BADGERS HOST GREEN BAY AT THE KOHL CENTER

- Following a "Brew City Battle" win vs. Stanford, Wisconsin returns home to host Green Bay on Tuesday. Tip is set for 8 p.m. on Big Ten Network.
- Up next, the Badgers travel to the Bahamas for the Battle 4 Atlantis. UW opens the Thanksgiving tournament facing No. 24 Dayton on Nov. 23.

FAST BREAK FACTS

- This year marks the 125th season of Wisconsin men's basketball and UW will be celebrating the history of one of the Big Ten's most successful programs all year long (more pg 6).
- Tuesday, UW welcomes back **Bronson Koenig** (2013-17) as honorary captain. One of the program's most prolific shooters, Koenig finished his career as UW's career 3-point king (270 3FG). Brad Davison broke the record last year.
- Koenig was part of back-to-back Final Fours in 2014 & 2015, plus Sweet 16s in 2016 & 2017.
- Wisconsin and Green Bay renew a rivalry that has been played every year except one dating back to 1999. The 28th all-time meeting, UW owns a 26-1 record (23-0 in Madison) and has won 11 straight over GB. (more on page 4)
- **Greg Gard's** first game as head coach was against Green Bay, an 84-79 win on Dec. 23, 2015. Gard is 6-0 all-time against Green Bay.
- Green Bay head coach **Will Ryan** is the son of Wisconsin Hall of Fame coach **Bo Ryan**. (pg 4)
- UW is coming off a 60-50 win over Stanford last Friday as part of the "Brew City Battle" at American Family Field ballpark in Milwaukee. **Tyler Wahl** led UW with 17 points (more pg 3).
- 2022 Big Ten Coach of the Year and Naismith National COY finalist, **Greg Gard** has led UW to 5 of 6 NCAA tournaments during his tenure. As 2020 Big Ten champions, UW also would have qualified for that canceled tourney (more pg 3).
- Wisconsin won a share of the Big Ten title last season, UW's 2nd league crown in 3 years and the 20th regular-season title in program history.
- The Badgers return 3 starters from last year in sophomore PG **Chucky Hepburn**, junior F **Steven Cowl** and senior F **Tyler Wahl**.
- UW welcomes 3 new scholarship players this year in junior transfer **Max Klesmit** (Wofford), sophomore transfer **Kamari McGee** (Green Bay), along with freshmen **Connor Essegian**.
- Big Ten All-Freshman Team honoree **Chucky Hepburn** started every game for UW as a true freshman last year. He averaged 7.9 ppg while leading UW in assists (77) and ranked 2nd in steals (36). More impressive, he maintained a 1.97 assist-to-turnover ratio (more on page 5).
- Versatile **Tyler Wahl** does it all for the Badgers. This year, Wahl is the only player in the Big Ten ranked top 10 in the conference for points (18.0 ppg, 8th), rebounds (7.5 rpg, T10th) and assists (2.5 spg, 5th) - more on page 5.
- Wisconsin led the NCAA last year committing an average of just 8.7 turnovers per game.
- The Badgers begin the season unranked in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches Poll, but don't count out UW. Over the past 15 seasons, Wisconsin has begun the year unranked in the AP Top 25 6 times - in 5 of those 6 instances, the Badgers finished the season ranked.
- Since the Kohl Center has opened in 1998, Wisconsin has enjoyed a record of 336-61 (.846), which ranks as the ninth-best home record in the country among active venues.
- Last season, Wisconsin led the Big Ten and ranked 7th nationally in attendance.



Chucky Hepburn is coming off an All-Big Ten Freshman season during which he started all 33 games, the first true freshman to start a season opener at Wisconsin since Devin Harris in 2001.

LAST TIME OUT

WISCONSIN 60, STANFORD 50

Nov. 11 | American Family Field | Milwaukee, Wis.

- Wisconsin knocked off Stanford, 60-50, in the 2022 Brew City Battle. The event, which also featured the UW women facing Kansas State, marked the first-ever basketball games played at American Family Field in Milwaukee, the home of MLB's Milwaukee Brewers.
- Leading 45-40 with 8:22 remaining, UW held Stanford without a field goal the next 6:49 en route to opening up a 55-44 lead.
- UW opened the season 2-0 for the 3rd straight season and the 5th time in the last 6 years.
- UW held Stanford to just 50 points, UW's lowest since beating Penn State, 51-49, last season.
- Senior **Tyler Wahl** led UW with 17 points, while adding 5 rebounds and 3 steals. He scored in double figures for the second straight game and 26th time in his career.
- Junior **Steven Crowl** set new career highs with 11 rebounds and 3 blocks. He also scored 9pts.
- Junior **Jordan Davis** scored a career-high 13 points, shooting 5-for-9 from the field. His previous career best was 7 points at Minnesota last season (2/23/22).
- Sophomore **Chucky Hepburn** scored 11 points and his 5 assists came one shy of matching his career best. He also swiped 3 steals.

WINS ADD UP UNDER GARD

- With a regular-season record of 24-7 last season, UW posted its best start of the Greg Gard era and the 6th-best 31-game start in program history:

- The Badgers won 24 regular season games for just the 5th time in program history.
- Including wins at No. 3 Purdue and over No. 8 Purdue this season, Gard has led UW to 10 top-10 wins, including 6 away from home.
- UW went 15-5 in the Big Ten, posting the most conference wins in the Gard era. The Badgers won 15 Big Ten games for just the 3rd time in program history. Overall, UW has won 14+ games just 5 times, and Gard-led teams are responsible for 3 of those seasons.

- Wisconsin has won at least 14 Big Ten games for the 3rd time in the last 4 seasons, the only team that can make that claim.

- Over the past 4 seasons, Wisconsin has 53 Big Ten wins, the most in the league over that span (Purdue has 52). Among major conference teams, only Virginia (56), Kansas (55) and Duke (54) have more league victories.
- During the Greg Gard era (since 2015-16), Wisconsin has the most road wins of any Big Ten team, going 42-37 (.532) in such games. Michigan State is second with 40 road wins.

GARD'S GUIDANCE

Now in his 8th season as head coach, **Greg Gard** has led the Badgers to Big Ten titles in two of the last three seasons and kept the program winning at a high level. In fact, Gard's resume stacks up among the Big Ten's best of the last 40 years.

- Gard has guided the Badgers to a record of 145-78 (.650), the 4th-highest win total and 3rd-highest win percentage in UW annals.

CHAMPIONSHIP DNA

- Wisconsin clinched a share of the 2022 Big Ten championship, marking the Badgers' 2nd league title in 3 seasons and the 20th in school history.
- With 2 Big Ten championships during his tenure, **Greg Gard** joins Tom Izzo (10) and Matt Painter (2) as the only active coaches with multiple Big Ten titles.
- The Badgers (20) trail only Purdue (24) and Indiana (22) for most conference titles.
- Wisconsin has won 6 Big Ten regular season titles since 2002 (02-03-08-15-20-22), matching MSU (6) for most titles during that span.

SERIES VS. GREEN BAY

Wisconsin and Green Bay renew a rivalry on Tuesday that has been played every year except one dating back to 1999. The schools meet for the 28th time, with the Badgers owning a 26-1 record against Green Bay (23-0 in Madison).

- **Greg Gard's** first game as head coach was against Green Bay, an 84-79 win on Dec. 23, 2015. Gard is 6-0 all-time against Green Bay.
- UW has won each of the last 11 games vs. GB by an average of 19.6 points per contest.
- Green Bay head coach **Will Ryan** is the son of UW Hall of Fame coach **Bo Ryan**. Among the credentials for the elder Ryan:
 - The winningest coach in UW history, Bo held a 364-130 (.737) record in 14-plus seasons.
 - Bo led UW to 4 Big Ten regular season championships and 3 Big Ten Tournament titles
 - Bo received 4 Big Ten Coach of the Year honors
 - Bo led UW to 14 straight NCAA tournament appearances, 7 Sweet 16s, 3 Elite Eights, 2 Final Fours and the 2015 national championship game

- **Greg Gard** and **Will Ryan** worked together on the UW staff from 2002-07, with Gard serving as assistant coach and Will Ryan holding the positions of video coordinator and director of basketball operations.
- Wisconsin sophomore guard **Kamari McGee** is a transfer from Green Bay, where he was a 2021-22 Horizon League All-Freshman Team honoree.
- Green Bay assistant coach **Freddie Owens** played 111 games (61 starts) at Wisconsin, scoring 796 career points. He helped the Badgers win the 2002 and 2003 Big Ten regular-season and 2004 Big Ten Tournament championships.
- Green Bay assistant coach **Brandon Pritzl** is the older brother of former Badger Brevin Pritzl (2016-20). Brevin Pritzl, who appeared in 122 games for Wisconsin, is playing professional basketball in Belgium.
- UW is 9-3 against in-state opponents under Greg Gard and has gone 48-12 (.800) in such games dating back to 2000.
- This season, UW is also scheduled to face in-state foe Marquette on Dec. 3 in Milwaukee.

- Hepburn has scored in double figures in two straight games, and now 14x in his career. UW was 13-1 when Hepburn hits double digits.
- To begin this season, Hepburn was named to the 2023 Preseason All-Big Ten Team.

WALL-TO-WAHL PLAYER

- One of the most versatile players in college basketball, **Tyler Wahl** does a little bit of everything — and then some — for Bucky.
- Wahl is the only player in the Big Ten this year ranked top 10 in the conference for points (18.0 ppg, 8th), rebounds (7.5 rpg, T10th) and assists (2.5 spg, 5th) - through Nov. 13, 2022.
- In UW's season opener vs. South Dakota, Wahl posted the 5th double-double of his career, filling up the stat sheet with 19 points, 10 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals and 1 block.
- The improvement of Wahl over his four years at Wisconsin has been notable and impressive:

- Wahl made his presence known last season with an All-Tournament performance at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational in Las Vegas.
- In 3 games, Wahl averaged 11.0 ppg (18 pts and 4 blk in championship game), plus 5.3 rpg.
- Wahl built on that confidence, scoring double figures in 17 of the final 22 games of the season. Wahl had scored in double figures just 5 times his first two seasons as a Badger.
- That includes a career-high 23 points vs. Rutgers (2/12). Wahl shot 9-for-14 from the floor, including 1-1 3FG, 4-5 FT. He also tallied 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals.
- Wahl also had 20-point outings at Maryland (21 pts) and vs. #16 Ohio State (20 pts), which marked the first 20-pt games of his career.
- Wahl led UW in scoring vs. #8 Purdue (3/1), finishing with 19 points (8-14 FG) and 5 steals.
- Last season, Wahl ranked 3rd on the team in scoring (11.4 ppg) and 2nd in rebounding (5.9 rpg). He led the team shooting 51.6% FG.
- Wahl also led the team in steals (37) and ranked 2nd for the Badgers lead in blocks (25).
- This season, Wahl was 1 of 20 candidates in the country nominated to the 2023 Julius Erving Award Watch List, which annually recognizes the best small forward in the nation.
- Wahl was also named to the 2023 Preseason All-Big Ten Team.

CROWL COMING ON

After playing 12 games and a total of 39 minutes as a freshman, sophomore forward **Steven Crowl** started all 33 games last season and continued to develop and grow his game with experience.

- Along with experience, Crowl has also continued to add size to his frame. Listed at 217 as a freshman, he's now pushing 250 lbs.
- Last Friday vs. Stanford in the "Brew City Battle," Crowl set career highs with 11 rebounds and 3 blocks, also scoring 9 points.
- Crowl has scored in double figures 14x in his career, and UW is 13-1 in those games. He reached double-digit scoring 13x last season, including a pair of 20+ point performances.
- Over the final 15 games of the regular season last year, Crowl averaged 9.5 ppg shooting 54.4% from the floor (18-for-21 at FT line).
- Crowl led UW in scoring at Minnesota (2/23) with 20 points, shooting 7-for-9 from the floor (5-6 FT), while also grabbing 7 rebounds.
- Crowl scored a season-high 21 points vs. Illinois State (12/29), shooting 7-for-8 FG (2-2 3FG). He also grabbed 7 rebounds that game.
- Last year, Crowl shot 49.6% FG (2nd for UW). In Big Ten play, that number climbed to 53.1% FG (69-130), including 32.6% 3FG.

125 YEARS OF BADGER BASKETBALL

This year marks the 125th season of Wisconsin men's basketball and all season long UW will be celebrating the history of one of the Big Ten's most successful programs:

- Wisconsin made its 26th appearance in the NCAA tournament last season. In fact, UW is 1 of 5 schools to participate in 22 of the last 23 NCAA tourneys, joining Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas and Michigan State.
- Wisconsin clinched a share of the 2022 Big Ten championship, marking UW's 2nd league title in 3 seasons and the 20th in school history.
- The Badgers (20 titles) trail only Purdue (24) and Indiana (22) for most conference titles.
- Wisconsin has won 6 Big Ten regular season titles since 2002 (02-03-08-15-20-22), matching MSU (6) for most titles during that span.

As part of its 125th season celebration, UW welcomes back **Bronson Koenig** (2013-17) as honorary captain for Tuesday's game.

- One of the program's most prolific shooters, Koenig finished his career as Wisconsin's career 3-point king with 270 3-pointers.
 - Koenig was later bumped to 2nd all-time after Brad Davison broke the record last year (300).
 - Koenig also set a UW school record hitting at least one 3-pointer in 43 straight games.
- Koenig was a key contributor on back-to-back Final Four teams in 2014 and 2015, including when he helped the Badgers reach their first national championship game since 1941.
- He was also part of Sweet 16 teams in 2016 and 2017, hitting one of the program's most iconic shots with a 3 at the buzzer to beat Xavier in the second round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament.
- As a senior in 2016-17, Koenig was on national watch lists for Player of the Year awards and Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year
- 2017 Second-Team All-Big Ten, 2017 Big Ten All-Tournament Team, 2016 Third-Team All-Big Ten, 2017 USBWA Courageous Award.

WINNING AT WISCONSIN

With a record of 24-7 last season, the Badgers reached the 20-win milestone yet again. Since 2003, Wisconsin has won at least 20 games in 17 of 20 seasons, including a school-record 36 wins in 2014-15.

Greg Gard has four 20-win seasons on his ledger with a high of 27 wins in 2016-17, a mark that ranks 5th in UW history.

A coaching veteran of more than 30 years, Greg Gard enters his eighth season leading the Wisconsin men's basketball program in 2022-23 and has proven himself to be one of the best head coaches in the Big Ten. A finalist for Naismith National Coach of the Year, Gard guided the Badgers to the 2022 Big Ten regular season championship, marking the team's second title in the last three seasons, earning Big Ten Coach of the Year honors in both 2020 and 2022.

Wisconsin's incredible postseason success hasn't wavered on Gard's watch either, as he's led UW to 5 of 6 NCAA tournaments during his tenure. As 2020 Big Ten champs, UW would have also participated in the cancelled tournament that year. Most recently, Gard led UW to a No. 3 seed in last season's NCAA tournament.

In his first seven seasons as head coach, Gard has a record of 144-78, the second-fastest Wisconsin coach to 100 overall wins in the NCAA tournament era. He's also guided UW to a conference record of 84-50. His .627 conference win percentage is tied for sixth best among Big Ten coaches the last 40 years.

Gard is coming off of arguably his most impressive coaching job in 2021-22. Picked to finish preseason 10th in the Big Ten, UW went 25-8 overall and 15-5 in league play, claiming a share of the Big Ten regular season title for the second time in the past three seasons. Gard was named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. Sophomore guard Johnny Davis garnered consensus first-team All-America honors and won Lute Olson National Player of the Year. Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year, and Big Ten Player of the Year. Brad Davison was second-team All-Big Ten, Chucky Hepburn was an All-Big Ten Freshman, while Tyler Wahl was Honorable Mention All-Big Ten.

The 2020-21 season was unprecedented due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, but the leadership of Gard and his staff helped navigate the Badgers to an NCAA tournament appearance. UW finished 18-13 overall, highlighted by an 85-62 win over North Carolina in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

Gard's leadership during the 2019-20 season is among his best. After opening 5-5 overall and 5-5 in the Big Ten, Wisconsin won nine of its last 10 games, including its final eight games of the season to win

a share of the 2020 conference championship and claim the No. 1 seed for the later canceled Big Ten tournament. During that run, UW knocked off No. 14 Michigan State, won at No. 19 Michigan and closed the season with a win at Indiana to clinch the title.

In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. He followed that up by leading UW to the fifth-highest single-season win total in school history (27-10) and making a second-consecutive visit to the Sweet 16.

Gard's Badgers would follow that up with another 12-6 conference campaign in 2017, finishing second in both the regular season and the Big Ten tourney. UW capped off its 27-win season with a signature win in the NCAA tournament, knocking off the nation's No. 1 team Villanova, 65-62, to advance to the Sweet 16.

In 2018-19, Gard piloted the Badgers back to the Big Dance, posting a 23-11 overall record. Wisconsin also boasted a mark of 14-6 in Big Ten play, winning 14 conference games for just the 3rd time in school history, joining 16-win seasons in 2008 and 2015.

During his tenure as head coach, Gard has helped a trio of players reach first-team All-Big Ten status: Nigel Hayes in 2016, third-team All-American Ethan Happ in both 2017, 2018 and 2019, plus Johnny Davis in 2022.

Long considered one of the top assistant coaches in the game, Gard served as an assistant at Wisconsin for 14-plus seasons (final seven as associate head coach).

Gard helped guide the Badgers to back-to-back Final Fours in 2014 and 2015, and in 2015 UW reached its first national championship game since 1941.

In fact, Gard has been on the bench for each of the top 13 winningest seasons at Wisconsin.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin in 2001, Gard spent the previous two seasons as Ryan's assistant at UW-Milwaukee. Previously, Gard served as an assistant coach to Ryan at UW-Platteville from 1993-99. During Gard's years on the Pioneer staff, UW-Platteville compiled a 161-13 (.925) record and won three NCAA Division III titles, five straight Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) championships and appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments.

Hepburn's heroics lifted the Badgers past No. 8 Purdue on March 1, 2022, as the freshman hit a go-ahead 3-pointer with 1.5 seconds left to finish with a career-high 17 points and help UW clinch a share of the Big Ten regular season championship.
