- » Freshman **Kendra Lewis** walked off the game one with a game-winning triple. Lewis' hitting streak was also snapped in game two of the series. She now holds the longest hitting streak this season at 11.
- » Senior Molly Schlosser is hitting career-best numbers for a season. Schlosser has surpassed her batting average, doubles, and home run totals in a single season.
- » Badgers check in at No. 51 in the latest RPI.

IOWA RECAP

- » The Badgers swept the series over lowa for the team's home opener. In 2023, UW also swept the Hawkeyes at home.
- » Down 4-7 headed into the bottom of the seventh, the Badgers walked off thanks to a **Kendra Lewis** triple. Senior **Molly Schlosser** hit the game-tying homerun before Lewis' game winner.
- » Freshman Jordan Felci earned her first victory on the mound in game one of the series, and also picked up her second win the next game against lowa.

OPPONENT SCOUT

- » Washington: The Washington Huskies lead the all-time series 6-0. The last time the two teams meet was in 2024 at the Clearwater Invitational where Washington won 1-9 (5).
- » Freshman Alexis DeBoer was named D1 Softball National Player of the Week for the week of March 11, and was named Big Ten Player of the Week for the week of March 3.
- » DeBoer currently ranks third in the Big Ten with 14 home runs, 25th in hits (38), fifth in RBI (43), ninth in OPS (1.349).
- » The Huskies also rank third in the B1G with a staff 2.37 ERA. Oregon leads the conference at 1.73.

FOR THE GREATER GOOD

» The Badgers have totaled 34 sacrifice bunts so far in 2025. The 34 sacrifice bunts ranks 5th in the NCAA and tops in the Big Ten. Louisiana leads all of DI with 49 total sac bunts.

FRESHMAN PHENOM

- » Freshman phenom Kendra Lewis held a team-best and season-high 11 game hitting streak. Included with that is an 11-game on base streak. The streak was snapped on March 28 vs Iowa.
- » Against Iowa, Lewis hit the game-winning triple in the bottom of the seventh in game one against Iowa.
- » Lewis has totaled eight multi-hit games and five multi-RBI games.
- » In the three-game series against Illinios, Lewis hit one home run in each game.
- » For the week of March 17, Lewis was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.

BADGERS' LEAD OFF HITTER

- » From February 21 to March 8, sophomore Alivia Bark held a 10 game hitting streak - the longest of her career. The hitting streak came to an end on March 8 against Southern Illinios.
- » Previously this season, Bark also held a nine-game hitting streak from Feb. 21 to March 2.
- » Bark has also had 14 multi-hit games, and has recorded at least one hit in 25-of-34 games.

DUBS FOR DOUBLES

- » Wisconsin currently ranks 18th in NCAA and 4th of the Big Ten, smashing out 60 doubles so far this season. Indiana and Ohio State lead the NCAA with 74.
- » The team averages 1.76 doubles per game which ranks 15th in the NCAA and 3rd in the B1G.
- » The Badgers totaled 17 doubles at USF, and achieved double-digit double toatls a week later at the Chanticleer Showdown with 13.
- » UW slashed 12 hits against USF on Feb. 21. Of those 12 hits, eight were doubles. The eight doubles in a single game marked a program record for most doubles in a single game.

WHERE ARE YOU, GOODMAN DIAMOND?

» After four netural games at Oklahoma City, the Badgers endured seven-

straight weeks on the road, and will be the last to host a home game in the Big Ten. All other teams in the Big Ten will have hosted at least one home game before Wisconsin before March 28.

» Wisconsin, however, is not the last Division I softball team to not have a home game by March 28. North Dakota (April 2), North Dakota State and Maine (April 5), will be the last to have a home opener beyond March 28.

GOING, GOING, GONE!

- » Wisconsin has now hit two grand slams this season. The first came on February 7 against Kansas hit by Eden Dempsey. While the second grand slam occurred recently at Illinois on March 14 by Brooke Kuffel.
- » On March 14, Wisconsin hit five home runs in the 15-4 demolish over Illinois. The five home runs in a single game ties for second-most in program history. The last time Wisconsin hit five home runs in a single game came on April 9, 2014 against North Dakota.

SAVING HER BEST FOR LAST

- » Graduate pitcher **Gabi Salo** is off to the best start of her career. Salo leads the team with a 11-5 overall record in 19 appearances and a 2.54 ERA.
- » Salo's 2.54 ERA is the 14th-best in the Big Ten.
- » She averages 1.22 walks per seven innings which ranks 18th in the NCAA and second in teh Big Ten.
- » The RHP has already surpassed the amount of innings in one season in her career. Last season, Salo pitched 93.2 innings, whereas in 19 appearances, she has pitched 75.0 innings.

RUN, RUN, RUN AS FAST AS YOU CAN

- » Wisconsin has recorded 45 stolen bases in 2025 and ranks 68th in the NCAA and 4th in the Big Ten.
- » UW averageds 1.32 swipes per game which ranks fifth in the Big Ten.
- » The Badgers swiped eight alone against Kent State, marking the second highest in program history in a single game.
- » Senior Molly Schlosser leads the team with 12 (12-for-13) stolen bases so far this season.

THANK YOU, NEXT

- » Catcher Emmy Wells ranks 46th in the NCAA and 3rd the Big Ten in Caught Stealing By with eight runners thrown out.
- » Wells threw out four runners at FAU, including two in one game against Georiga State.

SHELBY PUTS THE "S" IN STRIKOUT

» Junior Shelby Jacobson recorded 11 strikeouts against BGSU on March 1 and set a career-best that day. Jacobson came in relief and eanred the win, punching out 11 Falcons in 6.1 innings.

CALL HER MS. CLUTCH

- » Senior Eden Dempsey hit the go-ahead grand slam against Kansas, leading the Badgers to a 6-3 victory over Kansas.
- » The grand slam is Dempsey's first grand slam, and just her second career home run.
- » Both of her career home runs have come while pinch hitting.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS

- » Emma King collected both her first career hit and stolen base against Ole Miss
- » Kendra Lewis went 1-for-2 against the Rebels, also earning her first career hit against the Rebels. Lewis also picked up her first career win in the circle over Georgia State.
- » Lewis also hit her first career home run on March 14. Lewis totaled three home runs alone, one in each game against Illinios.
- » Hannah Conger collected her first RBI, single and stolen base in the sixth inning against the Jayhawks.

BIG TEN WATCH LIST

- » For the first time in conference history, the Big Ten has announced a 2024 Big Ten Player Watch List.
- » Sophomore Hilary Blomberg and Graduate Molly Jacobson have been to the B1G Watch List.

HILARY "BOMB" BERG

- » Sophomore Hilary Blomberg exploded onto the scene for the Badgers in her freshman campaign. The Wisconsin native led the team with a .365 batting average, tallied 50 hits, 13 doubles, seven home runs, and slashed a .613 slugging percentage and .401 on-base percentage.
- » Blomberg earned All-Big Ten First Team honors, All-Big Ten Freshman Team (Unanimous), and NFCA Great Lakes All-Region Second Team.
- » Blomberg also wrote herself into the program record book in eight different freshman categories; highest batting (.365/1st), doubles (13/1st), slugging percentage (.613/2nd), total bases (84/3rd), RBI (35/4th), OPS (1.104/4th), home runs (7/T4), and on-base percentage (.401/7th).

PRESEASON HONORS

- » Sophomore Hilary Blomberg picked up two preseason honors being ranked No. 90 in Softball America's Top 100 players. She was also listed at No. 11 in the D1Softball position rankings (catcher).
- » Freshmen, **Kendra Lewis**, **Hannah Conger**, and **Jackie Showalter** also picked up presason watch list honors from D1Softball and Softball America.

ONLY THE YOUNG


- » With eight freshmen and five sophomores on the roster this season, the Badgers will be one of the youngest squads in the Big Ten.
- » Rutgers has 11 freshmen, two red-shirt freshmen and two sophomores.
- » Illinois enters the season with 10- freshmen, five sophomores, and two redshirt sophomores.
- » Lastly Washington has seven freshman and sophomores on its rosters this season.

WHAT HAPPENS IN THE MIDWEST, STAYS IN THE MIDWEST

» On this season's 25-person roster, 64 percent either hail from Wisconsin or Illinois. The other nine that call home are from Texas, California, Michigan, Iowa, Indiana, New York, and Arizona.

SEASON PREVIEW

- » After a run in the 2024 Big Ten Tournament (Semifinals) the Badgers will look to improve from it's 21-31, 8-15 (B1G) record.
- » The Badgers welcome eight freshmen and two transfers to the 2025 squad. Wisconsin picks up much needed pitching in Molly Jacobson from Virgina Tech and infielder Makenzie Foster from Syracuse.
- » Key returners include Hilary Blomberg, Emmy Wells, Brooke Kuffle, Ellie Hubbard, Aliva Bark, and Gabi Salo who saw significant playing time a season ago.

Yvette Healy enters her fifteenth season at the helm of the program with the highest winning percentage of any UW coach in the program's 29-year history with a .587 (411-289-1) winning percentage.

In 2024, despite being the No. 11 seed to the Big Ten Tournament, the Badgers advanced all the way to the semifinals before falling to the 2024 Big Ten Tournament champions, Michigan, 4-6. Wisconsin's path to No. 2 seeded Michigan, were victories over No. 6 Ohio State (5-1), and No. 3 Rutgers (7-4).

The Badgers finished 21-31 (8-15) in 2024, with freshman Hilary Blomberg earning All-Big Ten First Team honors, and Ava Kuszak earning All-Big Ten Second team honors. Both also earned NFCA Great Lakes All-Region honors as well.

Of the nine times that Wisconsin has made the NCAA tournament, Healy has led the softball program to six NCAA appearances. The last time Wisconsin made it to the dance was in 2022 where the Badgers went 30-21 (12-11). In 2022, the Badgers finished eighth in the Big Ten, but were awarded an at-large bid to the Gainesville Regional.

Under her tutelage, Chloe Miller became the program's first-ever NFCA All-American, the first USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year finalist, and the second-ever NFCA Player of the Week and NPF Draft pick (No. 11, Akron).

Shortly after Miller, in 2019 Kayla Konwent also earned NFCA All-American honors, and was a unanimous First Team All-American, and is the program's only First Team All-American. Konwent earned All-American honors again, earning Third Team honors in 2023.

Prior to Wisconsin, Healy took over as head coach at Loyola (Chicago) in July of 2004 after spending two seasons as an assistant at her alma mater, DePaul. While with the Blue Demons, Healy coached five All-Americans as the team won the Conference USA title in 2003 and 2004 to make the NCAA tournament.

Healy graduated cum laude and earned her bachelor's degree in marketing and communications from DePaul in 1999 and her master's in secondary education and English from DePaul in 2007. She and her husband Shawn have been married since 2006. They currently reside in Madison with their two daughters, Grace and Maeve.

GOODMAN SOFTBALL COMPLEX

Located on beautiful Lake Mendota, the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Softball Complex offers the University of Wisconsin softball program state-of-the-art amenities. From the indoor practice facility to the newly resurfaced playing field, the Badgers are happy to call Goodman Softball Complex home.

- The complex, located at 2415 University Bay Dr., is an extensive redesign of the previous softball field. Groundbreaking took place on June 25, 1998, and the Badgers opened the facility with a 9-1 victory over Loyola on March 30, 1999. The field and grandstands -- with a capacity of approximately 1,600 -- are positioned just north of Nielsen Tennis Stadium and share the parking areas in that proximity. Spectators have the view overlooking University Bay and Picnic Point. The facility meets the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- The Goodman brothers, longtime area softball players, businessmen and UW donors, provided the lead gift of \$500,000. Named for the Madison jewelers, the original renovation project cost more than \$1.2 million and has been affectionately dubbed, "Goodman Diamond."
- 2002 marked the first year under the lights for the Badgers. The lighting system was made possible by Bob Goodman, one of the original donors who made the field possible.
- In 2011, the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman family foundation pledged \$1.8 million to initiate the Goodman Softball Training Center project, which was a positive start toward the total project cost of \$3 million.
- The diamond received a complete resurfacing during the summer of 2012 with a new infield and outfield surface being installed. The infield was resurfaced with Hilltopper Infield Mix, natural soil enhanced with polymer that provides excellent drainage and coverage, while the outfield was leveled and tiled.
- In 2013 the Goodman Softball Training Center was completed. In the 16,500 square foot indoor facility the Badgers have access to a regulation sized infield, batting cages, team conference room and lounge. In addition, the team locker room and athletic training areas underwent extensive renovations.
- Enhancements were made to Goodman Diamond for the 2017 season thanks to a \$600,000 gift from the Goodman family foundation, highlighted by the addition of a high-definition video board to elevate the game day atmosphere for the Wisconsin Softball team by providing fans with highlight videos. Fans are further immersed in the game with the addition of player headshots and various stat displays.
- The Dave McClain Athletic Facility serves as the year-round home for a number of University of Wisconsin teams, including softball. The facility, renovated in 2013, offers a climate-controlled indoor training space, locker rooms, sports medicine center and strength and conditioning facilities. Opened in 1988 at a cost of \$9.5 million, the McClain Center has undergone an extensive renovation as part of the \$86 million Student-Athlete Performance Center project undertaken by UW Athletics to provide first-class facilities for the Badgers.
- The centerpiece of the McClain Center is a 76,000-square foot main floor that features a 90-yard practice field utilized by a variety of UW athletic programs. The practice area was re-surfaced in 2013 with the installation of the most advanced playing surface offered by FieldTurf.
