2018 (Fr.): Redshirted ... Took over the place-kicking duties for the final 4 games of the season ... Was 18-for-18 on PATs and 3-for-3 on field goal attempts ... Converted a 50-yard field goal versus South Dakota State and a 42-yarder versus Western Illinois.

PREP: One of 10 kickers nationwide nominated for the 2017 Chris Sailer Kicking Award ... Made 19-of-24 field goals as a senior, including five kicks from beyond 40 yards ... Twice made a career-long field goal of 48 yards ... Converted 46-of-51 PATs ... 2017 Most Valuable Player at the BCAA All-Star Game ... Also played soccer.

Appeared in 32 games for the Trojans, totaling 2,107 all-purpose yards ... Has 656 rushing yards on 107 carries, nearly 400 receiving yards on 38 receptions and 1,097 kickoff return yards with one TD ... Graduated from Troy in May 2020.

2016 All-Sun Belt First Team (Return Specialist)

2020: Did not compete.

2019 (R-Junior): Played in eight games ... Rushed for 146 yards and a pair of touchdowns on 33 carries and added 10 receptions for 90 yards in eight games; missed four games due to injury ... Posted a season-high 37 yards on six

carries in Troy's win against Georgia Southern ... Found the end zone against Coastal Carolina and Texas State ... Caught three passes against South Alabama and posted a season-best 46 yards on a pair of receptions at Texas State ... Averaged 24.2 yards on eight kickoff returns ... Returned the opening kickoff against Southern Miss 50 yards ... Led the Trojans (at least 10 receptions) averaging 11.1 yards after the catch .

2018 (R-Sophomore): Appeared in 13 games, including the Dollar General Bowl win over Buffalo ... Finished the season with 948 all-purpose yards, the 15th most in the Sun Belt ... Rushed 53 times for 371 yards, caught 22 passes for 235 yards and totaled 342 yards in the return game ... Averaged 10.7 yards per all-purpose play, the eighth best in the Sun Belt ... Ranked third in the league and 20th nationally at 7.0 yards per carry (53/371) ... Recorded first career 100-yard rushing game with 140 yards on just five carries against Coastal Carolina (9/29/2018); helped Troy set the single-game school record with a team average of 9.1 yards per carry in the game ... Rushed for touchdowns against Boise State (9/1/18) and Coastal Carolina ... Caught two or more passes in seven different games with a high of four for 32 yards at Georgia Southern (11/10/18) ... Season-high 47 receiving yards at ULM (9/22/18) ... Would have ranked 27th nationally with his 25.31 kickoff return average if he met the minimum number of returns.

2017 (Sophomore): Played in the season opener at Boise State (9/2/17) ... Returned one kickoff for 16 yards and recorded one rushing attempt ... Received a medical hardship as he continued recovery from 2016 right ACL injury.

2016 (Freshman): Saw playing time in 10 games as a true freshman ... Finished the year with 139 rushing yards on 20 carries and six catches for 33 yards ... Led the Sun Belt and ranked 11th nationally averaging 27.9 yards per kickoff return ... Also returned one punt for 12 yards ... Took a 4th-and-1 at Clemson (9/10/16) 66 yards for a touchdown as Troy nearly knocked off the nation's second-ranked team (30-24); the run ranked as the longest in Troy's Division I history by a freshman and tied for the longest on fourth down in the country (rushing or passing)... Returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against New Mexico State (9/24/16) and blocked a punt against the Aggies that was returned for a touchdown; named the Sun Belt Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts ... The 100-yard kickoff return was just the 10th in Sun Belt Conference history, the sixth in Troy history and the third in Troy's FBS history ... Suffered a torn right ACL against Arkansas State (11/17/16) in the 10th game of the season.

PREP: Three-year letter winner at Escambia HS for coach Mike Bennett ... Finished his three-year career with 3,936 all-purpose yards, 38 total touchdowns and 27.7 yards per punt return ... Averaged 9.1 yards per carry in his career ... As a senior in 2015, earned Florida Class 6A All-State honors after rushing for 1,125 yards and 10 touchdowns on 116 carries (9.7 YPC) in eight games ... Also returned a pair of punts, one kickoff and one interception for a touchdown ... In a single game, recorded 496 all-purpose yards with five touchdowns (three rushing, one passing and one kickoff return) ... Played in the Subway East/West All-Star Game and was named the West Offensive MVP ... Also named to the *Pensacola News Journal* All-Area First Team ... Named to the Florida High School Football Panhandle Preseason Super 12 prior to his senior year.

Honorable Mention All-State and an All-OVAC selection ... helped Morgantown to a 10-3 record, advancing to the state semifinals ... as a junior and sophomore, second-team All-State and an All-OVAC selection ... also lettered in basketball.

PERSONAL: Born December 31, 1997 ... Son of Kathleen and Dale Wolfley ... Has three brothers – Stone, Jaden and Kyle – and a younger sister, Talley ... Father and brother Stone played football at West Virginia ... Father was a standout performer on the offensive line for WVU on the 1988 team that played for the national championship ... Uncle Ron Wolfley was also a former Mountaineer standout at fullback and for almost 10 years in the NFL, including four years as an NFL Pro Bowl selection ... Grandfather Ray Mansfield started at the University of Washington and played 14 years in the NFL, including 13 with the Pittsburgh Steelers.
