Wolves Open 2019 at Catawba

» West Georgia head coach David Dean enters the 2019 season needing just two victories to become just the third coach in Gulf South Conference history with 100 victories. He has a career record of 98-33 entering his 13th year as a head coach and in three years at West Georgia, Dean has a record of 19-6.

» The Wolves have been to the NCAA Playoffs in four of the last five seasons. West Georgia was the sixth seed in 2014 and the top seed in Super Region 2 in 2015. UWG missed out on the playoffs with a 7-4 record in 2016, then was the sixth seeded team in 2017. Last year, the Wolves finished the regular season with a 10-2 record and were the second seed in the NCAA Playoffs.

» For the fourth-straight season, West Georgia was ranked in the preseason, by three publications. The American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) rankings came out this past week and the Wolves were ranked 15th in that poll.

» The matchup of West Georgia against Catawba in the season opener is happening for the third time in the past five seasons. The Wolves won 44-13 in 2015 in Salisbury, then took a 23-3 victory in Carrollton in 2016.

» Four seniors were named as the permanent captains at the end of fall camp. Quarterback Willie Candler and receiver John Hurst were named captains on the offensive side of the ball while Korie Rogers and Chad Price were named on the defensive side.

» West Georgia has 50 victories in the past five seasons, the most successful run of that span in school history.

» Five games are scheduled to be played on Ra-Lin Field in University Stadium in the 2019 season. The Wolves have three in the first two months of the season, then will close out the year with two home games in the final three weeks of the regular season.

» Saturday's game will be broadcast live on KISS 102.7 in the Carrollton area. This will mark the beginning of Mitch Gray's 39th season in the broadcast booth as the Voice of the Wolves. Outside of the Carrollton area, fans may listen to the game online via the Listen Live links on the Gradick Communications portal.

» Game times have changed this season more than in the past, as the Wolves will host two night games at University Stadium. Saturday's opener will be at noon in Shuford Stadium in Salisbury, NC, the first of two noon games. The other will be on October 5 against Shorter on Ra-Lin Field. The night games will bookend the season, as West Georgia will host Albany State in the home opener on September 21 at 7 p.m., then host Valdosta State at 7 p.m. on November 16 in the regular season finale.

» All of the preseason rankings are now out, and West Georgia appears in every one. The lowest of the four preseason ratings for the Wolves was in the most recent poll, as West Georgia was ranked 14th in the D2football.com media poll. The AFCA coaches poll put UWG at 15th, and Lindy's ranked West Georgia 18th. The Street & Smith's poll put head coach David Dean and his charges in their lowest preseason ranking at 24th.

HEAD COACH DAVID DEAN

By any measure David Dean's first two seasons as head football coach at the University of West Georgia were a success. Dean arrived in Carrollton in January 2017, on the eve of signing day, and led the Wolves to nine victories and a return to the NCAA Division II Playoffs. In his second season last year, West Georgia won 10 games and reached the playoffs for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

Were there up-and-downs, and some disappointments? Certainly, but from start to finish, Dean put his stamp on a veteran roster and veteran coaching staff. The result was a Wolves team back in the national picture in Division II football. A 9-4 record and a playoff spot came in year one under Dean, followed by a 10-2 record, top-five national ranking and the fourth trip to the NCAA Playoffs in the past five seasons came in year two.

Dean was no stranger to the Carrollton campus when he returned to UWG last season. He brought with him a resume that would rival any coach in the nation. As an assistant or as a head coach, David Dean and his football teams are winners.

A former wide receiver at Georgia Tech, Dean got his introduction to the wars of Gulf South Conference football in 1988 when he began a four-year run on the staff at Valdosta State. In 1992 Dean moved to Carrollton for an eight-year run on the staff at West Georgia. That stint included the first winning season at the Division II level, the first NCAA D-II Playoff berth, and the program's first two Gulf South Conference titles.

Dean departed UWG following the 1999 season, joining the staff of Chris Hatcher at Valdosta State. He spent seven seasons as the Blazers' offensive coordinator, a run that included the 2004 NCAA Division II Championship.

In 2007 Dean ascended to the head coaching post at VSU. He had to assemble a coaching staff almost from the ground up as all but one fellow staff member moved on. The results were positive as Valdosta State posted a 13-1 record and won the program's second national championship.

Five years later, Dean was back in the winner's circle again. This time the Blazers lost twice in the regular season, but they were untouchable in the playoffs, averaging 42 points a game during a postseason march to a second national title.

That second national title with the Blazers put Dean in rare company. College football has been played in the state of Georgia since the 1890s, and during that time only three football coaches in this state have won multiple national titles. Erskine Russell won three FCS crowns at Georgia Southern, while Paul Johnson followed him in Statesboro with a pair of championships of his own, and now it is also David Dean.

Dean's run as head coach at Valdosta State covered nine seasons. Beyond the two national crowns, his Blazer teams posted an impressive record of 79-27, including a mark of 42-19 in games played with the nation's best Division II conference, the Gulf South. His teams advanced to the NCAA Playoffs six times, and Dean's postseason head coaching record is 13-6.

The success of Dean's Valdosta State program resulted in numerous individual plaudits. He captured American Football Coaches Association Division II Coach of the Year honors following both national titles. He was also named 2007 Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports, AFCA Regional Coach of the Year, and GSC Coach of the Year in 2010.

Beyond his individual success, Dean's VSU players captured the highest of honors. His VSU teams had 18 Division II All-America selections, while 10 players signed National Football League contracts. Dean also coached three players who earned GSC Freshman of the Year honors, two league players of the year, and a national defensive player of the year.

Clearly, David Dean has been linked to success throughout his 30-year coaching career. At UWG or at UWG's biggest rival, the results are irrefutable: David Dean is a winner. His teams win and his program flourishes.

As Dean begins his first season at UWG, he is



following the most successful three-year run in the history of the Wolves' program. Few coaches have the gravitas to continue, and even increase that level of success.

Dean is a native of DeKalb County in the metro Atlanta area. He was born in Decatur, and enjoyed a stellar high school career for the Avondale Blue Devils. Dean arrived at Georgia Tech as a walk-on in 1982, but was awarded a scholarship the following season. He played wide receiver for the Jackets through the 1985 campaign.

Married to the former Stacie Stott, the Deans have three daughters: Caroline, Allison, and Natalie.

Year Three Under Dean

On September 7, West Georgia Wolves will enter the third season under head coach David Dean. UWG is 19-6 in the first two seasons with Dean at the helm, reaching the NCAA Playoffs in each of those seasons. This is the 13th season for Dean as a head coach, and he has eight visits to the NCAA Playoffs in his first 12 years. More impressive than that, no Dean team has finished with a record below .500.

National Rankings

For the fifth consecutive season, West Georgia is ranked nationally in the preseason. After a trip to the NCAA Semifinals in 2014, the Wolves were ranked in the top-10 for the bulk of the season, finishing the 2015 season in the top-10 after another trip to the semifinals. Last season, the Wolves were ranked as high as third nationally, and West Georgia opens the 2019 campaign ranked 15th in the AFCA preseason rankings.

UWG vs. Catawba History

Saturday marks the fourth meeting in the history of the series with West Georgia and Catawba. All games between the two programs have either started or ended the season. The first meeting came in 2000 in Salisbury, when West Georgia fell 28-24 in the first round of the NCAA Playoffs, ending the season for UWG. The last three meetings have been the season opener for both teams, as the two teams opened the year in 2015, 2016, and now in 2019 against each other. West Georgia holds a 2-1 lead in the series, with the Wolves winning the last two meetings.

On The Road

The Wolves will open the 2019 season as road warriors, as UWG will not play at home until September 21 against Albany State. That will be the only home game in the month of September for West Georgia, as the Wolves will take on Florida Tech the very next week in the 2019 Gulf South Conference opener for both teams. The Wolves will burn up I-85 for the first two weeks, taking on Catawba in Salisbury, NC followed by a battle with Limestone in Gaffney, SC in Week 2.

UWG Milestones

West Georgia senior quarterback Willie Candler is poised to rewrite the passing record book at West Georgia this season, but Candler is not the only member of the team in search of milestones this season. Head coach David Dean comes into the season with 98 career victories in his coaching career, needing just two wins to become just the third coach in Gulf South Conference history to win 100 career games.

The Magnificent Seven

The front seven for the West Georgia defense will be a tough nut to crack for opposing offenses. Within the front seven for UWG this season are three players with NFL Draft grades entering the 2019 season. Auzoyah "Big Z" Alufohai joins Chad Price and Korie Rogers with that honor. Alufohai transferred to UWG from Kennesaw State, while Rogers is in his third season after transferring from Clemson. Price is a homegrown talent, signing with West Georgia out of Brookwood high school in 2015. He redshirted in 2015 and began his playing career in 2016.

Wide Receiver Corps

Touchdowns No. 2 and 5 of the Willie Candler era as quarterback of the West Georgia Wolves went to Thomas Lester and John Hurst, respectively. That trio will be at the forefront of the UWG aerial attack in 2019. Candler has two receivers who have more than 1,000 yards combined and have been consistent targets for three seasons. Add in an All-American speedster in Laperion Perry and the Wolves have the ingredients for a tough passing game this season.

Rebuilt Secondary

The 2019 West Georgia Wolves may have the most experienced secondary in many years, but at first glance, that would not be the case. Six seniors are among the two-deep, including two players who are in at least their second season as a regular starter for the Wolves. Chris Blackston (SS) and Jakyron Young (CB) have a combined 26 starts between them, and three of the four other seniors have had extensive playing time at Division I institutions. Rishad Goode played at UWG two years ago and has returned from a one-year hiatus.

The Return Game

To return to the playoffs for a fifth time in six seasons, special teams will play a big role for the Wolves. Speed is prevalent on this team, but the return man with the biggest resume thus far is Laperion Perry, who was an All-American returner last season. He had two kickoff returns for a touchdown as a redshirt freshman and has the speed to carry the Wolves in that area. Add in senior transfer Quan Harrison, who was All-Southern Conference as a sophomore kick/punt returner for East Tennessee State.

Carrying the Torch

Devontae Jackson graduated, but waiting in the wings last season was true freshman Christian Royalston, who rushed for 453 yards and four touchdowns in his rookie campaign with the Wolves. West Georgia also picked up a solid transfer back in Eric Swinney, who most recently played at Ole Miss. Swinney played high school ball at GHSA power Sandy Creek, and will give the Wolves a big back this season. Freshman Rajaez Mosley enters the opening week of the season at second on the depth chart, followed by Chauncey Williams, a redshirt freshman who was the Class AAAAAAA offensive player of the year in the state at Meadowcreek High School.

Preseason Accolades

Last week saw the West Georgia Wolves ranked 15th in the AFCA Coaches' Poll, but this week brought more preseason honors. Korie Rogers, Laperion Perry, and Chad Price were each named Preseason All-American by D2Football.com. Rogers and Perry were named as All-Americans last season and Price was an All-Region performer. In the media poll released by D2Football.com on Tuesday, West Georgia was ranked 14th heading into the 2019 season.

Next Level Wolves

Alex Armah ('16) continues to be the standard for West Georgia players at the next level, as this weekend will begin his third year as the starting fullback for the Carolina Panthers. Marcus Sayles ('16) has been outstanding for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers this year, blocking two punts thus far. Malik Henry ('18) has been added to the San Francisco 49ers practice squad and Devontae Jackson made it to the final cut with the Denver Broncos. He is expected to sign with an NFL practice squad.

THE LAST MEETING

Sept. 3, 2016 - Carrollton, Ga.

Two of the top defenses in the nation met at University Stadium to open the 2016 season. Offense was there as well, but the two teams combined for just two touchdowns and four field goals in a 23-3 West Georgia victory.

UWG kicker Hunter Heck booted field goals from 22, 41, and 30 yards in the UWG victory, starting his senior campaign off with a bang. Devontae Jackson scored on a two-yard run with 16 seconds left in the first half to give the Wolves a 13-0 first-half advantage.

West Georgia's defense allowed just 235 yards of offense to the Indians, including just 95 on the ground. Catawba found the Wolves' front seven tough to break, as the Indians averaged just 2.7 yards per rush in the game.

Junior wide receiver Qa Walker had another huge performance against Catawba, scoring a touchdown in back-to-back years for the the Wolves against the Indians. In the 2016 game, Walker connected with Will Gardner for a 42-yard strike.

Defensively, the Wolves forced three turnovers, picking up interceptions from Marcus Sayles, A.J. Leggett, and Jeff Fulwood in the contest.

Sept. 7, 2013

The final season in the coaching tenure of Daryl Dickey begins with a 31-21 victory over Mars Hill in Mars Hill, NC. It was a day that would foreshadow two of the most successful players in the last 10 years. Marcus Sayles blocked his first collegiate kick and Alex Armah had 10 tackles to lead the UWG defense, both playing in their first game in college. The Wolves scored 17 of their 31 points on special teams and defense, as Mark Bard-enwerper kicked a 21-yard field goal, David Singleton returned a blocked punt for a touchdown, and Rocky Capobianco picked off a pass for a score. Quan Jones and Dallas Dickey each ran in for a touchdown to cap the scoring on the day.

Sept. 7, 2002

More than 900 yards of offense were produced on September 7, 2002, as West Georgia held off a late charge from the Presbyterian Blue Hose for a 37-35 victory to open the season. It was a heart-pounding way to open the Mike Ledford era, as the then Braves scored the game-winning touchdown with just under 10 minutes left in the game. The defense took over from that point on to hold on to the narrow lead and give West Georgia a season-opening win. Detronn Harris hauled in five passes for 101 yards, Frankey Iverson caught two touchdown passes and the defense provided a safety in the first quarter to give West Georgia the two-point victory.

Sept. 7, 1996

One of the biggest victories on the road back to prominence for the West Georgia football program came on September 7, 1996, as the then Braves picked up the school's first victory over Jacksonville State in Jacksonville, Ala. The Gamecocks had taken the first 16 meetings, but a solid defensive effort held Jacksonville to a just 10 points in a fairly lopsided 30-10 victory for West Georgia. Kevin Carroll had two touchdown runs and Jeremy Coates banged in three field goals to lead the scoring effort on the day.

Sept. 7, 1991

One of the most lopsided scores in school history opened the 1991 season, as West Georgia lambasted the Alma College Scots 55-0 on September 7, 1991. The then Braves came out in what seemed to be essentially a two-minute offense, scoring the first touchdown on a seven yard run from Kevin Fleeman just over two minutes into the contest. West Georgia never looked back from that point on, turning on the afterburners with 34 points in the second half. Eric Gomillion scored three times on the day, rushing 15 times for 123 yards in the win. Overall, West Georgia picked up more than 550 yards of total offense while allowing less than 100 yards to the Scots.

Sept. 7, 1985

The 1985 season opens in dramatic fashion for West Georgia, as the Braves traveled to Lynchburg, Virginia to pick up a 10-7 victory over the Liberty Flames. Both teams were Division II at the time, and the West Georgia defense was nasty on the day, allowing just 208 total yards in the win, including just 65 through the air. The win was the first in the head coaching tenure of Frank Vohun at West Georgia.

Willie Candler Watch

UWG quarterback Willie Candler enters his senior campaign in Carrollton poised to become the most prolific passer in school history. He already has the top efficiency ratings in school history and has no signs of slowing down in that category. He set the school single-season record for completions (205) and yards (2,786) as a sophomore and tied the school record for touchdowns in that year as well with 25. Last year, he set another record for completions with 215 and tied the record for touchdowns again. This year, he will be hunting the school career record in those categories. He needs just over 900 yards passing and five touchdowns to set records in those two categories.

Big Play Threat

There is a big buzz around the West Georgia football program with the return of Laperion Perry for his third year in Carrollton. The LaGrange native was named an All-American as a redshirt freshman last season after putting up huge numbers in the kick return game. Perry had two kickoff returns for a touchdown in his first full football season for the Wolves and piled up more than 1,000 all-purpose yards in the process. He will likely return kicks, punts and will start at the H receiver position this fall.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

Veteran Leadership

Two players have started each game of the last two seasons for the Wolves on defense, and those two were named one-half of the Wolves' captains for the 2019 season. Korie Rogers is the leading returning tackler for the Wolves at middle linebacker and is an NFL Prospect already this season after an All-American campaign in 2018. Chad Price has an outside shot at Dylan Donahue's sack record, but as a two-time All-Conference performer and an All-Region honoree in 2018, the staff knows what he can do, and he is poised for a solid season.

Hot Corners

A quick comparison of the 2018 depth chart to the 2019 chart would seem to be of concern without historical context. Senior Latrell Gibbs played the nickel position for the Wolves in 2018, but when he played at Appalachian State as a sophomore, he was fifth in Division I in the category of interceptions as a cornerback. When we last saw Jakyron Young in 2017, the Ocala native was intercepting a pass at Florida Tech to give the Wolves a victory in the final minute of the game. Young went on to be named Second Team All-GSC at the conclusion of that season, but has returned after a one-year hiatus.

Youth Steps Up

With six seniors in the secondary, the Wolves have experience on their side, but the starting lineup features a true freshman and a redshirt freshman as well. Jalen Bustamante, Deonte Overstreet, and

Offensive Line in 2019

West Georgia has produced an All-American offensive lineman in each season since the 2012 season, but this year will start off differently than in previous years. The Wolves return just one starter from a year ago in junior Ben Walters, who started every game. Three of the five starters played regularly a year ago, but Walters is the only returning starter. Starting right tackles Kevin Kwapis worked with the first unit early in the season in 2018, but his season was cut short due to injury.

Stable Backfield

Losing the best running back in school history would be a daunting task for most coaches, but head coach David Dean has a stable of young talent to turn to for the 2019 season. Leading the pack is sophomore Christian Royalston, who rushed 79 times for 453 yards behind Devontae Jackson in the 2018 season. Royalston scored four touchdowns last year and showed an outstanding burst of speed. Behind Royalston are freshman Rajaez Mosley, redshirt freshman Chauncey Williams, and Division I transfer Eric Swinney.

Historical Connection

The Wolves have two players on the roster who have Gulf South Conference greatness in their blood. Senior Tim McClain will be in the mix for playing time as a fullback and is the son of Tim McClain, who is in the UWG Athletics Hall of Fame as a linebacker. Rajaez Mosley is the son of former Valdosta State great Reggie Mosley. Rajaez is second on the depth chart at running back as a true freshman.

Nasier Currie-Sudler are the top three players at the nickel position and are all extremely talented freshmen. Starting at free-safety since Day 1 of spring practice in February is redshirt freshman M.J. Latimer. The College Park native's last action in a game was in the 2017 Class AA State Championship game, as he led the Hornets to a win in that game as a senior at Hapeville Charter.

The Year of the Return

This could be dubbed the Year of the Return for the UWG defense, as the depth chart for the opening game of the season features three defensive players who sat out during the 2018 season. Defensive end Deandre Gardenhire started eight games as a redshirt freshman in 2017, but was forced to sit out the 2018 season. He is back and will provide a tough 1-2 punch with Chad Price on the pass rush. Rishad Goode and Jakyron Young are the other two, and they will help hold down things in the secondary this year.

On the Front Lines

With three NFL prospects in the front seven, expect opposing offenses to have tough sledding against the West Georgia front line. Chad Price and Korie Rogers have solid experience at this level, but the coaching staff expects Auzoyah "Big Z" Alufohai to be a force in the middle. At 6-foot-4, 320 lbs, Big Z will make things difficult on teams to run in the middle. Try the outside and meet Gardenhire or Price on either side. Get past any of those three and the backs will have to contend with Rogers and Matthew Parker at linebacker.

For the first time since the 2015 season, there will not be someone named Jackson in the backfield for the University of West Georgia, as former All-American Devontae Jackson has moved on via graduation to the next level, spending the last five months with the Denver Broncos.

In the first year under head coach David Dean, West Georgia boasted the fifth-best rushing total in program history, rushing for 2,376 yards in 13 games. Year two in 2018 saw the Wolves come within a yard of that total, rushing for 2,375 yards in just 12 games.

The new mantle in 2019 will be taken up by a stable of young and capable backs. Christian Royalston was the backup in 2018 as a true freshman and won the starting job for 2019 in spring practice and fall drills in preparation for the year. Behind him is a trio of solid backs in Rajaez Mosley, Chauncey Williams, and Eric Swinney. Mosley is a true freshman from Valdosta, Williams is a redshirt freshman from Norcross and Swinney transferred to UWG after three years at Ole Miss.
