### SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE

The Lady Choctaws from Mississippi College come into the weekend with a 3-8 record, standing at 2-4 in the Gulf South Conference after falling to No. 9 Valdosta State in a sweep on the road. It is an uncharacteristic start for a normally very strong program.

Jordan LaFosse and McCall Lee have led MC offensively, hitting .394 and .344, respectively. LaFosse also leads the team in hits (13), doubles (4), RBIs (7), OBP (.459) and slugging (.606), and Lee is right behind her in each category.

Avery Sanders has been the ace in the circle for the Choctaws, with 46 strikeouts in 40.0 innings and a .191 batting average against. Those marks put her near the top of the GSC, though she has also walked 40 batters and has an ERA of 3.85.

UWF leads the all-time series against MC 19-5, and the Argonauts are 10-5 since the Lady Choctaws joined the NCAA in 2015.

### HOMESTAND SWEET HOMESTAND

The Argonauts wrap up an 11-game homestand this weekend, and it's been a good start. Over the last eight games at home, UWF is 6-2 and has hit .329 while scoring more than seven runs per game. More surprisingly, the Argonauts have slugged .571, with 15 doubles and 12 home runs during that time.

# NEWS AND NOTES

Teala Howard has led UWF in batting (.500), runs (12), hits (14), steals (7), and on-base percentage (.533) in the homestand, and Mika Garcia, Brett Leiva, Ally Merrill, and Kara Wilson have each hit two home runs. Garcia leads the team with 10 RBIs over the last eight games, Wilson has added three doubles, and Leiva is slugging a team-best .846.

## WILSON ON A ROLL

Senior outfielder Kara Wilson got off to a career-best start in 2020, and she has continued that hot streak into 2021. The Odessa, Florida, native is hitting .341 and leads UWF in doubles (3), home runs (4), and RBIs (12). Her four round-trippers lead the Gulf South Conference, and they are the sixth-most in Division II. She is also ninth in total bases (30), 16th in RBIs, and 20th in hits (15).

Wilson is on a nine-game hitting streak, dating back to February 13 against Hillsdale. Since then she has hit .333 with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 11 RBIs, and a .733 slugging percentage that leads the team over the last nine contests.

## ABOUT LAST WEEK

It was a busy few days for Argonaut softball, sweeping Spring Hill in a mid-week doubleheader before hosting No. 15 Alabama Huntsville on Saturday and Sunday.

The offense stayed hot, scoring seven runs per game and slugging .468. The Argonauts hit .295 as a team, led by Teala Howard and Brett Leiva, who each hit an even .500. Howard led the team with nine hits and five stolen bases, and Leiva slugged 1.100 with a pair of home runs.

Freshman Montana Young was sharp in the circle, with 22 strikeouts and no walks over a team-high 15.0 innings pitched, with a 1.87 ERA. She struck out 10 Spring Hill batters on Wednesday, across four innings of relief in the two games.

## SCORING IN BULK

West Florida has made a habit out of putting crooked numbers on the scoreboard this year. The Argonauts have scored 3 or more runs in 11 separate innings this season. This recent scoring output has put them second in the GSC in total runs.

## THE EXCITING TEALA HOWARD

Teala Howard has been one of the top players in the country since she arrived in Pensacola in 2019. The junior from Lake Butler, Florida, is UWF's all-time batting leader (.474), ranks third in steals (86) and fifth in slugging (.589), and leads Division II in stolen bases this year (13). Howard also led DII in hits last season, and she tied the UWF single-season record for batting in 2019 (.464) as a freshman.

# NEWS AND NOTES

She has at least one hit in 13 of 14 games this season and is riding a nine-game hitting streak. She has hit .484 with 15 hits, 14 runs, a .529 on-base percentage, and seven steals over that time -- all of which lead the team. UWF's third baseman also wrapped up an 18-game hitting streak at the beginning of the season that dated back to February 19, 2020.

## YEAR THREE FOR MCLEAN

Ashliegh McLean enters her third year as the head coach of the University of West Florida softball team. Her first two years have been noteworthy, to say the least -- she led the team to the NCAA Championship and 54 wins in 2019, before going 17-9 in the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

With a career 80-25 record, she has a better winning percentage through her first three seasons (.762) than any other current Gulf South Conference coach did in their first three seasons, with the exception of Eric Newell at Auburn Montgomery (.780), who started his tenure in the NAIA.

## MONTANA YOUNG IS GETTING EVERYONE OUT

Freshman pitcher Montana Young has impressed through the first month of the season, with 33 strikeouts and just 5 walks in 30.2 innings. Opponents are also hitting just .246 against the rookie from Slidell, Louisiana, which ranks 13th in the GSC. In Wednesday's doubleheader against Spring Hill, Young struck out 10 batters and did not walk any in 4 total innings of relief, and she struck out 22 with no walks over 15 innings and a 1.87 ERA over the last week.

## WE ARE SLUGGING

There has been a major power surge at the UWF Softball Complex. West Florida hit seven home runs in the series against West Alabama, while slugging .750 as a team and adding eight doubles, and they added another six doubles and two homers on Wednesday against Spring Hill. UWF's team slugging percentage went up more than 100 points during the series, up to .572 for the year. UWF was 33rd in Division II in slugging before the weekend series against UWA -- their .572 team mark at that time put them up to 15th in the country.

And while UWF has hit for power in the past, it does not usually look quite like this. Of course the season is young and things will change, but UWF's current .515 slugging percentage would be the highest single-season mark for the program since joining Division II. UWF ranks third in the country in home runs (16), fourth in doubles (22), fifth in hits (113), and eighth in runs (83) this year.

# IN THE RECORD BOOKS

## ARGOS AT HOME

Put simply, UWF likes playing at home. The Argonauts are 79-17 (.823 winning percentage) at the UWF Softball Complex since 2017.

Kelsey Sweatt and Grace Gilbert have been outstanding at the UWF Softball Complex, affectionately known as The Fork. Sweatt has a 1.85 ERA over 139.2 innings pitched, and Gilbert has spun a 2.22 ERA in 154.2 innings at home, with a career 23-4 record.

Gilbert is also hitting .357 at the plate, second behind only Teala Howard among active Argonauts. Howard is hitting .514 at the dish in her two-plus years at home, and Mika Garcia and Courtney McLellan have also hit well above .300 in Pensacola. Garcia is slashing .331/.382/.550 at home in her four years, and McLellan has hit .352 while slugging .539.

## IN THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

With a 36-11 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.766) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 36 conference wins -- as well as their 80 total wins -- over the past two seasons are the most in the GSC.

Even in the shortened 2020 season, West Florida was dominant in conference play. The Argonauts averaged more than 5 runs per game and hit .296 as a team, while holding GSC opponents to a paltry .169 batting average and just over 2 runs per contest. Teala Howard, Grace Gilbert, and Kara Wilson were outstanding against the GSC last year -- Howard hit .475 and struck out just once in 40 at-bats, Wilson hit .350, and Gilbert hit .359 while spinning a 1.50 ERA over 28.0 innings. Additionally, Kelsey Sweatt went 4-1 with a 1.43 ERA, with 41 strikeouts in 34.1 innings.

## PROTOCOLS AT HOME

University of West Florida athletics has increased attendance to 25 percent capacity for all softball home games. Each game is first come, first serve to the general public, with a set number of tickets to be held aside for Argonaut Athletic Club Booster members. AAC members can collect their tickets at the ticket window on gameday with their booster club card.

Gates will open 60 minutes prior to first pitch. Tailgating in the parking lot is not allowed, and, as a reminder, pets are not allowed. Face coverings and at least six feet of social distancing will be required. All other COVID-19 visitor compliance guidelines must be followed.

# THE ASHLEIGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

In her final three years as an assistant from 2016-18, the UWF pitching staff ranked in the top three in the Gulf South Conference in ERA (2.72), shutouts (32), opponent batting average (.241), strikeouts (822) and wins (119), and Argonaut pitchers have earned nine All-GSC or All-South Region awards.

In McLean's first season as a full-time assistant coach in 2016, her efforts led the UWF pitching staff to a 2.50 ERA and a .238 batting average against -- a major improvement from the team's 3.57 ERA and .264 batting average in 2015.

The staff improved even more on the way to the program's 2017 trip to the NCAA Championships in Salem, Virginia, posting a 2.49 ERA and .231 batting average against while recording a Gulf South Conference-best 15 shutouts.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned her masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

In 2016, Johansen helped lead ASU to 28 wins, which was the third-highest single-season win total in program history, and the Lady Hornets led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in team batting average (.321), runs scored (296), hits (482), doubles (92), and home runs (38).

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
