ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida has extended its winning streak to five games, after a doubleheader sweep at Spring Hill on Wednesday.

The Argonauts swept Shorter on the road over the weekend, hitting .392 and scoring 29 runs. Hannah Harper was named the GSC Freshman of the Week after batting .750 in the series with a pair of RBIs. Erin Moon hit two home runs and had a team-high five RBIs.

The pitching was strong at Shorter and even better at Spring Hill.

Montana Young highlighted the day with a no-hitter against the Badgers, and she and Jeya Prasad struck out 16 over 12.0 innings of work.

SCOUTING MONTEVALLO

Montevallo enters the weekend with a 10-16 overall record and a 4-8 mark in the GSC, having lost six straight to AUM and Alabama Huntsville.

The Falcons do have one of the strongest offenses in the league, ranking fourth in home runs (40) and slugging percentage (.543). Shelby Sloan (.423, 8 HR) and Taylor Robinson (.397, 10 HR, .926 slugging percentage) headline one of the most powerful in Division II.

NEWS AND NOTES

THAT'S GSC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HANNAH HARPER

Hannah Harper was named the GSC Freshman of the Week after the series with Shorter. Harper hit .750 in Rome, going 9-for-12 with four runs scored, a double, and two RBIs. She had multiple hits in all three games of the series, with a 4-for-4 day in Sunday's series finale.

The freshman also leads the Gulf South Conference in hitting, with a stunning .469 batting average. Her .522 on-base percentage is third in the GSC and 23rd nationally, and she is 10th in the GSC in hits (38). She has been even better in conference play, hitting .523 with a team-best 12 runs scored.

The rookie was moved to the leadoff spot in the Delta State series and that move paid off -- Harper hit .545, leading the team in both hits and runs for the weekend. In total, she's hitting a stellar .480 from the leadoff spot in the lineup.

WATCH OUT FOR KELSEY HODGES

Kelsey Hodges has been as tough as anyone to stop in GSC play, batting .469 and slugging .906 against the league. The senior from nearby Milton, Florida, wrapped up an eight-game hitting streak on Wednesday, during which she hit .481 (13-27) with six runs, three doubles, two triples, and a home run.

Hodges dealt with a bit of a slow start to the season, picking up her first hit on February 25 at Union. But since then, the outfielder has hit a blistering .410 and slugged .795.

CHELSEA DUMAS TOO

Infielder Chelsea Dumas has picked up the pace as well, hitting .419 in March with a team-best five stolen bases. She ranks second on the team with 11 runs scored this month, and she leads UWF in hits (13) and batting average (.520) with runners in scoring position this year.

Dumas has five multi-hit games on the year -- good for fourth on the squad. Her three three-hit games are tied for the team high, and she is hitting .414 in conference play.

ERIN MOON LATELY

It was a bit of a slow start for Erin Moon in the first few games of the year, but the sophomore has been a staple in the middle of the Argonaut lineup for good reason.

Moon has hit .400 in March, leading the team in doubles (6), home runs (2), and walks (7), while slugging .700 and scoring 10 runs. The catcher has hit .412 over the last five games, with a pair of home runs in the Shorter series.

NEWS AND NOTES

THE PITCHING LOOKS PRETTY GOOD

Jeya Prasad and Montana Young have gotten things back on track in the last five games, pitching to a combined 1.13 ERA against Shorter and Spring Hill. The duo has struck out 35 batters in 31 innings, with opponents hitting just .161 against them.

MONTANA YOUNG CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

Junior pitcher Montana Young spun her second career no-hitter on Wednesday at Spring Hill, striking out eight Badger hitters. It continued a dominant week for Young, who has thrown to a 1.43 ERA over her last 14.2 innings.

She was as good as ever on March 4, as she struck out a career-high 10 Lady Statesmen on the way to her second shutout of the year.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

UWF has done well with runners in scoring position this year, hitting .310 as a team. Chelsea Dumas (13-for-25; .520) has stood out, leading UWF in hits and batting average with runners in scoring position. Hannah Harper (10-21; .476) and Madelyn Vasquez (10-28; .357) each have the second-most hits in that situation.

IT'S A GOOD DEFENSE

UWF has led the conference in fielding percentage each full season since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. It is no surprise that you'll see the Argonauts right near the top of the conference leaderboard again this year, with a stunning .970 fielding percentage.

That ranks third in the league, and UWF has the fewest errors (19) among GSC teams this season and ranks second in stolen base percentage, as Erin Moon and Bella Holliday have thrown out 29.4 percent of baserunners this year. The catching duo has also thrown out the second-most baserunners in the league, with 10.

Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
