Game 4: McNeese (1-2, 0-0) at Wisconsin (1-1, 0-0)

Nov. 11, 2019 • 6 p.m. (CT) • Kohl Center • Madison, Wisconsin

The Game:

- McNeese will play its fourth game in eight days on Wednesday night when it visits Wisconsin.
- This will also be the third game away from home in the four outings.
- Wednesday's game will be the first of three as part of the Legends Classic, an early season tournament that features eight teams from eight different conferences.
- McNeese is 0-6 all-time vs. members of the Big Ten Conference (losses to Illinois, Michigan State, Iowa, Ohio State, Indiana, and Purdue).

Last Time Out:

- McNeese had a record night in a 104-33 win over Southern-New Orleans on Monday night.
- The Cowboys set a new school record with 19 three-point baskets (old mark was 15) and a 63.3 shooting percentage behind the arc (old record 61.5 percent).
- Newcomers Dru Kuxhausen and Sam Baker combined to hit 14 of 19 from 3FG range and scored 44 points - Kuxhausen with 23 and Baker 21.
- Each sank 7 threes - Kuxhausen going 7 for 10 and Baker 7 for 9.
- Sha'Markus Kennedy added 14 points and A.J. Lawson 12 as McNeese hit 53.3 percent for the game from the field and 61 percent in the second half.

PLAYER NOTES:**Roydell Brown**

- Preseason All-Southland Conference 2nd Team
- Missed the last eight games of the season last year due to a sprained ankle
- Averaged 19.5 pts and 9.2 rebounds in SLC games before his injury.
- Has good range and has tremendous jumping ability.
- Recorded 11 double-doubles last season and scored in double-figures 18 times.
- Scored 20 or more seven times with a high of 28 points against HBU.
- Had a streak where he scored 20 or more in four straight games.
- 12 double-digit rebounding games with a high of 17 in a win over Campbellsville-Harrodsburg.

Sha'Markus Kennedy

- Preseason All-Southland Conference 2nd Team.
- Led the team and ranked 3rd in the Southland Conference with 59 blocked shots.
- 6th in the league in rebounding with a 7.1 average.
- Averaged 14.6 points while connecting on 62 percent of his shots in SLC games only.
- Recorded seven double-doubles on the season.
- Scored 20 or more a team-high 9 times with a high of 30 points against Campbellsville-Harrodsburg.
- Led the team and ranked No. 1 in the league FG shooting at 64.1 percent.

Trey Johnson

- Saw action in 20 games as a true freshman last season.
- Quick on his feet and good with his hands is what makes him such a good defender.
- Scored season-high 7 points a couple of times last season - vs. Central Arkansas and New Orleans.

A.J. Lawson

- Took a redshirt last season due to transfer rules after coming over from North Texas.
- Has tremendous ability in handling the ball and great range on his shots.
- Expected to play a lot at point guard but can play four positions.
- Can score in a lot of ways and a great passer.

Dru Kuxhausen

- A shooter Coach Schroyer says is the best 3-point shooter he's ever seen.
- Has an unbelievable skill set and has deep range.
- Able to get the ball off quick.
- Ability to knock down perimeter shots at a high clip.
- Brings a dimension to McNeese basketball that wasn't seen last season.

Sam Baker

- Strong shooter who is good off the screen with catch-and-shooting.
- Good ball handler and has good range with his shots.
- Appeared in 18 games last season as a sophomore at Northwest Florida.

Jalen Poyser

- A transfer from St. Bonaventure who is eligible to play immediately.
- Can play three positions.
- Played at UNLV prior to St. Bonaventure so has a lot of Division I experience and is expected to be a key player this season.
- Played in 27 games making 13 start at St. Bonaventure and averaged 9.6 points while connecting on 32 percent of his 3-point shots.

Chris Orlina

- Will add depth to the forward position.
- A member of two JUCO Final Four teams and winning a national championship.
- Schroyer call him his Swiss Army Knife, meaning he can be used, and beat teams, in a lot of ways.

Leondre Washington

- A transfer from Barton Community College but before that, played at Robert Morris so he has some Division I experience.
- A good shooter and ball handler.
- Has the ability to shoot and drive close outs.

Truman Moore

- Transfer from Snow College where he earned all-conference and all-region honors while leading his team to a 26-7 record.
- A big body that can create some space.
- Has a high basketball IQ and is a good passer for his size.
- Signed with Utah Valley out of high school but instead served a two-year mission to Canada.

Jeremy Harrell

- Took a redshirt last season.
- Dropped some weight during the offseason and can play either inside or the outside.

NBA great Joe Dumars played for the Cowboys

Perhaps the greatest player in McNeese Basketball history and one of the best to play in the Southland Conference, Joe Dumars etched his name as one of the greats collegiately but also professionally.

During his college career, Dumars is one of only three players in SLC history to be named to the first team all-SLC squad four times. He currently holds eight McNeese records, including the all-time scoring mark with 2,607 points. He also holds school records for most career field goals made (942) and attempted (2,038); career free throws made (723) and attempted (917); single-season scoring as a junior (26.4 ppg), sophomore (19.6 ppg), and a freshman (18.2 ppg). His 25.8 average as a senior ranked him No. 6 in the nation and ended his career as the 11th leading scorer in NCAA history.

He was named the Southland Conference and Louisiana Player of the Year in 1985 and the SLC Freshman of the Year in 1982. Also in 1985, was named a Sporting News All-American and played in the East-West, Aloha and Hall of Fame Classics.

His No. 4 jersey is one of only four retired by the McNeese basketball program.

Drafted 18th overall in the first round of the 1985 NBA draft, he played guard for the Detroit Pistons for his entire career, from 1985 to 1999. He won two championships as a player in 1989 and 1990, and was voted the 1989 Finals MVP, averaging 27.3 points per game as the Pistons swept the Los Angeles Lakers in four games. The following year, he won accolades during the Eastern Conference Finals when, with Dennis Rodman, he was a cornerstone of coach Chuck Daly's "Jordan Rules" defensive playbook, which forced the Chicago Bulls to change their offensive strategy to include less of Michael Jordan and more of the other members of the team. According to Jordan, Dumars was the best defender he ever faced in the NBA.

During his career, he was selected to the All-Star team six times, and to the All-Defensive first team four times. In 14 seasons, all with the Pistons, Dumars scored 16,401 points, handed out 4,612 assists, grabbed 2,203 rebounds and recorded 902 steals.

Although he was a member of the famed "Bad Boys" teams known for their aggressive play and demeanor, he became personally known for his quiet and upstanding behavior. He was the first recipient of the NBA Sportsmanship Award which has been named the Joe Dumars Trophy.

His number 4 jersey was retired by the Pistons in March 2000. He has the distinction as being the only Pistons player to ever wear this number.

He played for the US national team, the Dream Team 2, in the 1994 FIBA World Championship, winning the gold medal.

He was inducted into the Louisiana Association of Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1990, McNeese Sports Hall of Fame in 1994, Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2003, Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006, and the Southland Conference Hall of Honor in 2009.

Heath Schroyer, a veteran coach in the Division I ranks with over 20 years of experience at the level, including 10 as a head coach, enters his second season as the McNeese Cowboys head coach.

Schroyer broke into the coaching ranks in 1996 at Fresno City College before being hired on a year later at BYU for his first stint

with the Cougars.

After spending four seasons at BYU (1997-2001) where he helped rebuild a team that won one game in 1996-97 to the Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2000-01, he was an assistant coach at Wyoming (2001-02) where he helped guide the Cowboys to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 1987-88 season.

Following his stint at Wyoming, Schroyer earned his first head coaching job at Portland State from 2002-05 where he led the Vikings to 19 wins and the Big Sky Conference title in 2004-05 for the school's first league title in any men's sport.

He went on to become the associate head coach at Fresno State from 2005-07 and then back to Wyoming as head coach from 2007-11.

Schroyer was hired as an assistant coach at UNLV from 2011-14 where he was named one of the nation's top 15 assistant coaches twice in three seasons. He helped UNLV land four McDonald's All-Americans and two top 10 recruiting classes in three seasons.



He was named the head coach at UT-Martin in 2014 and guided the Skyhawks to back-to-back 20-win seasons and back-to-back appearances in the CIT.

While at UT-Martin, Schroyer was named the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Men's Basketball Coach of the Year and was a finalist for mid-major Coach of the Year for the 2014-15 season.

He spent the 2016-17 season as the assistant head coach at North Carolina State and rejoined the BYU staff this past season where he has helped guide the Cougars to a 24-win season and an appearance in the NIT.

In addition, three of Schroyer's assistants over the years are current Division I head coaches – Barrett Peery at Portland State, Dedrique Taylor at Cal State Fullerton, and Anthony Stewart at UT Martin.

He began his coaching career as an assistant at Fresno City College in 1996-97, before stops at BYU (1997-2001) and a year (2001-02) as an assistant at Wyoming, the school he would later return to as head coach.

Schroyer prepped at the prestigious DeMatha High School program in Hyattsville, Md., where he played for the legendary coach Morgan Wootten, whose 1,274 wins as a head coach are the second-most in the history of basketball at any level.

Earning his bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1995, Schroyer earned his Master's degree in institutional leadership from National University in Fresno, Calif. in 1996.

A native of Walkersville, Md., Schroyer married the former Kim Ortega of Logandale, Nev., in May of 2014. He has one daughter, Sierra, and a son, Hayden, from a previous marriage.

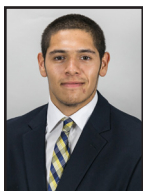

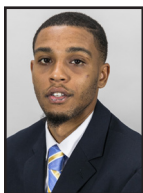
