About Valdosta State

The Lady Blazers from Valdosta State enter the weekend ranked No. 9 in the country following a pair of losses at Mississippi College, and VSU is 16-5 overall with a 5-3 record in the Gulf South Conference.

Valdosta State is getting things done a little differently this year than fans may be used to seeing -- VSU is second to last in batting average and runs scored but leads the GSC with 24 home runs and has been one of the best pitching teams in the conference all season.

Caylie Van Auken and Kasie Johnson have been stellar in the circle, ranking third (0.93) and ninth (1.77) in the GSC in ERA, respectively. Johnson is also third in the conference in strikeouts (70) and Van Auken is fourth (66), and both rank in the top 10 in the nation in strikeout-to-walk ratio.

How We've Been Lately

While UWF's winning streak ended at 17 games on Sunday against No. 4 North Georgia, the Argonauts still got strong performances around the diamond in Dahlonega.

The Argonaut pitching staff put together a 1.35 ERA over 26 innings and allowed batters to hit just .202, led by a terrific weekend from Grace Gilbert. Gilbert tossed a pair of complete games, going 1-1 with a 1.08 ERA and 11 strikeouts over 13 innings.

Offensively, UWF stole eight bases and posted a .358 on-base percentage with 13 extra-base hits over the weekend. Despite a slower offensive weekend than usual, West Florida still ranks 6th in Division II in batting (.366), 10th in on-base percentage (.438), and 19th in scoring (7.11 runs per game).

NEWS AND NOTES

Perkins in the Circle

A graduate of nearby Tate HS, Tori Perkins has taken a big step forward in the circle in her senior season. The UAB transfer ranks 11th in Division II with a 0.88 ERA and is 14th in the country in hits allowed per seven innings (3.75), while those marks rank second and third in the GSC, respectively.

Perkins is also second in the conference with a .154 opponent batting average and her eight wins are the second-most in the league.

The highlight of her season to this point has been a no-hitter against California (Pa.) on February 9 at the Leadoff Classic, when she went six innings and struck out seven in an 8-0 win. She has not allowed an earned run since March 2 against Mississippi College, striking out seven and allowing only six hits in nine innings since then.

Perkins has been absolutely dominant in relief this year, posting a 0.00 ERA over 18 innings and eight appearances out of the bullpen, with 16 strikeouts.

Goodness, Our Pitchers

UWF's dominant performances in the circle last weekend should have come as no surprise. The team is second in the GSC and sixth in Division II with a 1.25 ERA and the team has put together 10 shutouts, good for fourth-most in DII.

Tori Perkins (.154) and Kelsey Sweatt (.158) have each been close to unhittable, ranking second and fourth in the conference in opponent batting average, and Grace Gilbert's .211 opponent batting average is good for 11th in the conference.

Teala Howard Is Only A Freshman

Freshman Teala Howard has been one of the most electric players in the country this year, ranking in the top 30 in Division II in hits (43; 2nd), stolen bases (24; 10th), runs per game (1.26; 12th), batting average (.518; 13th), and on-base percentage (.559; 29th). Each of those marks also puts Howard in the top four in the Gulf South Conference, including her league-leading 34 runs scored.

The Lake Butler, Florida, native is a three-time GSC Freshman of the Week and has recorded multiple hits in 8 of her last 12 games played, including a 4-for-4 day against Montevallo on Wednesday when she scored three runs.

In all, Howard leads UWF with 15 multi-hit games for the season and has successfully stolen in 10 consecutive steal attempts.

Oh Yeah, We're Ranked

West Florida remained ranked No. 2 nationally in the latest National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, released on Wednesday. Additionally, UWF received a first-place vote in the poll, which reflects games played through Sunday afternoon.

Concordia Irvine jumped from No. 3 to the top spot for the first time in program history, and UWF's No. 2 ranking matches the highest for the program since 2005, when the Argonauts were ranked No. 1 on March 23. North Georgia moved up a spot to No. 3, and Central Oklahoma and Chico State round out the top five.

For the first time this season, there are four Gulf South Conference teams in the top 25, with No. 9 Valdosta State, No. 14 Alabama Huntsville, and poll newcom-

er No. 23 Mississippi College. UWF will face Valdosta State in Valdosta this upcoming weekend.

West Florida has been one of the most well-rounded teams in the NCAA this year, ranking 10th in batting (.361), 8th in ERA (1.34), 11th in fielding percentage (.979), and 20th in scoring (7.08 runs per game), while posting the sixth-best winning percentage in Division II (.885). The Argonauts are the only team in Division II to rank in the top 11 in batting, ERA, and fielding percentage, and no other team is in the top 11 in even two of those categories.

Against Montevallo

UWF improved to 25-3 on the year with a doubleheader sweep over Montevallo on Wednesday afternoon. UWF outscored the Falcons 15-2 and hit .440 on the day.

With a triple in Game 1, Rhiannon Sassman became the Gulf South Conference all-time leader with 22 career three-baggers. The West Florida pitching staff shined again, posting a 0.00 ERA with one shutout while allowing only six hits in the doubleheader – all of which were singles. Montevallo hit just .133 as a team and struck out 16 times in 12 innings.

UWF was outstanding again offensively, tallying five extra-base hits and slugging .600 as a team. Teala Howard led the Argonauts with four hits and three runs scored, doing all her damage in the first game.

Wow Gracie Gilbert

Sophomore Grace Gilbert has allowed just five runs over her last eight appearances, in which time she is 7-1 with a 0.68 ERA over 41 innings. That stretch includes three complete game shutouts -- a total that ranks 10th in Division II this year.

Gilbert struck out a career-high eight batters against No. 4 North Georgia on Sunday, going the distance in a tough-luck loss. Prior to that, Gilbert struck out five batters in a shutout against Mississippi College, and she threw another shutout against Auburn Montgomery on February 22. Aside from a start against then-No. 18 Palm Beach Atlantic on February 9 when she gave up 5 runs, Gilbert has posted a 0.80 ERA over 11 appearances with only six earned runs allowed over 52.1 innings.

How About Rhiannon Sassman

Senior Rhiannon Sassman has started the season on a tear for West Florida, leading the Gulf South Conference with six triples and ranking eighth in Division II in RBIs (32), 12th in total bases (62), and 18th in hits (36).

The senior broke the GSC career triples record on Wednesday against Montevallo, passing Lincoln Memorial's Nikki Carter (1993-96) with her 22nd career three-bagger.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the

team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

UWF ranked second in the GSC in opponent batting average (.257), third in shutouts (7), and fourth in ERA (3.23) and strikeouts (227) under McLean in 2018, on the way to another 30-win season.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead the team to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
