## ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida got off to a 2-2 start last weekend, going 2-1 at the Gulf Shores Invitational and dropping a home contest to Barry to open the season.

Teala Howard stood out for UWF, batting .500 (7-14) with a double, a triple, two stolen bases and three runs scored. Kayanna Perez hit an even .300 (3-10) and stole a base, and newcomer Jessica Ford led UWF with three steals and three runs scored.

Pitchers Jeya Prasad and Kelsey Sweatt turned in solid starts for the Argonauts and pitched to a 3.37 ERA over 27 innings of work with 24 strikeouts.

UWF got wins over Palm Beach Atlantic and Union, with Sweatt earning the victory in both. Prasad had streaks of dominance in both of her outings, against Barry and Union. She delivered three hitless innings of relief against Barry in the opener and went 6.2 innings with 9 strikeouts in a start against Union on Saturday. Sweatt was sharp against PBA, with just one earned run allowed over 7.0 innings.

West Florida is now 19-8 at the Gulf Shores Invitational since 2016.

## THE FLORIDA TECH INVITATIONAL

UWF will play four games over Saturday and Sunday at the Florida Tech Invitational in Cocoa, Florida, this weekend. It will be the first time the Argos have ever faced Bentley or No. 8 Saint Anselm, while Argonaut fans will no doubt be familiar with South Region opponents Barry and

## NEWS AND NOTES

Florida Tech.

West Florida is 16-16 all-time against Barry after the loss last week but have still won four of the last five matchups dating back to 2017.

UWF has more recent history with Florida Tech, having won the last four matchups with the Panthers. Two of those four wins came in the 2019 NCAA South Super Regional, where the Argonauts went 2-0 and finished off two late, come-from-behind victories to advance to the NCAA Championship in Denver, Colorado.

### CLIMBING THE CAREER LEADERBOARD

Four-year starters and seniors Teala Howard and Kelsey Sweatt have turned in outstanding careers with UWF. They each rank among or close to the top 10 in West Florida history in several categories.

Howard is the all-time leading hitter (.460) in UWF and Gulf South Conference history and she ranks in the top five in the program record book in stolen bases (103; 3rd) and slugging percentage (.587; 5th). The lefty is just outside the top 10 in UWF history in hits, runs, total bases, and triples.

Similarly, Sweatt ranks second in program history in hits allowed per seven innings (4.60) and is fourth in strikeouts per seven innings (6.66). She is also eighth in strikeouts (360) and winning percentage (.758), while standing just outside the top 10 in wins, with 44.

### SOME PRESEASON BUSINESS

Teala Howard and Kelsey Sweatt earned spots on the Preseason All-Gulf South Conference Softball team and UWF was selected fourth in the GSC preseason coaches poll. Additionally, the Argonauts have been picked 17th in the country, according to the NFCA preseason poll.

Howard started all 49 of UWF's games at third base, hitting .430, and she was a first team All-GSC, first team All-South Region, and an All-American in her junior season. Howard led the GSC in hits and batting average for third consecutive year, and ranked 7th in the country in hits (74) while ranking second in the conference in stolen bases (28) and runs scored (55), third in triples (3), fourth in total bases (99) and assists (89), and sixth in doubles (10). She is the GSC and UWF all-time leader in career batting average (.459) heading into her senior campaign.

Sweatt turned in some of the most dominant starts in the conference last season. Her work in the postseason earned her a spot on the NCAA All-South Regional Tournament team. The senior from Jacksonville, Florida, appeared in 30 games and made 21 starts in the circle last season, with a 16-5 record. She posted a 3.14 ERA over 129.1 innings, with 128 strikeouts and ranked second in the GSC in wins (16), fourth in strikeouts (128), opponent batting average (.202), and innings pitched (129.1), and was fifth in saves (2).

## NEWS AND NOTES

The Argonauts, who reached the NCAA South Regional Final last season and are coming off a 33-16 season, received one first-place vote and finished fourth in the preseason coaches poll. Auburn Montgomery was picked first, followed by Valdosta State, Alabama Huntsville, and UWF. West Georgia, Mississippi College, Montevallo, and Lee rounded out the top 8 teams in the league.

### WHO'S BACK?

West Florida brings back 13 letterwinners from the 2021 squad, including All-American Teala Howard and All-Region pitcher Kelsey Sweatt. While just six starters remain from last year's team, plenty of role players from last season are primed to contribute this year.

Pitcher Montana Young returns for her sophomore season after throwing to a 2.37 ERA as a freshman, while starting position players Angela Agurkis, Kayanna Perez, and Mallory Vining are also back in the blue and green this year.

Fellow returners include catcher Brett Leiva, infielders Chelsea Dumas, Kayla Mayo, and Madilynne Webb, and outfielders Kelsey Hodges, Morgan Zettle, and Laurynn Boggs.

### WHO'S NEW?

Head coach Ashliegh McLean brought in nine new faces to the program, which includes six true freshmen and three transfers.

The transfers include local pitcher Jeya Prasad, from West Florida HS and Florida State, Pensacola State College outfielder Jessica Ford, and Madelyn Vasquez -- a Milton, Florida, native who comes to the Argonauts by way of Southern Mississippi.

### THE CLASS OF THE GSC

With a 54-16 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.771) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 54 conference wins -- as well as their 106 total wins -- since 2019 are the most in the GSC.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### ARGOS AT HOME

Put simply, UWF likes playing at home. The Argonauts are 92-17 (.844 winning percentage) at the UWF Softball Complex since 2017.

Teala Howard is a career .502 hitter at The Fork, with 112 hits at home, and Kelsey Sweatt and Montana Young have been excellent in their home circle. Young posted a 1.32 ERA over 53.0 innings at home last season, striking out 54 batters against just 5 walks, and Sweatt has a 22-3 all-time record at the UWF Softball Complex, with a 2.03 ERA and 159 strikeouts.

### EARNING #100

UWF head coach Ashliegh McLean is in her third season at the helm of the program, and earned her 100th career win in the final regular season series of 2021. With a career 104-36 record, she has a better winning percentage through her first three seasons (.743) than any other current Gulf South Conference coach did in their first three seasons, with the exception of Eric Newell at Auburn Montgomery (.780), who started his tenure in the NAIA.

# THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51).

Teala Howard earned All-American status from the NFCA and D2CCA again, while she, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kelsey Sweatt, and Kara Wilson each picked All-Region honors.

McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee. Her 104-36 record through three seasons gives her a .743 career winning percentage -- better than any other current coach in the GSC through their first three seasons at their respective schools. The offense took another step forward in the 2021 season, setting program records in home runs (51) and slugging percentage (.494).

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

The Argonaut offense has taken big strides in Johansen's first three years with the program, setting UWF records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51) in 2021. In Johansen's first season with the offense in 2019, West Florida totaled the third-most extra-base hits, fourth-most total bases, and fifth-most doubles in program history, to go along with the third-best slugging percentage (.449) in the Argonaut record books.

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
