### IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

After 12 games on the road to start the season, West Florida will finally be back at the friendly confines of the UWF Softball Complex. Over the last three years, the Argonauts have hit .321 at home while averaging 5.7 runs per game, and the pitching staff has compiled a 2.18 ERA. West Florida has also had a 64-12 at home in that time.

Juniors Courtney McLellan, Grace Gilbert, and Mika Garcia have truly stood out at home in their two years with UWF. McLellan is a career .356 hitter at home with 9 doubles and twice as many walks as strikeouts, and Garcia has hit .330 with a .546 slugging percentage at the UWF Softball Complex. Gilbert has a career .398/.451/.490 batting line and an 18-2 record in the circle with a 1.99 ERA at home.

Jacquelynne Poling broke out at home in 2019, hitting .382 with 8 doubles and 16 RBIs in just 23 games played. Teala Howard hit .485 and was a perfect 24-24 in stolen base tries at home in her freshman season.

### ABOUT SPRING HILL

Spring Hill has gotten off to a shaky start in 2020, holding a 1-5 record. The Badgers are hitting .226 as a team, but Delaney Thomas and Hannah Fillmore have stood out. Thomas is batting .412/.524/.706 with 5 doubles, while Fillmore is hitting .316 with a double and 4 RBIs. UWF is 15-4 against SHC since 2014 and has won 12 in a row.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### A LOOK AT LAST WEEK

UWF got off to a 1-2 start in conference play at Montevallo last weekend, but there were still positive takeaways from the weekend. The pitching staff combined for a 2.14 ERA and a .186 opponent batting average. Kelsey Sweatt put together a 0.95 ERA with 9 strikeouts over 7.1 innings, and Megan Warhurst allowed just one hit over 5.2 innings against the Falcons. Those two rank first (Warhurst; .056) and third (Sweatt; .083) in the GSC in opponent batting average in conference play. Warhurst also ranks ninth in Division II in hits allowed per seven innings (2.85).

Courtney McLellan led the team with 4 hits and a .400 batting average over the weekend, Madison Lanier went 2-for-3 with a double and a walk in her first career start, and Grace Gilbert went 3-for-9 at the plate with 2 RBIs -- giving her a GSC-best 16 runs driven in this year.

### WATCH OUT

University of West Florida softball student-athletes Grace Gilbert, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt have been named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Player of the Year Watch List. West Florida's three players on the list are the most in the country, tied with Winona State.

Gilbert has undoubtedly been one of the top two-way players in the country this year, with a 1.66 ERA and a .213 opponent batting average to go along with her .390 batting average and Gulf South Conference-leading 16 RBIs. The junior was a first team all-conference selection last year, posting a 1.72 ERA across 36 games with a 25-5 record. She also hit .325 at the plate with 5 doubles and earned a place on the NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team.

Howard took no time to get back to last year's form, when she tied the UWF single-season batting average record (.464), earned All-America honors from the NFCA and the D2CCA, and was a finalist for both the NFCA Freshman of the Year and the NFCA National Player of the Year. This season, Howard is second in the league in hits (17), second in runs scored (15), and third in triples (2).

Sweatt also brought home All-America honors from the NFCA and D2CCA last season, and she was named the South Region Pitcher of the Year by the D2CCA and the GSC Pitcher of the Year. Sweatt was also named the Most Outstanding Player at the GSC Tournament after going 2-0 over 14 innings, with 18 strikeouts and a 0.50 ERA in the tournament. This year, Sweatt has pitched to a 2.39 ERA over 29.1 innings, in which she has struck out 29 batters and picked up two wins over No. 9 Florida Tech.

### THAT'S PITCHER OF THE WEEK GRACE GILBERT

After an outstanding weekend at the Florida Tech Invitational, University of West Florida softball junior Grace Gilbert was named the Gulf South Conference Pitcher of the Week by the league for the week of February 11.

## NEWS AND NOTES

Gilbert posted a 0.33 ERA over 21 innings, taking wins over New Haven and No. 25 Saint Leo, before taking a tough-luck loss against Florida Southern on Sunday. The Chipley, Florida, native had a 2-1 record over the weekend and batters hit only .127 against her.

### STARTING GSC PLAY

Conference action gets started this weekend as UWF heads to Montevallo, Alabama, to face the Falcons in a three-game set on Friday and Saturday. West Florida has been the best team in the GSC over the last three years, holding a .717 winning percentage (66-26) and the second most wins in the conference over that time, behind only Alabama Huntsville (67-27). UWF also won its fourth GSC title last season -- its first since 2005.

Outfielder Teala Howard led the league in batting against conference opponents last year, hitting at a .438 clip, and Grace Gilbert and Kelsey Sweatt led the league in GSC wins with 10 each. Sweatt also ranked second in opponent batting average against GSC teams, at .205.

### TEALA HOWARD BACK AT IT AGAIN

Sophomore outfielder Teala Howard has had no trouble over the first three weeks of the 2020 campaign, leading UWF in batting (.405), runs scored (15), hits (17), on-base percentage (.457), and steals (7). Her numbers with teammates on base have been even better -- she's 10-14 (.714) with runners on and is hitting .750 (6-8) with runners in scoring position.

She started the season with an 8-game hitting streak and has multiple hits in 6 games this year. She hit .474 with 5 runs scored, 2 triples, and 4 stolen bases at the Florida Tech Invitational.

### STRIKEOUT ARTIST KELSEY SWEATT

Junior pitcher Kelsey Sweatt has two wins on the season, and both have come against No. 9 Florida Tech. She has allowed just four hits and two runs over her nine innings against FT, and the Jacksonville native now has 29 strikeouts over 29.1 innings of work this season.

She also had 9 strikeouts over 7.1 innings at Montevallo last weekend, with just two hits allowed.



# THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
