SCOUTING AUBURN MONTGOMERY

Auburn Montgomery received votes in the latest NFCA coaches poll released on Wednesday. With a 14-0 record, the Warhawks have been one of the best teams in the country, statistically. They rank first in Division II in stolen bases per game (4.29) and total stolen bases (60), fifth in ERA (1.22), and seventh in home runs (18) and runs scored (116).

AUM has been led by a handful of players, both at the plate and in the circle. Gia Martin has been one of the best freshmen in the GSC, ranking fifth nationally with 6 home runs and 11th with 19 RBIs. Allie Miller ranks second in the country with 13 stolen bases, behind only UWF's Teala Howard. And Molly Cobb has been outstanding at the plate, hitting .541 with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, and 10 walks against 3 strikeouts.

Alanna Goble and Bailie Barnes have thrown the most for AUM, sporting ERAs of 1.31 and 0.56, respectively. Goble has struck out 29 batters over 32.0 innings, and Barnes has struck out 18 in 25.0 innings.

UWF is 5-3 all-time against AUM, sweeping the Warhawks in 2019 in Montgomery.

ALLY MERRILL HITS FOR POWER

Several UWF hitters have hit for more power than usual this season, but none have taken the steps forward that first baseman Ally

NEWS AND NOTES

Merrill has. Merrill has slugged .688 and hit .375, compared to career averages of .425 and .303, respectively.

A key contributor to the 2019 South Region Championship team and a starter for the last two seasons, Merrill has already set career highs in RBIs (12) and total bases (33) batting in the middle of the UWF order this season, and she has hit four home runs.

Merrill is also on a six-game hitting streak, batting 8-for-16 with two home runs, 16 total bases, a 1.000 slugging percentage, and a .571 on-base percentage, while walking twice as often as she has struck out.

GILBERT SPINNING GEMS

Pitcher Grace Gilbert has been outstanding in her last four outings, dating back to the series against Alabama Huntsville at home. She has thrown 17.2 innings with a 0.79 ERA, striking out 11 and issuing 3 walks, while opponents have hit just .190. Over her last four appearances, Gilbert's ERA has dropped from 4.57 to 2.93.

She was especially strong against Mississippi College on March 5, when she struck out six and allowed three hits in a dominant complete game shutout. She also spun five shutout innings against Spring Hill on Tuesday afternoon.

DOMINANT IN THE CIRCLE

West Florida's rotation dominated over the weekend against Mississippi College, posting a 1.00 ERA over 21 innings of work. The trio – Grace Gilbert, Kelsey Sweatt, and Montana Young – struck out 17 batters while walking just 4, and they held the Lady Choctaws to a .155 batting average.

Gilbert threw a shutout on Friday to open the series, with six strikeouts and just three hits allowed and no walks. Sweatt and Young followed suit on Saturday, combining for 11 strikeouts and a .163 batting average against them to take two more wins from MC. Sweatt started the day by striking out six and allowing only three hits, and Young struck out five with no walks over her seven innings of work.

THE EXCITING TEALA HOWARD

Teala Howard has been one of the top players in the country since she arrived in Pensacola in 2019. The junior from Lake Butler, Florida, is UWF's all-time batting leader (.467), ranks third in steals (89) and sixth in slugging (.579), and leads Division II in stolen bases this year (16). Howard also led DII in hits last season, and she tied the UWF single-season record for batting in 2019 (.464) as a freshman.

She is riding a 14-game hitting streak -- the third streak of at least 14 games in her career. She has hit .429 with 21 hits, 17 runs, a .481 on-base percentage, and 10 steals over that time -- all of which lead the team. UWF's third baseman also wrapped up an 18-game hitting streak at the beginning of the season that dated back to February 19, 2020.

NEWS AND NOTES

WILSON ON A ROLL

Senior outfielder Kara Wilson got off to a career-best start in 2020, and she has continued that hot streak into 2021. The Odessa, Florida, native is hitting .373 and leads the Gulf South Conference in total bases (43), while ranking second in doubles (6) and home runs (5). Her 43 total bases are the sixth-most in Division II, her 6 doubles rank 10th, and she is 15th in home runs and 15th in hits (22).

WE ARE RANKED

The University of West Florida softball team entered the National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll at No. 23 on Wednesday.

The rankings reflect games played through Sunday, after UWF swept Mississippi College. West Florida hit .299 and slugged .582 over the weekend, scoring six runs per game and walking nearly twice as much as they struck out.

UWF is one of three Gulf South Conference teams ranked in the poll, joining Valdosta State at No. 5 and Alabama Huntsville at No. 13, and Auburn Montgomery received votes. Additionally, South Region opponents Rollins (No. 7) and Saint Leo (No. 11) are ranked.

ABOUT LAST WEEK

The Argonauts dominated Mississippi College over the weekend, taking their second sweep in conference play this season. The pitching staff spun a 1.00 ERA over the weekend, while UWF hit .299 and slugged .582. The Argonauts also showed great patience at the plate, with 21 walks to go along with their 11 extra-base hits.

With the sweep, UWF is tied for third in the GSC with a 7-2 conference record. West Florida leads the league in doubles and home runs, and ranks second in runs and hits, offensively. The pitching staff is fourth in the conference in ERA (2.79) and opponent batting average (.232), while leading the conference in strikeouts (117).

THE HOMESTAND IS OVER

UWF wrapped up an 11-game homestand over the weekend and went 9-2 in those 11 games. The Argonauts were impressive in all phases of the game in that time, hitting .322 and slugging .573, with more walks than strikeouts. The Argos also hit 16 home runs and stole 21 bases over those 11 games, while the pitching staff struck out 75 batters over 74.2 innings.

Freshman Montana Young was excellent during the homestand, with a 4-1 record and a 2.00 ERA, striking out 32 and walking just 1 batter in 28.0 innings.



At the plate, Howard and Wilson stood out, among others. Howard hit .436, with 14 runs and 17 hits, and Wilson's 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 11 RBIs, and .788 slugging percentage were all team highs. Ally Merrill and Courtney McLellan also put together a strong three weeks of work – Merrill hit three homers and slugged .692, while McLellan hit .345 with three doubles, two home runs, and she drew five walks without striking out.

YEAR THREE FOR MCLEAN

Ashliegh McLean enters her third year as the head coach of the University of West Florida softball team. Her first two years have been noteworthy, to say the least -- she led the team to the NCAA Championship and 54 wins in 2019, before going 17-9 in the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

With a career 84-26 record, she has a better winning percentage through her first three seasons (.764) than any other current Gulf South Conference coach did in their first three seasons, with the exception of Eric Newell at Auburn Montgomery (.780), who started his tenure in the NAIA.

MONTANA YOUNG IS GETTING EVERYONE OUT

Freshman pitcher Montana Young has been impressive in the first month-and-a-half of her college career. The rookie from Slidell, Louisiana, leads the GSC in walks per seven innings (0.82) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (9.00), a category in which she also ranks 11th nationally. Young has appeared in 12 games -- the second-most in the country this year -- and also ranks 22nd in DII and third in the GSC in strikeouts (45).

Young has struck out 45 batters and walked just 5 over 42.2 innings of work, with opponents hitting just .238 against her.

WE ARE SLUGGING

UWF has hit for power in the past, it does not usually look quite like this. West Florida's current .520 slugging percentage would be the highest single-season mark for the program since joining Division II in 1994. UWF ranks third in the country in home runs (21) and fourth in doubles (33), fifth in hits (154), and 10th in runs (108) this year.

IN THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

With a 39-11 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.780) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 39 conference wins -- as well as their 84 total wins -- over the past three seasons are the most in the GSC.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player

of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
