GAME 1

SEASON OPENS TUESDAY

- Wisconsin will officially open the 2018-19 season on Tuesday, Nov. 6 against Coppin State at the Kohl Center. The Badgers have won 15 of the last 16 season openers dating back to the 2002-03 season.
- The Badgers will have a week until their next game when they travel to Cincinnati, Ohio to take on Xavier on Nov. 13 as part of the Gavitt Games between the Big Ten and Big East conferences. UW has split a pair of recent matchups with the Musketeers, claiming a 66-63 win in the 2016 NCAA Tournament and falling, 80-70, at home last season.



Preseason All-American Ethan Happ enters his senior season as 1 of 5 Big Ten players in the last 20 years to tally 1,500 points, 800 rebounds and 250 assists in his career.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- Wisconsin begins its 121st season of men's basketball in 2018-19 and the fourth under head coach Greg Gard. As head coach, Gard has led the Badgers to a mark of 57-36 (.613) overall in his first 3 seasons, the 3rd-highest win percentage in program history (min. 60 games).
- Wisconsin returns 94.9% (2,094 of 2,206 points) of its scoring in 2018-19, the 6th-highest mark in all of college basketball. George Mason (100%), Harvard (99.4%), Wofford (96.0%), Washington (95.9%) and Brown (95.3%) are the only schools with a higher percentage of returning points.
The Badgers also bring back 92.6% of their minutes played (6,136 of 6,625).
- In UW's lone exhibition game, sophomore **Brad Davison** led 4 Badgers in double figures, scoring 16 points against UW-Oshkosh last Friday. Seniors **Ethan Happ** and **Khalil Iverson** both scored 13 points and sophomore **Nate Reuvers** added 11 in the win.
- Preseason AP All-American **Ethan Happ** enters his senior season ranked 8th in UW history in points (1,541), 2nd in rebounds (875), 17th in assists (270), 6th in blocks (110) and 3rd in steals (179).
- Including Happ (a 2017 and 2018 All-Big Ten selection), Wisconsin players have earned a total of 15 first-team All-Big Ten honors since 2001-02, the most of any team (Ohio State is second with 13).
- In 3 seasons under Greg Gard, Wisconsin has a total of 6 wins over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll, going 6-7 in such games. Among Big Ten teams in that era, the Badgers own the second-highest win total and win percentage over top-10 teams (Michigan 7-7, .500).
- The Badgers look to return to their usual place in the postseason in 2018-19. Wisconsin is 1 of just 5 teams to participate in at least 19 of the last 20 NCAA tournaments, joining Duke, Kansas, Michigan State and Gonzaga.

ALL-TIME VS. COPPIN STATE

- Tuesday's game will mark the 4th all-time meeting between Wisconsin and Coppin State in a series that dates back to 1997.
- The Badgers own a 3-0 lead in the all-time series, including an 80-56 win in the most recent meeting in 2010.

UW IN SEASON OPENERS

- Wisconsin has won 15 of its last 16 season openers dating back to 2001. The lone loss came in a 69-67 setback to Western Illinois in the 2015-16 debut.
- Last season, the Badgers opened with an 85-50 win over South Carolina State. UW's last 15 season-opening wins have come by an average of 28.3 ppg.

BADGERS WILL BE ROAD-TESTED

- For the first time since the 2001-02 season, Wisconsin will play a total of 7 games away from home prior New Year's Day.
In addition to 3 games at the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament, the Badgers will play road games at Xavier (Nov. 13), at Iowa (Nov. 30), at Marquette (Dec. 8) and at Western Kentucky (Dec. 29).
- Over the last 16 seasons, UW has played more than 5 games away from home in Nov./Dec. just twice, playing 6 in 2014 and 2008.
- UW has not played 4 or more true road games before New Year's in any season since 2001, when the Badgers played 5 true road games.

EXHIBITION EXTRACTS

- Wisconsin posted a pair of exhibition victories over Iowa State, 85-69, in a closed scrimmage and an 82-70 win over Div. III national runner-up UW-Oshkosh at the Kohl Center.
- Against Iowa State, sophomore **Aleem Ford** led the Badgers with 19 points on 7-for-9 shooting (3-3 3FGs). Sophomore **D'Mitrik Trice** poured in 16 points (4-9 3FGs) and senior **Ethan Happ** tallied 14 points, 7 rebounds, 6 assists, 2 blocks and 3 steals in 25 minutes.
UW shot 47.6% compared to 40.4% for the Cyclones and out-rebounded ISU, 10-4, on the offensive glass.
- Against UW-Oshkosh, the Badgers built a 27-point lead late in the first half, before cruising to the win.
Sophomore **Brad Davison** was 1 of 6 players to tally at least 9 points, leading the Badgers with 16 points. **Happ** (13), **Khalil Iverson** (13), **Nate Reuvers** (11), **Trice** (9) and **Kobe King** (9) balanced out the scoring.

FORD OUT WITH LEG INJURY

- Wisconsin will open the season without the services of sophomore forward **Aleem Ford**, who is out indefinitely after suffering a leg injury on Oct. 29. Ford is expected to return to action later this season.
Ford appeared in all 33 games last season, starting 20. He averaged 5.8 points and 2.8 rebounds, shooting a team-high 40.9% (45-110) from 3-point range. A native of Lawrenceville, Georgia, Ford's 45 3FGs ranked as the fifth-highest freshman total in UW history.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

■ Ethan Happ - Senior - Forward

Already one of the most-accomplished players in school history, Ethan Happ returns for his senior season looking to cement his status as one of the Big Ten's all-time greats. A two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection, two-time Big Ten All-Defensive Team pick and 2017 All-American, Happ enters the 2018-19 season with a chance to finish his career ranked in UW's top three of nearly every category. The Milan, Illinois' versatility was on display last season as he became the first Big Ten player to lead his team in points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals since 1995-96. Known for his hard work and durability (has started all 105 games in his career), Happ finds himself in an exclusive club as one of just five Big Ten players owning at least 1,500 career points, 800 rebounds and 250 assists over the last 20 years. Happ earned his bachelor's degree in May of 2018 and will spend his final year of eligibility pursuing a master's degree in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis.

■ Trevor Anderson - Sophomore - Guard

Trevor Anderson is set to make his Wisconsin debut in 2018-19 after sitting out last season as a transfer from Green Bay. In one year with the Phoenix, Anderson started the first 20 games as a true freshman before suffering a back injury that cost him the remainder of the season. A physical point guard who led Stevens Point Area Senior High to back-to-back state championships, Anderson averaged 9.8 points and 2.7 assists per game for Green Bay in 2016-17.

■ Brad Davison - Sophomore - Guard

A relentless competitor and natural-born leader, Brad Davison put together one of the best freshman seasons in recent UW history in 2017-18. A Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection, Davison started the final 29 games of the season and flourished after taking over the point guard reins when D'Mitrik Trice was lost to a season-ending injury. The physical, combo guard scored in double figures 20 times in his debut season, demonstrating the ability to attack the rim and get to the foul line while setting UW's freshman 3-point field goal record (60). A two-sport prep standout on the hardwood and gridiron in Maple Grove, Minnesota, Davison enters his sophomore season healthy after playing 2017-18 with a left shoulder injury that included 8 dislocations during the season.

■ Aleem Ford - Sophomore - Forward

Aleem Ford turned heads last season, appearing in all 33 games (20 starts) and playing 24.4 minutes in his first season of action at Wisconsin. Now a redshirt sophomore, Ford has added 15 pounds and looks to build on a season in which he led the Badgers shooting 40.9% from 3-point range. Ford sustained a leg injury on Oct. 29 and is out indefinitely, but is expected to return later this season. A native of Lawrenceville, Georgia, Ford spent a season at IMG Academy before joining the Badgers. A lengthy wing, Ford combines a soft-shooting touch with a slashing ability to get to the rim.

■ Kobe King - Freshman - Guard

An athletic combo guard, Kobe King returns from an injury-shortened freshman season. King averaged 19.0 minutes and 5.2 points per game during the first 10 games of last season before suffering a season-ending knee injury. King was granted a medical hardship and will retain his freshman eligibility in 2018-19. Even in the short sample size, the former Wisconsin Mr. Basketball showed off a versatile skill set equally adept at attacking the rim and stretching the floor.

■ Khalil Iverson - Senior - Forward

One of the most explosive athletes in the Big Ten, Khalil Iverson broke into Wisconsin's starting lineup last year as a junior and enjoyed the best season of his career. Now entering his senior season in 2018-19, Iverson has expanded his game from above-the-rim athlete to all-around player. In addition to highlight-reel dunks, Iverson has shown a knack for scoring in the lane and getting to the free throw line and embraced the role of defensive stopper last season. The Delaware, Ohio, native has scored 506 career points in 102 games at UW, including 33 starts.

■ Brevin Pritzl - Junior - Guard

After emerging as a starter in 2017-18, junior Brevin Pritzl returns for his fourth year at Wisconsin. The hot-shooting guard began his career with a medical hardship when a broken left foot cost him nearly the entire 2015-16 season. He bounced back to appear in 24 games as a redshirt freshman in 2016-17 before averaging over 29 minutes per game last season. Lethal from long range, Pritzl hit multiple 3-pointers in 13 games last season, including a career-high six triples and 20 points vs. Minnesota. The all-time leading scorer in De Pere High School history, Pritzl has rounded out his game since arriving in Madison, ranking third on the team in rebounds and tops in assist-to-turnover in 2017-18.

■ Nate Reuvers - Sophomore - Forward

Nate Reuvers enters year number two after a season of growth both on and off the court as a freshman. At 6-foot-11, Reuvers brings size to the UW frontcourt and now he has added 25 pounds to that frame. An inside-outside threat, Reuvers started 15 of the final 18 games as a true freshman in 2017-18 and finished the season averaging 5.3 ppg and 2.0 rpg in 16.6 mpg.

■ D'Mitrik Trice - Sophomore - Guard

D'Mitrik Trice returns as a third-year sophomore in 2018-19 after missing the final 23 games and receiving a medical hardship last season with a foot injury. Trice, who debuted with a strong freshman campaign in a sixth-man role in 2016-17, took over the starting point guard reins a year ago for Wisconsin. Starting the first 10 games of the season, Trice averaged a team-high 31.5 minutes per game and responded by ranking third on the team with 9.4 points per game and second with 2.3 assists per game before the injury. A sturdy ball handler and sharp-shooter, Trice shot a team-high 41.8 percent from 3-point range in 37 games as a freshman in 2016-17. The Huber Heights, Ohio, native has earned a reputation as a natural leader after a successful prep career in basketball and quarterbacking his high school football team to a state championship.

HEAD COACH GREG GARD

2016 JIM PHELAN NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

A coaching veteran of more than 20 years, Greg Gard has expertly made the jump from assistant coach to head coach at Wisconsin. After assuming the head coaching reins on Dec. 15, 2015, Gard promptly led the team to the Sweet 16 in each of his first two seasons at the helm and will begin his fourth season as the head coach of the Badgers in 2018-19.

Initially an interim head coach, Gard proved quickly he was worthy of the head coaching position and was officially named as such on March 7, 2016. In three seasons, he owns the third-highest winning percentage in UW history, piloting the Badgers to a record of 57-36 (.613).

In his first two seasons with the head coaching title, Gard maintained a level of success that has become synonymous with Wisconsin Basketball. In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. He followed that up by leading UW to the fifth-highest single-season win total in school history (27-10) and making a second-consecutive visit to the Sweet 16.

Gard is just the third coach in the last 20 years to pilot his team to the Sweet 16 in each of his first two seasons, joining UCLA's Steve Lavin (1996-97) and Gonzaga's Mark Few (2000-01).

Wisconsin maintained its place among the top of the Big Ten during the transition to Gard as well. In his first season, the Badgers finished the regular season in a tie for third place in the Big Ten standings — extending its streak of top-four finishes to a league-record 16th-consecutive season — with a 12-6 conference record. Gard led the Badgers to the most Big Ten wins by a first-year coach since 2004 (Bruce Weber, Illinois).

Gard's Badgers would follow that up with another 12-6 conference campaign in 2017, finishing second in both the regular season and the Big Ten tournament. Wisconsin would cap off its 27-win season with a signature win in the NCAA tournament, knocking off the nation's No. 1 team Villanova, 65-62, to advance to the Sweet 16.

Gard's first two seasons as head coach at Wisconsin continued a trend of lofty academic success, placing 15 players on the Academic All-Big Ten list. Over his 17 years in Madison, UW has boasted a total of 63 Academic All-Big Ten honors, trailing only Purdue and Northwestern over that span.

Long considered one of the top assistant coaches in the game, Gard served as an assistant at Wisconsin for 14-plus seasons, including the final seven as the associate head coach. In 2015, Gard was ranked as the fourth-best "X&O" assistant coach in college basketball by coachstat.net. In 2012, Gard was named No. 3 on the list of top assistant coaches in college basketball according to Bleacher Report. FOX Sports also listed Gard No. 10 on its list of the nation's top 25 assistant coaches.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin in 2001, Gard spent the previous two seasons as an assistant at UW-Milwaukee and served as an assistant coach at UW-Platteville from 1993-99.

Prior to joining Ryan's staff in Platteville, Gard spent three seasons at Southwestern High School and one at Platteville High School, where he served in junior high and assistant varsity coaching capacities.
