Christian Brothers enters the weekend at 2-12 overall, but Argonaut fans will see a better CBU team than they have seen in the past. The Lady Bucs have pulled wins against GSC teams West Alabama and Montevallo so far, with some interesting offensive numbers.

Josie Bond, a freshman with multiple hits in three of her last five games, leads the team in batting at .385. Bond is one of three Lady Bucs batters with an on-base percentage over .400, joined by Elaina McGill (.468) and Ashley Dyer (.475). McGill, despite hitting .194 for the year, has drawn 16 walks -good for the seventh-most in the country. Dyer has drawn 12 walks and has been hit by 10 pitches this year, and CBU as a team has walked more than it has struck out.

It has been tough in the circle for CBU, with a team 6.61 ERA and a combined .385 opponent batting average.

UWF is 36-3 against CBU since 2003.

A LOOK AT LAST WEEK

UWF was the first team this year to defeat Auburn Montgomery, taking two of three from the Warhawks on the road and moving up to 9-3 in the Gulf South Conference this year.

NEWS AND NOTES

games against AUM and Spring Hill, and she, Jacquelynne Poling, and Ally Merrill each had three RBIs. Poling added three home runs over the week, giving her 10 for her career, which leads all active Argonauts.

The pitching staff put together a 2.76 ERA, with 26 strikeouts over 33.0 innings. The defense was sharp as well, with a .965 fielding percentage, and the Warhawks especially were stopped on the bases. AUM entered the series leading Division II in total steals (60) and steals per game (4.3). Over the three-game series, AUM went just 2-for-4 in stolen base tries, with Angela Agurkis and Brett Leiva each throwing out one runner.

PROFESSIONAL HITTER COURTNEY MCLELLAN

Courtney McLellan had another strong week, batting .429 with a double, a triple, a home run, and an .857 slugging percentage over five games. She also walked two more times and did not strike out, which is a common theme for her career -- McLellan has 24 career walks against just 13 career strikeouts, while adding 32 extra-base hits. She has taken a step forward offensively this season, with career highs in batting (.375), slugging (.696), on-base percentage (.453), and home runs (3).

THE 2020 SENIORS

UWF will be honoring the seniors from the Class of 2020 on Saturday, after the group lost its Senior Day and senior seasons due to the pandemic. The seniors who will be recognized are catcher Ashley McNally, outfielder Jibrasha Moore, and infielder Callan Taylor.

Moore and Taylor were part of the 2017 team that went to the NCAA Championship in Salem, Virginia, and all three were significant contributors to the 2019 GSC Champions that also reached the NCAA Championship. Over Moore and Taylor's four years with the program, UWF won 148 games and had a .759 winning percentage.

REMEMBERING 2019

A West Florida will also recognize the 2019 team during Saturday's double-header, with the team receiving championship rings for their efforts during that season. It was one of the best seasons in UWF softball history -- the team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 team ERA was the best since 2006, and the offense scored more runs than any UWF team since 2010.

ALLY MERRILL HITS FOR POWER

Several UWF hitters have hit for more power than usual this season, but none have taken the steps forward that first baseman Ally Merrill has. Merrill has slugged .649 and hit .333, compared to career averages of .426 and .296, respectively.

A key contributor to the 2019 South Region Championship team and a starter for the last two seasons, Merrill has already set career highs in RBIs

(14) and total bases (37) batting in the middle of the UWF order this season, and she has hit five home runs.

Merrill just wrapped up a seven-game hitting streak, batting 10-for-23 (.435) with three home runs, 21 total bases, a .913 slugging percentage, and a .500 on-base percentage.

GILBERT SPINNING GEMS

Pitcher Grace Gilbert has been outstanding in her last five outings, dating back to the series against Alabama Huntsville at home. She has thrown 24.2 innings with a 1.14 ERA, striking out 15 and issuing 6 walks, while opponents have hit just .211. Over her last five appearances, Gilbert's ERA has dropped from 4.57 to 2.79.

She was especially strong against Mississippi College on March 5, when she struck out six and allowed three hits in a dominant complete game shutout. She also spun five shutout innings against Spring Hill last Tuesday, before earning the win in the series-opener against Auburn Montgomery.

THE EXCITING TEALA HOWARD

Teala Howard has been one of the top players in the country since she arrived in Pensacola in 2019. The junior from Lake Butler, Florida, is UWF's all-time batting leader (.467), ranks third in steals (89) and sixth in slugging (.579), and leads Division II in stolen bases this year (16). Howard also led DII in hits last season, and she tied the UWF single-season record for batting in 2019 (.464) as a freshman.

She recently put together a 15-game hitting streak -- the third streak of at least 14 games in her career. She hit .415 with 22 hits, 18 runs, a .466 on-base percentage, and 10 steals over that time. UWF's third baseman also wrapped up an 18-game hitting streak at the beginning of the season that dated back to February 19, 2020.

WILSON ON A ROLL

Senior outfielder Kara Wilson got off to a career-best start in 2020, and she has continued that hot streak into 2021. The Odessa, Florida, native is hitting .348 and is fourth in the Gulf South Conference in total bases (45), while ranking third in doubles (6) and fifth in home runs (5). Her 45 total bases are the 18th-most in Division II

WE ARE RANKED

UWF moved up to No. 21 in the latest National Fastpitch Coaches Poll, released on Wednesday morning. The Argonauts jumped two spots in the poll on Wednesday after splitting a doubleheader with Spring Hill



and winning a series at Auburn Montgomery last week.

West Florida has been one of the top offenses in the country this year, ranking second in Division II in home runs (26), seventh in hits (171), and ninth in doubles (34). The UWF pitching staff has also been one of the better units in the conference, with a 2.78 team ERA that ranks fourth in the Gulf South Conference and a 2.07 ERA in the month of March.

The Argonauts are one of three GSC teams in the poll, joined by Valdosta State at No. 7 and Alabama Huntsville at No. 25, while AUM is receiving votes. South Region rivals Rollins (No. 5) and Saint Leo (No. 11) are also in the poll.

YEAR THREE FOR MCLEAN

Ashliegh McLean enters her third year as the head coach of the University of West Florida softball team. Her first two years have been noteworthy, to say the least -- she led the team to the NCAA Championship and 54 wins in 2019, before going 17-9 in the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

With a career 86-27 record, she has a better winning percentage through her first three seasons (.761) than any other current Gulf South Conference coach did in their first three seasons, with the exception of Eric Newell at Auburn Montgomery (.780), who started his tenure in the NAIA.

WE ARE SLUGGING

UWF has hit for power in the past, but it does not usually look quite like this. West Florida's current .509 slugging percentage would be the highest single-season mark for the program since joining Division II in 1994. UWF ranks third in the country in home runs (26) and 11th in doubles (34), fifth in hits (171), and 15th in runs (120) this year.

IN THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

With a 41-12 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.774) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 41 conference wins -- as well as their 86 total wins -- over the past three seasons are the most in the GSC.

UWF is third in the league with a 9-3 conference record so far this year, and they've gotten production from every part of the lineup. Teala Howard leads the team with a .395 batting average in conference play, and she, Mika Garcia, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kara Wilson have each hit multiple home runs against conference opponents. As a team, UWF is hitting .276 and slugging .591 against the GSC.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player

of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
