### ABOUT LAST WEEK

It was a rough weekend for UWF against AUM, but the Argonauts still stand in second place in the Gulf South Conference with a 12-3 record in the league. Teala Howard and Erin Moon led the team with a .333 batting average over the weekend, and Howard's four base hits were a team-best.

### ABOUT COLUMBUS STATE

Columbus State comes into Wednesday's doubleheader with a 16-14 record, having played one of the toughest schedules in the country. Holding a 7-2 record in the Peach Belt Conference, CSU took two out of three games in a series against North Georgia, but has had mixed results outside of conference play.

Hannah Rose Corbin has been an outstanding two-way player for the Cougars. She leads the team in batting (.382), doubles (9), slugging (.697), and on-base percentage (.561), and she's added also five home runs. In the circle, she has a 2.77 ERA with 118 strikeouts in 108.2 innings pitched.

Morgan Elston leads the team with nine home runs, and Caitlyn Canady ranks second on the team with a .327 batting average.

West Florida leads the all-time series 7-3 and has won five matchups in a row. UWF won the last meeting 7-1, in April 2021. The teams had not played each other since 2017 before that game.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### ABOUT MONTEVALLO

Montevallo started the season around .500 but has heated up lately. Following a tough stretch against Alabama Huntsville and Valdosta State, the Falcons won 10 out of 11 games, against Shorter, Union, Christian Brothers, and Georgia Southwestern. The team ranks fourth in the GSC standings with a 9-4 Gulf South Conference record.

Without question, third baseman Sierra Easterwood has been one of the best hitters in the country this year. Through the halfway point of the season, Easterwood leads the GSC in slugging (.904), OPS (1.359), home runs (11), total bases (85), and runs scored (31), while ranking second in the conference in RBIs (30), despite hitting in the leadoff spot.

Lauren Hamby leads Montevallo in batting, at .407, and the Falcons have hit 31 home runs -- good for second-most in the conference. Kaylee Hawkins, Mychael McMillan, and Mabry Norris have split time in the circle, combining for a 5.09 ERA.

Since Montevallo rejoined the GSC in 2016, UWF leads the series 9-6.

### IT'S A ROAD TRIP

West Florida will play its next seven games on the road, following a short, three-game homestand that came after eight consecutive road contests.

The Argonauts are 7-1 on the road this year, and the stats have been impressive. Kayla Mayo has hit a team-best .429 on the road, and Teala Howard and Madelyn Vasquez have stood out as well. Howard leads the team in hits (14) and steals (8) in road games, and Vasquez has slugged a very impressive 1.167 in eight road games, with three doubles, five home runs, and 12 RBIs.

### AN OUTSTANDING STAFF

UWF's pitching trio -- Jeya Prasad, Kelsey Sweatt, and Montana Young -- has been arguably the best in the conference this season. Prasad leads the GSC in opponent batting average (.153) and is second in ERA (1.65), and Young is 10th in opponent batting average (.242) and fifth in ERA (2.47). And Kelsey Sweatt has continued an outstanding career, ranking sixth in the conference in opponent batting average (.217), second in strikeouts (80), sixth in wins (8), and 14th in ERA (3.29).

Those numbers have helped put Sweatt in the UWF record book. The senior ranks third in UWF history in hits allowed per seven innings and strikeouts per seven innings, and she is seventh in career strikeouts.

UWF is the only team in the league to have three pitchers with at least five wins, and one of two teams to have three of the top 10 pitchers in opponent batting average.

## TEALA AND THE RECORD BOOKS

Teala Howard has continued her climb in the UWF record book. The senior utility player holds the GSC and UWF all-time batting average record, at .457, and she ranks among the top 10 in UWF history in several other categories.

Howard is also fifth in career slugging percentage at UWF (.593) and is second in career stolen bases (121). A little farther down the list, Howard ranks fifth in program history in hits (259), seventh in runs (179), and eighth in total bases (336).

This season, Howard leads the GSC in batting average, hits, and stolen bases, and she's led the conference in hits and batting average in each of her three seasons.

And keep in mind – Howard has done this about three years, having lost half of her sophomore season due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

## A MADELYN VASQUEZ BREAKOUT

Sophomore Madelyn Vasquez has been one of the top hitters in the GSC and the country this season. She continued her tear through the conference at West Alabama with her best series yet – she hit .417 and slugged 1.417 with four home runs and eight RBIs at UWA.

The Milton, Florida, native ranks 31st in Division II with 8 home runs and is 25th in slugging percentage (.817). Vasquez ranks third in the GSC in slugging, on-base percentage (.495), OPS (1.312), RBIs (29), and homers. She has also reached base in 24 consecutive games, or: every game since the second contest of the season.

## JESSICA FORD'S OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Junior outfielder Jessica Ford has been on a hot streak through the Gulf South Conference, and she kept it going at West Alabama. A transfer from nearby Pensacola State, Ford hit .417 with three home runs and a double in the series in Livingston. Her final home run of the weekend turned out to be the game-winner on Saturday and was the second of three consecutive Argonaut homers in the seventh inning of that game.

Ford is hitting an outstanding .426 in conference play, while ranking second in runs scored (18), third in RBIs (18), fifth in hits (20), sixth in slugging (.851), and fifth in OPS (1.351).

## SLUGGING AS USUAL

UWF's .477 slugging percentage would be the second-best in program history, behind only last year's record-setting .494. That is no surprise for an Ashliegh McLean-run team – in the four years that McLean has

been UWF's head coach, the team has posted four of the top six slugging percentage marks in program history, including this season. Last year's team hit a program-record 51 home runs. The teams in 2019 and 2020 slugged .449 and .454, respectively, which currently rank as the fifth- and sixth-best slugging percentages in team history.

## RISP-Y BUSINESS

West Florida has been one of the better offensive teams in the conference, averaging 6.5 runs per game. That fact makes the following less surprising: UWF is hitting .323 with runners in scoring position.

Naturally, the heart of the Argonauts order has been a big part of this. Erin Moon leads the team with 12 hits with runners in scoring position, and Jessica Ford and Madelyn Vasquez each have 10. Teala Howard, Angela Agurkis, and Laurynn Boggs are each hitting .400 or better with runners in scoring position, proving plenty of offense throughout the lineup.

## THE CLASS OF THE GSC

With a 66-19 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.776) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 66 conference wins since 2019 are the most in the GSC, and UWF's 122 total wins are the second most in the league.

West Florida has hit an impressive .330 in 15 conference games this year, averaging 8.5 runs per game in GSC action. The pitching staff has been the best in the GSC in conference play, with a combined 2.89 ERA over 97.0 innings of work. The Argonauts pitchers hold a .211 opponent batting average, 15 points better than Auburn Montgomery's .226.

## WE'RE RANKED

UWF was ranked 16th in the latest National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, released on Tuesday morning. West Florida is one of the more well-rounded teams in the GSC, ranking second in ERA (2.63), third in slugging percentage (.477), second in strikeouts (153), and first in opponent batting average (.205).

The Argonauts were one of three GSC teams in the poll, along with No. 3 Valdosta State and No. 11 Auburn Montgomery. Other South Region teams in the poll include No. 6 Tampa and No. 23 Embry-Riddle.

# THE ASHLEIGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51).

Teala Howard earned All-American status from the NFCA and D2CCA again, while she, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kelsey Sweatt, and Kara Wilson each picked All-Region honors.

McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee. Her 104-36 record through three seasons gives her a .743 career winning percentage -- better than any other current coach in the GSC through their first three seasons at their respective schools. The offense took another step forward in the 2021 season, setting program records in home runs (51) and slugging percentage (.494).

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

The Argonaut offense has taken big strides in Johansen's first three years with the program, setting UWF records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51) in 2021. In Johansen's first season with the offense in 2019, West Florida totaled the third-most extra-base hits, fourth-most total bases, and fifth-most doubles in program history, to go along with the third-best slugging percentage (.449) in the Argonaut record books.

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
