#### **ABOUT LAST WEEK**

West Florida put together another banner weekend against Shorter at home. It was a clean sweep for the Argonauts, who did not allow a run all weekend and picked up three run-rule wins over the Hawks.

The highlight of the weekend was, without question, Montana Young's perfect game on Saturday. More information about that milestone is below.

The team hit .418 and slugged nearly .700 while stealing eight bases and walking 12 times against just 7 strikeouts. The pitching could not have been better -- Young, Kelsey Sweatt, and Jeya Prasad combined to allow just five hits all weekend and struck out 18 Shorter batters over 17 innings of work.

#### **ABOUT CHRISTIAN BROTHERS**

Christian Brothers enters the weekend with a 5-11 overall record and is 1-2 in conference play, having picked up a win over Mississippi College last weekend.

Kendall Westbrooks leads the team offensively, batting .404 with seven doubles and a .673 slugging percentage. Mackenzie Puckett has been the top pitcher for CBU, holding a 3.84 ERA over 34.2 innings of work.

West Florida holds a 35-2 all-time record against Christian Brothers, having won each of the last 19 matchups.

## **NEWS AND NOTES**

#### **MONTANA YOUNG, PERFECTION**

UWF sophomore Montana Young was named the Gulf South Conference Pitcher of the Week, after throwing a perfect game against Shorter last Saturday.

Young, a native of Slidell, Louisiana, retired all 15 batters she faced on Saturday, striking out seven over five innings. Her perfect game was the first for UWF since 2015 and the ninth in program history.

This year, Young holds a 1.70 ERA with 14 strikeouts and just 1 walk over 12.1 innings of work. She also owns a 2-0 record, improving her career record to 10-5. She has not allowed a run over her last 10 innings, with 11 strikeouts in that time as well.

#### IT'S A STREAK

West Florida heads to Memphis riding an eight-game winning streak, and the team could not be playing much better. The Argonauts are hitting .365 and slugging .600, while scoring 7.5 runs per game over the last few weeks. Nobody has hit better than Angela Agurkis, who is batting .563 and slugging 1.250 with a pair of home runs and a team-best .682 on-base percentage. Erin Moon, Jessica Ford, and Teala Howard are all hitting .500 or better during the streak, and Madelyn Vasquez is batting .476 and leads the team with three home runs and 14 RBIs over the last eight games.

The pitching staff, to no surprise, has also been excellent. UWF has thrown to a 1.14 ERA over 49 innings with 45 strikeouts. Opponents are hitting just .151 against Jeya Prasad, Kelsey Sweatt, and Montana Young.

#### THE CLASS OF THE GSC

With a 60-16 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the best winning percentage (.789) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 60 conference wins -- as well as their 115 total wins -- since 2019 are the most in the GSC.

West Florida has hit a league-best .420 in six conference games this year, averaging more than eight runs per game over the last two weekends. The pitching staff has been the best in the GSC in conference play by far, with a combined 0.62 ERA over 34.0 innings of work. The Argonauts pitchers hold a .143 opponent batting average in six conference games, more than 30 points better than AUM, which ranks second at .178.

West Florida has covered the leaderboards in conference play through the first two weekends of action. Angela Agurkis is second in GSC play with a 1.333 slugging percentage, while Madelyn Vasquez (1.143; fourth), Jessica Ford (1.063; sixth), and Erin Moon (.917; seventh) are also in the top 10. Those same four, along with Teala Howard, each rank in the top 15 in the conference in on-base percentage, OPS (on-base plus slugging), and runs scored.

In the circle, Jeya Prasad, Kelsey Sweatt, and Montana Young are all in the top five in the league in opponent batting average, the top 10 in ERA, and tied for second with two wins in conference play.

#### AND SHE'S JUST A FRESHMAN

Freshman Erin Moon has started 12 of UWF's 14 games this season either behind the plate or as the designated player, and the rookie has gotten off to a hot start.

In her last four games, Moon's batting average has shot up 126 points, from .238 to .364, and she's driven in four runs and added two doubles and triple. Moon has a six-game hitting streak, batting .529 (9-for-17), with a pair of multi-hit games.

#### JESSICA FORD'S OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Junior outfielder Jessica Ford was on a tear against West Georgia, hitting .700 (7-10) with four doubles, five RBIs, and three runs scored. Ford had multiple hits in each of the Argonauts' three games, including a perfect 3-for-3 day on Sunday.

She had another big weekend against Shorter, batting .500 (3-for-6) with a team-best five runs scored and five walks. Ford slugged 1.000 over the three-game series.

#### PITCHING AND DEFENSE

West Florida has led the GSC in fielding percentage twice in the last three years, and the Argonauts top the conference again, with a .976 team fielding percentage and the fewest errors in the league, with 8.

The pitching staff has been one of the best in the conference in every category, leading the GSC with a 1.89 ERA and a .180 opponent batting average. The staff also ranks third in the GSC in strikeouts (83), despite ranking 12th in innings pitched this year.

The team's ERA ranks 24th in the country, while UWF's fielding percentage ranks 22nd. Additionally, West Florida ranks 8th in the country in WHIP (0.99) and 15th in shutouts (4).

#### A MADELYN VASQUEZ BREAKOUT

Sophomore Madelyn Vasquez broke out at the Florida Tech Invitational, hitting .385 over that weekend, and she has kept it up over the first two weeks of GSC competition. Vasquez ranks fifth in the GSC in RBIs (17) and doubles (5), seventh in slugging (.718), and ninth in OPS (1.186).

The Milton, Florida, native hit .500 (5-10) against Shorter over the weekend, with two doubles, two home runs, and a team-best nine

RBIs, with multiple RBIs in each game of the series. She hit .500 in the series against West Georgia to open GSC play, leading the team in runs (4), walks (4), and on-base percentage (.778).

Vasquez doubled in each game against Bentley and No. 8 Saint Anselm and hit her first career home run -- a first-inning, two-run shot to center field -- against Barry on Sunday of the Florida Tech Invitational.

#### FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK JEYA PRASAD

Jeya Prasad was named the Gulf South Conference Softball Freshman of the Week on February 15, and she has continued her strong start to the season.

She pitched 3.2 innings of relief to start GSC play, allowing just one hit and striking out 5, while earning the win in Game 2 against UWG. She turned in a complete game shutout against Shorter on Sunday – the first of her career.

Prasad has gotten off to an impressive start, leading the GSC in opponent batting average (.147) and WHIP (0.83), and ranking third in ERA (1.56).

#### **CLIMBING THE CAREER LEADERBOARD**

Seniors Teala Howard and Kelsey Sweatt have turned in outstanding careers with UWF. They each rank among or close to the top 10 in West Florida history in several categories.

Howard is the all-time leading hitter (.461) in UWF and Gulf South Conference history and she ranks in the top five in the program record book in stolen bases (111; 2nd) and slugging percentage (.587; 5th). The lefty is just inside the top 10 in UWF history in hits, runs, total bases, and triples.

Similarly, Sweatt ranks second in program history in hits allowed per seven innings (4.60) and is fourth in strikeouts per seven innings (6.67). She is also eighth in strikeouts (383) and winning percentage (.758), while standing just outside the top 10 in wins, with 47.

#### **WE'RE RANKED**

Following a sweep against Shorter at home over the weekend, UWF moved up to No. 19 in the latest National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, released on Tuesday morning.

## THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player

of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2C-CA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51).

Teala Howard earned All-American status from the NFCA and D2CCA again, while she, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kelsey Sweatt, and Kara Wilson each picked All-Region honors.

McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee. Her 104-36 record through three seasons gives her a .743 career winning percentage -- better than any other current coach in the GSC through their first three seasons at their respective schools. The offense took another step forward in the 2021 season, setting program records in home runs (51) and slugging percentage (.494).

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

## **ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN**

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

The Argonaut offense has taken big strides in Johansen's first three years with the program, setting UWF records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51) in 2021. In Johansen's first season with the offense in 2019, West Florida totaled the third-most extra-base hits, fourth-most total bases, and fifth-most doubles in program history, to go along with the third-best slugging percentage (.449) in the Argonaut record books.

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
