A Look at Mississippi College

Mississippi College has been one of UWF's toughest matchups since joining the conference in 2015, with West Florida holding a 7-5 advantage against the Choctaws in the last four years. MC has won nine straight games and 13 of 14.

As usual, MC has been a well-balanced team offensively, with five batters hitting over .325. Carly Crawford leads the team with three home runs and a .375 batting average, while Alexia Harmon ranks 3rd in Division II with 8 doubles.

Cori Cooper (3-2, 1.04 ERA) leads the team in ERA and has allowed just 14 hits and four earned runs over 27.0 innings. Hannah Creel (6-0, 1.86 ERA) has a team-high 48 strikeouts in 49.0 innings pitched.

How About Rhiannon Sassman

Senior Rhiannon Sassman has started the season on a tear for West Florida, leading the Gulf South Conference in batting (.519), slugging (.923), and triples (5), while also ranking second in the league in on-base percentage (.591), RBIs (23), and total bases (48). Her 48 total bases also rank 5th in Division II, and she is 7th in the country in both hits (27) and RBIs (23).

Sassman currently ranks sixth in UWF history with a .370 career batting average, fourth with a .609 career slugging percentage, ninth with 37 career doubles, third with 21 career triples, and is tied for first with 26 times hit by pitch. Her 21 triples also lead all active Division II softball players, rank second among active players at any NCAA level, and are tied for the most in Gulf South Conference history.

NEWS AND NOTES

Over five games last week, Sassman tallied 12 hits, scored eight runs, and slugged 1.471, while stealing four bases and not striking out. She hit .900 (9-10) with three doubles, two triples, and two home runs in the weekend series against Christian Brothers, leading the team in each of those categories.

The Streak

West Florida is currently riding a 14-game winning streak that dates back to February 8, with the team's lone loss of the season coming earlier that day against now-No. 9 Florida Tech. It's easy to find things to be happy with in an 18-1 season, and UWF has been even better in the last 14 games. The team is hitting .410, averaging 8.8 runs per game, has 50 extra-base hits, and has a 1.19 team ERA during the streak. This is UWF's longest winning streak since the team won 23 in a row in 2017.

You Can't Be Wrong If You're...

Rachel Wright has come out on fire in her senior campaign, batting .448 with 5 doubles, 5 triples, and 23 runs scored at the top of the UWF order. She entered the season ranked eighth in the UWF record books with 38 career doubles, and she has moved up to fifth on that same list with 43.

Wright ranks in the top 10 in Division II in hits (26; 9th), total bases (44; 9th), and triples (5; 2nd). She also has a team-best 12-game hitting streak, hitting .471 with 9 extra-base hits and 18 runs scored over those 12 games.

No Sweatt

Sophomore Kelsey Sweatt has gotten off to an outstanding start in her UWF career, posting a 0.76 ERA over her first nine appearances in the circle. Sweatt has earned the win in her last six appearances, including starts against No. 5 Saint Leo and No. 18 Palm Beach Atlantic in Clearwater and against Auburn Montgomery -- a complete game shutout for the sophomore.

Sweatt recorded 10 strikeouts in two consecutive trips to the circle, going 5.2 innings of scoreless, two-hit relief against No. 18 PBA, and starting her first game at the UWF Softball Complex against Spring Hill on Wednesday, with a complete game win. She followed that with a complete game win over Christian Brothers, in which she struck out seven and allowed just three hits.

Sweatt ranks in the top 25 in NCAA Division II in hits allowed per seven innings (3.02; 18th), wins (6; 19th), and strikeouts (53; 21st).

Goodness, Our Pitchers

UWF's dominant performances in the circle last weekend should have come as no surprise. The team is second in the GSC and seventh in Division II with a 1.11 ERA and the team has put together 7 shutouts, good for 3rd in DII.

Kelsey Sweatt (.126) and Tori Perkins (.139) have each been close to unhittable, ranking first and third in the conference in opponent batting average, and Grace Gilbert's .248 opponent batting average is good for 20th in the conference.

Oh Yeah, We're Ranked

After sweeping Auburn Montgomery on the road last weekend, the University of West Florida softball maintained its No. 10 ranking in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, which was released on Wednesday.

UWF is one of three Gulf South Conference teams in the top 25, joining No. 4 Valdosta State and No. 16 Alabama Huntsville. Mississippi College was the second team receiving votes in this week's poll.

The Argonauts have impressed in every aspect of the game, ranking sixth in Division II in shutouts (6), eighth in ERA (1.21), 10th in fielding percentage (.978), 10th in batting average (.375), and 12th in scoring (8.00 runs per game).

Entering Wednesday, West Florida led the GSC in batting, on-base percentage (.454), scoring, slugging percentage (.549), and winning percentage (.941), while also holding the longest winning streak in the conference at 14 games.

About Last Week

UWF took care of Auburn Montgomery to improve to 16-1 overall and 6-0 in the Gulf South Conference with a series sweep over last weekend. The Argonauts pitching staff did not allow a run all weekend on the way to outscoring the Warhawks 14-0 over three games.

Rachel Wright and Teala Howard were the stars at the top of the lineup, each batting .500 in the series. Wright had a pair of triples in the series finale on Saturday and led UWF with 10 total bases for the weekend, while Howard matched Wright's team-high 5 hits and stole three bases. Mika Garcia came in clutch on Saturday and tallied four RBIs while going 3-for-6 in the doubleheader.

All three of West Florida's pitchers -- Grace Gilbert, Kelsey Sweatt, and Tori Perkins -- threw complete game shutouts in the series. The trio held AUM to a .116 batting average and shutout the Warhawks for the first time. AUM entered the weekend hitting .373 and averaging 8.3 runs per game.

Teala Howard Is Only A Freshman

University of West Florida freshman outfielder Teala Howard was named the Gulf South Conference Softball Freshman of the Week for a second consecutive time on February 12. That week, Howard hit .556 (10-for-18) with 8 runs, 7 RBIs, 4 steals, and a home run at the Leadoff Classic, and she has continued dominating in the following weeks.

The rookie leads UWF with 10 multi-hit games, and she has reached in 18 of 19 contests this year. She ranks fourth in Division II with 29 hits on the year, leads the GSC in runs (29) and stolen bases (17), and is second in the GSC in batting (.509).

Howard's top highlight of the Leadoff Classic weekend was the game against No. 18 Palm Beach Atlantic, when she went 4-for-4 with two runs and five RBIs, just one game after she tallied three hits, two RBIs and a walkoff inside-the-park home run against Cal (Pa.).

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

UWF ranked second in the GSC in opponent batting average (.257), third in shutouts (7), and fourth in ERA (3.23) and strikeouts (227) under McLean in 2018, on the way to another 30-win season.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead the team to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
