ABOUT PALM BEACH ATLANTIC

Palm Beach Atlantic has battled through a tough schedule in the first month of the season, facing seven ranked opponents in the team's first 21 games, including one against West Florida at the Florida Tech Invitational.

Senior Magnolia West has led PBA offensively, hitting .364 and totaling 28 hits. Edmilly Molina leads the way with 6 doubles and is batting .315. Abbey Busby has pitched to a 1.17 ERA and has made 10 starts for the Sailfish.

West Florida rallied late to take an extrainnings win over PBA when the teams last met. PBA scored twice in the second inning and held that lead until Grace Gilbert's inside-the-park home run in the sixth tied the game. In the eighth, Jibrasha Moore scored the game-winning run on a wild pitch. UWF is 7-3 all-time against PBA.

A LOOK AT LAST WEEK

UWF swept Delta State over the weekend, with a pair of run-rule wins on Saturday before rallying in the sixth inning on Sunday to win 4-2.

The series marked UWF's best offensive week of the year. The Argonauts slugged .646 as a team, with 12 extra-base hits over three games, and 10 players hit .400 or higher.

NEWS AND NOTES

After batting .700 (7-10) over the weekend, Teala Howard leads the GSC with 31 hits, and Gilbert ranks second with 27 hits. Howard also leads the league in runs scored (25), and Gilbert is second in the conference with 23 RBIs.

A LOOK AT CHRISTIAN BROTHERS

The Lady Bucs from Christian Brothers have gotten off to a solid start in the 2020 season, with a 9-10 record heading into Tuesday. CBU has picked up quality wins over Missouri-St. Louis, Auburn Montgomery, and Lee.

Bree Brady is batting .362 with a team-high 21 hits and 19 RBIs, while leading the team in slugging (.569). McKenna Rose has posted a 3.05 ERA witha 6-4 record over a team-high 57.1 innings pitched.

West Florida is 30-2 all-time against CBU.

Thursday's doubleheader will not count toward conference standings, though Christian Brothers is a member of the GSC.

THAT PITCHING, THOUGH

The Argonauts pitching staff has been nothing short of outstanding this year, with a 1.84 team ERA that ranks second in the GSC and 20th in the nation. West Florida also leads the league in opponent batting average (.180).

And it's been an effort from the entire staff -- all three pitchers have thrown at least 31 innings. Freshman Megan Warhurst leads the squad with a 1.34 ERA and a .120 opponent batting average, Grace Gilbert has pitched to a 1.47 ERA and has six complete games, and Kelsey Sweatt has struck out 49 batters in just 46.2 innings. All three rank in the top 10 in the GSC in opponent batting average and in the top 13 in the league in ERA.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

West Florida was incredible with runners in scoring position against Delta State, batting .515 (17-33). Mika Garcia (3-5), Teala Howard (3-3), and Courtney McLellan (3-4) especially stood out, with three hits with runners in scoring position over the weekend. Equally as impressive, 16 of UWF's 26 RBIs in the series came with two outs.

WOW, TEALA HOWARD

After hitting .700 against Delta State over the weekend, University of West Florida softball sophomore Teala Howard has been named the Gulf South Conference Player of the Week. This is Howard's fourth career weekly conference award and the first time she has earned Player of the Week honors.

Howard batted .700 (7-10) and slugged 1.100 in the series against Delta State, scoring five runs and adding two doubles and a triple over the weekend. She had a pair of three-hit games on Saturday, with two RBIs in each.

The Lake Butler, Florida, native leads the GSC in runs scored (25) and hits

(31), and her hit total also ranks 10th nationally. She leads the 13-6 Argonauts in batting (.470), doubles (4), total bases (44), on-base percentage (.514), and stolen bases (13).

She started the season with an 8-game hitting streak and has multiple hits in 11 games this year. The sophomore is also riding a current 7-game hitting streak.

A NOTE ABOUT ANGELA AGURKIS

Transfer Angela Agurkis has gotten off to a hot start for UWF, batting .346 and slugging .731 through 10 games. In the sophomore's eight starts, she has recorded five games with multiple RBIs, hit four doubles and two home runs, and batted .375.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

With 15 of the team's first 16 games coming on the road to start the season, UWF finally got its first home conference series of the year last weekend. Over the last three years, the Argonauts have hit .321 at home while averaging 6.4 runs per game, and the pitching staff has compiled a 2.13 ERA. West Florida has also had a 68-12 record at home in that time.

Junior Courtney McLellan is a career .356 hitter at home with 11 doubles and twice as many walks as strikeouts, and shortstop Mika Garcia has hit .330 with a .546 slugging percentage at the UWF Softball Complex. Grace Gilbert has a career .398/.451/.490 batting line and an 18-2 record in the circle with a 1.99 ERA at home.

Jacquelynne Poling broke out at home in 2019, hitting .382 with 8 doubles and 16 RBIs in just 23 games played. Teala Howard hit .485 and was a perfect 24-24 in stolen base tries at home in her freshman season.

GRACE GILBERT, UTILITY SUPERSTAR

It's been quite a start to the season for junior Grace Gilbert, leading the GSC in RBIs (23), ranking second in hits (27), fifth in ERA (1.47), eighth in batting average (.422) and ninth opponent batting average (.208).

Gilbert was excellent again against Delta State, batting .400 with four runs scored and three RBIs, while also earning the win in Game 1 of the series on Saturday.

After an outstanding weekend at the Florida Tech Invitational, Gilbert was named the Gulf South Conference Pitcher of the Week by the league for the week of February 11. Gilbert posted a 0.33 ERA over 21 innings, taking wins over New Haven and No. 25 Saint Leo, before taking a tough-luck loss against Florida Southern on Sunday. The Chipley, Florida, native had a 2-1 record over the weekend and batters hit only .127 against her.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player

of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
