UWF FACES FINAL ROAD TEST OF REGULAR-SEASON

• The fourth-ranked UWF football team travels to 21st-ranked West Alabama this week as it faces a tough 2-game stretch to end the regular season. Kickoff at Tiger Stadium in Livingston, Ala. is at 1 p.m. CT.

FOUR DOWNS WITH UWF

- UWF's offense ranks in the top 25 nationally in scoring offense (4th, 43.9), passing offense (8th, 324.8), total offense (9th, 469.2), first downs per game (24th, 24.8), third-down conversion (15th, 49.2%), tackles for loss allowed (1st, 1.1) and sacks allowed (6th, 0.5 per game).
- On defense, UWF ranks among the top 50 in rushing defense (46th, 117.1) and sacks (21st, 3.1).
- UWF is 42-18 all-time for a .695 winning pct. That would rank third among active Division 2 programs but UWF does not have the minimum 20 seasons of competition for inclusion - check back with us in 2037.
- UWF is looking for its tenth-consecutive road victory. The Argonauts are 26-9 (.743) all-time on the road. UWF & UWA are part of just five teams at 5-0 on the road in 2021, with only Shepherd at 6-0 ahead of them.

HERE ARE SOME MORE QUICK **HITTERS ON THE ARGOS**

- The Argos average 25.1 first downs per game which is second in the GSC.
- UWF has had at least one passing TD in 42-consecutive games & 57 out of 60 all-time games.
- UWF won a school-record 11-consecutive games prior to the loss to then-No. 12 West Georgia last month. The 30-26 loss also ended UWF's home winning streak at a school-record six.
- UWF is 13-9 all-time against ranked teams and is 10-4 on the road. This will be the third time UWA has been ranked at the time of the game, with both previous meetings coming in 2017.

UWF leads the GSC and ranks 21st nationally with 3.21 sacks per game. The Argos have had at least two sacks in six games.

Austin Reed has a 5.8 TD-to-INT ratio, which places him fourth in the country. His 3.6 passing TD per game are third in Division 2.

Shomari Mason leads the country with 8.59 yards per carry. Last week he ran for a career-high 170 yards on 12 carries for 14.9 ypc.

ABOUT UWF

- UWF enters week nine of the 2021 season at 7-1 and ranked No. 4 in the country and in the NCAA Super Region 2 rankings.
- The Argos average 43.9 points per game (4th nationally) on 469.2 yards of total offense, led by 324.8 yards through the air. Dating back to the national championship game in 2019, UWF has scored at least 35 points in eight of its last nine games, including a school-record sixconsecutive prior to the UWG game.

ABOUT WEST ALABAMA

- West Alabama is 7-2 overall and 4-2 in GSC play. The Tigers are 2-2 at home this season, having dropped their last two against Valdosta State and Delta State.
- The Tigers are ranked in the top 25 nationally in both total offense (15th, 453.1) and total defense (25th, 292.0). Their rushing defense is 26th in the country, allowing just 99.1 ypg behind one of the best defensive lines in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

- UWA leads the series, 3-2, having gone 2-1 in Livingston and 1-1 in Pensacola.
- UWF's victories came in 2017 in the NCAA Super Region 2 title game in Livingston and in the 2019 regular-season finale in Pensacola.

• Anthony Johnson, Jr. has two of the longest runs from scrimmage in school history - both at UWA - breaking off a 41-yarder in 2018 and a 40-yarder a year earlier in the playoff victory.

• The NCAA Division 2 Football Committee announced the second edition of the regional rankings this week & the Argonauts came in at No. 4 in Super Region 2.

SHINNICK BITES

- · Pete Shinnick was hired as the first head coach in program history on Feb. 2, 2014. The 1988 Colorado graduate is 42-18 in four seasons at UWF.
- He is 144-64 in his 19th season as a head coach, with previous stops at UNC Pembroke (50-24 from 2007-13) and Azusa Pacific (53-22 from 1999-2005).
- Shinnick was named the 2019 D2Football.com Division 2 National Coach of the Year and the 2017 AFCA & D2Football. com D2 National Coach of the Year. He was also the AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year in 2017.
- He is 13-8 all-time in the postseason -9-3 in the Division II Playoffs and 4-5 in the NAIA Playoffs while at Azusa Pacific from 1999-2005.

• Even before they played a game in 2016, coaches, administrators and fans across the Gulf South Conference footprint had a feeling UWF could be a major player in the league and region really quick. BIG PLAY OFFENSE

- UWF has had 56 plays of 20 yards or more, including season-highs of 13 at Delta State and 11 last week against Shorter. A total of 34 have been through the air, eight on the ground, eight kick returns, three punt returns and three intercep-
- David Durden leads the team with 10 big plays. Rodney Coates has nine and Ka'Ron Ashley has eight.
- The Argos average 25.5 first downs per game, with a season-high 30 against SW Baptist, one shy of tying the school re-

ARGOS #2 NATIONALLY IN YARDS PER PLAY

- · UWF's offense has always leaned towards the big play and 2021 is no exception. The Argonauts average 7.8 yds per play, which ranks second in the country and is on pace to set a new school record.
- Three times this season, UWF has set the single-game record for yards per play, putting up 8.3 at McNeese before 9.3 against Shorter two weeks ago and a monster number of 10.9 last week at MC.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE

· Along the lines of the previous note, when you average 7.8 yards per play, you are going to move the ball towards the end zone in a short amount of time. Last week, UWF's nine scoring drives averaged a season-best 1:53 per possession.

UWF #15 NATIONALLY IN 3RD DOWN PERCENTAGE

- One of the many recipes for success is UWF's efficiency on 3rd down, where the Argos rank 15th nationally and third in the GSC with a 49.2 pct. conversion rate. • The Argos are 29-for-57 on the season,
- converting a season-best 8-of-10 against SW Baptist and then 7-of-12 three weeks ago at NGU.
- UWF has been especially stout in the first and third quarters, making 7-of-11 (63.6%) & 9-of-14 (64.3%), respectively.

UWF BACKFIELD: NO VISITORS ALLOWED

Through eight games, UWF has allowed just four QB sacks for 35 total yards, But further inspection shows the starters have allowed just two QB sacks. The other two sacks have come with backups and on backup QB Wyatt Eget.
 Additionally, UWF has only allowed nine other tackles for loss for a combined 35 yards.

REED-ICULOUS SEASON FOR AUSTIN

• Sophomore Austin Reed took over as the starting quarterback in the second game of 2019 and led UWF to it's first national title, throwing for 4,000 yards and 40 TDs while amassing a 13-1 record as a starter. Those numbers earned the St. Augustine,

Florida native National and GSC Freshman of the Year.

- But the awards only tell part of the story. To say he got better as the season went along would be a huge understatement. In UWF's first nine games, he threw for 2,001 yards and 19 TD, before exploding for identical numbers of 2,088 yards and 21 TD in the final six games.
- In the national championship, he shattered both the UWF and NCAA Championship single-game records with 523 passing yards and tied both organization marks with six passing TD. He was 33-of-54 on the day with his completions tying the finals mark and his attempts setting a new top effort. He had 399 yards by half-time to break the previous yardage mark of 361 which had stood since 2002.
- Through eight games in 2021, he ranks 6th nationally with 315.9 passing yards per

- Reed and Shepherd's Tyson Bagnet are the only two players nationally to rank in the top 15 in passing yards per game, passing efficiency and points responsible per
- In the week two win over SW Baptist, he set a UWF record with a 210.72 passer rating, completing 20-of-26 passes for 257 yards while playing into the first drive of the third quarter. Last week at Mississippi College, he broke that single-game passer rating mark with a 210.79.
- He has thrown for over 300 yards four time in 2021, including the last three.
- As a senior at St. Augustine HS in 2017, Reed was the Florida Class 6A Player of the Year after throwing for 2,925 yards and 34 TD.

MASON A TOUGH LOAD TO BRING DOWN

- Sophomore RB Shomari Mason leads the UWF rushing attack, entering the UWA game with 696 yards on 81 carries. That breaks down to 8.59 yards per carry, which leads the country.
- · The North Fort Myers, Fla., native is ranked 20th nationally with 9 rushing TD, 48th with 7.5 points per game and 43rd with 87.0 yards per game.

JOHNSON SETS TD MARK

- · Senior RB Anthony Johnson, Jr. had three rushing touchdowns on five carries against SW Baptist in week two, tying his own single-game record set at Valdosta State in the 2019 NCAA Playoffs. The final score against the Bearcats pushed his career TD number to 16, moving him past Quentin Randolph (2016-19) into first place all-time at UWF.
- · He ranks second in UWF rushing history with 335 carries and 1,411 yards. Chris Schwarz compiled 413 rushes for 1,992 yards from 2016-18.

ARGOS RECEIVING CORPS AMONG THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY AGAIN

- UWF has had one of the top receiving groups in the country the past two seasons. This year the Argonaut wide receivers have averaged 21.1 receptions per game and 322.7 yards per game.
- · Senior Rodney Coates leads the team with 35 catches and 581 yards, to go along with six TD and 72.6 yards per game. He had a career day against Southwest Baptist, hauling in 126 yards on nine catches with two touchdowns, which earned him GSC Co-Player of the Week honors.
- Junior David Durden has been a force since transferring from Mercer two years ago. He had a dynamite debut against Mc-Neese this year, catching six passes for 172

yards and one TD, while running once for a 6-yard TD. He leads the team with seven TD receptions and also has 22 receptions for 490 yards and 22.3 yards per catch over six games. He has missed the last two games with an injury but is expected to return at West Alabama.

- Durden had at least one TD catch in the first five games, moving him into first place for consecutive games with a TD, passing three great Argo receivers Quentin Randolph, Anas Hasic and Ishmel Morrow who each had a catch in three-straight at one time in their careers.
- The Midville, Ga. native transferred to UWF prior to the 2020 academic year from Mercer, where he had 1,054 receiving yards and 971 return yards on 37 returns (26.2 ypr) in two seasons. He earned FCS Freshman All-America honors in 2018.
- Durden was a 20th Round draft pick by the Red Sox in the 2017 MLB Draft and played in 30 games for the GCL Red Sox.
- Grad student **Ka'Ron Ashley** had a career game against No. 12 West Georgia, hauling in 12 catches for 169 yards and three touchdowns. All three stats were the most by a receiver in the GSC this season and among the top 5 in UWF history.
- Ashley joined former Argo standouts Quentin Randolph and Anas Hasic as the only players to catch three TD passes in a single game.
- Freshman **Jared Smith** made his first career start two weeks ago week against Shorter, producing in a big way with four receptions, 116 yards and two TD all career-highs. The Enterprise, Ala. native has 11 receptions for 229 yards and three scores this year. His 20.8 yards per catch are second on the team.
- Junior Larry Rembert has quietly worked

his way into the top targets, coming into the UWA game with 321 yards on 17 receptions and four TD. Last week at MC, he was the latest Argo to put on a show, finishing with 184 yards on six receptions with three TD.

• Sophomore RB **Shomari Mason** has also gotten into the fold with the receivers, catching 16 passes for 162 yards (10.6 avg.) out of the backfield. Against West Georgia, he had a school-record six receptions by a RB.

games when the Argos failed to get a turnover. The team responded with two forced fumbles and recoveries at MC last week.

- Further inspection shows the Argonauts have gotten at least one turnover in 53 of their 60 all-time games. UWF is 39-12 when getting a turnover and 3-6 when unable to force a sudden change.
- The turnover prize for UWF is a navy blue Turnover Shield and was created by Defensive Coordinator Darian Dulin prior to the 2018 campaign. The round wooden disk has a large UWF logo on a navy blue background. The shield, which is a replica of what Jason and the Argonauts may have used in mythological times, is then signed in silver marker by the player(s) who had a hand in creating the turnover. New for 2021 is a metal trash can that is struck with a wooden sword in celebration.

UWF AMONG THE BEST AT FORCING TURNOVERS

- UWF is one of the best teams in the country at forcing turnovers. In fact, the Argonauts are one of just three teams nationally to rank in the top 20 each of the last three seasons in turnovers gained, joining CSU Pueblo and Winona State.
- Since 2017, UWF has 102 turnovers gained in 46 contests, averaging 2.2 per game.

CERRA STILL PERFECT

- Redshirt sophomore PK Griffin Cerra (pronounced 'Sara') had a nice debut for the Argos at Delta State, making five PAT & a 26-yard FG. He has since run his season totals to 29-for-29 PAT & a 4-for-4 on FG, making one FG in four games prior to last week at MC.
- Cerra transferred to UWF this season after three years at Southern Illinois. He was 47-of-48 on PATs and 5-for-6 on FGs with a long of 50 yards in 2018-19. He did not play in 2020.

ARGOS' ROAD SUCCESS CONTINUES YEAR AFTER YEAR

- UWF went 7-2 on the road in 2019. The seven wins tied for the highest total in Division 2 with Minnesota State's 7-0 mark.
- Following the Mississippi College win last week, the Argonauts are now 26-9 all-time on the road in their fifth season of play, including an 8-1 mark in 2017 when they tied Harding for the most road victories in the country.
- After a 2-4 road mark in the 2016 inaugural season, UWF has had a winning record away from home each year - 8-1, 4-2, 7-2 and 5-0.

UWF STRONG AT HOME... ESPECIALLY AT NIGHT

- UWF has enjoyed a winning record in three of its four seasons, amassing a 13-8 home mark overall. The Argonauts have been especially successful in night games (5 pm kickoff or later), going 10-2.
- After the 5-0 home record in 2019 and the 63-14 win over Southwest Baptist at Pen Air Field on Sept. 11, UWF had won a school-record 6-straight at home.

UWF VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Including this week's game against West Alabama, UWF has played 23 of 61 games against ranked foes - that's 38.6 percent of its history.
- By week 2 of their third season (2018), #10 Midwestern State was the eighth-consecutive contest against a ranked opponent for UWF. It was also the tenth in a stretch of 12 games for the Argonauts.
- Additionally, UWF had played 12 games (out of 28 up to that point) against teams ranked in the top 25 meaning that 43 percent of the program's games in its history had been against ranked opponents.
- UWF saw it's record 6-game winning streak against ranked opponents come to an end in a 30-26 loss to #12/15 West Georgia. UWF is now 13-9 all-time against ranked teams.

- Due to a variety of factors, UWF has two student-athletes that have been with the program since the practice season of 2015 Trent Archie and Rodney Coates.
- Two additional Argos have been around since the inaugural season of 2016 - Ka'Ron Ashley and Marcus Clayton.

UWF PICKED FIRST IN GSC PRESEASON POLL, RECORD 10 ARGOS NAMED PRE-

- UWF was picked first in a vote of Gulf South Conference coaches in the 2021 GSC Preseason Football Poll that was announced in August.
- UWF earned five of the seven possible first place votes and totaled 47 polling points. Valdosta State had the remaining three first place votes and was picked second with 45 points. Delta State, West Alabama, West Georgia and Mississippi College were bunched together in third through sixth, respectively. North Greenville and Shorter were at the bottom of the poll.
- UWF had a league-high nine student-athletes selected to 10 positions on the preseason all-conference team.
- On offense, five Argonauts were chosen, led by quarterback Austin Reed, wide receiver Rodney Coates, tight end Jacure' Jackson, and offensive linemen Jacob Bruce and Mike Dilla. The defensive representatives are Matthew Gotel on the line, Trent Archie at nickel back, and defensive backs D'Anthony Bell and Marcus Clayton. Jackson was also voted on special teams to the blocking team position.

UWF FOOTBALL HISTORY

September 4, 2011: Former UWF President Judy Bense announces the University will sponsor football with the first season of competition being 2016.

February 2, 2014: Pete Shinnick is announced as the first coach in program history, following an 8-year run at UNC Pembroke.

December 19, 2014: Division I transfers Blake McCall and Tyler Henderson announced as mid-year signees and the first student-athletes in program history.

February 4, 2015: First regular signing class is announced. 32 high school seniors sign to join the team in the fall. Mike Beaudry makes history as the first NLI received at 6:00 a.m. CT.

March 18, 2015: First practice held with 9 transfer studentathletes.

January 2016: Artificial turf field completed in University Park section of campus. It is later named Pen Air Field in recognition of the \$1 million gift from Pen Air FCU.

Fall 2015: UWF conducts four intrasquad scrimmages, with 3 on campus and 1 at Blue Wahoos Stadium before 4,000 fans.

April 16, 2016: More than 2,000 fans attend the first-ever Spring Game.

September 3, 2016: UWF defeats Ave Maria, 45-0, in the program's inaugural game.

September 10, 2016: UWF defeats Missouri S&T, 45-28, before a standing room only crowd of 6,288 in the first-ever game at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

October 2, 1016: UWF defeats 16th-ranked Florida Tech in the inaugural Coastal Classic at home for the first win over a nationally ranked team. The game was also televised nationally by the American Sports Network as the Division II Football Showcase Game of the Week.

October 6, 2016: UWF breaks ground on the University Park Center - a 32,700-square foot facility at the South end of Pen Air Field that will house the football locker room, a state-of-the-art weight room for all 15 intercollegiate sports, along with office space for UWF's Usha Kundu, M.D. College of Health and the Florida State University College of Medicine's Pensacola Campus.

April 29, 2017: Anas Hasic becomes the first NFL signee in program history, signing a free agent deal with the Kansas City Chiefs.

November 12, 2017: UWF receives a bid to the NCAA Division II Football Championship Playoffs, becoming the fastest D2 startup to reach the postseason in NCAA history.

December 15, 2017: UWF falls to Texas A&M-Commerce in the NCAA Division II Football Championship Game, ending the year ranked No. 2 by the AFCA & D2FB.com.

Summer 2018: UWF is listed as the preseason No. 1 team in the country by Lindy's and Street & Smith's in their college football preview issues.

August 13, 2018: UWF is ranked No. 2 in the AFCA Preseason Top 25.

October 13, 2018: Tenth-ranked UWF plays host to fourth-ranked West Georgia at Blue Wahoos Stadium. The game marks the first time the Argos have played a top-10 team at home and the first time they have played a home game featuring two top-10 programs.

Nov. 16, 2019: UWF defeats West Alabama, 48-37, at Blue Wahoos Stadium, completing the first-ever undefeated home season in program hiistory, while also securing the second NCAA Playoff berth in four years of the program.

November 30, 2019: Anthony Johnson, Jr. scores from a yard out with 6.9 seconds left to take down undefeated No. 1 Valdosta State, 38-35, in the NCAA Second Round for its second-ever win over a top-ranked team and snapping the Blazers' GSC-record 25-game winning streak.

December 7, 2019: UWF ends unbeaten Lenoir-Rhyne's 15-game home winning streak with a 43-38 win to win it's second Super Region 2 title in the last three years.

December 14, 2019: UWF finished 12-0 Ferris State's unfinished business with a 28-14 win in 33-degree, snow-covered Top Taggart Field to advance to the national championship game for the second time in four seasons as a program. The Argonauts forced a school-record tying six turnovers (which resulted in 18 points) while scoring the game's final 21 points.

December 21, 2019: 20th-ranked UWF defeated fourth-ranked Minnesota State, 48-40, for it's first national championship. Austin Reed threw for a UWF and NCAA Championship Game record 523 passing yards and tied both organization marks with six passing touchdowns. He was 33-of-54 on the day with his completions tying the finals mark and his attempts setting a new top effort. He had 399 yards by halftime to break the previous yardage mark of 361 which had stood since 2002.

September 4, 2021: Playing its first game as the No. 1 ranked team, UWF defeated Division I FCS McNeese State, 42-36, in Lake Charles, for its second win over a DI team in program hisory.

September 11, 2021: UWF hosted Southwest Baptist at Pen Air Field for the first-ever on-campus game in program history. A crowd of 5,463 saw the Argos score 63 unaswered points in a 63-14 win over the Bearcats.
