ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida picked up a pair of wins over Flagler in last Saturday's home-opener, and they did so in exciting fashion. The Argos took a 3-0 win in Game 1, behind a dominant performance from Montana Young in the circle.

Game 2 was a different story. Trailing 7-2 in the bottom of the fifth inning, UWF rallied with two outs to score five runs in the inning, and freshman Emma Brice capped off the win with a walkoff home run in the eighth.

That was Brice's first home run of her career, and Young improved to 3-1 on the year after spinning 4.1 innings of strong relief in Game 2. Freshman Hannah Harper had multiple hits in both games, giving her four on the year.

SCOUTING UNION

The Bulldogs will bring a strong offense to the series this weekend, with a 7-7 record after starting GSC play with a 2-1 series win over Shorter last weekend.

Macey Neal has started the season on a tear for Union, ranking third in the nation in home runs (6), total bases (47) and RBIs (21).

NEWS AND NOTES

Riley Vaughn has led the Bulldogs pitching staff, with a 2.66 ERA and 35 strikeouts over 29.0 innings of work. As a whole, however, Union has a 5.65 ERA with a .315 opponent batting average.

UWF is 22-4 all-time against Union, having won nine matchups in a row. The Argonauts have also won 15 of the last 16 contests against Union, and took a 5-4 walkoff win at last year's Gulf Shores Invitational.

MONTANA YOUNG IS IMPRESSIVE

Junior pitcher Montana Young put together another strong start on Saturday against Flagler, shutting out the Saints over 7.0 innings of work. She followed that up with 4.1 innings of relief in Game 2, where she struck out six batters and allowed only two hits.

The righty has been sharp in her third season at UWF, with a 1.16 ERA over her last three appearances in the circle. She ranks in the top 10 in the GSC in ERA (2.66), opponent batting average (.231), innings pitched (28.2), and strikeouts (22) this year.

THE START OF GSC PLAY

West Florida has been among the class of the Gulf South Conference since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. In those four seasons, the Argonauts rank second in the conference in GSC wins, total wins, and winning percentage.

IT'S A GOOD DEFENSE

UWF has led the conference in fielding percentage each full season since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. It is no surprise that you'll see the Argonauts on top of the conference leaderboard again this year, with a stunning .984 fielding percentage.

That mark leads the GSC and ranks seventh in Division II early in the season. West Florida, with 195 putouts, has 15 more putouts than any of the four teams ahead of them and has only made four errors in the first 10 games of the year.

PICKING UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

Madelyn Vasquez is hitting a ridiculous .500 through the first 10 games of the season, leading the league in batting, ranking third in doubles, and eighth in hits.

That's more of the same for Vasquez, who was an All-GSC and All-South Region pick last season, after hitting 11 home runs and ranking second among UWF players with a .604 slugging percentage, 9 doubles, and 24 walks.

NEWS AND NOTES

A GOOD START FOR HANNAH HARPER

Freshman lefty Hannah Harper stood out in her first collegiate action, hitting a team-best .500 and in South Florida to open the season. Harper also impressed in the circle, allowing just one run to Palm Beach Atlantic over six innings.

And she put together another strong weekend at the plate against Flagler, batting a team-best .500. She ranks second on the team in batting (.448), hits (13), slugging (.517), total bases (15), and runs scored (6).

HOW ABOUT THIS PITCHING STAFF

The Argonaut pitching staff looked like a strength coming into the year, and Montana Young, Jeya Prasad, and Harper did not disappoint in Week 1.

The trio pitched to a 1.22 ERA that ranked second in the Gulf South Conference after a weekend of play, and their .215 opponent batting average ranks third in the league.

WE'VE BEEN PICKED FOURTH IN THE LEAGUE

UWF has been picked fourth in the Gulf South Conference preseason poll, and catcher Erin Moon was named to the preseason all-conference team.

Moon is one of two catchers on the preseason All-GSC team, along with Lee's Sidney Lee. Moon hit .358 as a freshman and earned All-GSC and All-South Region honors last season. She finished the season with 15 multi-hit games and was second in the league in batting average among catchers.

With 113 total points in the poll, West Florida is behind just Auburn Montgomery, Valdosta State, and Alabama Huntsville. The Argonauts were clear ahead of Lee, West Alabama, and Montevallo. Mississippi College, Union, West Georgia, Delta State, Christian Brothers, and Shorter rounded out the poll.

THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
