### ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida got back on track last week, going 4-0 against Spring Hill and Delta State. In a week where everything seemed to be clicking, the Argonauts hit .371, slugged .543, and stole 7 bases, and the pitching staff pitched to a 1.25 ERA.

The headline of the week was Kelsey Sweatt's no-hitter against Spring Hill on Wednesday, where she struck out eight batters over seven innings. And the two wins against DSU on Friday clinched a spot in the Gulf South Conference Tournament.

### ABOUT VALDOSTA STATE

The Blazers from Valdosta State currently lead the GSC standings, at 20-3, with a 28-7 overall record this year. VSU most recently dropped a very close series with AUM. Valdosta State took Game 2 with a run-rule victory but fell in Game 1 and Game 3, both in extra innings.

Valdosta State ranks third in Division II with 63 home runs and sixth in slugging percentage, at .573. It's a deep lineup, with eight starters hitting .300 or better and seven players with six or more home runs this season.

VSU has also been sharp in the circle, led by Samantha Richards. Richards leads the GSC in ERA (1.65), innings pitched (152.2), strikeouts (218), and wins (21).

## NEWS AND NOTES

UWF has a 9-7 record in the last 16 matchups with VSU, dating back to 2017, and the Argonauts are an impressive 9-1 against the Lady Blazers at the UWF Softball Complex since 2016.

### TEALA AND THE WATCH LIST

Senior third baseman Teala Howard has been named to the 2022 Schutt Sports/NFCA DII National Player & Pitcher of the Year Top 50 list, announced by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association.

This season, Howard leads the Gulf South Conference in stolen bases (28), ranks second in hits (59) and triples (4), fourth in batting average (.424), and eighth in runs (35).

In 37 games this year, Howard has 20 multi-hit games, and she has at least one hit in 33 contests. That is just more of the same for Howard, who ranks second in GSC history in career batting average (.451). The Lake Butler, Florida, native also ranks second in UWF history and fifth in GSC history in stolen bases (129), while ranking third in program history in hits and fourth in runs.

And keep in mind – Howard has done this about three years, having lost half of her sophomore season due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

### KELSEY SWEATT IS THE GSC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Kelsey Sweatt threw her second career no-hitter on Wednesday, in Game 1 of the doubleheader with Spring Hill. Sweatt also threw one against Hillsboro in 2021 and was a part of a combined no-hitter for the Argonauts in 2020, making her just the sixth pitcher in program history to play a part in at least three no-hitters in her career.

In all last week, Sweatt struck out 16 batters in 14 innings of work, holding opponents to a .152 batting average while going 2-0 in the circle.

This year, Sweatt ranks second in the GSC in strikeouts (113), fourth in wins (11), fifth in innings pitched (119.2), and sixth in opponent batting average (.218). She and Montana Young (10 wins) make UWF one of two teams in the conference to have two pitchers with at least 10 victories. Sweatt has had a career full of accolades at West Florida, earning first team All-GSC and All-South Region honors twice and ranking in the top six in UWF history in strikeouts, hits allowed per seven innings, and strikeouts per seven innings.

### JESSICA FORD'S OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Jessica Ford kept up her blistering pace in Gulf South Conference play last week, hitting .500 with three doubles, a home run, and four runs scored. Her work in the series against Delta State went about as well as it could -- Ford went 5-6 with three doubles, a home run, and two walks, as she reached base 7 times in 8 trips to the plate.

Ford is now hitting .397 and slugging .795 in GSC play, with six home runs and nine doubles.

### THIS SENIOR CLASS

West Florida will celebrate Senior Day on Sunday, before the series finale with Valdosta State. This year's class includes, Angela Agurkis, Teala Howard, Kelsey Sweatt, and Morgan Zettle.

Over the last four seasons, this class has won 130 games and has a .763 winning percentage in GSC action -- both of which are good for second place among teams in the conference. The class also helped lead UWF to a conference championship, a South Region title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver in 2019.

### CHECK OUT ERIN MOON

Freshman catcher Erin Moon has turned in a great rookie campaign, ranking second on the team with a .358 batting average and slugging .450 with eight doubles. The rookie from Jacksonville, Florida, has been even better in conference play, slashing .391/.419/.507 in 21 games.

She continued her hot streak over the weekend, batting .429 against Delta State and Spring Hill with a double and an RBI.

And Moon has been strong behind the plate, as well. She is one of five players in the GSC to have a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage and has thrown out base-stealers at the third-best rate in the conference, at 22.7 percent.

### AROUND THE LEAGUE

West Florida is in good standing with two conference series left to go, holding a 17-6 record in the league. That puts UWF a few games ahead of Alabama Huntsville and Lee, who are 15-9 and 14-9 in the GSC.

The Argos rank near the top of the conference in several categories, and those high rankings come in all three phases of the game. West Florida leads the conference in opponent batting average (.205), is third in ERA (2.87), third in stolen bases (73), fourth in slugging percentage (.475), and fifth in home runs (35). Defensively, UWF leads the league in fielding percentage (.965) and no team has allowed fewer steals than the Argonauts.

In the circle, Prasad, Sweatt, and Young make up the only trio in the conference to each rank in the top six in opponent batting average, and Sweatt and Young are one of just two pairs of teammates to each have at least 9 wins this year.

### WE'RE RANKED

Following a 4-0 weekend with wins over Spring Hill and Delta State, UWF has been ranked 20th in the latest NFCA poll, released on Tuesday.

UWF is one of three Gulf South Conference teams ranked in the top 25, along with No. 2 Auburn Montgomery and No. 7 Valdosta State. No. 11 Tampa and No. 21 Embry-Riddle also represent the South Region in the top 25, and Nova Southeastern and Rollins are receiving votes.

More important for postseason business, West Florida is ranked 10th in the first edition of the NCAA South Region Rankings, released by the NCAA on Wednesday. Auburn Montgomery, Tampa, Valdosta State, and Nova Southeastern make up the first four spots in the regional rankings. They are followed by Embry-Riddle, Alabama Huntsville, Rollins, Mississippi College, and Saint Leo.

The regional rankings decide the field for the NCAA Tournament, which begins on May 12. The field for the South Regional consists of the conference champions from the Gulf South Conference, the Sunshine State Conference, and the SIAC, and five more at-large selections.

### SLUGGING AS USUAL

UWF's .475 slugging percentage would be the third-best in program history, behind only last year's record-setting .494 and the .476 slugging percentage by the record-setting 2005 club.

That is no surprise for an Ashliegh McLean-run team – in the four years that McLean has been UWF's head coach, the team has posted four of the top six slugging percentage marks in program history. This year's team also ranks eighth in home runs already, with 35. Those 35 dingers are just five away from a top-four mark in program history.

Last year's team hit a program-record 51 home runs. The teams in 2019 and 2020 slugged .449 and .454, respectively, which currently rank as the fifth- and sixth-best slugging percentages in team history.

# THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant at UWF, and her first season has been nothing short of incredible.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade. The team's 54 wins were the most for the program since 2005, their 1.80 ERA was the best since 2006, and their 5.6 runs per game were the most since 2010.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51).

Teala Howard earned All-American status from the NFCA and D2CCA again, while she, Courtney McLellan, Ally Merrill, Jacquelynne Poling, Kelsey Sweatt, and Kara Wilson each picked All-Region honors.

McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee. Her 104-36 record through three seasons gives her a .743 career winning percentage -- better than any other current coach in the GSC through their first three seasons at their respective schools. The offense took another step forward in the 2021 season, setting program records in home runs (51) and slugging percentage (.494).

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

## ASSISTANT COACH EMMA JOHANSEN

Emma Johansen joined the West Florida softball staff in July 2018, after spending four years on staff at Alabama State in Montgomery.

The Argonaut offense has taken big strides in Johansen's first three years with the program, setting UWF records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51) in 2021. In Johansen's first season with the offense in 2019, West Florida totaled the third-most extra-base hits, fourth-most total bases, and fifth-most doubles in program history, to go along with the third-best slugging percentage (.449) in the Argonaut record books.

Johansen also helped coach ASU to its first SWAC championship, which helped clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Before ASU, Johansen served as the assistant softball coach for Auburn University at Montgomery and played a role in leading the team to the 2014 NAIA National Championship. In the summer of 2017, Johansen also coached the Swedish National Team in the European National Championships.
