ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida took an important series win over Delta State, behind a dominant outing from Montana Young in Game 1 and explosive, timely offense in Games 1 and 3.

Young earned the win in Game 1, striking out a career-high 10 batters, and threw 2.1 innings of relief in Game 2. In all, Young posted a 0.95 ERA for the weekend.

West Florida hit .427 as a team, with eight extra-base hits. Hannah Harper (.545, 4 runs) and Madelyn Vasquez (.462, 4 RBIs) led the team with six hits apiece. Kayla Mayo went 5-for-11 and Erin Moon went 4-for-9, while Jessica Ford added three triples in the series and Chelsea Dumas went a perfect 3-for-3 with four runs scored.

SCOUTING ALABAMA HUNTSVILLE

As they often are, the Alabama Huntsville Chargers have been one of the strongest and most balanced teams in the conference this season. The team is in the top four in the conference in ERA, on-base percentage, scoring, shutouts, stolen bases, and walks, among other categories.

NEWS AND NOTES

Pitcher Katie Bracken has been one of the best in the GSC so far, with a 1.21 ERA and a .163 opponent batting average over 40.2 innings of work. She leads a staff that has posted a 2.80 ERA, leads the league in strikeouts, and ranks third in opponent batting average.

The Chargers return a few names to the lineup, including leading batter Lawren Hayes (.448; 11 stolen bases), Jada Henderson (.365; 2 home runs), and All-American Kaylee Vaught (.328; 16 RBIs).

A GOOD START FOR HANNAH HARPER

Hannah Harper has been on an absolute tear in her freshman season, batting a ridiculous .476 this year. Not surprisingly, that leads all freshmen in the GSC and is third in the league among all players. She also ranks third in the GSC in on-base percentage (.549) and leads UWF in walks.

The rookie was moved to the leadoff spot in the Delta State series and that move paid off -- Harper hit .545, leading the team in both hits and runs for the weekend.

MONTANA YOUNG IS IMPRESSIVE

Junior hurler Montana Young has put on a show lately, throwing to a 1.31 ERA with a 4-0 record in her last six appearances.

She was as good as ever on Saturday, as she struck out a career-high 10 Lady Statesmen on the way to her second shutout of the year. Young ranks in the top 10 in the GSC in ERA (2.15; 5th), opponent batting average (.235; 8th), innings pitched (42.1; 10th), wins (4; 7th), and strikeouts (35; 9th).

MADDIE TWO-BAGS

Madelyn Vasquez is hitting a blistering .451 this season, ranking seventh in the GSC in batting (.451) and third in doubles (8). The junior also has a team-best 12-game hitting streak and has a hit in 14 of UWF's 15 games this year.

That's more of the same for Vasquez, who was an All-GSC and All-South Region pick last season, after hitting 11 home runs and ranking second among UWF players with a .604 slugging percentage, 9 doubles, and 24 walks.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

A few Argonauts have thrived this season with runners in scoring position -- Chelsea Dumas, Hannah Harper, and Madelyn Vasquez are each hitting .500 or better with runners in scoring position on the year, and Harper is hitting .538 (14-26) with runners on base.

Harper (8-15) and Vasquez (8-16) each lead the team with 8 hits with runners in scoring position, and Dumas (6-11) is close behind, hitting .545.

IN THE GSC

West Florida has been among the class of the Gulf South Conference since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. In those four seasons, the Argonauts rank second in the conference in GSC wins, total wins, and winning percentage.

IT'S A GOOD DEFENSE

UWF has led the conference in fielding percentage each full season since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. It is no surprise that you'll see the Argonauts right near the top of the conference leaderboard again this year, with a stunning .976 fielding percentage that ranks third in the league. Only Auburn Montgomery and Mississippi College are ahead of UWF in the category, each with a .977 fielding percentage.

WE'VE BEEN PICKED FOURTH IN THE LEAGUE

UWF has been picked fourth in the Gulf South Conference preseason poll, and catcher Erin Moon was named to the preseason all-conference team.

Moon is one of two catchers on the preseason All-GSC team, along with Lee's Sidney Lee. Moon hit .358 as a freshman and earned All-GSC and All-South Region honors last season. She finished the season with 15 multi-hit games and was second in the league in batting average among catchers.

With 113 total points in the poll, West Florida is behind just Auburn Montgomery, Valdosta State, and Alabama Huntsville. The Argonauts were clear ahead of Lee, West Alabama, and Montevallo. Mississippi College, Union, West Georgia, Delta State, Christian Brothers, and Shorter rounded out the poll.

THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
