OPENING TIP: Rutgers travels to No. 22/22

Wisconsin on Monday for its first Big Ten road game of the season and third game in six days (two on the road) against teams ranked or receiving votes. RU has the opportunity to earn its first ranked victory since defeating No. 15 Seton Hall at the RAC last season and first ranked win on the road since downing No. 13 Pittsburgh on Jan. 26, 2008.

Rutgers will be working to return to the win column following a 78-67 loss to No. 9/8 Michigan State before a sold-out RAC on Friday evening. Eugene Omoruyi had a double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds and ranks ninth nationally with four double-doubles this season. RU held MSU 10 points below its average and committed a season-low seven turnovers in the first November sell out at the RAC since 1997.

THE SERIES: The contest signals the ninth meeting between the Scarlet Knights and Badgers dating back to 1949 with Wisconsin holding a 6-2 advantage. Rutgers' two victories both came at home since joining the Big Ten. In the last meeting, Rutgers earned a 64-60 win at The RAC last season, forcing All-American Ethan Happ into seven turnovers. Rutgers' win over No. 4 Wisconsin at home on Jan. 11, 2015 was its last win over a top-ten foe and highest ranked victory in program history. This is RU's third trip to the Kohl Center, with UW winning the prior contests.

THE OPPONENT: Wisconsin is 7-1, with its lone loss coming to No. 4 Virginia. The Badgers defeated No. 14 Iowa Friday in its Big Ten opener and also own wins over Xavier, Stanford, Oklahoma and N.C. State. UW's five wins over Power Five teams are the most in the nation. 2017 All-American Ethan Happ and D'Mitrik Trice share the team lead with 17.4 points-per-game. Trice is the Big Ten's leading 3-point shooter (58.3%), while Happ is second in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in rebounding (11.6). Happ leads the nation with seven double-doubles. Wisconsin is first in the Big Ten in 3-point FG% (42.1).

Wisconsin is sixth in the NCAA's NET rankings, and is the nation's number 11 team per KenPom. Since the 2001-02 season when Greg Gard first joined the staff, UW is 124-24 (.838) in Big Ten home games, the best mark in the conference.



Scarlet Knight Notables

- Per KenPom.com analysis, Rutgers is among the nation's youngest teams with 1.18 years of experience to rank 311th nationally out of 353 D-I programs.
- Rutgers ranks 19th nationally in scoring defense (59.6), 19th in blocked shots (5.6) and 38th in FG% defense (38.3). RU is among the top five in the Big Ten in seven stat categories, including second in blocked shots (5.6) and third in rebounding (41.1) and scoring defense (59.6).
- Seventeen of Rutgers' 30 regular season games (57%) are against opponents currently ranked or receiving votes in the polls. Five Big Ten programs that have won NCAA titles will compete in Piscataway, including five-time champion Indiana.
- Eugene Omoruyi has four double-doubles through seven contests, ranking ninth in the nation.
- Eugene Omoruyi's 17 rebounds vs. BU marked the most for a Rutgers player since Adrian Hill grabbed 18 versus Notre Dame on March 3, 2007, a span of 12 seasons.
- Against Eastern Michigan, Rutgers allowed four points in the opening half to tie the NCAA Division I record for fewest points allowed in a half during the shot clock era (since 1985-86). The 36 points allowed also tied the school record, matching the defensive effort against Columbia (60-36) on Nov. 18, 2002 in the preseason NIT at the RAC.
- In the shot clock era, Rutgers has held an opponent under 40 points eight times. Steve Pikiell has been the head coach in four of those contests.
- Per KenPom.com analysis, Rutgers is among the nation's tallest teams with an average height of 79.0" to rank fifth behind UCLA (79.3"), Syracuse (79.3"), Stanford (79.2") and Siena (79.2").

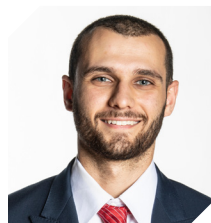

PAUL MULCAHY SIGNS WITH SCARLET KNIGHTS

Paul Mulcahy, an ESPN four-star prospect who averaged 17.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 6.7 assists-per-game under head coach Mergin Sina as a junior at Gill St Bernard's HS in Gladstone, N.J., signed to compete at Rutgers.

"I'm very excited about Paul," said Steve Pikiell. "He's a 6-6 pass first point guard. I think he is one of the best passers in the country. He's a winner, from a winning program. He is a great student that comes from a great family. He's a terrific basketball talent. He plays the game the right way. People are going to love his tenacity and his toughness. We are so excited to have him join our Rutgers family and watch him make all kinds of highlights at The RAC."

The son of Paul and Lisa Mulcahy, the Rivals 150 selection has five siblings and signed with the Scarlet Knights over reported offers from Northwestern, UConn and Xavier.

RWJBARNABAS HEALTH ATHLETIC PERFORMANCE CENTER

The RWJBarnabas Health Athletic Performance Center at Rutgers University continues to rise next to the RAC. Slated for completion in summer of 2019, the 307,000-square-foot, sports facility and parking deck will provide state-of-the-art practice facilities, training areas, locker room, film room, NBA scout observation deck and office space for men's basketball, in addition to shared support (nutrition cafe, VIP/closing room, roof terrace, hydrotherapy, etc.) and public elements (spirit store, lobby/hall of fame).

THE EXCITEMENT IS RISING

For the third straight year, men's basketball has experienced an increase in paid season tickets. For 2018-19, there was an 8% increase in tickets and 17% increase in revenue from 2017-18. Overall there is an 18% increase in tickets and 75% increase in revenue from 2016-17. RAC Pass, a mobile-only ticket solution made available in a limited quantity of 200, sold out for the second consecutive season. Rutgers Athletics created new loge seating on the east baseline to improve the game day experience and offer seating options more consistent with our Big Ten Conference and metropolitan peers. Sponsored by EisnerAmper, the new loge seating has 48 seats with a delineated tabletop.

In 2017-18, Rutgers enjoyed multiple home sell-outs at the RAC in the same season for the first time since 2011. The 8,325 spectators vs. Purdue (Feb. 3, 2018) was the largest at the RAC in 15 years. This year, the game on November 30 vs. Michigan State marked the first November sell-out at the RAC since Nov. 22, 1997 vs. Princeton.

PERFORMING IN THE CLASSROOM

Men's basketball concluded the 2017-18 school year with a 2.9 team grade point average and four Dean's List honorees. In the spring 2018 semester, 10 players posted GPAs of 3.0 or higher. In the NCAA Graduate Success Rate (GSR) report issued on Nov. 14, 2018, men's basketball achieved a score of 82. In addition, the team's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score was 984, which ranked fifth among conference programs.

GIVING BACK

A commitment to the community has been emblematic of Rutgers basketball under Steve Pikiell, with all student-athletes participating in Leadership Development and Strategic Partnerships community service initiatives. On Sept. 30, men's basketball (with the RU baseball team)

participated in the annual Tunnel to Towers 5K Run & Walk for the second consecutive year. Last season, the program sponsored a charity exhibition that raised \$15,000 for American Red Cross Disaster Relief and hosted a clinic with the Special Olympics New Jersey unified basketball team that represented the Garden State at the 2018 Special Olympics USA games. The team has also volunteered at Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, participated in the SAAC Holiday Toy Giveaway and visited children at RWJBarnabas Health facilities around the state.

UTILIZING THE LATEST TRAINING TECHNOLOGIES

Rutgers strives to implement the latest technologies to benefit its student-athletes. In that effort, men's basketball utilizes Sparta Science, Catapult, Polar Team Pro and GymAware. With the recently-dedicated Druskin Strength and Conditioning Center as a backdrop, David VanDyke and Richard Campbell have made a significant impact on the program's student-athletes. In their initial two seasons, players were sidelined a total of 14 combined games due to injury. The Scarlet Knights had 11 total games missed among players in 2017-18 after players combined to miss a total of just three games in 2016-17.

Sparta Science provides an objective measure of how players react to gravity with validated scientific assessments and provides evidence based training prescriptions. Catapult replaces laboratory-based performance testing with microtechnology to obtain actionable data in real time regarding performance. Polar Team Pro provides real-time heart rate data to make objective decisions. GymAware is the gold standard Linear Positional Transducer (LPT with angle measurement) for measuring performance, implementing Velocity Based Training and monitoring power.

Before and after every season, men's basketball welcomes BAM (Basic Athletic Measurement) to the RAC to conduct player testing. A team of strength and conditioning coaches and technology professionals who utilize the most reliable methods and precise measuring tools, BAM has conducted the NBA Draft combine since 2009. Results are registered to a BAMScores™, a proprietary index for reliably measuring athletic performance, and placed in a requisite category. As a result, players receive the information necessary to gauge personal and professional aspirations.

STATE PRIDE IN PAINT

READY TO MAKE A #GARDENSTATEMENT

The Scarlet Knights must replace two regular season starters, six scholarship letterwinners, 55% of its scoring and 48% of its rebounding from last season. Rutgers returns seven scholarship lettermen, including 2017-18 redshirts Peter Kiss and Myles Johnson, from a team that advanced to the 2018 Big Ten quarterfinals at MSG via victories over Minnesota and Indiana. It marked the first time RU won two conference tournament games since 1998. Four players who started in the BIG Championship return in co-captains Shaquille Doorson and Eugene Omoruyi, Issa Thiam and MET Rookie of the Year Geo Baker.

Rutgers welcomed a signing class that includes multiple (Montez Mathis, Ron Harper, Jr.) four-star players for the first time since 2008. Junior college transfer Shaq Carter is a preseason Big Ten All-Newcomer selection by *Street & Smith's*.

2017-18: RIDE & GRIND

Despite the 2nd toughest conference schedule in the Big Ten per Ken Pom analysis for the 2nd straight year in 2017-18, Rutgers ranked 17th nationally in scoring defense (64.8) and offensive rebounding (13.15), while placing 27th in 3-point FG% defense (27.0). RU ranked among the top three in eight Big Ten stat categories last season, including leading the league in offensive rebounding and 3-point FG% defense. RU played 10 games against NCAA Tournament round of 32 qualifiers.

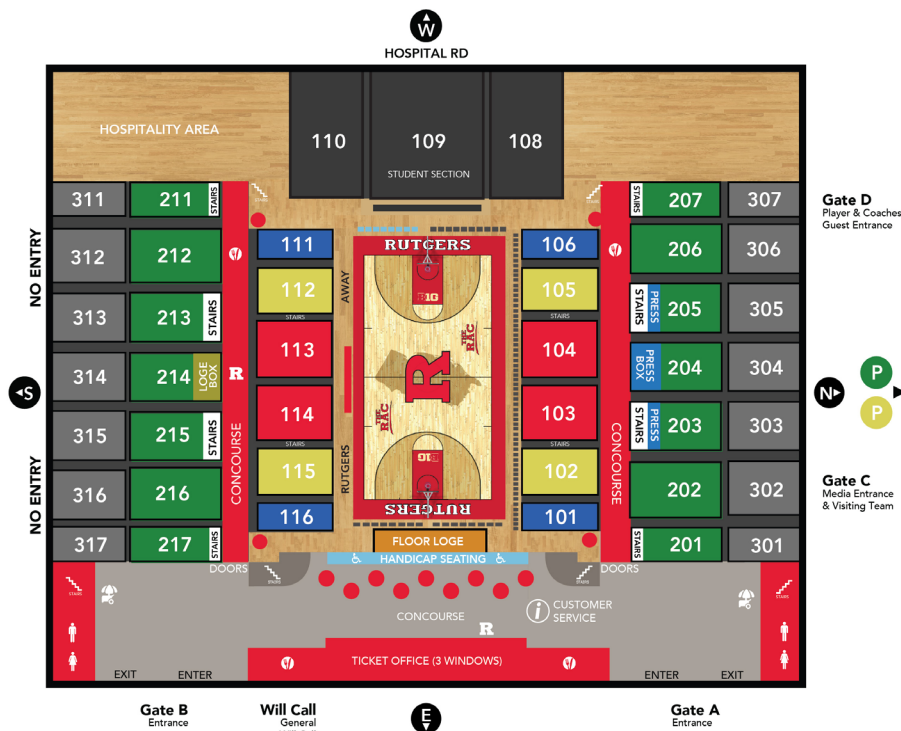

The opposing coach and players (if requested) will also be brought to the media conference room, either before or after Rutgers depending on time constraints.
