### A LOOK AT WEST GEORGIA

West Georgia comes in at 9-8 overall, with series wins over Lee and Shorter this year.

Pitcher Morgan Goree has stood out for UWG so far, with a 2.27 ERA and 78 strikeouts in just 49.1 innings pitched. That puts her at eighth in the country with 11.1 strikeouts per seven innings this year. Offensively, Raven Smith has led the way, with a .412 batting average and a .608 slugging percentage.

The Wolves faced off with UWF in the GSC Championship Game in last year's conference tournament, with West Florida taking a 4-1 win. West Florida has won the last 7 and 12 of the last 13 matchups against West Georgia.

### OUR WEEK SO FAR

UWF has gone 3-1 this week, with double-headers against Palm Beach Atlantic and Christian Brothers. West Florida has hit .369 and averaged nearly 7 runs per game during the week, with 15 extra-base hits. Argonaut pitching has impressed as well, with a .207 opponent batting average and a no-hitter against Christian Brothers on Thursday.

Teala Howard has a team-high .600 batting average and 9 hits, Kara Wilson leads UWF with 5 RBIs, and Callan Taylor's 1.250 slugging percentage is the highest on the team this week.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### THE NO-HITTER

UWF threw a combined no-hitter against Christian Brothers on Thursday afternoon, as Grace Gilbert, Kelsey Sweatt, and Megan Warhurst combined to strike out three and allow just one baserunner via hit by pitch for five innings. It was the program's first no-hitter since February 9, 2019 against Cal (Pa.), when now-UWF graduate assistant Tori Perkins no-hit the Vulcans.

Gilbert threw three hitless innings in the start, before Sweatt and Warhurst each pitched a perfect inning of relief. Gilbert earned the win, improving to 6-4 on the year.

### KARA WILSON, ON FIRE

Kara Wilson has been on an absolute tear over her last six games, batting .563 (9-16) with 3 doubles, a home run, and 7 runs scored. The senior has four multi-hit games on the season, with two of those coming on Thursday against CBU. She went a combined 4-for-5 with 5 RBIs, 2 doubles, and a home run in the doubleheader.

On the year, Wilson leads the team in slugging (.833) and is second on the team with a .433 batting average. She is tied for the UWF lead with 2 home runs.

### WOW, TEALA HOWARD

After hitting .700 against Delta State over the weekend, University of West Florida softball sophomore Teala Howard was named the Gulf South Conference Player of the Week. It marked Howard's fourth career weekly conference award and the first time she has earned Player of the Week honors.

Howard batted .700 (7-10) and slugged 1.100 in the series against Delta State, scoring five runs and adding two doubles and a triple over the weekend. She had a pair of three-hit games on Saturday, with two RBIs in each.

The Lake Butler, Florida, native leads the nation with 40 hits, is second in the country with 30 runs scored, and is eighth with 19 stolen bases. She also ranks second in the GSC with a .494 batting average.

She has raised her batting average 81 points since the home-opener against Spring Hill on February 19, when she began her 11-game hitting streak. In that time, Howard is hitting .590 (23-39) with 4 doubles, 2 triples, a home run, 15 runs scored, and 12 stolen bases.

### IN GSC PLAY

Conference play continues for UWF as West Georgia comes to Pensacola. West Florida has been one of the best teams in the GSC over the last three years, holding a .713 winning percentage (72-29) and the second-most wins in the conference over that time, behind only Alabama Huntsville (74-29; .718). UWF also won its fourth GSC title last season -- its first since 2005.

Through nine Gulf South Conference games this year, Teala Howard leads

the team in batting (.448), hits (13), runs (11), and stolen bases (7). Angela Agurkis has had no trouble adjusting to the GSC, with a .304 batting average and team highs slugging percentage (.696), doubles (3), home runs (2), and RBIs (10).

The pitching has also been sharp. Grace Gilbert, Kelsey Sweatt, and Megan Warhurst have combined for a 1.34 ERA against GSC competition, with a .177 opponent batting average.

### RISP-Y BUSINESS

West Florida was incredible with runners in scoring position against Delta State, batting .515 (17-33). Mika Garcia (3-5), Teala Howard (3-3), and Courtney McLellan (3-4) especially stood out, with three hits with runners in scoring position over the weekend. Equally as impressive, 16 of UWF's 26 RBIs in the series came with two outs.

### A NOTE ABOUT ANGELA AGURKIS

Transfer Angela Agurkis has gotten off to a hot start for UWF, batting .333 and slugging .639 through 14 games. In the sophomore's 12 starts, she has recorded six games with multiple RBIs, hit .353, slugged .676, and had seven of her 12 hits go for extra bases.

### IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

With 15 of the team's first 16 games coming on the road to start the season, UWF finally got its first home conference series of the year last weekend. Over the last three years, the Argonauts have hit .321 at home while averaging 6.4 runs per game, and the pitching staff has compiled a 2.13 ERA. West Florida has also had a 68-12 record at home in that time.

### GRACE GILBERT, UTILITY SUPERSTAR

It's been quite a season for junior Grace Gilbert, leading the GSC in RBIs (26), ranking second in hits (29) and wins (6), eighth in ERA (1.67), and 11th in opponent batting average (.210). She hit her second home run of the year on Thursday against Christian Brothers, and she went 3-for-3 with 3 RBIs, 3 runs scored, a double, and a triple in Game 1 against Delta State last Saturday.

Gilbert was excellent again against Delta State, batting .400 with four runs scored and three RBIs, while also earning the win in Game 1 of the series on Saturday.

After an outstanding weekend at the Florida Tech Invitational, Gilbert was named the Gulf South Conference Pitcher of the Week by the league for the week of February 11. Gilbert posted a 0.33 ERA over 21 innings, and the Chipley, Florida, native had a 2-1 record over the weekend and batters hit only .127 against her.



# THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
