About Alabama Huntsville

The Chargers from Alabama Huntsville have been one of the most impressive offensive teams in the country this year, ranking in the top 10 in Division II in batting (.351; 6th), on-base percentage (.446; 3rd), scoring (7.8 runs per game; 5th), slugging (.556; 7th), and stolen bases per game (3.13; 3rd). That offense has helped UAH to a 33-12 record with a 17-7 conference mark that puts the team in second place in the GSC standings.

Shelby Booker and Ashley Cornell have been dynamic for Alabama Huntsville, hitting .469 and .439, respectively. Booker leads the GSC in runs scored (52), hits (68), and steals (42), while Cornell leads UAH with 83 total bases -- a total that ranks fifth in the GSC. Booker and Cornell are just two of six Alabama Huntsville starters with an on-base plus slugging average above 1.000.

What's On the Line Here?

With just six regular-season GSC contests remaining, West Florida holds a five-game lead over Alabama Huntsville in the conference standings. Winning the regular-season GSC championship means hosting the conference tournament from May 2-5, and it would be the first time since 2006 that UWF has posted the best regular-season conference record -- a time when the GSC was split into East and West divisions.

UWF was ranked first in the season's initial South Region rankings, which came out Wednesday. The Argonauts are one of five Gulf South Conference teams in the first set of rankings, joined by Valdosta State at No. 3, Mississippi College at No. 5, and Alabama Huntsville and Union at Nos. 8 and 9.

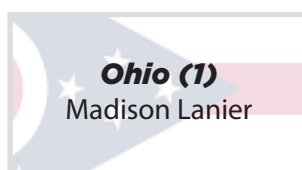

NEWS AND NOTES

Eight teams from the South Region are chosen for the NCAA Tournament. The field is made up of conference champions from the Gulf South, Sunshine State, and Southern Intercollegiate Athletic conferences, and the remaining five highest seeds in the regional rankings.

Home Sweet Home

There has been no place quite like the UWF Softball Complex for the Argonauts this year. The team has gone 17-1 at the friendly confines with one regular-season series left to go -- against West Alabama to wrap up the season on April 26-27.

UWF is hitting .384, led by Rhiannon Sassman, Courtney McLellan, and Jacquelynne Poling, who are each hitting .500. Sassman leads the team in runs (19), hits (27), home runs (3), RBIs (21), and slugging (.944) at home, while McLellan leads Argos with 6 doubles.

How About Mika Garcia?

Sophomore shortstop Mika Garcia has been on a tear since the series against Delta State, hitting .419 and slugging .581 over her last 12 games. The Jacksonville, Florida, native has reached base in each of her last 11 games, marking the longest active streak on the team.

She has three multi-hit games and a pair of contests with multiple RBIs, including the series finale against Lee on Saturday when she went 2-for-2 with two RBIs and a walk. She also drove in the first two runs of the series opener against Shorter on March 30, which included a solo home run in the third inning to start the scoring.

And Courtney McLellan?

Courtney McLellan is another sophomore lighting things up for UWF offensively, as the Bradenton, Florida, native has hit .394 over her last 11 games. McLellan has four multi-hit games in that time, including two on Saturday against Lee when she went a combined 5-6 with an RBI and a double.

She has destroyed GSC pitching this year, with a .431 batting average and a .690 slugging percentage. She leads UWF with 7 doubles in conference play.

We're Still #1

The University of West Florida softball team has earned the top spot in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll for a fourth consecutive week, the organization announced on Wednesday. The Argonauts again received 15 of a possible 16 first-place votes, while the other went to No. 2 Central Oklahoma.

West Florida leads all Division II teams with 39 wins this season and could be the first to reach 40 with a win at No. 18 Alabama Huntsville this weekend. The Argonauts' .886 winning percentage ranks second in the country, and the team is fifth in fielding percentage (.976), ninth in ERA (1.64) and batting average (.347), and 10th in on-base percentage (.424).

No. 16 Valdosta State and No. 18 UAH remained ranked, giving the Gulf South Conference three teams in the top 25, and Mississippi College is the first team receiving votes. Additionally, Sunshine State Conference and South Region opponent Florida Tech jumped up to No. 5 in the poll, and Rollins is receiving votes.

NEWS AND NOTES

No Sweatt

Kelsey Sweatt earned the Gulf South Conference Pitcher of the Week award last week, after her performance in No. 1 UWF's sweep at Union over the weekend.

Sweatt earned the win in a 7-2 victory over Union in Game 2 of the series, with a season-high 11 strikeouts. The sophomore held Union batters to a .200 average in the game, and her 11 strikeouts in a single game are the most for an Argonaut pitcher since February 19, 2018.

The USC-Upstate transfer impressed again over the weekend series against Lee, throwing 9.2 innings and holding batters to a .212 average. She posted a 0.72 ERA and earned two wins, one of which was a complete game victory on Saturday.

The Jacksonville, Florida, native leads the GSC in ERA (1.35), opponent batting average (.171), and hits allowed per seven innings (4.24), while also ranking second in wins (14).

Goodness, Our Pitchers

UWF has been dominant in the circle all year long, with a 1.64 team ERA that ranks eighth in Division II and leads the Gulf South Conference.

Kelsey Sweatt (1.35), Tori Perkins (1.77), and Grace Gilbert (1.84) have three of the best six ERAs in the GSC this year, and all three rank in the top five in the conference in opponent batting average, with Sweatt (.171) ranking first. Gilbert leads the league with 16 wins in the circle, and Sweatt is second with 14 victories.

Sweet Relief

West Florida has had one of the best pitching staffs in the country this year, ranking eighth in Division II with a 1.64 team ERA, and Grace Gilbert, Tori Perkins, and Kelsey Sweatt have been even better in relief. Across 43.2 innings of relief this year, the trio has struck out 44 batters, allowed opponents to hit just .152, and they have allowed just two earned runs -- good for a 0.32 ERA.

Perkins, who has thrown 22.0 innings out of the bullpen, has struck out 21 batters and has posted a .132 opponent batting average, both of which lead the group.

So Clutch

UWF ranks 8th in Division II with a .347 batting average, and the Argos have been just as good when in clutch situations. West Florida is hitting an outstanding .351 with runners on and .345 with runners in scoring position.

The Argonaut pitching staff has held opponents to a .200 average with runners on, and a .190 average with two outs.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

UWF ranked second in the GSC in opponent batting average (.257), third in shutouts (7), and fourth in ERA (3.23) and strikeouts (227) under McLean in 2018, on the way to another 30-win season.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead the team to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.

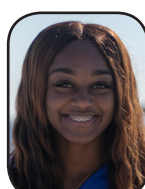
