nation's top 25 assistant coaches.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin in 2001, Gard spent the previous two seasons as an assistant at UW-Milwaukee and served as an assistant coach at UW-Platteville from 1993-99.

Prior to joining Ryan's staff in Platteville, Gard spent three seasons at Southwestern High School and one at Platteville High School, where he served in junior high and assistant varsity coaching capacities.

In 2016, Gard and his wife, Michelle, partnered with the University of the Wisconsin and Wisconsin Foundation and Alumni Association, to launch Garding Against Cancer. This fundraising initiative raises funds and awareness for cancer research and care within the state of Wisconsin. In its first two years of hosting fundraising events across the state, GAC raised more than \$2 million dollars in the fight against cancer.

Gard is a 1995 graduate of UW-Platteville with a degree in physical and health education. He received a master's degree in counselor education from Platteville in 2007. Gard and his wife, Michelle, have two daughters, Mackenzie and Peyton, and a son, Isaac.
