SETTING THE STAGE

- For the second time in four years, the Wisconsin Badgers will be part of the AVCA Jeep First Serve to kick off the 2026 campaign.
- Wisconsin opened the exhibition season with a match against its start studded alumnae on August 8 and an exhibition against Butler on Aug. 14.
- Of the 18-person roster, Wisconsin has 11 newcomers on its roster this season - in which nine of its 11 newcomers are freshmen; **Audrey Flanagan, Isabelle Hopee, Kymora Scott, Lynney Tarnow, Halle Thompson, Anna Bardaro, Jane Manecke, Decelise Champion, and Alyssa Konrad.**
- In the Big Ten Preseason Poll, the Badgers come in at No. 2, behind unanimous choice in Nebraska. Penn State, Purdue and Minnesota round out the Top 5 in the poll.
- Both **Jaela Auguste** and **Charlie Fuerbringer** were named to the All-Big Ten Preseason Team.
- **Auguste** and **Fuerbringer** were also named to the 30-person AVCA Division I Player of the Year Watch List.
- It was just nine months ago the last time Kentucky and Wisconsin met. The two teams fought in a five-set thriller in Kansas City at last year's NCAA National Semifinal matchup. The Badgers ended up falling 2-3.
- Wisconsin last met in Lexington, Ky. in the inaugural AVCA First Serve in 2024 - Fuerbringer's freshman season. Fuerbringer is the only player on the current roster to have played in the event in 2024.

- Kentucky's key returners include outside hitters Brooklyn DeLeye, Morgan Gaerte, setter Kassie O'Brien and libero Molly Tuozzo. All four have also been named to the 2026 AVCA Division I Player of the Year Watchlist. - Setter Kassie O'Brien is coming off a AVCA National Freshman of the Year honors, leading the high-powered Wildcat offense. - Wisconsin and Kentucky met just nine months ago at the 2025 NCAA National Semifinals.	- Louisville's key returners include opposite Kalyssa Blackshear, setter Nayelis Cabello, and outside hitters Chloe Chicoine and Payton Petersen. - Blarshear was the 2025 ACC Freshman of th Year and Second Team All-ACC. - Both Cabello and Chicoine earned AVCA Honorable Mention All-America and First Team All-ACC honors a season ago. - Wisconsin and Louisville last met in 2024 at the inaugural AVCA First Serve i Lexington, Ky.

19 of the Badgers' 27 regular season matches will be on national television this season. - Eight matches will air on the Big Ten Network; Marquette, Purdue, Indiana, Minnesota, Illinois, Iowa, Washington, and UCLA. - Four matches on FS1; Florida, Auburn, Michigan and Penn State. - Four matches on ESPN; Kentucky, Stanford, ESPN, and Texas. - Two matches on FOX; Louisville and Nebraska. - One match on the SEC Network against Texas A&M.	- The 2026 Badgers check in at No. 6 in the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Preseason poll. - This marks the 13-th straight year where the Badgers have been ranked in the Top-10 in the preseason poll.
FLANAGAN SHINES IN 2026 DEBUT	BIG TEN PRESEASON POLL
- Freshman Audrey Flanagan totaled a match-high 17 kills against the Badger Alumnae on Aug. 8. - She also hit .316 (17-5-38) in three sets. - Against Butler on Aug. 14, Flanagan totaled just five in the first three sets of play, but added nine in the fourth set alone for a total of 14.	- The Badgers have been picked to finish second behing unanimous picked Nebraska. - Wisconsin finished 17-3 a season ago - good for a second place finish.
¡BIENVENIDO, G-LO!	PEEP THE NON-CON SCHEDULE
17 months ago was the last time opposite Grace Lopez saw competitive action. - Against the alumnae, Lopez served and played in the back row. But then agianst the Butler, Lopez played six rotations.	- Head coach Kelly Sheffield has scheduled he toughest non-conference shcedule to date. This season's non-con includes six (Kentucky, Lousville, Stanford, Pitt, Texas A&M, and Texas) opponents who finished in the Top 10 of the 2025 AVCA Final poll. All six will be played in the Badgers first eight matches. - The first four matches include No. 3 Kentucky, No. 7 Lousville, No. 5 Stanford, and No. 4 Pitt, before opening the regular season at home against No. 17 Florida. - Of their 10 matches of non-conference, the Badgers will face seven ranked opponents with Marquette receiving votes in the preseason poll.
YOU'VE BEEN GRACE'D	PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN TEAM
- The Badgers totaled 14 service aces against Butler in its exhibition on Aug. 14 - 11 in the first set alone, thanks to Grace Lopez and Grace Egan. - The two top spin servers totaled eight of the 11 service aces against the Bulldogs.	Charlie Fuerbringer and Jaela Auguste have been selected onto the Preseason All-Big Ten Team. A total of 19 student-athletes were honored. - Fuerbringer was a All-Big Ten First team honoree in 2025, and All-Freshman team in 2024.

- ◆ This is Auguste's first year in the Big Ten. In her first two seasons at Florida, Auguste earned All-SEC First Team (2025), Second Team (2024), and SEC Freshman of the Year (2024) honors.

AVCA PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- ◆ **Charlie Fuerbringer** and **Jaela Auguste** have also been selected onto the AVCA Division I Player of the Year Watch List.
- ◆ Fuerbringer earned All-America Third Team honors her freshman season. Due to not playing in enough matches in 2025 due to injury, she did not qualify for All-America honors.
- ◆ Last season, Auguste Earn All-America Third Team honors for her performances with the Gators.
- ◆ In program history, the Badgers have had two athletes, **Dana Rettke** (2021) and **Sarah Franklin** (2023) who have earned the prestigious award. In 2025, **Mimi Colyer** was a finalist.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

- ◆ Wisconsin enters the 2026 season the youngest teams in the Big Ten, and maybe all of Division I Volleyball.
- ◆ The 2026 Badger roster includes nine freshmen; Decelise Champion, Audrey Flanagan, Kymora Scott, Lynney Tarnow, Halle Thompson, Isabelle Hoppe, Jane Manecke, and Alyssa Konrad, and Anna Bardaro.
- ◆ The next closest team to that amount of freshmen in the Big Ten is Washington with six, while Illinois, Indiana, and Iowa have just two freshmen listed on their rosters.

SOMEONE SAY CONFERENCE TOURNEY?

- ◆ 2026 marks the inaugural year for the Big Ten Volleyball Tournament.
- ◆ The tournament will be held at the Fishers Event Center in Fishers, Ind.
- ◆ Teams will play each other just once this season due to the addition of the tournament.
- ◆ There will be regular season champion and tournament champion.

A COUPLE OF INTERNATIONAL STARS

- ◆ Wisconsin is no stranger to athletes with international experience. This year's roster adds libero/defensive specialist **Anna Bardaro** (Italy) and outside hitter **Decelise Champion** (Puerto Rico).
- ◆ Bardaro played at one of the highest levels winning the Imoco Volleyball Congeliano and Italy's women's national U21 team.

SET UP FOR SUCCESS

- ◆ Despite missing nine matches in 2025, setter **Charlie Fuerbringer** led the nation in averaging 12.34 assists per set, and was named First Team All-Big Ten.
- ◆ Due to missing the amount of matches she did, Fuerbringer was not eligible for AVCA honors.
- ◆ With Fuerbringer, the Badgers went 22-2, 11-0 in the Big Ten. The team averaged 15.78 kills/set, while hitting .349 in those 24 matches. Wisconsin also averaged 14.81 assists per set with a .457 assist percentage.
- ◆ In the nine matches that Fuerbringer missed, Wisconsin went 6-3, averaged 13.61 kills/set, 12.87 assists/set, a .391 assist percentage, while the team hit collectively at .269 in those nine matches.

A HISTORY OF EXCELLENCE

- ◆ Dating back to 1982 and through 644 AVCA Coaching Polls, the Wisconsin Badgers have been ranked for 182 consecutive polls and 85-straight polls where they've been ranked in the Top 10.
- ◆ Over the course of time, UW has been ranked a total of 385 polls, 22 ranked at No. 1, and 312 total polls where the team has been ranked in the Top 10.

ALL FOR THE "W"

- ◆ Wisconsin volleyball has finished ranked in the Top 10, 11 out of the last 12 seasons in the AVCA poll.
- ◆ The Badgers have also finished ranked in the Top 10 for seven-straight seasons in the AVCA poll.

ONE OF THE GOATS

- ◆ Entering the 2026 season, head coach Kelly Sheffield ranks No. 21 as the Winningest Coaches All-Time in Division I.
- ◆ In 25 years, Sheffield has accumulated 619 total wins and just 185 losses for a .770 winning percentage.
- ◆ Don Shaw of Stanford (1984-1999) ranks at the top of the list with 440-70 record and .863 winning percentage.
- ◆ Active head coaches include Dan Fisher (Pitt), Jerritt Elliott (Texas), Todd Lower (UTRGV), Craig Skinner (Kentucky), Matt Botsford (FGCU), and Devin Hambly (Stanford).
- ◆ A minimum of 10 years as a Division I head coach to meet the requirement.

- Original capacity was 8,000 as the "Barn" was built without the upper balcony. The balcony was added in 1939, raising the seating capacity to 12,000.
- The facility had a dirt floor for many years and an eighth-of-a-mile track encircled the perimeter of the building.
- Home of the UW boxing team from 1933-60, when boxing was an NCAA sport. An all-sport record crowd of 15,200 watched the Wisconsin vs. Washington State boxing match in 1949.
- Used a training facility for the track, football and baseball teams until the Shell was built in 1956.
- Muhammad Ali suffered one of his few losses as an amateur boxer during the 1959 Pan American Games trials.
- Notable speakers include then-presidential candidate John F. Kennedy in 1960, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Reverend Jesse Jackson, Bob Hope and the Dalai Lama.
- Other events held in the building include basketball, wrestling, concerts, carnivals and Native American pow wows.

UW FIELD HOUSE

It's a landmark building in a number of ways. From being listed on the National Register of Historic Places to the record-setting attendances and the momentous wins, the Wisconsin Field House is a memorable place steeped in a rich history.

Since it was built, the Field House has been the site of numerous sporting events including basketball, boxing, track and field, and wrestling. It also hosted UW commencement exercises, carnivals and speakers, including John F. Kennedy.

The Badger volleyball team first competed in the Field House in 1977 when it hosted the Big Ten Tournament. UW didn't return to the building until 1980, hosting two tournaments. Wisconsin's play in the Field House was sporadic until 1986 when it became the permanent home of volleyball. With the construction of the Kohl Center in 1998, volleyball took over possession of the Field House for practice and competition. The building is also used as the competition site for the wrestling team.

As the sole occupant of the UW Field House, UW has made the building one of the finest volleyball facilities in the country. A new wood floor was installed in 2013, making the volleyball court the center of attention. In 2020, the building was renovated with new windows installed, marking the first time since the late 1960s that the windows have been uncovered during a match.

Volleyball facilities include a team room for relaxing, studying, as well as a video room separate from the locker room. The team room features a large-screen television, leather sofas, pub tables and chairs, and a kitchenette.

The renovation of Camp Randall Stadium in 2005 included improvements to the north end of the Field House including updated restrooms as well as a new media room and opponent locker rooms on the lower level. In 2021, the entire upper deck was opened for the first time since the 2007 season while in 2022, chair-back seats on the east side and Bucky's Balcony on the north end were added as well as increased ADA seating.
