### ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida stayed hot at West Georgia, taking its fourth consecutive series win and stretching the team's good run to 9-2 over the last 11 games.

Erin Moon led the Argonauts with a .600 batting average, and she and Hannah Harper each had six hits. In all, UWF hit .408 in the series and continued a hot streak for the offense. In the last 11 games, West Florida is hitting .396, slugging .577, and has hit 11 home runs.

Montana Young was especially sharp in Game 1 of the series, striking out eight in a complete game shutout.

### SCOUTING AUM

It was a bit of a slow start for the Warhawks this season, but the team has been playing well lately, winning 12 of their last 15 game, including a win over No. 1 North Georgia on Tuesday.

The series history between UWF and AUM has been as tight as any two teams in the conference, with Auburn Montgomery holding an 8-7 advantage since 2017. The Warhawks swept UWF last year, but the Argonauts were 6-1 from 2019-21.

## NEWS AND NOTES

As usual, Auburn Montgomery is a well-rounded squad. The Warhawks lead the GSC in fielding percentage (.973), rank second in batting average (.340), third in hits, and fourth in both scoring (6.8 runs per game) and ERA (2.98). Chloe Baynes (.421 BA; 7 doubles; 11 SB), Molly Cobb (.407 BA; .568 SLG), and Allie Miller (.400 BA; 36 runs) lead a strong offense.

Morgan Ferguson and Avery Dickerson have been the top two arms for AUM this season. Ferguson is 9-4 with a 2.75 ERA in 94.1 innings, and Dickerson is 10-3.

### AROUND THE LEAGUE

West Florida has several student-athletes near the top of the statistical leaderboards in the GSC overall, but many Argonauts have shone in conference play.

Hannah Harper (.493) and Kelsey Hodges (.490) are the top two hitters in GSC play this season, and Harper's .568 on-base percentage is also tops in conference action. Madelyn Vasquez leads the league with 10 doubles in GSC games, and Erin Moon's 9 doubles rank second, while Harper's 33 hits are also second in the league.

### WE'RE PLAYING WELL

West Florida is one of the hottest teams in the conference, going 9-2 over the team's last 11 contests. To absolutely no surprise, both the hitting and pitching have contributed to the team's success.

In the last 11 games, UWF is hitting a preposterous .396 and slugging .577. The team has hit 11 home runs, despite having hit just three round-trippers in the first 21 games of the year. Hannah Harper has continued a remarkable freshman season, batting .512 during the stretch, while Erin Moon has hit .474 with two home runs and six doubles, and Kelsey Hodges has 12 RBIs to go with her .432 batting average.

And the pitching has stepped up as well. Montana Young is 6-0 over UWF's last 11 games, with a 2.31 ERA, 40 strikeouts and a .188 opponent batting average over 36.1 innings. Opponents have had an even tougher time hitting Jeya Prasad, who has a .174 opponent batting average and a 3-1 record in UWF's last 11 games.

### HANNAH HARPER... IMPRESSIVE

Hannah Harper was named the GSC Freshman of the Week after the series with Shorter. Harper hit .750 in Rome, going 9-for-12 with four runs scored, a double, and two RBIs. She had multiple hits in all three games of the series, with a 4-for-4 day in Sunday's series finale.

## NEWS AND NOTES

The freshman also leads the Gulf South Conference in hitting, with a stunning .471 batting average. Her .529 on-base percentage is third in the GSC and 32nd nationally, and she is sixth in the GSC in hits (49). She has been even better in conference play, hitting .493 with a team-best 21 runs scored.

The rookie was moved to the leadoff spot in the Delta State series and that move paid off -- Harper hit .545, leading the team in both hits and runs for the weekend. In total, she's hitting a stellar .479 from the leadoff spot in the lineup.

### WATCH OUT FOR KELSEY HODGES

Kelsey Hodges has been as tough as anyone to stop in GSC play, batting .490 and slugging .784 against the league. The senior from nearby Milton, Florida, wrapped up an eight-game hitting streak at Spring Hill, during which she hit .481 (13-27) with six runs, three doubles, two triples, and a home run.

Hodges dealt with a bit of a slow start to the season, picking up her first hit on February 25 at Union. But she has been one of the top hitters in the GSC lately, batting .440 with runners in scoring position and hitting .432 in UWF's last 11 games.

### ERIN MOON LATELY

Sophomore Erin Moon made a strong statement in her freshman season, earning All-GSC and All-South Region honors. It was a great season by any measure, and the Jacksonville, Florida, native has stepped up her game this year.

Moon is hitting .388 and is tied with Madelyn Vasquez for the GSC lead in doubles (15), while slugging .602. She has been even better during UWF's recent stretch, hitting .474 with six doubles and a pair of home runs in UWF's last 11 games. She leads UWF in doubles (6), slugging (.789), and walks (6), and is second on the team in batting, runs, hits, and RBIs in that span.

### THE PITCHING LOOKS PRETTY GOOD

West Florida has benefitted from strong pitching in the last few weeks, with a combined 2.60 ERA and a pair of shutouts in the last 11 games. Montana Young and Jeya Prasad are 9-1 since the Shorter series began, and they've held opponents to a .182 batting average in that time.



# THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
