Starting Five

- The Buckeyes are 1,159-418 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.735) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 237-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes faced a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and then Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (W, 72-51). Ohio State is 179-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856). The Buckeyes are 34-48 (.415) when playing in the state of Wisconsin all-time. The Buckeyes did not play in Wisconsin last year. Chris Holtmann recorded his first victory in Big Ten Conference play vs. the Badgers, an 83-58 win Dec. 4, 2017.
- Three current Buckeyes were named Mr. Basketball in their respective states. Junior Kaleb Wesson was named Ohio Mr. Basketball as a senior at Westerville South High School ... freshman D.J. Carton was named Mr. Basketball in Iowa in 2019 as a senior at Bettendorf High School and freshman E.J. Liddell was named Illinois Mr. Basketball in both 2018 and 2019 after leading Belleville High School to back-to-back state titles.
- Andre and Kaleb Wesson are one of 16 sets of brothers playing in NCAA Division I this season and one of two sets in the Big Ten (Iowa, McCaffery) also have siblings on the roster.
- Ohio State has 58 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth-most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the most recent Buckeye to reach the milestone with 1,121 career points over his career. He became the 37th Ohio State player all-time to reach 500 rebounds with nine vs. West Virginia Dec. 29. His 23 points at Michigan Feb. 4 moved him over the 1,100-point mark.
- Ohio State will play before at least five sold out crowds at Value City Arena in 2020. The Wisconsin (19,049, Jan. 3), Indiana (Feb. 1), Purdue (Feb. 15), Maryland (Feb. 23) and Michigan (March 1) games are sellouts. There is limited availability for

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 173-32 (.844) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 11 with 162 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 188 wins over 223 games (188-35). The Buckeyes also have played the eighth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 149 (62 wins/12th) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

- Ohio State is 61-19 all-time when games are sold out at Value City Arena. Ohio State is 53-16 in sold out games against the Big Ten, including a 20-11 record against ranked conference opponents. The last sellout at VCA was vs. Wisconsin Jan. 3, 2020 (L, 61-57).
- Ohio State is 1,703-1,100 all-time after a 15-7 start this season.
- In the first NCAA NET rankings of the year, released Dec. 16, Ohio State was rated the No. 1 team nationally after its 9-1 start. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 1 in the first NET rankings a year ago as well. This year Ohio State has played eight Quad 1 games (3-5) with a total of 8 Quad 1 (5) and Quad 2 (3) games remaining on the schedule.
- When the then-No. 5 Buckeyes tipped vs. the No. 6 Kentucky Wildcats Dec. 21 in Las Vegas, the Wesson family reached 300 games played as Buckeyes. Keith Wesson, who lettered for Ohio

State from 1983-87, played in 115 games. Senior Andre Wesson has appeared in 118 games while junior Kaleb Wesson has taken the court as a Buckeye 87 times. In 320 games played, the Wessons have scored 2,112 points for an average of 6.6 a game. Andre passed Keith in total games played at Northwestern Jan. 28.

- In three seasons as Ohio State head coach, Chris Holtmann teams have made 10 or more 3s 23 times (17-6 rcd.). Ohio State made 10+ from distance five times in 2017-18 and posted a 4-1 record in those games. The Buckeyes were 5-5 in 2018-19 and are 8-0 this year when make 10+ 3-pointers.

- The Buckeyes have made 30 or more field goals seven times this year (7-0) after doing so three times a season ago (3-0). Chris Holtmann Ohio State teams have scored 30 or more FGs in 22 games during his tenure (21-1) after doing so 12 times in his first year (12-1). Ohio State has won its last nine games when reaching at least 30 FGs made.

Kaleb Wesson Welcomed to Exclusive Club

Ohio State junior Kaleb Wesson has entered both the 1,000 career point and 500 career rebound club with 1,121 points and 599 boards. Wesson became the 29th Buckeye all-time with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career.

The Ohio State vs. Wisconsin Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with Wisconsin 88-72. The Buckeyes are 54-25 in Columbus and 30-46 in Madison. The teams have met five times on neutral courts with Ohio State winning four. Andre Wesson has faced the Badgers five-times, most on the Ohio State roster. He averages 5.6 points and just over two rebounds in the series. Kaleb Wesson averages 20.5 points and eight rebounds in two meetings with the Badgers.

Scouting the Badgers

Wisconsin enters the game at 13-10 overall and 6-6 in the Big Ten. Nate Reuvers leads Wisconsin with 13.8 points per game. He also is the top rebounder with 4.9 boards a contest.

Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 831-736 against current league members. Chris Holtmann

faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes in 2017-18. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs. conference foes. He is 33-30 vs. conference opponents in nine years as a head coach.

108 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Noting the Michigan Game

- The Buckeyes held a 30-16 advantage in points in the paint and a 24-16 advantage in bench points.
- Ohio State leads all-time series 98-78. Michigan leads 48-38 in games played in Ann Arbor.

- The win at Michigan was the first this season for the Buckeyes when trailing with 5:00 remaining in the game (48-49/1-5) and when being out-rebounded (42-31/1-3).

- Ohio State's last win when trailing with 5:00 to play in the second half was at Creighton Nov. 5, 2018 when the Buckeyes rallied to win 69-60 after being down 55-54 at the 5-minute mark.

- Chris Holtmann improves to 2-3 all-time against Michigan and 2-2 while at the helm of the Buckeyes.

- Holtmann now has a win against every Big Ten coach he's faced.

- Duane Washington Jr. scored 17 points for his ninth double-figure scoring game of the year.

- Kaleb Wesson notched his third-consecutive double-double, 10th of the year and 16th of his career with 23 points and 12 rebounds. The Buckeyes are 14-2 in the last three seasons and 8-2 this year when Wesson records a double-double.

- Wesson now has 1,121 career points and 599 career rebounds. With one more rebound, Wesson will become the 22nd Buckeye to pull down 600 career boards.

• Wesson moved to No. 44 on the all-time scoring list with 23 points vs. the Wolverines, giving him 1,121 for his career. He passed Mel Nowell (1,100), Ron Sepic (1,107) and Curtis Wilson (1,120). Wesson trails No. 43 Brad Sellers (1,122) and No. 42 Richard Schnittker (1,129).

• With 12 rebounds vs. the Wolverines, Wesson moved to No. 22 all-time on the career rebounds list at Ohio State. He passed both Larry Huston and Michael Redd, who was in attendance in Ann Arbor, who each ended Ohio State careers with 593 boards. Wesson has 599.

• Wesson has scored in double figures in all but two games this season.

• Wesson tied his season-high nine made field goals, previously accomplished against Penn State Dec. 7.

• Kyle Young scored 12 points, marking his eighth double-figure scoring game of the year.

• Young is shooting a team-best 61 percent (61-for-100) from the field this season after going 5-for-9 against the Wolverines.

Kaleb Wesson on Honors Lists

Junior Kaleb Wesson was tabbed a member of the **2019-20 Preseason All-Big Ten** squad by conference media Oct. 2. He was one of three unanimous selections on the squad of 10 league players. Wesson also was listed as one of 20 preseason candidates for the **Karl Malone Award**, given annually by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame to the best power forward in the country. Wesson, listed as a center with the Buckeyes, played his way on to the **Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award** list for the country's best center. It was announced Feb. 7 that he was a Top 10 candidate for the honor. That list will be reduced to five in March. He was named to the preseason Top 50 watch list for the **Wooden Award** Nov. 6 and was selected to the Midseason Top 25 Jan. 8. He also was named by the U.S. Basketball Writers as one of 46 players being considered for the **Oscar Robertson Trophy** Dec. 5. The award is given to the organization's national player of the year selection.

The Last Time vs. Wisconsin

Wisconsin 61, Ohio State 57 (1/3/20)

COLUMBUS -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team dropped a 61-57 decision to Wisconsin at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fifth double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 boards while Duane Washington Jr. added 18. Nate Reuvers led Wisconsin with 17 points and nine rebounds while Kobe King poured in 13. Ohio State raced out to an early 7-0 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup with 16:33 remaining but the Buckeyes missed six of their next seven shots as Wisconsin trimmed the deficit to 9-8 on a King jumper with 11:22 remaining in the half. The Buckeyes held a 23-19 advantage after a pair of Andre Wesson free throws with 2:06 left to play but the Badgers went on a 10-2 run the rest of the way, capped by 3-pointers from Trevor Anderson and Aleem Ford, to take 29-25 lead into the break. Ohio State trailed 31-28 less than a minute into the second half before going on a 10-0 run over a 2:21 spurt to take a 38-31 lead with 16:58 left to play. The Buckeye lead remained at six at 45-39 with 9:19 left to play but the Badgers pulled back even with an 8-2 run over 2:28 to knot the score at 47-all with 6:51 remaining. The Buckeyes held a 51-49 advantage at the under-4 timeout with 3:47 to go but Wisconsin scored 12 of the next 15 points over the next 3:44 to gain a commanding 61-54 lead in the final seconds.

Cincinnati Game Second Earliest Opener in Ohio State History

When Ohio State tipped vs. Cincinnati in the 2019-20 opener, the game was the second earliest opening date in Ohio State history. The Nov. 6 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53.

Matta Enters Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Thad Matta, the all-time winningest coach in Ohio State history, was selected to enter the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during a ceremony Sept. 6. The 13th coach in program history, Matta recorded 337 career wins, made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, five "Sweet Sixteens," three "Elite Eights" and two Final Fours over 13 seasons (2005-17).

Kaleb Wesson Tests NBA Waters, Returned for Junior Year

Kaleb Wesson elected to enter his name into the 2019 NBA Draft process to gain feedback into his goal of becoming a professional basketball player. After going through the process he elected to return to Ohio State for his junior year. Wesson made the decision in late May.

Sueing Selects Ohio State, Eligible in 2020-21

Justice Sueing joined the Ohio State program in May of 2019 following a transfer from the Uni-

versity of California. Sueing, a 6-foot, 6-inch forward from Honolulu, Hawaii, will have two years of eligibility with the Buckeyes after sitting out the 2019-20 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Sueing played 31 games for the Golden Bears a season ago. He averaged 14.3 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting better than 78 percent from the foul line (129-165). While sitting out in Columbus, Sueing underwent successful surgery on a ligament in his left foot Jan. 14. He is expected to recovery fully to participate in offseason workouts.

Diebler Added to Coaching Staff

Jake Diebler, who spent three seasons with the Buckeyes as the team's video coordinator (2014-2016) was hired as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes after spending the last two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt. Diebler, older brother of Ohio State great Jon Diebler, is a 2009 graduate of Valparaiso. He was a standout high school player at Upper Sandusky (Ohio).

Diallo Picks Ohio State

Ibrahima Diallo, a 6-foot, 10-inch center from Senegal, signed a letter of intent to play for Chris Holtmann and the Buckeyes in mid-April 2019. Diallo enters the 2019-20 season along with a stellar freshman class. He joins forwards Alonzo Gaffney and E.J. Liddell and guard D.J. Carton. Diallo played a season ago at Prolific Prep in California where he averaged 11 points, 11 rebounds and nearly four blocks a game.

Buckeyes Enter 2019-20 Campaign with 20+ Wins in 14 of the Last 15 Seasons

Ohio State has 29 seasons with 20 or more wins and three with 30 or more. Holtmann has won at least 20 games in each of his two years at Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won 20 or more in 14 of the last 15 seasons.

Notable Numbers--Kaleb Wesson Reaches 1,000

Kaleb Wesson has scored 1,121 career points over three seasons to average 12.9 points for his career. He has played in 87 games with 83 starts.

Roster Grows for 2020-21 Buckeyes

Chris Holtmann, now in his third year as the head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the addition of two student-athletes to the program's roster for the 2020-21 season.

Eugene Brown III, a 6-6, 185-pound guard from Southwest Dekalb (Georgia) High School, and Zed Key, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Long Island (New York) Lutheran High School, signed NCAA National Letters of Intent in early November.

Brown III was the first player from the class of 2020 to commit. Brown, a native of Decatur, Georgia, averaged 9.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists over his first three years of his high school career, despite a leg injury sidelining him for most of his junior season. In five games as a junior he averaged 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists.

"We are really excited about Eugene," Holtmann said. "He is a gifted perimeter player who has developed a great skill set thanks to many hours in the gym as a coach's son. He plays the game with the energy and competitiveness we want in our student-athletes."

Key, who hails from Brookville, New York, averaged 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds his junior season. He also was a part of the 2019 New York State Federation Class AA State Championship team (25-2), who defeated Chris The King, 51-31, last March. Key played in four games at the 2019 National Basketball Players Association Top 100 camp, averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.

"Zed is a great addition to our university and program," Holtmann said. "He plays the game with a high level of physicality and understanding of the game. He has been a part of championship teams in New York and it became clear early on in the recruiting process how important winning is to him."

- The annual Big Ten Tournament will be contested in Indianapolis in 2020, Chicago in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2018-19 plus an exhibition contest vs. Cedarville Oct. 30.
- Seven Big Ten teams (Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, Penn State, Maryland, Wisconsin and Nebraska) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hits the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern this year.
- Ohio State will play 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2019. Fifteen games are scheduled vs. 2019 NCAA Tournament teams (Maryland-2, Minnesota-2, Michigan State-1, Michigan-2, Wisconsin-2, Villanova-1, Purdue-1, Cincinnati-1, Iowa-1, Kentucky-1, North Carolina-1) while four contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2019 NIT squads (Indiana-2, Nebraska-2).

Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his two seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

Holtmann Reaches 50 Wins as a Buckeye

Chris Holtmann is working on 300 games as a head coach (290/174-116) and is off to a 15-7 start this year at Ohio State. He won game No. 50 as a Buckeye Nov. 22, 2019 in an 85-46 win over Purdue Fort Wayne at Value City Arena. Holtmann needed 74 games to reach 50 wins at Ohio State, the fourth-fastest among the 14 head coaches in OSU history.

Wesson earned the 12th Ohio Mr. Basketball award among nine players to sign with the Buckeyes out of high school and the 13th among those to ultimately play for Ohio State. Tony Stockman earned the honor in 2000 but elected to start his career at Clemson. He later transferred to Ohio State and played in Columbus in 2004 and 2005.

Six Seasons with 20 Wins for Holtmann

Holtmann teams have won 20 or more games in each of his last six full years as a head coach. Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

Ohio State's 29 20-Win Seasons

The win over Iowa State in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2018-19 season. The feat marked the 29th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 29 in Ohio State history.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

Value City Arena at the Jerome Schottenstein Center has been the home of the Buckeyes for the last 22 years (1998-99 to present). The Buckeyes have played 382 games at the facility and have averaged 15,483 fans a game for a total of 5,914,823 fans. To reach 6,000,000 in attendance all-time, Ohio State needs to average 17,035 (85,177 total) over the five home games in 2020. Three remaining games are sold out (Purdue, Maryland, Michigan) at 18,809 (games where students are in attendance). The Buckeyes need to average 14,375 over the two games that currently have tickets available (Rutgers and Illinois) to reach 6,000,000 in total attendance at Value City Arena all-time.

Game 1 No. 18 Ohio State 64, Cincinnati 56 Nov. 6, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 18 Ohio State men's basketball team opened its 2019-20 season with a 64-56 victory over Cincinnati at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes also opened the 2018-19 season with a 64-56 win over the Bearcats. Kyle Young notched his first-career double-double, going for 14 points and 13 boards, to pace the Buckeyes while D.J. Carton added nine points and Kaleb Wesson went for eight points and 11 boards. Jarron Cumberland and Keith Williams led Cincinnati with 13 points apiece while Chris McNeal chipped in with 10. The Buckeyes struggled out of the gate, falling behind 6-0 before a Young dunk on the fast break made it 6-2 at the 12:20 mark of the opening half. A quick 5-0 Ohio State spurt gave the Buckeyes their first lead at 10-11 but, after the contest was knotted at 15-all, the Bearcats closed the half on an 11-4 run to take a 26-19 lead into the half. Ohio State came out of the break on a roll, opening the half with a 14-3 run spurred on by a pair of Kaleb Wesson 3-pointers, to take a 33-29 lead with 13:17 left to play. The Buckeye lead grew to nine at 52-43 on a Luther Muhammad 3-pointer with 7:12 remaining but Cincinnati answered with an 8-1 run over the next 3:32 to cut their deficit to 53-51 with 4:40 to go. After the teams exchanged baskets, Ohio State scored the next five points to put the contest out of reach at 60-53 with less than a minute remaining.

Notes:

- Ohio State improved to 8-4 all-time against the Bearcats.
- Eight players scored for the Buckeyes: Kyle Young (14), D.J. Carton (9), Kaleb Wesson (8), CJ Walker (8), Duane Washington Jr. (7), Andre Wesson (7), Luther Muhammad (6), and E.J. Liddell.
- Ohio State shot 9-29 (.310) then improved to 11-20 (.550) in the second half.
- Ohio State opened the season against Cincinnati last season at Fifth-Third Arena. The final score of 64-56 exactly matched the score of the game last year.
- Ohio State is 28-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season.
- Ohio State is 28-15 all-time vs. teams representing the American Athletic Conference.
- In season-opening games, Ohio State is 99-21 all-time and 102-17 in the first home game of the season.
- The game vs. UC was the second earliest opener in Ohio State history (Nov. 6), second only to the Nov. 5 season starter vs. Towson State in 2005.
- Ohio State observed a moment of silence pregame in honor of Buckeyes great John Havlicek, who died at age 79 in April.
- Jerry Lucas, who led the Buckeyes to the 1960 NCAA title, three-consecutive NCAA title game appearances (1960-62) and was a three-time first team All-American and two-time national player of the year, was on hand for the game vs. the Bearcats.
- With Kyle Young's first career double double (14 pts./13 rebs.), Ohio State has 915 D-Ds all-time and own a record of 641-274 in those games.

Game 2 No. 18 Ohio State 76, UMass Lowell 56 Nov. 10, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 18 Ohio State men's basketball team defeated UMass Lowell, 76-56, at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson led five Buckeyes in double figures with his seventh career double-double, going for 13 points, 13 rebounds and five assists. D.J. Carton added 13 points and four assists while Luther Muhammad poured in 11. Obadijah Noel led UMass Lowell with 15 points while Connor Withers came off the bench to tally a double-double with 10 points and 11 boards. UMass Lowell scored the first six points of the game but the Buckeyes responded to score the next seven, taking a 7-6 lead on a Muhammad layup with 15:43 to play in the opening half. A Christian Lutete layup gave the River Hawks a 10-9 advantage with 14:30 remaining but Alonzo Gaffney responded with a 3-pointer for the Buckeyes, who connected on 10 of their 18 shots from the field the rest of the half to take a 38-25 lead into the break. Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes with 11 points, 11 rebounds and four assists while Carton scored seven points in the opening half. Withers led the River Hawks with six points in the first 20 minutes.

Notes:

- Five players scored in double digits for the Buckeyes: Alonzo Gaffney (10), Kyle Young (10), Luther Muhammad (11) D.J. Carton (13), and Kaleb Wesson (13).
- The last time Ohio State placed five in double figures was vs. Iowa (2/26/19); Andre Wesson (11), Kaleb Wesson (18), Justin Ahrens (29), Keyshawn Woods (13) and Duane Washington, Jr. (10).
- Ohio State has allowed 20 or fewer field goals in each of the first two games. Cincinnati made 19 buckets, UMass Lowell 20.
- The last time the Buckeyes allowed 20 or fewer field goals in back to back games was in 2018: 20(51), vs. Minnesota (12/2/18) and 19(58) vs. Illinois (12/5/18)
- Freshman Alonzo Gaffney made his first appearance as a Buckeye vs. the River Hawks. He sank his first career field goal attempt, a 3-pointer from the left corner. Duane Washington Jr. was the last to knock down his first shot from 3-point range, last year in the opener at Cincinnati.
- With Kaleb Wesson's double-double (13 pts./13 rebs.), Ohio State has 916 D-Ds all-time and own a record of 642-274 in those games.
- Wesson's D-D was his seventh of his career and first this season. Ohio State is 7-0 when he records a D-D.
- Kaleb Wesson had a double-double in the first half with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Jae'Sean Tate was the last Buckeye with a first half double-double vs. Wisconsin (2/23/17) with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- Wesson surpassed 400 career rebounds with his 13 total rebounds and now has 408 in his career.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 16 Ohio State men's basketball raced out to an early 16-point lead and never looked back on its way to a 76-51 win over No. 20 Villanova in a Gavitt Tipoff Games matchup at Value City Arena. Duane Washington Jr. led five Buckeyes in double figures with 14 points to go along with five rebounds while Luther Muhammad added 11 points and D.J. Carton went for 11 points, five boards and five assists. Kaleb Wesson recorded his second-consecutive double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds while CJ Walker scored 10 points and dished out a game-high seven assists. Jermaine Samuels led Villanova with 14 points while Cole Swider added 11 and Collin Gillespie scored 10. The Ohio State onslaught started early as the Buckeyes connected on their first six shots, including three 3-pointers from Washington Jr. and another from Walker, to take a 19-3 lead after an E.J. Liddell layup at the 15:41 mark of the opening half. The Buckeyes held a 21-7 lead with 14:16 left to play, then held Villanova to two for its next 18 from the field in building a 40-13 lead with 2:26 remaining before halftime.

No. 10 Ohio State 86, Stetson 51 Nov. 18, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team picked up an 86-51 victory over Stetson at Value City Arena. Kyle Young paced Ohio State with his second-career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds while Kaleb Wesson went for 13 points and eight boards and D.J. Carton scored 10 points and dished out five assists. Eleven Buckeyes scored in the win. Rob Perry led Stetson with 17 points and eight rebounds. The Buckeye defense was the story of the opening half as Ohio State held a 42-14 lead after 20 minutes. After Ohio State scored the first eight points of the game, a Christian Jones 3-pointer got the Hatters on the board at the 16:37 mark of the opening half. The Buckeyes would then go on to score the next 20 points, holding Stetson scoreless over the next 10:40 before a Rob Perry free throw made it 28-4 with 5:57 remaining. Ohio State went on another run, this time a 14-4 spurt, to extend the lead to 42-8 with 1:21 left to play before Jones connected on a pair of 3-pointers late in the half to make it a 28-point game at the break. Nine Buckeyes scored in the opening 20 minutes, led by Kaleb Wesson with nine points, while Ohio State held the Hatters to 14.3 percent (4-for-28) shooting. Perry paced Stetson with seven points at the half.

Notes:

- Ohio State had three players in double figures: Kyle Young (15), Kaleb Wesson (13) and D.J. Carton (10).
- The last time an opponent scored 15 or fewer points before half was 15 at Rutgers (1/14/18). Stetson was held to 14 at the half.

- Kyle Young recorded a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, his second of the season and for his career.
- Kaleb Wesson put up 13 points, tying his season high.
- Ibrahima Diallo scored his first points on his first field goal attempt. Diallo ended the game with six points.
- Diallo pulled down a season high five rebounds.
- E.J. Liddell's eight points and five rebounds tied his previous season highs from the game against Villanova (11/13/19).
- Harrison Hookfin scored his first career points, a two, in the career-high six minutes he played.

Game 5

No. 10 Ohio State 85, Purdue Fort Wayne 46 Nov. 22, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Purdue Fort Wayne, 85-46, at Value City Arena. With the win, which was head coach Chris Holtmann's 50th at the helm, the Buckeyes move to 5-0 on the year while the Mastodons drop to 2-5. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 15 points and seven boards while D.J. Carton added 13 and CJ Walker chipped in with 11 points and a game-high four steals as 11 Buckeyes found the scoring column. Marcus DeBerry scored 16 for Purdue Fort Wayne while Brian Patrick added 13. Ohio State scored the first five points of the game and held a 9-7 lead at the 16:36 mark of the first half after a DeBerry 3-pointer for the Mastodons. The Buckeyes followed with a 16-0 run over a 6:46 spurt to take a 25-7 advantage on a Duane Washington Jr. 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. Ohio State extended its lead to as many as 21 twice in the final three minutes of the first half before Purdue Fort Wayne scored the final four points of the half as the Buckeyes held a 42-25 lead at the break. Ohio State connected on 10 of its first 14 attempts from the field in the second half on its way to a 27-7 run and a 69-32 advantage with 9:27 remaining. The 3-point ball, including three in a three-minute spurt from Justin Ahrens, then pushed the Buckeye lead to a game-high 46 at 84-38 with 3:56 left to play as Ohio State came away with the convincing victory.

Notes:

- Three players scored in double-digits for the Buckeyes: Kaleb Wesson (15), D.J. Carton (13) and CJ Walker (11).
- Ohio State's bench outscored Purdue Fort Wayne's bench 40-7. This is back-to-back games with 40-plus bench points.
- Ohio State held the Mastodons to 17 made field goals, marking the first time since at least 1996 that Ohio State limited five consecutive opponents to 20 or fewer made field goals.
- Ohio State shot 10-for-14 (.714) 3FG in the second half.
- This was Holtmann's second matchup against Purdue Fort Wayne. His record improves to 2-0.
- Luther Muhammad passed 100 career rebounds with four, giving him a total of 103.
- C.J. Walker had three 3-pointers, going 3-for-4 (.750) from behind the arc.
- Duane Washington Jr. had a season- and career-high five assists, surpassing his four at Maryland (2/23/19).
- Kaleb Wesson had a season-high three 3-pointers.
- Kyle Young had four assists, tying his previous career high vs. Michigan State (3/15/19).
- Justin Ahrens was perfect from the floor, shooting 3-3 in three-pointers. His nine points tie his season high.
- E.J. Liddell's eight points and five rebounds tied his previous season high from the games against Stetson (11/18/19) and Villanova (11/13/19).

No. 10 Ohio State 71, Kent State 52 Nov. 25, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team used a 17-0 second-half run to pull away from Kent State on its way to a 71-52 victory at St. John Arena. The Buckeyes' Kaleb Wesson totaled 17 points and six rebounds while Duane Washington Jr. went for 16 points, a team-high seven boards and three assists. Danny Pippen scored a game-high 19 points and eight rebounds while Antonio Williams scored 17 for the Golden Flashes. Kent State scored the first five points in a physical first half but the Buckeyes, up 14-13 with 9:37 remaining in the half, took control with a 19-6 run, capped by a D.J. Carton 3-pointer, over the next 7:36, to take a 33-19 lead with just over two minutes left to play. After an Williams jumper for the Golden Flashes and two free throws from Carton, an Anthony Roberts layup with four seconds remaining in the half trimmed the Buckeye lead to 35-23 at the break. A dunk by Wesson and a 3-pointer from Luther Muhammad pushed the Ohio State lead to a game-high 17 at 40-23 with 17:33 left to play but the Golden Flashes responded with a 3-pointer from Pippen and a three-point play from Philip Whittington to make it a 40-29 game with 16:44 remaining. Washington Jr. followed with a layup to push the lead back to 13 but Kent State connected on four of its next six attempts from deep as the Golden Flashes battled back to tie it at 48-all with 10:30 left to play. However, Muhammad scored the next five points and Carton followed with a highlight-reel layup as the Buckeyes took control with a 17-0 run spanning 6:35 for a 65-58 lead with 3:55 remaining. The Golden Flashes would get no closer than 15 the rest of the way.

Notes:

- Ohio State improves its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with a 71-52 win over Kent State.
- Four players scored in double-digits for Ohio State: Kaleb Wesson (17), Duane Washington Jr. (16), Luther Muhammad (13) and D.J. Carton (11).
- The Buckeyes improved to 7-0 at St. John Arena since the end of the 1998 season.
- Since trailing Cincinnati by seven (26-19) at the half in the season opener, the Buckeyes have led by at least 12 in each of the last five games (35-23 vs. Kent State).

No. 6 Ohio State 74, No. 7 North Carolina 49 Dec. 4, 2019, Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team used a dominant second half to go on the road to defeat No. 7 North Carolina 74-49 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge at the Dean Smith Center. Duane Washington Jr. led four Buckeyes in double figures with 18 points while E.J. Liddell came off the bench for a career-best 12 points. Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and nine boards while CJ Walker added 10 points. Cole Anthony paced North Carolina with 15 points while Brandon Robinson chipped in with nine. Ohio State struggled with turnovers in the opening half but took a 29-27 lead into the break. The Buckeyes came out of the half using a 10-3 spurt, capped by layups from Washington Jr. and Kyle Young, to take a 39-30 lead at the 16:49 mark but Anthony responded with a pair of 3-pointers to make it a three-point contest at 39-36 with 15:57 left to play. This time, Ohio State answered with a 15-4 run over the next 4:09, finished by a fast-break dunk by E.J. Liddell, to push its lead to 14 at 52-38 with 11:48 remaining. The Buckeyes then used another 14-0 run over 3:11 to put the game out of reach at 71-47 on a Young layup with 3:40 left in the contest. Ohio State shot 53.6 percent (15-for-28) from the field in the second half and held the Tar Heels to 17-for-62 (27.4 percent) from the field for the game.

Notes:

- The 8-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
- The 25-point margin of victory was the second-largest by an opponent at the Dean Smith Center. The largest margin of victory by an opponent over North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center was a 29-point margin by Duke in an 87-58 win in 2002.
- The 27.4 field goal percentage was the lowest by the Tar Heels in the Dean Smith Center.
- The 49 points were the third-fewest points by North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center.
- Ohio State outscored the Tar Heels by 23 points (45-22) in the second half. The figure is the largest margin by which an opponent has outscored North Carolina in a half at the venue. The previous-highest mark was 22 set by Maryland in 1997 and Temple in 1988.
- Ohio State held a 48-32 advantage on the boards, a 25-10 lead in bench points and 30-10 stronghold in points in the paint in the contest.
- For the season, Ohio State's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench 244-97.
- Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.
- Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (19), E.J. Liddell (12), CJ Walker (10) and Kaleb Wesson (10).

Minnesota 84, No. 3 Ohio State 71

Dec. 15, 2019, Minneapolis

MINNEAPOLIS -- The No. 3 Ohio State men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season, an 84-71 decision at Minnesota. D.J. Carton led Ohio State, which was playing without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr., with a career-high 19 points while E.J. Liddell scored a career-best 14 and Kaleb Wesson scored 12. Minnesota's Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35, including 28 in the second half, to go along with seven assists while Gabe Kalschauer scored 15 and Daniel Oturu went for 14 points and 13 boards. The contest was back-and-forth early with Ohio State using a Liddell jumper to take a 14-11 lead with 13:15 remaining in the first half. However, Minnesota responded with a 13-2 run over the next 6:00 to pull ahead 24-16 with 7:15 left to play. The Buckeyes cut the deficit to four at 27-23 on a Kaleb Wesson 3-pointer at the 3:49 mark but the Golden Gophers again answered with a run of their own, this time a 9-2 spurt, to go up 36-25 with 1:10 remaining before taking a 38-29 lead into the break. A Luther Muhammad made 3-pointer made it an eight-point game in the opening minute of the second half but Minnesota hit six of its next seven shots from the field, going on a 15-5 run to push the lead to a game-high 18 at 55-37 with 12:29 remaining. Ohio State scored the next six points to trim the deficit to 12 at 55-43 at the 10:15 mark but the Buckeyes would get no closer than nine the remainder of the way.

Notes:

- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures: D.J. Carton (19), E.J. Liddell (14) and Kaleb Wesson (12).
- With the loss, Ohio State drops to 87-58 all-time against the Golden Gophers. The Buckeyes are 39-32 in games played against the Golden Gophers in Minneapolis and 30-5 when ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 against Minnesota.
- Ohio State falls to 520-153 all-time when ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25. The Buckeyes are 342-78 when ranked in the Top 10 and 42-10 when ranked No. 3 nationally.
- The Buckeyes fall to 39-67 all-time in Big Ten road openers.
- Ohio State was playing the game without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr. (rib soreness), who was averaging 11.4 points per game.
- Minnesota's 84 points, 31 made field goals and 15 made free throws were opponent season highs against the Buckeyes.
- The Golden Gophers' Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35 points, marking the first time an opponent eclipsed the 30-point mark against the Buckeyes since Penn State's Tony Carr scored 30 Feb. 15, 2018.
- Chris Holtmann falls to 2-1 all-time against Minnesota.
- Holtmann dropped his first December Big Ten contest and now sits 5-1 in such games.
- D.J. Carton scored a career-high 19 points on 6-for-12 shooting.
- E.J. Liddell went for a career-best 14 points while tying his career-high five rebounds.
- Also blocked two shots and recorded two steals.
- Andre Wesson made the start against the Golden Gophers, his first since the season-opener against Cincinnati. Wesson suffered an eye injury in that contest and was forced to miss the following two games.
- Kaleb Wesson scored 12 points, marking his ninth-consecutive game scoring in double figures.

No. 5 Ohio State 80, SEMO 48

Dec. 17, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Southeast Missouri, 80-48 Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fourth double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson scored 14, Kyle Young went for 10 points and nine boards and D.J. Carton totaled 10 points, five boards and five assists. DQ Nicholas and Isaiah Gable each scored 10 for the Redhawks. The Buckeyes battled back from a sluggish start to take a 35-26 lead at the break. Southeast Missouri held a 16-12 lead after an Isaiah Gable 3-pointer with 9:39 remaining in the half before Ohio State went on a 13-1 spurt over the next 4:01 to take a 25-17 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup at the 4:58 mark. The Redhawks cut the lead to five twice in the final two minutes but the Buckeyes' CJ Walker scored the final four points of the half as Ohio State took a nine-point advantage into the break. The Buckeyes' lead stood at 45-30 after a pair of Nicholas free throws with 14:47 remaining before Ohio State went on a 14-0 run, spurred on by a 3-point play from Andre Wesson, a 3-pointer from Kaleb Wesson and a pair of 3s from D.J. Carton, to take a commanding 59-30 advantage with 11:40 left to play. Ohio State then pushed its lead to a game-high 38 at 78-40 with 3:17 remaining after a pair of Andre Wesson 3-pointers as the Buckeyes picked up their 10th win of the season.

CLEVELAND -- The No. 2 Ohio State men's basketball team fell to No. 22 West Virginia, 67-59, Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse in Cleveland. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 17 points to go along with nine boards while Duane Washington Jr. scored 12 and Luther Muhammad and CJ Walker scored 10 apiece. Miles McBride went for a game-high 21 points for the Mountaineers while Chase Harler poured in 10. The Buckeyes got out to an early lead in a tightly-contested first half but were never able to push the advantage to more than four before a Harler 3-pointer gave the Mountaineers their second lead of the contest with 7:38 remaining in the opening period. With the game tied at 24-all with 6:19 left to play, Ohio State went on a 13-4 spurt over the next 5:17 to regain the lead at 37-28 with 1:02 remaining before a Sean McNeil 3-pointer trimmed the Buckeye advantage to 37-31 at the break. The Mountaineers came out of the break on a 10-3 run, using a 3-pointer and a jumper from McBride, to take a 41-40 lead with 13:28 remaining. West Virginia then pushed its lead to 52-47 on a 3-point play by Jermaine Haley with 8:38 left to play but the Buckeyes answered right back, using four free throws from Kaleb Wesson and a 3-pointer from Andre Wesson to regain the lead at 54-53 at the 4:40 mark. Indiana held an early 7-6 lead after a Joey Brunk dunk at the 17:06 mark of the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 14-3 spurt, capped by an Andre Wesson 3-pointer, over the next 7:31 to take a 20-10 advantage with 9:35 left to play. Ohio State would extend its lead to as many as 14 with 6:13 left to play but the Hoosiers battled back, making it a 31-22 contest on Green's half-court heave at the first-half buzzer. The Hoosiers trimmed the deficit to six in the opening minutes of the second half but Ohio State used a 13-4 run midway through the second half to take a commanding 58-40 lead on an Ahrens 3-pointer with 7:59 remaining. Another Ahrens 3-ball pushed the margin to a game-high 19 at 61-42 with 6:06 left to play before the Buckeyes came away with the nine-point win to avenge a Jan. 11 loss at Assembly Hall. For the game, Ohio State, which connected on 10 3-pointers in the contest, held a 31-24 advantage on the boards, a 26-20 lead in points in the paint and an 8-0 edge in fast-break points.

- Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Kaleb Wesson (15), CJ Walker (14), Justin Ahrens (11) and Andre Wesson (10).
- The Buckeyes had eight second chance points and held the Hoosiers to zero.

Ohio State 61, Michigan 58

Feb. 4, 2020, Ann Arbor

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Behind 23 points and 12 rebounds from Kaleb Wesson, the Ohio State men's basketball team edged Michigan, 61-58, at Crisler Center. Wesson's double-double was his third in a row, 10th of his junior campaign and 16th of his career. Duane Washington Jr. added 17 points for the Buckeyes while Kyle Young poured in 12 points and pulled down five boards. Xavier Simpson paced Michigan with 12 points to go along with seven rebounds and five assists while Austin Davis chipped in with 11 points. In a physical opening half, Ohio State bounced back from a 5-0 deficit behind a strong effort from Wesson as the junior center scored 12 of the Buckeyes' first 16 points to pull Ohio State ahead 16-7 with 8:52 remaining. However, the Wolverines, who missed 14 of their first 17 shots from the field, went on a 15-5 spurt over the next 5:21 to regain the lead at 22-21 with 3:31 left to play. Justin Ahrens then hit a 3-pointer and E.J. Liddell made a layup to push the Buckeyes in front 26-22 with 2:16 remaining but an Eli Brooks 3-pointer with 1:19 left in the half cut the Ohio State lead to 28-27 at the break. The second half was back-and-forth once again, with neither team holding a lead of more than three points until consecutive buckets from Washington Jr. and Young gave the Buckeyes a 46-42 advantage with 7:05 to go in the contest. Washington Jr. again came up big with a 3-pointer to push Ohio State on top at 57-56 with 54 seconds to go. On the Wolverines' ensuing possession, Simpson drove to the hoop and was fouled by Young on the shot but Simpson pulled the Buckeyes' forward down, resulting in a flagrant foul on the Michigan guard. Simpson and Young each followed by making their respective free throws as Ohio State held a 59-58 advantage with 33 seconds left on the clock. CJ Walker was then fouled with 17 seconds remaining and calmly hit a pair of shots from the charity stripe for the 61-58 win.

Notes:

- Ohio State leads all-time series 98-78. Michigan leads 48-38 in games played in Ann Arbor.
- The win at Michigan was the first this season for the Buckeyes when trailing with 5:00 remaining in the game (48-49/1-5) and when being outrebounded (42-31/1-3).
- Ohio State's last win when trailing with 5:00 to play in the second half was at Creighton Nov. 5, 2018 when the Buckeyes rallied to win 69-60 after being down 55-54 at the 5-minute mark.
- Duane Washington Jr. scored 17 points for his ninth double-figure scoring game of the year.
- Kaleb Wesson notched his third-consecutive double-double, 10th of the year and 16th of his career with 23 points and 12 rebounds. The Buckeyes are 14-2 in the last three seasons and 8-2 this year when Wesson records a double-double.
- Wesson now has 1,121 career points and 599 career rebounds. With one more rebound, Wesson will become the 22nd Buckeye to pull down 600 career boards.
- Wesson moved to No. 44 on the all-time scoring list with 23 points vs. the Wolverines, giving him 1,121 for his career. He passed Mel Nowell (1,100), Ron Sepic (1,107) and Curtis Wilson (1,120). Wesson trails No. 43 Brad Sellers (1,122) and No. 42 Richard Schnittker (1,129).
- With 12 rebounds vs. the Wolverines, Wesson moved to No. 22 all-time on the career rebounds list at Ohio State. He passed both Larry Huston and Michael Redd, who was in attendance in Ann Arbor, who each ended Ohio State careers with 593 boards. Wesson has 599.
