### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- It's a battle of ranked teams on Ra-Lin Field on Saturday as a pair of unbeaten teams square off in the GSC opener. West Georgia enters the game ranked 18th and Delta State is ranked for the first time this season at 22nd.
- Saturday marks the 35th meeting between the Wolves and Statesmen. Delta State leads the all-time series, 20-14, but the series is deadlocked 9-9 in games played in Carrollton.
- The Wolves improved to 2-0 with a 47-0 home win over Morehouse in week one. It was the first shutout for the Wolves since 2017.
- UWG's defense has been solid, allowing just 122 yards of total offense to Morehouse, but Delta State presents a big challenge for the Wolves as the Statesmen average 491 yards of total offense per game.
- Christian Royalston had a pair of touchdown runs in the Morehouse win, but only had 22 yards. The UWG running back corp had three rushers with over 60 yards in Semaje Banks, Tyray Devezin, and Rajaez Mosley.
- The Wolves defense had two more takeaways against the Maroon Tigers with Raekwon Chatman getting the first UWG interception of the season. West Georgia also had a fourth-quarter strip sack that helped preserve the shutout.
- The passing game also looked good as the Wolves played four quarterbacks in the blowout win. Harrison Frost was 18-for-30 with 273 yards and two more touchdowns, giving him 589 yards with five touchdowns on the season with just one interception.

### LAST MEETING WITH DELTA STATE

**November 9, 2019 • Parker-McCool Stadium • Cleveland, MS** - The Wolves were without the all-time leading passer Willie Candler on the road in game ten of 2019, and the Statesmen scored 14 fourth quarter points including a fumble recovery returned for a score to defeat West Georgia in Cleveland. Each team had three turnovers in the contest, and Delta State rushed for 254 yards while holding West Georgia to just 78 yards on the ground. Omar Cervantes kicked two field goals in the game and Garrett Bass had touchdown passes to John Hurst and Thomas Lester.

### MOVIN' ON UP

After cruising to a 2-0 record with a 47-0 win over Morehouse, the Wolves moved up and inside the top-20 of the AFCA Division II Coaches' Poll earlier this week, coming in at 18th. The Wolves are one of four GSC teams inside the top-25, joining top-ranked West Florida, number four Valdosta State, and this week's opponent, Delta State, who came in at 22nd.

### DOMINANT DEFENSE

Second year defensive coordinator Nate Masters has had unit looking extremely stout through two games, allowing less than 200 yards of total offense in back-to-back games. Against Morehouse, the Wolves held the Maroon Tigers to just 122 yards of total offense. The Wolves' defense ranks first in the GSC in total defense, allowing 158 yards per contest. That number is good for sixth-best in all of Division II. In terms of passing defense, the Wolves are atop the league and rank third in the country, allowing 57 passing yards per contest.

### NO SACKS GIVEN

If you're looking for an unsung hero of the UWG football team through two games, look no further than the entire offensive line. Not only have they paved the way for over 1,000 yards of total offense combined, they have yet to allow a sack. That's given time for Harrison Frost to throw for 589 yards thus far with five touchdowns and one interception.

### SCOOP OF FROST-ING

Junior quarterback Harrison Frost has been incredible in his first two games in the West Georgia red and blue. He ranks in the top 25 in all of Division II in passing efficiency (158.5), passing touchdowns (5), passing yards (589), passing yards per game (294.5), completion percentage (67.1), and completions per game (23.5). His longest pass of the season came last week against Morehouse as he connected with Quan Harrison for a 69-yard touchdown. It's the second time the duo has connected for scores this season.

### MORE FIRST TOUCHDOWNS

Just like in week one, there were a couple of first touchdown moments for the UWG Wolves last Saturday. Running back Tyran Devezin and wide receiver Za'Tarious Anderson both scored their first touchdowns of the season against Morehouse. For Devezin, the senior transfer, it was his first touchdown at UWG while Anderson's fourth-quarter touchdown grab was his first collegiate touchdown.

### ROYAL-STON RETURN TO RA-LIN

Playing in his first game at Ra-Lin Field since 2018, running back Christian Royalston had not one, but two rushing touchdowns. The Fairburn native only rushed for 22 yards but found the endzone twice in the blowout win, giving him six career touchdowns. Royalston missed most of the 2019 season with an injury, but as a true freshman in 2018, he rushed for 453 yards and four scores as the primary backup to former All-American and the all-time leading rusher in UWG history, Devontae Jackson.

### A THORN IN DEAN'S SIDE

Throughout the coaching career of David Dean, Delta State has proven to be a tough team for him to beat. Including his nine season at Valdosta State, Dean is 3-9 against the Statesmen and is 1-2 against DSU since coming to West Georgia. Even Dean's 2007 National Championship squad at VSU lost to Delta State.

### INSIDE THE SERIES

It's the 35th meeting between West Georgia and Delta State, and the 19th meeting in Carrollton. The series is deadlocked at 9-9 all-time in Carrollton, but the Wolves have only lost to Delta State at home once since opening University Stadium in 2009. One of those wins in Carrollton was over a top-ranked Delta State team in 2011 and in the last 10 meetings, West Georgia holds a 7-3 advantage.

### WOLVES IN SEPTEMBER

September continues to be a good month for West Georgia. Historically the Wolves are 86-60 all-time in September, including two September wins in 2021. Since David Dean took over prior to the 2017 season, the Wolves are 12-3 in September.

POSITIVE TURNOVER MARGIN

The UWG defense did good work in keeping the turnover margin positive as they forced two takeaways against Morehouse: an interception and a fumble recovery on a fourth-quarter strip sack. The offense did it's part as well, protecting the ball well without a turnover in 81 offensive snaps against Morehouse. The season turnover margin is +3 through two games.

GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE OPENERS

Saturday opens the Gulf South Conference slate for West Georgia, and arguably the toughest schedule maybe in the country. Under David Dean, West Georgia is 1-2 in Gulf South Conference openers. It's the fourth time in 38 years that Delta State has served as UWG's Gulf South Conference opening opponent, most recently in 2017. Delta State won that game in Cleveland, 17-7.

HALL OF FAME SATURDAY

Ten former West Georgia greats will be inducted into the UWG Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, with the 2020 and 2021 classes being inducted in a pregame ceremony and then honored on the field at halftime. Of those ten, six of them are former football players. All but one of those six, Jordan Ritchey, played on the 2014-15 teams that won back-to-back Super Region Two titles.

WOLVES-STATESMEN CONNECTIONS

- Starting center David Bodden and Delta State's Ty Goldsmith and Adrian Hill all prepped at Alabama power Hoover High School.
- UWG has a pair of Buford High School products in the lineback corp, Matthew Parker and Davin Bryant. Delta State's Innis Claud V prepped at Buford and was in the same class as Parker and helped Buford to a 13-2 record as seniors.
- Delta State's wide receivers coach, Marcus Windham is a former UWG graduate assistant. Windham was on staff of the 2014 team that beat DSU twice including a second round playoff win in Cleveland.

DELTA STATE SCOUTING REPORT

22nd-Ranked Delta State easily provides West Georgia its biggest test thus far as the Statesmen come in with a potent offensive attack led by junior quarterback Patrick Shegog. The Batesville, Mississippi native is fourth in the GSC in passing with 468 yards and six touchdowns. In the backfield, Rico Owens II is DSU's leading rusher with 144 yards and two scores, but Shegog can also hurt you with his legs as he has 10 rushes for 88 yards and two touchdowns. Dohnte Myers is Shegog's top target as he has nine catches for 195 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Dante Williams has 15 tackles, a sack, and a forced fumble. Sherrod Paige (11) and Ty Woods (10) are the next leading tacklers. Parker Burleson is a weapon if the Statesmen have to punt. The sophomore from Mathison, Mississippi averages 46.25 yards per punt and has downes six of eight punts inside the 20. Todd Cooley leads the Statesmen and is 45-32 as DSU's head coach.

### HEAD COACH DAVID DEAN

David Dean became the 11th head coach in the history of UWG football in 2017, returning to a program where he was part of two Gulf South Conference championships and three trips to the NCAA Playoffs as an assistant in the 1990s.

Dean arrived in Carrollton in January 2017, on the eve of signing day, and led the Wolves to nine victories and a return to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in his first season.

In his second season in 2018, West Georgia won 10 games and reached the playoffs for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

In the second week of the season in 2019, Dean stepped even more into history, becoming the third coach in Gulf South Conference history with 100 wins in his career as the Wolves defeated Limestone on the road.

Since returning, Dean and his team has produced 27 All-Gulf South Conference selections and 12 All-Americans. Two players from his 2019 squad, John Hurst and Azouyah Alufohai signed undrafted free agent contracts in the National Football League.

Dean was no stranger to the Carrollton campus when he returned to UWG last season. He brought with him a resume that would rival any coach in the nation. As an assistant or as a head coach, David Dean and his football teams are winners.

A former wide receiver at Georgia Tech, Dean got his introduction to the wars of Gulf South Conference football in 1988 when he began a four-year run on the staff at Valdosta State. In 1992 Dean moved to Carrollton for an eight-year run on the staff at West Georgia. That stint included the first winning season at the Division II level, the first NCAA D-II Playoff berth, and the program's first two Gulf South Conference titles.

Dean departed UWG following the 1999 season, joining the staff of Chris Hatcher at Valdosta State. He spent seven seasons as the Blazers' offensive coordinator, a run that included the 2004 NCAA Division II Championship.

In 2007 Dean ascended to the head coaching post at VSU. He had to assemble a coaching staff almost from the ground up as all but one fellow staff member moved on. The results were positive as Valdosta State posted a 13-1 record and won the program's second national championship.

Five years later, Dean was back in the winner's circle again. This time the Blazers lost twice in the regular season, but they were untouchable in the playoffs, averaging 42 points a game during a postseason march to a second national title.

That second national title with the Blazers put Dean in rare company. College football has been played in the state of Georgia since the 1890s, and during that time only three football coaches in this state have won multiple national titles.

Erskine Russell won three FCS crowns at Georgia Southern, while Paul Johnson followed him in Statesboro with a pair of championships of his own, and now it is also David Dean.

Dean's run as head coach at Valdosta State covered nine seasons. Beyond the two national crowns, his Blazer teams posted an impressive record of 79-27, including a mark of 42-19 in games played with the nation's best Division II conference, the Gulf South. His teams advanced to the NCAA Playoffs six times, and Dean's postseason head coaching record is 13-6.

The success of Dean's Valdosta State program resulted in numerous individual plaudits. He captured American Football Coaches Association Division II Coach of the Year honors following both national titles. He was also named 2007 Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports, AFCA Regional Coach of the Year, and GSC Coach of the Year in 2010.

Beyond his individual success, Dean's VSU players captured the highest of honors. His VSU teams had 18 Division II All-America selections, while 10 players signed National Football League contracts. Dean also coached three players who earned GSC Freshman of the Year honors, two league players of the year, and a national defensive player of the year.

Clearly, David Dean has been linked to success throughout his 30-year coaching career. At UWG or at UWG's biggest rival, the results are irrefutable: David Dean is a winner. His teams win and his program flourishes.

Dean is a native of DeKalb County in the metro Atlanta area. He was born in Decatur, and enjoyed a stellar high school career for the Avondale Blue Devils. Dean arrived at Georgia Tech as a walk-on in 1982, but was awarded a scholarship the following season. He played wide receiver for the Jackets through the 1985 campaign.
