### ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida got the weekend off but took a trip to Mississippi College last Thursday. The Argonauts and Lady Choctaws split the nonconference doubleheader in a pair of pitching duels.

Kelsey Sweatt was handed the tough-luck loss, despite not allowing an earned run in her six innings of action. Montana Young struck out six and gave up just five hits and one run in seven innings, improving to 5-0 on the year.

While the offense was at a premium, the Argonauts came through with some timely at-bats. Teala Howard led UWF with four hits on the day, stretching her hitting streak to 11 games, and Madelyn Vasquez stretched her reached-base streak to 21 games.

### ABOUT AUM

The Warhawks from Auburn Montgomery have won seven of their last eight games, hosting Mississippi College, No. 24 Alabama Huntsville and No. 12 North Georgia. With a 21-6 overall record and a 9-3 Gulf South Conference mark, AUM stands in third place in the conference heading into the weekend.

Auburn Montgomery is a well-rounded team. The Warhawks rank in the top four in the GSC in hits, ERA, fielding percentage, home runs, and WHIP.

## NEWS AND NOTES

AUM, as usual, has some star power. Sophomore Gia Martin leads the league in RBIs (36), Kat Fallen's seven home runs are the third-most in the GSC, and Chloe Derrick has been one of the top freshmen in the conference this year. Their pitching staff has also been sharp, combining for a 3.03 ERA. All four of AUM's primary pitchers rank in the top 11 in the conference in ERA.

UWF leads the all-time series 8-4, and the Argonauts have thrown five shutouts against AUM in the last seven matchups between the teams.

### AN OUTSTANDING STAFF

UWF's pitching trio -- Jeya Prasad, Kelsey Sweatt, and Montana Young -- has been arguably the best in the conference this season. Prasad leads the GSC in opponent batting average (.144) and is second in ERA (1.49), Young is seventh in opponent batting average (.226) and eighth in ERA (2.55). And Kelsey Sweatt has continued an outstanding career, ranking fourth in the conference in opponent batting average (.209), second in strikeouts (70), third in wins (8), and 14th in ERA (3.18).

Those numbers have helped put Sweatt in the UWF record book. The senior ranks third in UWF history in hits allowed per seven innings and strikeouts per seven innings, and she is seventh in career strikeouts.

UWF is the only team in the league to have three pitchers with at least five wins, and the only team to have three of the top seven pitchers in opponent batting average.

### ARGOS AT HOME

Put simply, UWF likes playing at home. The Argonauts are 98-18 (.845 winning percentage) at the UWF Softball Complex since 2017.

It was a stellar couple of weeks at home for UWF to start the season. Angela Agurkis is hitting .467 with a 1.067 slugging percentage in the friendly confines, Teala Howard is hitting .542 in Pensacola, and newcomers Jessica Ford, Madelyn Vasquez, and Erin Moon have quickly made the UWF Softball Complex look like home. Ford has hit .526 and slugged .895 with five doubles, Vasquez is slugging .941 at home with a team-best 11 RBIs, and Moon is hitting an even .500 and slugging .786.

And it's been just as good in the circle -- Jeya Prasad has not given up a run in 12.2 innings at home, Kelsey Sweatt has struck out 21 in 16.0 innings, and Montana Young has posted a 1.70 ERA at the friendly confines, with 14 strikeouts over 12.1 innings and a perfect game against Shorter.

### A MADELYN VASQUEZ BREAKOUT

Sophomore Madelyn Vasquez has been one of the top hitters in the GSC and the country this season. She continued her tear through the conference at West Alabama with her best series yet -- she hit .417 and slugged 1.417 with four home runs and eight RBIs at UWA.

# NEWS AND NOTES

The Milton, Florida, native ranks 23rd in Division II with 8 home runs and is 16th in slugging percentage (.889). She also ranks second in the GSC in OPS (1.395), home runs (8), and RBIs (29), is third in slugging (.889) and fourth in on-base percentage (.506). She has also reached base in 21 consecutive games and has had multiple RBIs in 9 contests.

## JESSICA FORD'S OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Junior outfielder Jessica Ford has been on a hot streak through the Gulf South Conference, and she kept it going at West Alabama. A transfer from nearby Pensacola State, Ford hit .417 with three home runs and a double in the series in Livingston. Her final home run of the weekend turned out to be the game-winner on Saturday and was the second of three consecutive Argonaut homers in the seventh inning of that game.

Ford is hitting a blistering .474 in conference play and ranks only behind Vasquez in OPS (1.553) and RBIs (18).

## SLUGGING AS USUAL

It took the UWF offense a couple of weeks to heat up, but the lineup has been about as good as ever since the start of conference play. West Florida is slugging .688 in GSC action and is second in the league in slugging overall this season, at .514.

UWF's .514 slugging percentage would best the program record of .494 set last year. That is no surprise for an Ashliegh McLean-run team – in the four years that McLean has been UWF's head coach, the team has posted four of the top six slugging percentage marks in program history, including this season. Last year's team set the UWF record by slugging .494 and hit a program-best 51 home runs. The teams in 2019 and 2020 slugged .449 and .454, respectively, which currently rank as the fifth- and sixth-best slugging percentages in team history.

## RISP-Y BUSINESS

West Florida leads the conference in runs per game this year, scoring nearly 7 per contest. That fact makes the following less surprising: UWF is hitting .396 with runners in scoring position.

Naturally, the heart of the Argonauts order has been a big part of this. Jessica Ford leads the team with 10 hits in 19 at-bats with runners in scoring position, while Madelyn Vasquez is hitting .563 (9-for-16), and Angela Agurkis is hitting .583 (7-for-12).

Seemingly everyone has been productive in this situation. Even at the top of the lineup, Teala Howard is hitting .500 (7-for-14) and Kayla Mayo is hitting .357 (5-for-14).

# NEWS AND NOTES

## THE CLASS OF THE GSC

With a 66-16 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.805) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 66 conference wins -- as well as their 121 total wins -- since 2019 are the most in the GSC.

West Florida has hit a league-best .367 in 12 conference games this year, averaging 10 runs per game in GSC action. The pitching staff has been the best in the GSC in conference play, with a combined 2.76 ERA over 76.0 innings of work. The Argonauts pitchers hold a .191 opponent batting average in six conference games, 40 points better than Valdosta State, which ranks second at .231.

## IT'S A STREAK

West Florida wrapped up a 14-game winning streak at Mississippi College on Thursday, and the team could not be playing much better. The Argonauts hit .346 and slugging .641, with 23 home runs during the streak, and the pitching staff threw to a 2.69 ERA with 92 strikeouts in 91.0 innings of work, with opponents hitting just .188.

Madelyn Vasquez led the team in batting (.463), home runs (8), RBIs (25), and on-base percentage (.574), and four more Argonauts hit .400 or better.

## WE'RE RANKED

West Florida moved up another spot in this week's National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, standing at No. 11 in Division II. West Florida was one of three Gulf South Conference teams in the poll, along with No. 3 Valdosta State and No. 17 Auburn Montgomery. No. 9 Tampa and No. 25 Embry-Riddle are other South Region teams in the poll, and Alabama Huntsville received votes.

## TEALA AND THE RECORD BOOKS

Teala Howard has continued her climb in the UWF record book. The senior utility player holds the GSC and UWF all-time batting average record, at .459, and she ranks among the top 10 in UWF history in several other categories.

Howard is also fifth in career slugging percentage at UWF (.594) and is second in career stolen bases (119). A little farther down the list, Howard ranks fifth in program history in hits (255), seventh in runs (176), and 10th in total bases (330).

# THE ASHLEIGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51).

Teala Howard earned All-American status from the NFCA and D2CCA again, while she, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kelsey Sweatt, and Kara Wilson each picked All-Region honors.

McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee. Her 104-36 record through three seasons gives her a .743 career winning percentage -- better than any other current coach in the GSC through their first three seasons at their respective schools. The offense took another step forward in the 2021 season, setting program records in home runs (51) and slugging percentage (.494).

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

The Argonaut offense has taken big strides in Johansen's first three years with the program, setting UWF records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51) in 2021. In Johansen's first season with the offense in 2019, West Florida totaled the third-most extra-base hits, fourth-most total bases, and fifth-most doubles in program history, to go along with the third-best slugging percentage (.449) in the Argonaut record books.

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
