For the second consecutive year, North Georgia pitcher Kylee Smith has been selected as the Ron Lenz national Pitcher of the Year award, while one of top offensive players in the nation in Truman State's Christa Reisinger was named as the national Player of the Year on the Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association's All-America softball team for the 2019 season.

Smith earned her second straight national pitcher of the year award – and sixth by a North Georgia hurler in the last 10 seasons – after recording the lowest earned run average in NCAA Division II this season of 0.73. Her dominance in the circle was also highlighted by allowing just 3.1 hits per seven innings, 318 strikeouts and 12 shutouts as she went 30-4 on the season.

Reisinger, named to the D2CCA All-America team for the third time, was an offensive force for the Bulldogs in 2019 in all aspects. She recorded a national-best .619 on-base percentage while hitting .544 – the third-best mark in Division II – and stole a total of 60 bases that is tied for the high mark in the nation. Her offense wasn't limited to just getting on base and stealing bases, as she also belted 13 home runs out of the leadoff spot in the lineup and finished with a .918 slugging percentage.

Reisinger was joined on the first-team outfield by a pair of players from the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in Kutztown's Sara Keeny, who also batted over .500 and stole 45 bases and Edinboro's Olivia Jankowski, who hit .479 and posted an .880 slugging mark.

Two teams were honored with a pair of first-team selections and both hail from the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Winona State was represented by shortstop Lani Van Zyl – who along with Smith and Concordia-Irvine's Callie Nunes

were repeat selections to the first team – and designated player Alison Nowak. Meanwhile, Central Region champion Augustana had two players in utility roles make the first team in Maggie Kadrlik and utility-pitcher Ashley Miskschl, who won 27 games as a pitcher and hit .317 at the plate.

The first team on the 2019 D2CCA All-America squad features 10 players that were named as either the pitcher or player of the year in their conference. All three pitchers earned pitcher of the year honors, as Smith was joined by Nunes, whose 33 wins in circle leads the nation and Grand Valley State's Allison Lipovsky, who helped lead GVSU to the Midwest Region title.

The top home run hitter in Division II, LIU Post's Julia Seader, is the catcher on the first team as is the nation's leader in runs batted in Central Oklahoma's JoBi Heath at third base. The rest of the team consists of Colorado Mesa's AnnMarie Torres, who is tied with Kadrlik for third in Division II with 68 RBI from her first base position and Winston-Salem State's Daijah Chambers, who was one of two WSSU players selected among the top three teams.

Winston-Salem State was one of seven schools to have a player get selected to the D2CCA team (first-, second- or third team) for the first time, along with Chadron State, Maryville, Saint Anselm, Tarleton State, Union and Western Washington.

This is the 13th season of the All-America program which is selected by CoSIDA members from schools playing in NCAA Division II and fourth in which the program was solely sponsored by the Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association.
