







The UWRF Falcons were champions of the inaugural Isthmus Bowl 2021. This was the first bowl of any kind in the state of Wisconsin. The Falcons tied an NCAA record for 44 first downs in the 2021 game. In 2022, the Falcons defeated Washington University (MO) to bring them their second straight bowl title.



BEST LEAGUE IN THE NATION

The Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) is considered the top rated league in the nation. The 127 National Championships won by WIAC teams is the most in the history of Division III sports. At one time this year, there were five teams from the league rated in the Top 25 of both National Polls.

Matt Walker completed his 14th season as the head football coach at UW-River Falls in the fall of 2023. The 2023 season was a historic campaign that saw the Falcons climb to the No. 4-ranked team in the nation while spending the entire season ranked inside the Top 25 in all national polls. This was following a 2022 season in which Walker led the Falcons to their second-straight Isthmus Bowl Championship. In 2021, he led the Falcons to a nine-win season that tied the most wins in school history. That season, Walker was named the WIAC Coach of the Year and Hansen Rating National Coach of the Year.

Walker has coached over 120 Falcons to All-WIAC honors. On four separate occasions, one of his players has earned the conference's highest student-athlete achievement honor in the Max Sparger WIAC Scholar-Athlete Award. Greg Klingelutz won the award in 2011, John Schimenz in 2012, Ryan Kusilek in 2015 and Michael Diggins in 2017. Walker also coached WIAC Defensive Player of the Year Nick Jacobsen in 2017, who received a Mini Camp Tryout with the Minnesota Vikings. In 2021, Walker coached, Tight End, Ben Beise, who was named an AFCA First Team All-American and the only Division III player in the country that season to be signed to a 90-man NFL roster when he joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' preseason roster. Under Walker, UWRF has claimed the Athletic Department's Award for Team Community Service in 2017, 2018 and 2019.

In addition to being the head coach, Walker also coaches the quarterbacks. Since his time at UWRF, Falcon quarterbacks have re-written the record books for passing and total offense categories. Walker's quarterbacks own every passing yardage, touchdown and total offense record in school history. In 2019, senior Ben Beckman had the most prolific single season by a quarterback in program history. He was the first 3,000-yard passer, threw for over 300 yards five times, led the league in passing yards (3,105) and total offense (3,408), and broke single season marks for nearly every passing statistic in school history. In 2021, under Walker's guidance, Kole Hinrichsen made his own argument for the greatest QB season in school history. The senior signal caller broke school records for completions in a game (44), completions in a season (290), touchdown passes in a season (28), and broke Beckman's total offense record from 2019 with 3,546 yards in a season. Falcon QBs were the leaders of an offense that broke school records and led the league for total offense (544 yards per game), first downs (329), and scoring (43.6 points per game). The 2021 offense finished the season ranked 3rd in the nation in total offense and 2nd in first downs. And, in 2022 and 2023, Kaleb Blaha put his name in the hat as one of the greatest players in the history of the program. With one more season left ahead as the Falcon starter, he is on pace to walk out of the program owning nearly every single season and career record for QBs, total offense and yardage. In 2023, Blaha led the nation in total offense with 388.2 yards of total offense per game and was a Gagliardi Trophy finalist.

Before coming to UW-River Falls, Walker was the head football coach at DePauw University (Ind.) from 2006-09 and compiled a 22-8 overall record. His teams finished 13-7 in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference and placed second in the final conference standings in 2007 and 2008. From 2000-05, he was an offensive assistant with the Tigers. During the 2010 season, he was an offensive assistant coach at Butler University. Walker was also the head baseball coach at DePauw from 2001-09 and led the Tigers to five conference divisional championships and to a NCAA regional berth in 2001. He was named the Conference Coach of the Year in 2001. Three times he led the Tigers to the most wins in a single season (2004, 2005, 2008). He was one of the youngest coaches in college baseball history to get to 250 wins and left DePauw with a 253-166 record for the second most wins in program history.

He earned a sports science degree from DePauw in 1999. He went on to earn his master's degree in physical education from Indiana State in 2001 where he earned Phi Kappa Phi academic honors.

Walker resides in River Falls with his wife, Jana, their two daughters, Kraly (18), and Hudson (14), and two sons, Townsend (11), and Sullivan (4).

Your Next Step

We've got the tools, expertise, and support to help you transfer to UW-River Falls and thrive when you get here. Your transfer journey is unique to you - the school you attended, the credits you've taken, and we're here to provide a personalized plan to make transferring as seamless as possible.

You can set up an in-person or virtual appointment with our transfer admissions counselor. We'll talk you through your plans, share more about our academic programs, cost, financial aid, and the resources available to you as a transfer student. Before you enroll, you'll work with an adviser to review your unofficial credit evaluation and learn more about course equivalencies.

Get the Most from Your Coursework

- Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC): Completed MnTC will grant a waiver of General Education and University Requirements (except for a one credit Health and Fitness for Life course). Specific college, degree, licensure and prerequisite requirements must still be completed with individual courses.
- Associate of Arts (AA) degrees from Minnesota and Wisconsin will grant a waiver of University Requirements and General Education requirements. Specific degree, licensure and prerequisite requirements must still be completed with individual courses. AA degrees from other states are reviewed individually to see if they qualify for a similar waiver. Technical classes and Technical Degrees (AS - Associate of Science and AAS - Associate of Applied Science) are reviewed by faculty advisers for course-by-course transfer.

How to Apply

You've been to campus. You're feeling great. What's next? Time to apply! (Don't worry, we've made it simple.)

1. Complete an online application at apply.wisconsin.edu or on the Common Application website (first-year students only - just search for UW-River Falls!) if you'd like to apply for multiple schools with one simple application.
2. Submit an ACT or SAT score (optional*)
3. Submit transcripts

*When applying to UWRF, you have the choice if you want to submit standardized test scores (ACT or SAT) with your admission application.



How Do I Know if I Should Apply Test-Optional?

If you're satisfied with your scores and think they accurately reflect your academic achievements, we encourage you to include them with your application.

If you don't think your scores accurately reflect your academic ability and potential, you should consider applying Test-Optional. You won't be penalized for not including them, but you should know once you submit your application, you won't be able to add them if you change your mind.

Application Complete!

We know that GPA, class rank and course options vary widely between high schools, so we will continue to do a comprehensive review of your application. Although we'll consider both academic and non-academic factors, your performance in the classroom remains the most important factor in our review process.

High school GPA is a strong predictor of success in college, so we'll take a close look at your high school transcript, evaluating both the challenge of your high school courses and your academic performance. We'll also consider your extracurricular activities, personal achievements, community service, family commitments, employment responsibilities and any other information that you'd like to provide.
