#### **ABOUT LAST WEEK**

West Florida got off to a slow start in Gulf South Conference play, going 0-2 at Union on a rainy weekend. The Argonauts played close in both games, holding a late lead in each.

Montana Young turned in another strong start in Game 1, throwing 6.1 innings while striking out three and allowing just two runs.

A few Argonauts stood out offensively, with Kayla Mayo and Madelyn Vasquez each picking up a pair of doubles. Mayo added three RBIs, while freshman Hannah Harper drew an impressive five walks.

#### SCOUTING DELTA STATE

Delta State brings extremes to the ballpark. The Lady Statesmen rank third in the conference in batting (.326), second in hits, and first in stolen bases, but they are also last in the league with a 7.82 ERA.

MyCala Helms is the leading hitter for DSU, batting .444 with 5 home runs, 17 RBIs, and 10 steals -- all of which are team-bests. Jenny Griggers is hitting .404, adding a pair of home runs.

Madison Jenkins and Lacey Coats are the top two arms for DSU.

### **NEWS AND NOTES**

#### **RISP-Y BUSINESS**

A few Argonauts have thrived this season with runners in scoring position -- Chelsea Dumas, Hannah Harper, and Madelyn Vasquez are each hitting well over .400 with runners in scoring position on the year, and Harper is hitting .550 (11-20) with runners on base.

Harper leads the team with six hits with runners in scoring position, batting .545, while Vasquez is 5-for-11 (.455) and Dumas is 4-for-9 (.444).

#### A GOOD START FOR HANNAH HARPER

Freshman Hannah Harper has stood out for the Argonauts in the first month of the season, leading UWF in batting (.452), on-base percentage (.553), and walks (6), while ranking second on the team in hits (14) and runs (6). She leads all GSC freshmen in batting and OBP.

#### MONTANA YOUNG IS IMPRESSIVE

Junior pitcher Montana Young put together a strong start against Flagler two weekends ago, shutting out the Saints over 7.0 innings of work. She followed that up with 4.1 innings of relief in Game 2, where she struck out six batters and allowed only two hits.

The righty has been sharp in her third season at UWF, with a 1.42 ERA over her last four appearances in the circle. She ranks in the top 10 in the GSC in ERA (2.40), opponent batting average (.239), innings pitched (35.0), and strikeouts (25) this year.

#### IN THE GSC

West Florida has been among the class of the Gulf South Conference since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. In those four seasons, the Argonauts rank second in the conference in GSC wins, total wins, and winning percentage.

#### IT'S A GOOD DEFENSE

UWF has led the conference in fielding percentage each full season since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. It is no surprise that you'll see the Argonauts on top of the conference leaderboard again this year, with a stunning .981 fielding percentage.

That mark leads the GSC and ranks 10th in Division II early in the season.

first month of the year, ranking among league leaders in batting (.447), OBP (.488), and doubles (7). The junior also has a team-best 9-game hitting streak and has a hit in 11 of UWF's 12 games this year.

That's more of the same for Vasquez, who was an All-GSC and All-South Region pick last season, after hitting 11 home runs and ranking second among UWF players with a .604 slugging percentage, 9 doubles, and 24 walks.

## WE'VE BEEN PICKED FOURTH IN THE LEAGUE

UWF has been picked fourth in the Gulf South Conference preseason poll, and catcher Erin Moon was named to the preseason all-conference team.

Moon is one of two catchers on the preseason All-GSC team, along with Lee's Sidney Lee. Moon hit .358 as a freshman and earned All-GSC and All-South Region honors last season. She finished the season with 15 multi-hit games and was second in the league in batting average among catchers.

With 113 total points in the poll, West Florida is behind just Auburn Montgomery, Valdosta State, and Alabama Huntsville. The Argonauts were clear ahead of Lee, West Alabama, and Montevallo. Mississippi College, Union, West Georgia, Delta State, Christian Brothers, and Shorter rounded out the poll.

#### YEAR 5 FOR MCLEAN

UWF has enjoyed great success under head coach Ashliegh McLean, who enters her fifth season at the helm. The Argonauts have totaled 15 All-GSC selections in McLean's first four seasons, and she was named the GSC Coach of the Year in her first season (2019). West Florida has also tallied 10 All-America honors, 23 All-South Region nods, and two conference and South Region Player of the Year awards.

And with a 75-24 conference record since 2019, West Florida holds the second-best winning percentage (.758) in league play among all Gulf South Conference teams. The team's 75 conference wins since 2019 are the most in the GSC, and UWF's 134 total wins are the second-most in the league.

## THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
