ABOUT LAST WEEK

West Florida took a series win over No. 22 Valdosta State on the road last week, after splitting a doubleheader with Spring Hill on Wednesday. UWF went 3-2 during the week.

Kayla Mayo hit an absolutely blistering .692, going 9-for-13 with three doubles, three runs, and six RBIs. Erin Moon homered and hit .467, leading the team with seven RBIs, and the pitching staff threw to a 3.00 ERA, with 26 strikeouts and a .226 opponent batting average.

SCOUTING UAH

The No. 5-ranked Alabama Huntsville Chargers got the better of West Florida when the teams met in March, and UAH won 9 of its 10 GSC series this year.

UAH is near the top of the GSC in most categories, sitting in the top three in the conference in batting (.331), ERA (3.01), on-base percentage (.423), runs (328), and steals (95), among others.

Five Chargers hitters are batting .340 or better, including Kinley Adams (.426) and Lawren Hayes (.405), who rank fourth and tenth in batting in the GSC.

Freshman Katie Bracken leads the GSC with a 1.68 ERA and a .179 opponent batting average, having been one of the top arms in the South Region this year.

NEWS AND NOTES

IN THE GSC TOURNAMENT

West Florida will make its 25th appearance in the conference tournament, holding a 48-31 all-time mark in the GSC Championship. That gives UWF the third-most appearances and third-most wins in the tournament in the history of the conference.

UWF has also picked up fourth GSC Championships -- tied for fourth-most in conference history -- and has a .608 winning percentage that ranks third in the league.

GAP POWER

A hallmark of UWF softball since Ashliegh McLean took over the program has been a strong offense, and this year is no different.

West Florida's .323 batting average this season ranks second in program history, and the team's .462 slugging percentage ranks fourth. Additionally, the team's 82 doubles are UWF's most since 2019 (95) and rank ninth in program history.

In McLean's five seasons at the helm, the Argonauts have posted five of the top slugging percentages in program history, including the .494 mark in 2021.

HANNAH HARPER... IMPRESSIVE

First baseman Hannah Harper has been outstanding in her first collegiate season, leading GSC freshmen with a .426 batting average on the year. That mark ranks fourth in the league, and her 60 hits rank seventh.

She has been even better in conference play, batting .448 with a team-best .518 on-base percentage. She leads UWF in runs (29), hits (43), and total bases (55) in GSC action.

Harper was named the GSC Freshman of the Week after the series with Shorter. Harper hit .750 in Rome, going 9-for-12 with four runs scored, a double, and two RBIs. She stayed hot against Valdosta State as well, going 5-for-11 with a home run in Game 3.

ERIN MOON IS HITTING THE COVER OFF THE BALL

Sophomore Erin Moon made a strong statement in her freshman season, earning All-GSC and All-South Region honors. It was a great season by any measure, and the Jacksonville, Florida, native has stepped up her game this year.

Moon is hitting .394 and is tied the league lead in doubles

(17) this year, while slugging .591. Moon was one of the best hitters in the conference in April, hitting .451 with four doubles and 13 RBIs.

The sophomore just finished a 17-game hitting streak that ran from March 26 through last Wednesday, batting .473 with 8 doubles and 8 multi-hit games.

MAYO HEATING UP

Kayla Mayo was maybe the only hitter better than Moon in April. The Minneola, Florida, native hit .490 last month, leading UWF in hits (24) and doubles (9) in that time, while batting .471 with runners in scoring position from the No. 9 spot in the order. She raised her batting average nearly 80 points -- from .286 to .365 -- in April.

Mayo has been a four-year starter for West Florida all around the infield, and has come up with timely hits each season. This year, she's picked up game-winning or walkoff hits against Montevallo and AUM.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

UWF has done well with runners in scoring position this year, hitting .346 as a team. Chelsea Dumas (.500; 16-32) has been UWF's top hitter in those spots, while Erin Moon (.413; 19-46), Kayla Mayo (.391; 18-46), and Hannah Harper (.415; 17-41) have also stood out.

IT'S A GOOD DEFENSE

UWF has led the conference in fielding percentage each full season since Ashliegh McLean took over in 2019. It is no surprise that you'll see the Argonauts right near the top of the conference leaderboard again this year, with a stunning .964 fielding percentage.

The running game has been UWF's biggest defensive advantage this season, with Erin Moon and Bella Holliday behind the plate. The duo has thrown out more runners (21) than any other team in the conference, and the Argonauts lead the league in stolen base percentage (.611).

THE ASHLIEGH MCLEAN FILE



Ashliegh McLean was named head coach of the UWF softball program in May 2018, after four years as an assistant with the team.

McLean and the Argonauts had another 30-win season in 2022, marking the program's sixth in the last six full seasons. Teala Howard was again an All-American and All-South Region selection, while also earning South Region Player of the Year (D2CCA) and GSC Player of the Year honors. Kelsey Sweatt was an all-region and first team All-GSC selection for a third time, while Erin Moon, Madelyn Vasquez, and Montana Young earned All-GSC accolades for the first time in their careers.

The team hit 43 home runs, which is the fourth-most in program history and marks the first time that UWF has had 40+ home runs in consecutive seasons.

After a COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, the 2021 season provided more accolades and excitement for McLean and the Argonauts. With a 33-16 record, McLean lead UWF to its fifth season with 30 or more wins in the last five full years, and the 2021 squad set program records in slugging percentage (.494) and home runs (51). McLean also earned her 100th career win during the 2021 season, on May 1 against Lee.

It's tough to imagine a better possible start for the Argonauts during McLean's first year as head coach, as she led the team to a Gulf South Conference Championship, a South Region Title, and a trip to the NCAA Championship in Denver. The team also spent four weeks as the No. 1-ranked team in the country, on the way to earning the 1-seed in the South Region.

Awards flowed in for McLean and UWF, as Rhiannon Sassman, Teala Howard, and Kelsey Sweatt were each named All-Americans. Sassman was also the D2CCA South Region Player of the Year and the GSC Player of the Year, Howard was named the GSC Freshman of the Year, and Sweatt earned D2CCA South Region Pitcher of the Year honors, while McLean was named the GSC Coach of the Year -- her first such award and UWF's sixth.

West Florida finished the year at 54-11, and the team set the program record for fielding percentage (.977) and improved its record by 16.5 games. West Florida set several high-water marks this year, in many respects having the program's best season in over a decade.

McLean first joined the UWF coaching staff after spending two-years as a pitcher for the Argonauts softball program in 2011 and 2012. She started 39 games for the Argos in the circle and over 30 games in right field being a key utility player for West Florida and was listed as one of the GSC's top newcomers in 2011.

Originally from McKinney, Texas, McLean is the daughter of Kevin McLean and Sandy Ring and earned both her bachelor's degree and masters degree in Physical Education from UWF.
