STORYLINES

- · This is the first of two games under the current home-andhome contract. The Vols travel to Madison to face the Badgers on Nov. 11, 2020.
- · Tennessee's last contract with a Big Ten program was a two-game series with Ohio State in 2006-07 and 2007-08. Each team won at home.
- · Wisconsin boasts four Final Four appearances and a national championship in 1941.
- Tennessee Director of Men's Basketball Sports Performance Garrett Medenwald is a native of Green Bay, Wisconsin, and a 2013 graduate of UW-Whitewater.
- Lamonté Turner announced on Dec. 21 that he will no longer suit up for the Vols due to thoracic outlet syndrome.

LAYUP LINES

- Tennessee fell out of the top-25 rankings this week, though it is receiving votes in both polls.
- Tennessee leads the SEC and ranks ninth nationally in scoring defense, allowing only 57.2 ppg.
- Tennessee is a perfect 23 for 23 at the free-throw line over its last two games.
- Junior John Fulkerson is shooting a team-best .671 from the field while averaging a career-best 11.8 points per game this season.
- Junior forward Yves Pons has blocked at least one shot in every game this season and tied UT's single-game record with six blocks against Jacksonville State.
- True freshman Josiah-Jordan James leads the Vols and ranks 12th in the SEC with 6.3 rebounds per game. He is the top-rebounding freshman in the league.
- Midyear enrollee Santiago Vescovi set to arrive in Knoxville Saturday. See note on Page 3.

BY THE NUMBERS



There are only six active NCAA head coaches who have more career Division I wins to their credit than **Rick Barnes** (700).



Three Tennessee players were selected in the 2019 NBA Draft. No school in the country produced more.



Tennessee currently ranks third in the country in average home attendance (18,603), trailing only Syracuse and Kentucky.

NOTEWORTHY

BARNES BECOMES SEVENTH ACTIVE COACH TO REACH 700 CAREER WINS

- Rick Barnes recorded his 700th career victory as a college head coach when the Vols defeated Jacksonville State on Dec. 21.
- He became the seventh active head coach to log 700 Division I victories and the 22nd all-time.
- He is four victories away from recording his 100th win at Tennessee.

TURNER SHUTS IT DOWN

- After battling through shoulder problems since the 2017-18 season, redshirt senior guard Lamonté Turner announced on Dec. 21 that he was ending his UT playing career due to thoracic outlet syndrome.
- Turner graduated in May of 2019 (Communication Studies). He scored 1,086 career points and ranks tied for 10th in program history with 171 made 3-pointers.
- It is a significant blow to this UT roster, as Turner was the team's unquestioned leader. Jordan Bowden is now the team's lone active senior.

VESCOVI'S ARRIVAL IMMENENT

- Given the status of senior guard Lamonté Turner, the arrival of mid-year enrollee Santiago Vescovi is well timed.
- The 18-year-old, Uruguayan guard is set to arrive in Knoxville Saturday. Vescovi comes to Rocky Top from the NBA Global Academy in Canberra, Australia.
- Vescovi must await standard NCAA and SEC clearance protocols before becoming eligible to compete in games, and a decision on whether or not he will compete this season has yet to be made.
- Adjusting to college life is a challenge in itself—and the demands of playing the guard position for **Rick Barnes** is equally as difficult, if not more so.

TENACIOUS D

- Even when the Vols have struggled to produce offense, their smothering defense has kept them afloat.
- Tennessee allow only one of its first 11 opponents to score 70 points (Cincinnati), and the Vols rank among the top 25 nationally in both scoring defense (ninth, 57.2 ppg) and field-goal percentage defense (24th, 381).
- The Vols also rank 17th nationally—and second in the SEC—with 5.7 blocks per game.
- Statistical guru Ken Pomeroy of KenPom.com has Tennessee rated 19th nationally in adjusted defensive efficiency.

INITIATE LOCKDOWN SEQUENCE

- History indicates that teams are likely to experience a lengthy scoring drought when they face the Vols.
- Eight times this season, Tennessee has held an opponent scoreless or without a field goal for a span exceeding five minutes of game action.

PONS RIDING BLOCK STREAK

- Yves Pons, the SEC's second-leading shot-blocker, has blocked at least one shot in every game this season.
- His streak of 11 straight games with at least one block is the longest such streak by a Vol since Wayne Chism authored a 14-game block streak as a senior in 2009-10.
- Pons has blocked three or more shots in six games this season, highlighted by a program-record-tying six-block effort against Jacksonville State on Dec. 21.

YVES' OFFENSIVE EVOLUTION

- Yves Pons totaled 94 points while appearing in 59 games during his first two seasons as a Vol.
- Through his first eight games as a junior, he scored 101 points (12.6 ppg).
- Now Tennessee's third-leading scorer with 11.7 ppg, Pons is shooting .516 from the field this year and has scored 10 or more points in eight games.

FRONTCOURT EFFICIENCY

- Through Tennessee's first 10 games, starting forwards John Fulkerson and Yves Pons have combined to shoot 89-of-154 (.578) from the field.
- Fulkerson is averaging 1.67 points per *shot* this season.
- Fulkerson (+10.7) and Pons (+10.1) rank first and second on the team in plus/minus average, respectively.

GUARDS HITTING THE GLASS

- Did you know that Vols senior **Jordan Bowden** has the sixth-most career rebounds among all active players in the SEC? He has 376 boards in his career.
- True freshman Josiah-Jordan James leads the team and ranks 14th in the SEC in rebounding with 6.3 rpg. He stands as the league's top-rebounding freshman.
- James pulled down 13 rebounds in UT's win over Alabama State on Nov. 20. That is the most rebounds by a Vol this season. He has totaled 10+ rebounds twice this year.

TURNER 10th ON UT's 3-POINT LIST

- Senior guard **Lamontè Turner** stands tied for 10th in Tennessee history with 171 career 3-pointers.
- When he made the decision to shut it down after UT's game on Dec. 21, he had the second-most makes among all active players in the SEC (trailing only **Tyson** Carter of Mississippi State).
- Fellow senior Jordan Bowden has made 159 career 3-pointers and could ascend into UT's all-time top 10.

GAINES SHOWING FLASHES

- True freshman wing **Davonte Gaines** has shown flashes of potential for the Vols in recent weeks.
- He is averaging 3.9 points and 1.9 rebounds with a 3.0 assist/turnover ratio in 11.2 minutes per game.
- Gaines is shooting 83 percent at the free-throw line (20 for 24) and has made each of his last 14 attempts.
- His 1.77 points per shot is the highest on the team.

ABOUT WISCONSIN

- Wisconsin is currently riding an up-and-down season that sees the Badgers sitting at 6-5 overall and 1-1 in Big Ten play. Wisconsin is coming off an 83-64 win over UW Milwaukee last Saturday.
- Thus far, the Badgers have been led by junior Nate Reuvers who leads the team in scoring (15.2 ppg), rebounding (5.2 rpg) and blocks (2.5 bpg). His 2.5 bpg rank 25th in the country and are fourth in the Big Ten.
- Wisconsin has also seen consistent scoring from redshirt-junior Kobe King (11.5 ppg) who's seen a 7.2 ppg jump in scoring production from the conclusion of the 2018-19 season.
- Where the Badgers have struggled this season is moving the ball and assisting on made baskets. Wisconsin has just 128 assists to 263 made field goals, which is an assist rate of less than 50 percent. Their 11.6 apg ranks 287th in the country out of 350 Division I programs, as just one Badger, D'Mitrik Trice, averages more than 3.0 assists per contest.
- Wisconsin head coach Greg Gard has continued the storied success of Badgers basketball following the departure of former head man Bo Ryan. Gard became the third coach in the last 20 years to lead his team to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament in his first two years at the helm of his program when he led the Badgers to the round of 16 in both 2016 and 2017. Gard joined Steve Lavin at UCLA (1996-97) and Mark Few at Gonzaga (2000-01) on that list.
- Wisconsin is a public, state-funded institution that was the first public institution founded in Wisconsin (1848) and remains the oldest and largest public university in the state.

LAST TIME VS. WISCONSIN

- Tennessee overcame a 17-point deficit to take a second-half lead against 16th-ranked Wisconsin, but the Badgers' experience enabled them to hold off the UT charge and hand the Vols a 74-62 loss on Nov. 21, 2016, the opening day of the Maui Invitational.
- Sophomore guard Shembari Phillips (now a fifthyear senior at Georgia Tech) led the Volunteers with 16 points against the Badgers, including 10 in the second half. Senior Robert Hubbs III and junior Detrick Mostella each scored 12. Sophomore forward Kyle Alexander grabbed a team-high six rebounds, while redshirt freshman guard Lamonté Turner totaled five points, three steals and two assists with no turnovers.
- After trailing 40-32 at halftime, the Big Orange opened the second half with a 12-0 run, taking their first lead of the game, 42-40, on a jumper by freshman forward **Grant Williams**.
- Tennessee held Wisconsin scoreless for the first 4:25 of the second half until preseason All-Big Ten forward Bronson Koenig broke the Badger's drought with a layup, which keyed a 14-6 run by the Badgers.
- At the under-eight-minute media timeout, Tennessee found itself trailing by eight, 56-48. Koenig and senior teammate **Nigel Hayes** accounted for 13 of Wisconsin's final 16 points spanning the final four and a half minutes of the game.
- After missing the first two games of the season with a foot injury, true freshman point guard **Kwe Parker** made his debut for the Vols, logging six minutes off the bench and handing out one assist.

VOLS SEE NATION'S LONGEST HOME WIN STREAK HALTED AT 31

- Tennessee's Dec. 14 loss to 13th-ranked Memphis ended a 31-game home win streak for the Vols. It was the longest active streak in the nation at the time.
- The streak dated to the 2017-18 season. The Vols won their final eight games at Thompson-Boling Arena that year before going 18-0 at home last season.
- Tennessee's most recent previous loss in Knoxville was a 94-84 loss to Auburn on Jan. 2, 2018.

TENNESSEE WAS SEC'S WINNINGEST PROGRAM THE LAST TWO YEARS

- The media tabbed guard Lamonté Turner as a second-team preseason All-SEC selection. Turner also was one of nine players who received votes for SEC Player of the Year.

- That includes six home games as well as games at Memphis, Florida, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Auburn, the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic (two games) and Cincinnati.



VOLS ADJUSTING TO NEW, DEEPER 3-POINT LINE

- Per legislation passed in June of 2019, the NCAA this season extended the 3-point line from 20 feet 9 inches to match the international distance of 22 feet 1^{3/4} inches.
- During **Rick Barnes'** previous four seasons at Tennessee, with the shorter distance in play, the Vols shot .351 (975 of 2,778) from beyond the arc.
- This season, with the line extended, Tennessee is shooting .294 (62 of 211) from 3-point range.

DIPLOMA CULTURE

- Having graduated last May, senior Lamontè Turner is taking graduate-level courses this season.
- Junior guard Jalen Johnson graduated Dec. 13, while fellow juniors Jacob Fleschman and John Fulkerson project to complete their degrees in May.

SIX EARN VOLSCHOLAR STATUS

- Six members of Tennessee's roster are wearing the VOLScholar patch on their jersey this semester: Jacob Fleschman, John Fulkerson, Brock Jancek, Jalen Johnson, Yves Pons and Lamonté Turner.
- To be eligible to wear the patch, UT student-athletes must achieve a 3.0 GPA in either of the two previous semesters, or they must own a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

BOWDEN'S HS JERSEY RETIRED

- On Thursday, Dec. 19, Knoxville's Carter High School retired Jordan Bowden's No. 3 jersey.
- All of Bowden's Tennessee teammates attended the ceremony, joining Bowden and his family on the court.

TEAM NOTES

VOLS SIGN NATION'S #4 CLASS

- November 13 was an historic day for the Tennessee basketball program, as the Volunteers received signed National Letters of Intent from three elite prospects who comprise one of the most outstanding recruiting classes in program history.
- Five-star prospects Keon Johnson and Jaden Springer and four-star prospect Corey Walker Jr. give Tennessee a signing class that is ranked as high as No. 4 nationally by 247Sports, Rivals and ESPN. All three of those services also list Tennessee's three signees among the top 40 prospects in the Class of 2020.
- All three signees are expected to enroll in the summer of 2020 and will be freshmen next season.
- All three also were named to the Atlanta Tipoff Club's watch list for the 2020 Jersey Mike's Naismith High School Trophy for Boys Player of the Year Award.
- Including current freshman Josiah-Jordan James, Tennessee has now signed four national top 50 recruits during the Barnes era.

FUTURE FOES

- Tennessee next season will finish up home-and-home series with Cincinnati (in Knoxville) and Wisconsin (in Madison). Both series began this season.
- As the third and final game of the current contract, Tennessee will face in-state foe Memphis next season in Nashville at Bridgestone Arena.

TENNESSEE SET TO PLAY IN 2020 CHARLESTON CLASSIC

- Tennessee is set to join the eight-team field at the 2020 Charleston Classic, which takes place Nov. 19-22, 2020, in beautiful and historic Charleston, South Carolina.
- The tournament field also includes Florida State, Houston, Oklahoma State, Penn State, Seton Hall, VCU and host College of Charleston.
- Games will take place at CofC's 5,100-seat TD Arena.

VOLS FIVE FRESHMEN AVERAGE 6-8

- Tennessee's five scholarship freshmen have an average height of 6-8+.
- Josiah-Jordan James is the shortest of the bunch at 6-6. The others, in ascending order, are Davonte Gaines (6-7), Olivier Nkamhoua (6-8), Drew Pember (6-9) and Uroš Plavšic (7-0).
- \bullet The full team boasts an average height of 6-6 $\!^{1/3}\!.$

COMPREHENSIVE EXCELLENCE

- Tennessee's men's hoops squad isn't the only team enjoying success on Rocky Top.
- Three UT teams are currently ranked in the top 25 of their respective sports—with two ranked in the top 10.
- Those teams include women's basketball (No. 22, AP), men's swimming (No. 10, TYR/CSCAA) and women's swimming (No. 2, TYR/CSCAA).
- Tennessee softball finished last season ranked No. 11 (ESPN), while baseball ended the year ranked No. 23 (NCBWA).

I talk to VJ (Bailey) a lot about that."

TENNESSEE LOST 70 PERCENT OF ITS SCORING, TOP THREE SCORERS

- After losing four of the five starters from last year's squad and eight total players, the Vols have gone from one of the most experienced rosters in college basketball to one of the greenest.
- Of its 3,035 total points scored last season, Tennessee returns just 922 points—30 percent of its total scoring.
- UT's top three scorers from a year ago in Grant Williams (18.8 ppg), Admiral Schofield (16.5 ppg) and Jordan Bone (13.5 ppg) either graduated or elected to forgo their senior season to pursue a professional playing career.
- In addition to scoring, Tennessee also lost the majority of its production from last season in blocks (71.9%), assists (66.0%) and rebounding (65.1%).

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vols' 2019-20 roster features 14 players (11 scholarship student-athletes) representing seven states as well as Finland, France and Serbia.
- There are four Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, two from Texas and one each from Alabama, Maryland, North Carolina, New York and South Carolina.
- UT has two seniors, six juniors, one sophomore and five freshmen.
- Five Vols stand 6-5 or shorter, and nine players are 6-6 or taller.

BAILEY ON THE BENCH THIS YEAR

- After transferring from Oregon this past summer, guard Victor Bailey Jr. is sitting out this season and will have two years of remaining eligibility starting next year.
- Bailey played in 73 games at Oregon, including eight starts, and averaged 7.0 points in 17.9 minutes per game. As a sophomore last season, he scored in double figures 13 times and dropped a season-high 20 points on UCLA.
- Residents of Austin, Texas, the Bailey family is very familiar with **Rick Barnes**. Bailey's mother, 1996 Olympic bronze medalist **Tonja Buford-Bailey**, was an assistant track coach at the University of Texas while Barnes was leading the Longhorns' hoops program.
- Bailey Jr.'s father, Victor Bailey Sr., was a second-round NFL Draft pick out of Missouri in 1993 (wide receiver).

SCHWARTZ PROMOTED; RISING STAR ENGLISH JOINS STAFF

- After former lead assistant Rob Lanier accepted the head coaching job at Georgia State last spring, Rick Barnes promoted Mike Schwartz to associate head coach (the same title Lanier held).
- The vacancy created by Lanier's departure was very quickly filled, as Barnes immediately hired rising star Kim English as an assistant coach. A former All-Big 12 performer at Missouri and NBA Draft pick, English had previously worked as an assistant at Tulsa and most recently Colorado.
- Immensely confident in each of his assistants, Barnes often publicly asserts that each of them, **Desmond Oliver** included, is ready to take the reins as a Division I coach now.

SHORTENING THE BENCH

- For just the second time during his four-plus-year tenure as Tennessee's head coach, Rick Barnes used only seven players during UT's neutral-site win over 20th-ranked Washington on Nov. 16.
- The only other time a Barnes-coached Tennessee team used fewer than eight players in a game was a 2016 SEC Tournament win over Vanderbilt.
- As the season progresses, it will be interesting to see how deep Tennessee's bench will be in tight games.

EGGERT'S EFFICIENCY AN ASSET

- Mary-Carter Eggert is one of only two women who serve as the Director of Basketball Operations with a men's program at the "major-conference" level (Cal employs the other).
- Now in her fifth year in that vitally important role, Eggert keeps the program organized, efficient and running smoothly like a well-oiled machine.
- Vols freshman Josiah-Jordan James: "MC is really
 the mastermind behind it all. She's our coach off
 the court. She plays a big role in all of the players'
 lives by checking on us daily, making sure we have
 everything we need, and she always keep our
 spirits up. She brightens every room she's in, and
 Tennessee basketball wouldn't be as great as it is
 without her."

VOLS' ROSTER BOASTS INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- •Tennessee head coach **Rick Barnes** has vastly expanded the program's recruiting pipelines since arriving on Rocky Top, including internationally. Since his hiring in 2015, Barnes has now signed four international players, including two in the 2019 class.
- Junior wing Yves Pons, from Fuveau, France, returns to the team this year after seeing an increased role during his sophomore season. He appeared in 35 games with 13 starts and shot .516 from the field. In just his third career start, he recorded seven points, six rebounds and a block in UT's thrilling upset of No. 1 Gonzaga.
- Pons—who was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti—attended the INSEP (National Institute of Sport and Physical Education) Academy in Paris. Other notable INSEP basketball alums include Boris Diaw, Tony Parker and Ronny Turiaf.
- The Vols' other international team members this season are forwards Olivier Nkamhoua, from Helsinki, Finland, and Ivanjica, Serbia, native Uroš Plavšic.
- Nkamhoua competed for Finland (as a 6-4 point guard) in 2016 FIBA U16 European Championships divisional play. He is a true freshman this season.
- Plavšic, a redshirt freshman, has competed against fellow Serbian and NBA All-Star Nikola Jokic of the Denver Nuggets, as well as Croatian NBA center Ivica 7uhac
- All three players are the first from their respective countries to play for the Vols. Overall, Tennessee has signed 10 international players in its program history.

PONS LOGGED FIBA MINUTES IN FRANCE

- Junior Yves Pons spent the summer training with the U20 French National Team and then competing in the FIBA U20 European Championships July 13-21 in Israel.
- Pons started all seven games for France, averaging 2.6 points per game.
- The French team fell to Germany in the third-place game.

- Last season's average home attendance of 19,034 was Tennessee's highest since the 2009-10 campaign, during which it drew an average of 19,168 fans per game at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols have ranked among the top 20 in men's college basketball attendance for 15 consecutive years, including seven seasons ranked in the top five nationally.

- The total of Tennessee's season-tickets sold is more than the <u>capacity</u> of most (close to 300) Division I basketball venues, including 48 of the 65 "Power Five" arenas.

- The Volunteers own a 60-12 record at Thompson-Boling Arena under the direction of head coach Rick Barnes.

- The Vols and Lady Vols combined for a total attendance of 476,317 last season—the most of any school in the country.

20,000 STRONG

- Since Rick Barnes was named head coach prior to the 2015-16 campaign, Tennessee has played in front of 12 home crowds of 20,000 or larger. That includes eight games last season and one this season.
- Tennessee has played in front of 62 home crowds larger than 20,000 over the last 13 seasons.

COMMITMENT TO BASKETBALL

- Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, which houses two full-size gyms as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.
- Construction of Pratt Pavilion also marked the beginning of the "first phase" of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena. This \$19 million phase included the addition of 32 luxury suites located in the north balcony, a loge area just below the suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.
- In the "second phase" of Thompson-Boling Arena renovations, the athletics department overhauled the men's and women's basketball offices during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for both programs.
- New to Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2013-14 season was a 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.
- In March of 2014, Thompson-Boling Arena became the third college basketball arena to install an LED lighting system, which features fixtures that are smaller, brighter, and up to 85 percent more efficient than conventional arena metal halide lights.
- The weight room in Pratt Pavilion was renovated and expanded to 4,350 square feet in the summer of 2016. Additions include a full-court-length stretch of synthetic turf, a custom rubber floor, a 40-foot, steel-reinforced throwing wall, six Keiser Functional Trainers, four TRUEStretch Cages, three custom, 10foot Power Lift pulley units (ideal for taller student-athletes), seven sets of 90-pound PowerBlocks and a zoned, high-powered stereo system.
- In September 2018, work concluded on a \$5 million locker-room renovation at Thompson-Boling Arena. In addition to the beautifully revamped spaces for the men's and women's teams, the Larry Pratt Basketball Locker Room Complex also includes an athletic training facility featuring world-class hydrotherapy systems.

MISC NOTES

VOLS WELL REPRESENTED IN THE NBA

- Multiple Tennessee alums will have a presence in the NBA in 2019-20—highlighted by a pair of veteran starters with the Philadelphia 76ers in forward Tobias Harris (2010-11) and guard Josh Richardson (2011-15).
- Three VFLs had their names called in June's NBA Draft.
 Grant Williams was drafted in the first round (22nd overall) by the Boston Celtics. Admiral Schofield was selected 42nd overall, and Jordan Bone was taken with the 57th pick. Draft-day trades sent Schofield to the Washington Wizards and Bone to the Detroit Pistons.
- Tennessee was one of five schools to have three players selected in the NBA Draft, and UT was the first school to have three upperclassmen selected in the same draft since Vanderbilt in 2012.
- Harris is embarking on his ninth NBA season. He started all 82 regular-season games last year (55 with the Los Angeles Clippers and 27 with the 76ers). He averaged a career-best 20.0 points per game, and his 18.2 ppg with the Sixers ranked second on the team. For his career, Harris averages 15.4 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game while shooting .364 from 3-point range.
- Richardson enters his fifth NBA season—the previous four with Miami. The 26-year-old has started 154 games over the last two seasons and averages 12.1 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists during his NBA career. He also shoots at a .368 clip from 3-point range. His averages for points, rebounds and assists have improved every year as a pro.
- New York Knicks Assistant GM Allan Houston (1989-93) continues to play a key insider's role with the franchise he once starred for. He also serves as GM of the NBA G-League's Westchester Knicks.

VOLS ACTIVE IN NBA G LEAGUE

- Tennessee had two alums on NBA G League training camp rosters.
- Those players are Kyle Alexander (Sioux Falls SkyForce, affiliate player) and Devon Baulkman (Grand Rapids Drive, local tryout player).
- Rookie point guard Jordan Bone is on a two-way contract with the Detroit Pistons and will spend significant time with the Grand Rapids Drive this season.
- Alexander is embarking on his pro rookie season. He went undrafted in June but signed a free-agent deal with the Miami Heat after a strong showing with the club during the NBA Summer League. He was waived by the Heat at the conclusion of the preseason and quickly landed a roster spot with Sioux Falls.

BOWDEN ON NBA MOCK DRAFT BOARD

- Senior guard Jordan Bowden currently appears on a mock 2020 NBA Draft projection.
- The website NBAdraft.net projects Bowden to go to the Denver Nuggets as the 50th overall pick.

HISTORIC NIGHT FOR TURNER

- Lamonté Turner's 14-assist performance in the Nov. 12 win over Murray State made him one of only seven Vols to ever dish out 14 or more in a single game.
- It was the most assists by a Vol since **LaMarcus Golden** had 14 at South Carolina on Jan. 19, 1994.

PLAVŠIĆ TO LOSE A YEAR

- As October came to a close, Tennessee learned that transfer forward **Uroš Plavšic** will lose a year of eligibility after his NCAA waiver for immediate eligibility was denied (also denied on appeal).
- Tennessee plans to seek one final appeal.
- On Nov. 25, Plavsic was approved to travel with the Vols on team road trips this season.
- Plavšic redshirted last season as a true freshman at Arizona State. He enrolled at UT in May.
- #FreeUros

KENT OPTS TO TRANSFER

- It was announced on Nov. 20 that redshirt sophomore forward Zach Kent decided to step away from the program indefinitely.
- Then, on Dec. 11, Kent officially entered the NCAA Transfer Portal.
- Kent's departure, coupled with the ineligibility of incoming tranfer Uroš Plavšic, leaves the Vols without two key frontcourt pieces and significantly impacts depth along the front line.

UTK 225: LIGHTING THE WAY

- UT is celebrating 225 years of service to the state of Tennessee with a "Lighting the Way" celebration throughout this 2019–20 academic year.
- UT was the first public college chartered west of the Appalachian Divide. The state's flagship campus and premier public institution began as Blount College on Sept. 10, 1794, two years before Tennessee became a state. UT is now a land-grant university with a commitment to teaching, research, and service.

BARNES 22nd ON DIVISION I WINS LIST

- With Tennessee's 92-81 win over Louisville in New York City last season, Rick Barnes passed legendary UCLA head coach John Wooden on the all-time Division I wins list. It was Barnes's 665th career victory, which ranked 26th all-time.
- Barnes currently ranks 22nd on the list with 700 wins.
- He is now chasing Phog Allen and Don Haskins, each of whom totaled 719 career wins and are tied for 20th.

UNDER BARNES, VOLS ARE 55-17 AS AN AP-RANKED TEAM

 Tennessee has played 72 games as a ranked team (AP poll) under head coach **Rick Barnes**, and the Vols are 55-17 (.764) in those contests.

TOP SPOT: BARNES IS ONE OF SIX

- Rick Barnes led Texas to the No. 1 ranking for two weeks in January 2010. He most recently guided Tennessee to four straight weeks at No. 1 last year.
- He is one of six coaches ever to lead multiple schools to a No. 1 ranking: John Calipari, Frank McGuire, Rick Pitino, Eddie Sutton and Roy Williams.

LAST YEAR'S SWEET SIXTEEN PUT RICK BARNES IN RARE COMPANY

- Rick Barnes last season became one of only a dozen head coaches ever to lead at least three different schools to an NCAA Tournament Round of 16 appearance (Clemson, Texas, Tennessee).
- The 12 coaches who have led at least three different schools to the Round of 16 are: Lon Kruger (has done it with four schools), Barnes, Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bruce Pearl, Bill Self, Eddie Sutton, Tubby Smith and Bruce Weber.

BARNES CLAIMS TWO 2019 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR AWARDS

- Rick Barnes last season earned his first two career National Coach of the Year awards, as he received the Werner Ladder Naismith Trophy for Men's College Coach of the Year Award and the USBWA's Henry Iba National Coach of the Year Award.
- One year removed from leading Tennessee to the SEC Championship and a 26-9 overall record, Barnes guided the Volunteers to a 31-5 mark. That impressive record included a school-record 19-game winning streak and three victories over top-five opponents.
- The Vols spent four weeks atop the Associated Press Top 25 rankings. And for the first time in program history, Tennessee spent the entire season ranked among the top 10.
- Barnes also was a finalist for the and the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.



- held without a field goal for 5:31, as they were 0-0f-5 from the field during the stretch.


 Lamonté Turner helped Tennessee close out its first win of the season with 10 of his game-high 17 points coming in the second half while also leading the Vols with six assists on the night.
- Fellow upperclassman Yves Pons posted a career-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting while also tying his career-high with three blocks. He helped Tennessee control the glass, as he snagged seven rebounds.
- Pons was one of five Vols who collected six or more rebounds in the game, as the team finished with 49 boards, including 17 offensive rebounds. John Fulkerson tallied a game-high nine rebounds, as he nearly finished with a double-double (10 points).
- One of those players who finished with six or more rebounds was **Jalen Johnson**, who like Pons had a career night against the Bulldogs. Johnson finished the game with a career-high eight points, career-high six rebounds and he tied his career-high with a pair of assists.
- Freshmen Josiah-Jordan James, Olivier Nkamhoua and Dayonte Gaines all made their

- Junior forward **John Fulkerson**, for the second straight game, narrowly missed out on a double-double with nine points and nine rebounds
- Tennessee (2-0) trailed by as many as 12 points in the first half and faced a nine-point deficit heading into halftime. After the Vols and Racers battled evenly to start the second half, the Tennessee offense came alive with a 14-4 run, capped by a three-point play from Fulkerson that put the Vols in front, 64-58.

- Pons led all scorers in the first half with 13 points




- A balanced effort on both sides of the floor, along with double-digit scoring outputs from four different players, pushed Tennessee to a 75-62 victory over 20th-ranked Washington on Nov. 16, 2019, in the James Naismith Classic at Scotiabank Arena in Toronto.

 • The game marked the first time any University of Tennessee athletic team had competed
- The Vols improved to 3-0 for the third consecutive season, while Washington fell to 2-1.
- UT was led by senior **Jordan Bowden**, who poured in a game-high-tying 18 points, with 15 coming in the game's first half. His point total left him just five shy of becoming the 51st member of Tennessee's 1.000-Point Club.
- Junior John Fulkerson was a force in the paint, scoring 14 points and grabbing six rebounds. Fulkerson was also integral in putting Washington forward Isaiah Stewart into foul trouble early in the first half.
- Fellow Vols iunior Yves Pons put together another solid performance, tallying 15 points or reach that total for the third consecutive game.

 Freshman Josiah-Jordan James had a perfect shooting night, making all four of his
- shots from the field. His performance was good enough for season-highs in both points (9) and assists (5).
- An 11-2 scoring run early in the first half, gave UT a 16-7 lead, and it maintained its lead
- for the duration of the game.


 The Vols were lights-out from the field in the first half, shooting 55 percent overall and 62.5 percent from behind the 3-point arc, knocking down five of their eight attempts from long range.
- The Vols assisted on all 15 of their made field goals in the first half
- In the second half, the Orange & White fended off shooting struggles, holding the Huskies to a 37-percent shooting mark in the half, never allowing the lead to slip to fewer than seven points.
- Tennessee closed the contest netting its final 12 points from the free-throw line, with senior Lamonte Turner going 9-for-10 from the line down the stretch. Turner finished the night with 16 points, a game-high eight assists and a season-high seven rebounds. He was named the game's Most Valuable Player.
- The Huskies were led by Nahziah Carter who tallied a double-double with 18 points



- Lamonté Turner and Jordan Bowden both passed career milestones in the Vols' 76-41 victory over Alabama State Nov. 20, 2019, in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- For the second consecutive season, Tennessee had two players join the 1000-Point Club in the same game. Last season, Grant Williams and Admiral Schofield reached the milestone against Louisville (Nov. 21, 2018). This season, it was Turner and Bowden, becoming the 51st and 52nd Vols to score 1,000 career points.
- Bowden finished with a game-high 16 points, while Turner added 13 points to go along with a game-high six assists. Turner has had six or more assists in every game this season and came into the contest ranked second in the country with 9.3 assists per game.
- Josiah-Jordan James snagged a game-high 13 rebounds, the first time a Tennessee player has had 10 or more boards this season. The Vols finished with a +15 rebounding margin in the game.
- James became the first Tennessee freshman guard to grab 10 or more rebounds since
- Armani Moore had 11 on Jan. 19, 2013, in a win over Mississippi State.

 When Oliver Nkamhoua subbed in for junior John Fulkerson with 3:50 remaining in the game, it marked the first time this season UT's entire four-man freshman class was on the floor simultaneously. In the 3:14 that they were on the floor together, Tennessee went on a 12-1 run, including nine points from freshmen.



- The double-double was the first for Turner in his collegiate career. He finished the night with a game-high 12 assists to go along with a game-high 17 points. It was the first double-double for any Tennessee player this season, and he accomplished the feat at the 17:13 mark of the second half.
- Less than 10 minutes later. Bowden recorded his first collegiate double-double with his 10th rebound at the 8:07 mark in the second half. He finished the game with 13 points and 12 rebounds.
- It was the second time in the Rick Barnes era that two Vols recorded a double-double
- The second united in the NACE ballings and the Vols recorded a double-double in the same game.
 For the second consecutive game, freshman guard Josiah-Jordan James pulled down double-digit rebounds. He totaled 11 rebounds in the triumph, including a game-high four on the offensive glass.

 Tennessee junior **Yves Pons** put in a solid performance in his sixth straight start, tallying 13 points and a career-high 10 rebounds for his first career double-double. Pons also recorded three blocks, marking his fifth multi-block game of the season and keeping his
- six-game block streak alive.

 Senior Lamonté Turner was big from the charity stripe, knocking down 11 of his 14 free throw attempts. Turner finished the night with a game- and season-high 20 points. Freshman Josiah-Jordan James added a season-high-tying nine points while also
- pulling down seven rebounds.

 The Seminoles jumped out to an early lead, using a 10-0 run in the first half to put the Vols in a 12-point hole. The run was ceased by a dunk from Pons, who cut down the middle
- of the lane on a dish from James.

Tennessee's 29-point margin of victory was its second-highest margin thus far in the season.

 • Freshman **Olivier Nkamhoua** had a breakout performance, recording his first career
- double-double and the fourth for any Tennessee player this season.
- The Helsinki, Finland, native nearly doubled his season-high with 13 rebounds--with seven coming on the offensive glass. He also posted a season-high 11 points on 5-of-9 shooting while adding a team-high two blocks.
- Fellow Vols freshman Josiah-Jordan James finished with a season-high in points with 10, while freshman **Davonte Gaines** added seven. The first-year trio accounted for nearly 40 percent of the Vols' scoring.
- Their efforts helped push the nation's longest active home winning streak to 31 games,
- the third-longest in program history.

 In total, Tennessee had five players finish with double-digit points. John Fulkerson tallied a game-high 15 points on 7-of-12 shooting. It was just two points off his career
- high and was the sixth time in eight games this season he has scored in double-figures. Yees Pons posted 14 points to go along with seven rebounds, two steals and a block.
 The 6-6 junior extended his streak of consecutive games with a block to eight. Lamonté
 Turner was the final Vol with double-digit points, all 10 of which came in the first half.
- The win was the 699th of Rick Barnes' head coaching career.

- · A rough shooting night plagued No. 19 Tennessee, as the Vols dropped a low-scoring defensive battle to No. 13 Memphis at a sold-out Thompson-Boling Arena, 51-47, on Dec
- Tennessee's 25 percent (15-for-60) shooting mark from the field was the lowest of the Rick Barnes era.
- Despite the Vols' scoring struggles as a team, freshman Josiah-Jordan James posted a career-high 14 points that led all scorers in the loss.
- The Vols (7-2) and Tigers battled evenly to begin the second half after Memphis (9-1) took a one-point lead into halftime. Memphis gained a bit of separation at the 12:03 mark after **Tyler Harris** and **D.J. Jeffries** made back-to-back threes to put the Tigers in front,

After a 3-pointer from **Jordan Bowden** and a conversion on a contested layup from John Fulkerson, Tennessee took its first lead in more than eight minutes of game time at 43-42 on a **Yves Pons'** turnaround jumper in the lane with 5:56 remaining.

Over the course of the game's next four minutes, the lead changed hands four times

- before Memphis' **Damion Baugsh** hit a corner 3-pointer at the 1:43 mark.

 With Tennessee trailing 49-47 with 20 seconds remaining, Pons missed the front end of a one-and-one, and the Tigers grabbed the rebound. **Alex Lomax** then made two free throws to seal the game.
- Despite a sluggish start from the field, Tennessee built a 17-5 lead over the game's first 12 minutes. During that stretch, the Vols held Memphis to a 1-for-13 shooting mark, as the Tigers went more than 11 minutes between field goals.
- James paced the Vols early on, scoring Tennessee's first eight points and 11 of its first
- James placet une vious early on; Sorting remissees in sit eight points and not in sit.
 In the first six minutes of action, he also grabbed three rebounds and had two steals.
 After the Vols' initial spurt, Memphis fought back for the remainder of the first half, eventually taking a 25-24 lead into the break on a Harris layup as the clock expired.
 Three Tennessee true freshmen James, Drew Pember and Davonte Gaines combined
- to score 17 of the Vols' 24 first-half points



- Despite four Vols scoring in double digits and a perfect shooting night from the free-throw line, a late Cincinnati run pushed the Bearcats past Tennessee, 78-66, on Dec. 18, 2019, at Fifth Third Arena.
- · Vols senior Lamonté Turner fought through early foul trouble to pour in 12 points, six of which came from the foul line
- Senior **Jordan Bowden** had a solid night, scoring 13 points and dishing off a seasonhigh six assists.
- Junior Yves Pons dropped 11 points, breaking into double digits for the seventh time this season. Coming into the year, he had scored double-digit points just once. Pons also recorded a block for the 10th consecutive contest, marking the longest streak since **Grant** Williams logged at least one block in 10 straight games last season
- John Fulkerson was efficient from the field once again, tallying a team-high 14 points and knocking down six of his eight attempts from the field.
 The Bearcats jumped out to an early 8-0 advantage, but a 12-2 run by the Vols, during
- which five different players scored, gave UT it's first lead with just over 14 minutes
- remaining in the first half.

 The sides closed the final 14 minutes of the opening half trading baskets, with the largest lead for either team being six points. Heading into the locker room Cincinnati held a slim 38-34 lead.
- Down 46-42 near the mid-point of the second half, a 3-pointer at the top of the arc from Pons, followed by a turnaround jumper from Bowden, gave Tennessee its first lead since the 3:49 mark of the first half.
- From there, the squads continued to trade baskets and the lead. Then, with 6:20 remaining, and Cincinnati holding a 58-57 lead, the Bearcats went on a 9-0 run to increase their advantage to 67-57 with just over three minutes to play.



- A second-half offensive outburst propelled No. 21 Tennessee to a 75-53 win over Jacksonville State on Dec. 21, 2019, at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The win stands as the 700th in Tennessee head coach Rick Barnes' stellar 33-year
- Jordan Bowden led the Vols in scoring with 19 points, as John Fulkerson (16), Yves Pons (11) and Josiah-Jordan James (10) also scored in double figures
- (1) and Josani-Josen and Josense (1) and Josense (1) and Josense (2) and Lamonte Turner dished out 11 assists, marking his third game this season with double-digit assists. He became just the third player in program history to dish 11 assists or more in three games in the same season, joining Rodney Woods (1974-75) and Johnny Darden (1976-77 & 1977-78).
- After the game, Turner—who had been battling lingering shoulder problems— announced his decision to step away from the court for medical reasons. A redshirt senior from Florence, Alabama, Turner graduated in May. In 106 career games, Turner scored
- 1,086 points and averaged 10.2 points and 3.3 assists per game.

 As a team, Tennessee totaled 25 assists—its most in a single game this season. James also contributed a season-high six assists.
- On the defensive end. Pons tied a program-record with six blocked shots, becoming just
- To the determine and, rous use a programment with six blocks in a game.
 A brief second-half run by the Gamecocks cut their deficit to eight, but Tennessee responded with a 10-0 spurt to push the lead to 19 points and take full control. Tennessee scored 45 points in the second half—the second-most points it had scored in any half this season to that point.
- Following an evenly contested first half, the Vols led the Gamecocks 30-26 at halftime






