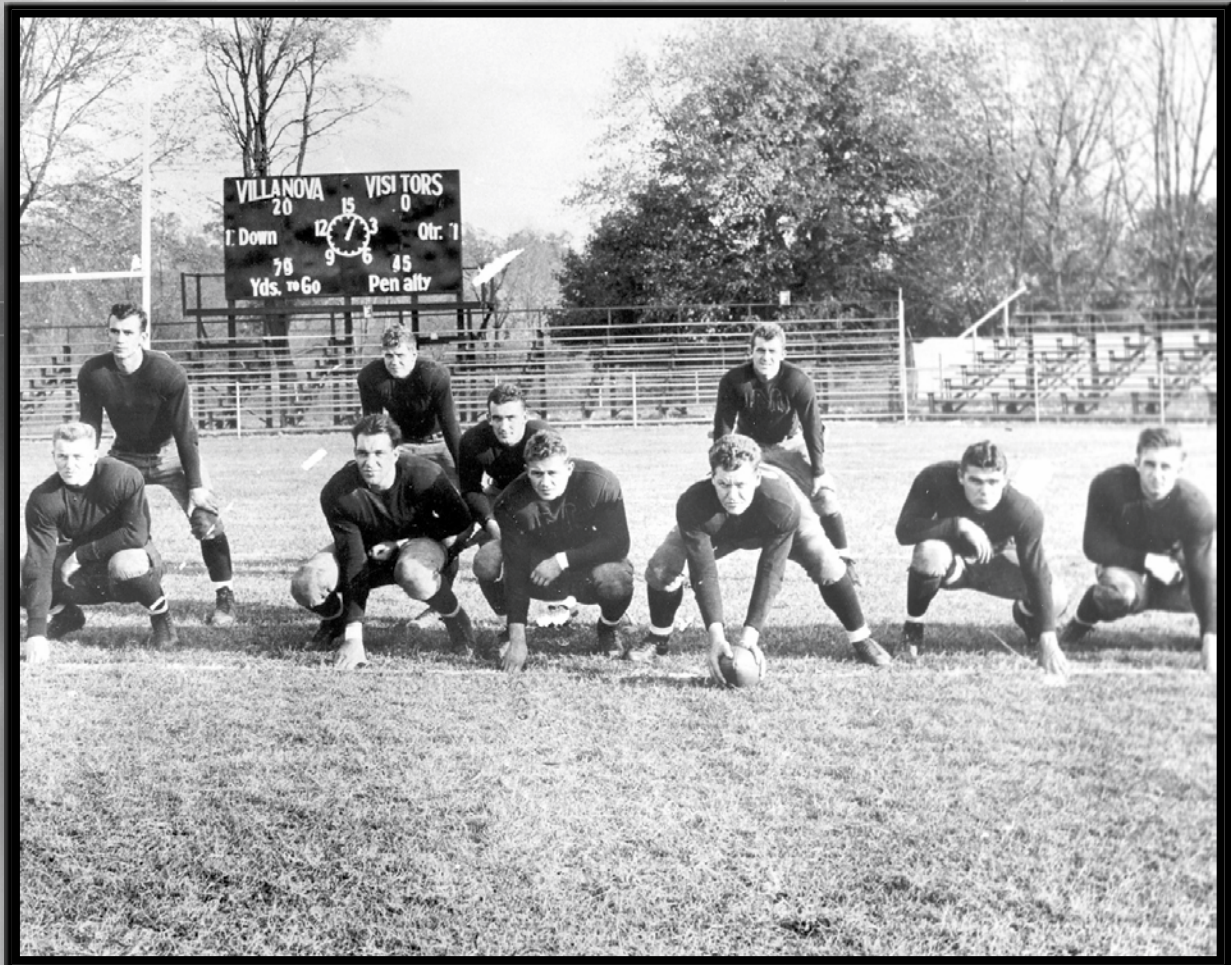

Significant Dates in Villanova History

November 22, 1894: Villanova College's first football game, a 24-0 victory over the Logan Athletic Association.

November 13, 1895: Villanova's first "intercollegiate" football game, a 12-0 win over Hahneman College.

October 8, 1927: Opening day at Villanova Stadium. After the dedication ceremonies, the Wildcats celebrate by winning the first game at their new home, a 32-7 victory over Lebanon Valley College.

September 28, 1928: Sophomore football player Leo J. Goodreau suffers severe injury during football practice.

October 2, 1928: Sophomore football player Leo J. Goodreau dies as a result of injuries suffered during practice.

May 7, 1930: Members of Leo J. Goodreau's class dedicate the playing field in Villanova Stadium to his memory.

January 1, 1937: Villanova and Auburn play to a 7-7 tie in the first, and only, Bacardi Bowl in Havana, Cuba.

December 6, 1947: The Kentucky Wildcats beat the Villanova Wildcats, 24-14, in the Great Lakes Bowl in Cleveland's Municipal Stadium.

January 1, 1949: Villanova beats Nevada, 27-7, in the Harbor Bowl in San Diego's Balboa Stadium.

September 23, 1950: Pete D'Alonzo carries the ball 23 times for 201 yards in a 39-28 season-opening Villanova victory against Duquesne. His yardage will stand as the single-game leader for 41 years.

October 31, 1952: First night game at Villanova Stadium, under portable lights. Wildcats battle to a 20-20 tie against the Parris Island Marines.

November 4, 1961: Villanova beats West Chester, 40-13, in the first game ever televised from Villanova Stadium. The game is carried live on Philadelphia's Channel 3, then known as WRCV-TV.

December 30, 1961: The Wildcats shock the Wichita Shockers in the Sun Bowl, at Kidd

Field in El Paso. The 'Cats collect a 17-9 victory. It's remembered as one of the greatest days in Villanova athletic history, for later that day the Wildcat men's basketball team won the Quaker City Tournament in Philadelphia.

December 15, 1962: The 'Cats lose to Oregon State, 6-0, in the Liberty Bowl at Philadelphia's Municipal Stadium, in their last bowl game appearance. Later that day, the Wildcat men's basketball team loses to Niagara at the Palestra, 73-61. Rich Richman plays in both games for the Wildcats, as a quarterback at Municipal Stadium, and off the bench as a forward at the Palestra.

September 27, 1969: "One of the most dramatic comebacks in college football's 101 years," claimed Philadelphia Bulletin writer Frank Brady. The Wildcats trailed at Delaware by 26 points three minutes into the final period, when quarterback Drew Gordon came in off the bench to hit 7-of-17 passes for 127 yards and three touchdowns. Villanova beat Delaware, 36-33.

September 27, 1980: Villanova Stadium is re-dedicated, after installation of astroturf, lights and a new track. At halftime of the Boston College-Villanova contest, the track is dedicated to legendary track coach James "Jumbo" Elliott. The Wildcats win the game, 20-9.

April 14, 1981: Villanova's board of trustees elects to discontinue football, citing economic reasons.

December 1, 1981: The Committee to Restore Football at Villanova hosts their first benefit, featuring Bob Hope at the Academy of Music in Philadelphia. The night is nicknamed, "Hope for Football."

November 3, 1982: Villanova's student government released results from a student survey, showing 96.07 percent of students responding want football back.

December 14, 1982: Villanova board of trustees agrees to review its position on football.

December 13, 1983: Villanova President John M. Driscoll, O.S.A. announces that the board of trustees has elected to restore football.

May 29, 1984: The task of rebuilding Villanova Football is placed on the shoulders of Andrew J. Talley, the 30th football head coach in Wildcat history.

October 10, 1984: Villanova announces it will be a member of the NCAA Division I-AA Yankee Conference.



November 3, 1984: A sold-out Villanova Stadium crowd of 13,400 is on hand for the first Villanova University football Homecoming game since 1980, a Blue-White scrimmage. Comprised of walk-ons who worked out for one month, the blue team beats the white, 23-7.

September 2, 1985: Villanova beats Iona, 27-7, and goes on to a 5-0-0 season back on the gridiron.

November 19, 1987: A sold-out Villanova Stadium is on hand for a nationally-televised ESPN clash with Holy Cross, the first night game at Villanova Stadium since 1952. The 'Cats lose to Holy Cross, 39-6.

September 24, 1988: Villanova beats Boston University, 31-24, in a day of firsts. The game, played at Boston University's Nickerson Field, is Villanova's first in the Yankee Conference. It's also Villanova's first overtime game. Tied 24-24 at the end of regulation, the Wildcats had possession of the ball first in overtime. On fourth and goal the 'Cats fake a field goal, as holder Bob Brady found tight end Rich Lage alone in the endzone for the score. Villanova's defense then held the Terriers in their possession, to win the game.

October 7, 1989: It took 3 hours and 40 minutes, but Villanova captured a 41-35 victory in six overtimes against Connecticut at Villanova Stadium. The game was won on Villanova's fourth play of possession in the sixth extra frame, as freshman Jeff Johnson ran for three yards off left tackle for the game winning touchdown.

November 25, 1989: Playing in the post-season for the first time in 27 years, Villanova loses to eventual National Champion Georgia Southern, 52-36, in the first round of the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs.

October 26, 1991: Pat Kennedy rushed for 249 yards and four touchdowns on 21 carries against William & Mary, in a 35-21 Villanova victory. It's the second greatest game ever by a Villanova running back.

November 30, 1991: Villanova loses to eventual National Champion Youngstown State, 17-16, in the first round of the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs.

November 28, 1992: Making it to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs for the third time in four years, the Wildcats lose at Youngstown State, 23-20.

September 30, 1995: Head coach Andy Talley sets new Villanova standard for most all-

time coaching victories on the Main Line, earning his 66th win in a 28-3 drubbing of Buffalo.

October 5, 1996: Villanova defeats Connecticut 38-27 in Storrs, Conn. The win marked the 100th career victory for Wildcat head coach Andy Talley. Also in the game, junior wide receiver Brian Finneran tallies a school record 16 receptions.

November 30, 1996: Villanova loses, 35-29, at East Tennessee State in the first round of the NCAA I-AA playoffs. In the loss, junior running back Curtis Sifford becomes the first Wildcat back to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.

July 1, 1997: Villanova becomes a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference who takes over the day-to-day operations of the Yankee Conference.

October 4, 1997: Senior wide receiver Brian Finneran becomes Villanova's all-time leading receiver for career receptions and career receiving yards versus JMU. In the win, Finneran tallied eight receptions for 144 yards and four touchdowns.

October 20, 1997: Villanova gains No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history. The 'Cats reached the top spot in both the Sports Network and ESPN/Sportsticker polls.

November 22, 1997: The Wildcats complete the first-ever undefeated, untied full season in school history with a 49-35 win over Northeastern.

November 29, 1997: Hosting the first-ever post season game at Villanova Stadium, the Wildcats record their first NCAA I-AA playoff victory with a 49-28 win over Colgate.

December 1, 1997: Head coach Andy Talley and wide receiver Brian Finneran make national headlines, as Talley earns the Eddie Robinson Award as the top I-AA coach in the country and Finneran garners the Walter Payton Award, symbolizing the best player in I-AA.

November 21, 1998: In a 27-15 win over Rhode Island, sophomore Brian Westbrook became the first player in the history of college football at any level to rush for 1,000 yards and receive for 1,000 yards in the same season.

October 30, 1999: Head Coach Andy Talley records his 100th victory at Villanova with a 31-28 victory over the University of New Hampshire.

November 24, 2001: Running back Brian Westbrook becomes the all-time leader in the history

of college football at any level for career all-purpose yards with a 46-yard rush in the second quarter versus William & Mary in Williamsburg, Va. Westbrook finished his illustrious Villanova career with 9,512 yards of all-purpose offense in 44 regular season games.

December 20, 2001: Brian Westbrook wins the Walter Payton Award as the top player in NCAA I-AA football at a banquet in Chattanooga, Tenn.

April 20, 2002: Brian Westbrook becomes the first Wildcat to be drafted by the NFL since Howie Long in 1981 when he was selected in the third round by the Philadelphia Eagles.

Dec. 7, 2002: Quarterback Brett Gordon completes 26-of-30 for 219 yards and two touchdowns as Villanova earns a 24-10 quarterfinal win over Fordham and advances to the semifinal round of the NCAA I-AA Playoffs for the first time in school history.

August 31, 2002: In the season opener in Piscataway, N.J., Villanova defeats Rutgers by a score of 37-19, giving the Wildcats their first win over a Division I-A opponent since becoming a I-AA program in 1985.

September 6, 2003: Villanova defeats Temple, 23-20 in overtime, becoming the first Division I-AA school to defeat a I-A team from a BCS conference in back-to-back seasons since the Bowl Championship Series was formed in 1998. The game was also the first regular season football game of any kind to be played at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia, Pa.

May 6, 2006: Villanova honors the history of Wildcat football by hosting the Gridiron Gala. More than 300 people attended the on-campus event including Wildcat legends Howie Long, Billy Joe, Brian Finneran and Brian Westbrook.

July 1, 2007: Villanova becomes a member of the Colonial Athletic Association who takes over the day-to-day operations of the Atlantic 10 Conference.

November 8, 2008: The Wildcats defeat New Hampshire by a score of 24-13 making head coach Andy Talley the all-time winningest coach in CAA history.

Brian Finneran

1997 Walter Payton Award Winner

At the 11th Annual Division I-AA National Football Awards Banquet held on Dec. 1, 1997, at the Official All-Star Cafe in New York City, Villanova University senior wide receiver Brian Finneran (Mission Viejo, Calif.) won the Walter Payton Award given to the top player in I-AA.

Finneran had a storybook career on the Main Line from 1994-97, and was one of the nation's finest players throughout his four years. During his storied career, he caught 265 passes for 3,872 yards and 34 touchdowns. Finneran currently holds 14 Villanova school records including the career marks for receptions, yards and touchdowns.

Arriving on the Main Line in 1994 from Mission Viejo, Calif., along with his twin brother and fellow Wildcat football standout Brad, Brian Finneran was on a mission. He immediately began to turn heads as a freshman in 1994, catching 56 passes for 805 yards and seven scores. Finneran set Wildcat class records for most catches and yards receiving in a season by a freshman. For his performance, he was named to the All-Yankee Conference second team.

Missing the first two games of his sophomore season due to a separated shoulder, Finneran returned slowly but still caught 32 passes for 471 yards on the year.

Finneran's real breakout season came in 1996, when as a junior, he posted 81 receptions for 1,207 yards and eight touchdowns. The honors came from everywhere, as he received first team All-Atlantic 10, All-ECAC, and All-American honors.

His top campaign would come one year later, as a senior, when he took both himself and the Wildcats to the status of one of the nation's best. With a perfect 11-0 regular season, Villanova was No. 1 in the country and posted the first-ever undefeated, untied full regular season in school history. Despite losing a 37-34 heartbreaker to Youngstown State in the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs, the season was a memorable one for Finneran and the 'Cats. Finneran finished the year with 96 catches for 1,389 yards and 19 touchdowns. He capped off his career by earning the Walter Payton Award, given to the nation's top Division I-AA player.

Finneran is currently in his 11th season in the NFL, including his 10th with the Atlanta Falcons.

Brian Westbrook

2001 Walter Payton Award Winner

Villanova University senior running back Brian Westbrook closed out his illustrious collegiate career in fine fashion on December 20, 2001 when he was awarded the Walter Payton Award given annually to the National Player of the Year in NCAA I-AA football. Westbrook received the award at a banquet held in Chattanooga, Tennessee. The other two finalists for the award included Rocky Butler of Hofstra University and Adrian Peterson of Georgia Southern.

Westbrook received 31 first-place votes and 320 points from the panel of 103 I-AA sports information directors and selected media. Following Westbrook in the voting were Hofstra's Rocky Butler, who earned 22 first place votes and 267 total points, and Georgia Southern's Adrian Peterson, who finished in the top three of the voting for the fourth consecutive year.

Westbrook became the second player from Villanova to win the award. In 1997, former Wildcat and current Atlanta Falcon wide receiver Brian Finneran garnered the award.

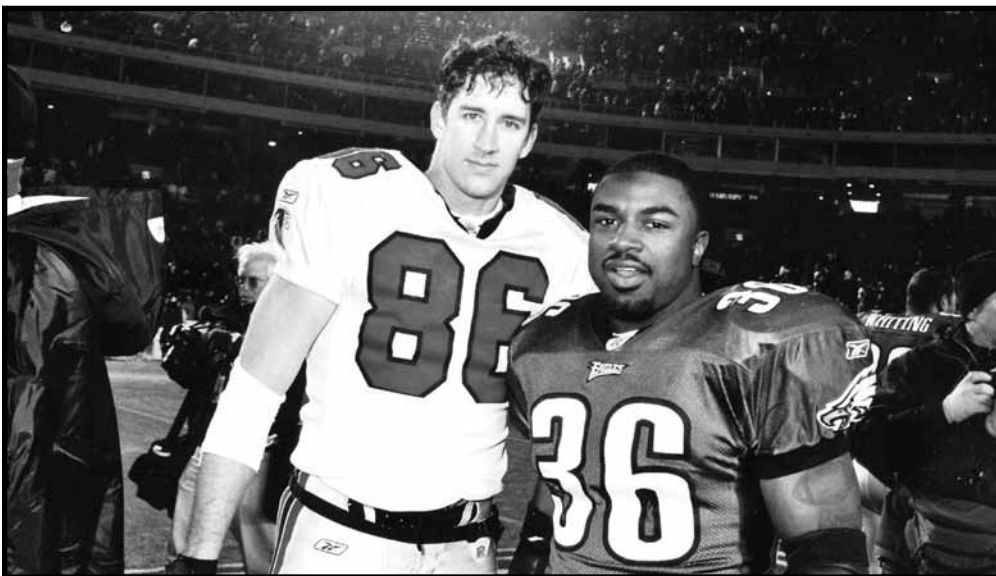
In 11 games in 2001, Westbrook led all of NCAA I-AA in both All-purpose yards with 2,823 and scoring with 176 points (29 TDs). The 5-9, 205 pound Westbrook rushed 249 times for 1,603 yards and 22 scores, caught 59 passes for 658 yards and six touchdowns, returned 17 kickoffs for 440 yards and a score, in addition to returning 12 punts for 90 yards during the 2001 campaign. In Villanova's season finale at William & Mary on Nov. 24, Westbrook set the NCAA All-Divisions career all-purpose yards record with 9,512 yards in 44 regular season games.

As a junior in 2000, Westbrook finished third in the Walter Payton Award voting behind Louis Ivory of Furman University who won the award and Peterson who finished second.

The most decorated player in school history, Westbrook finished his Wildcat career with 41 school records, 19 Atlantic 10 Conference marks and five NCAA records. Westbrook became the first player in the history of Villanova football to earn first team All-American honors in three different seasons, when he earned first team All-American acclaim from both *The Sports Network* and the AFCA in 2001. As a sophomore in 1998, Westbrook

became the only player in the history of college football at any level to rush for 1,000 yards and receive for 1,000 yards in the same season.

Westbrook is currently in his eighth year with the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.

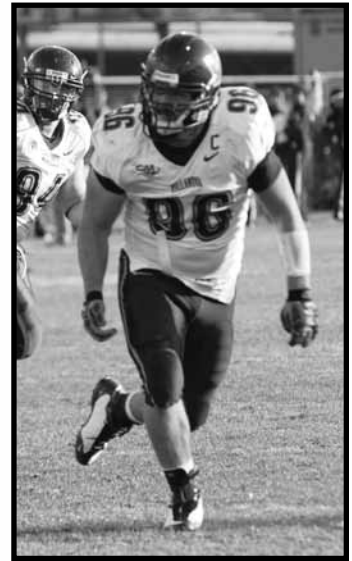

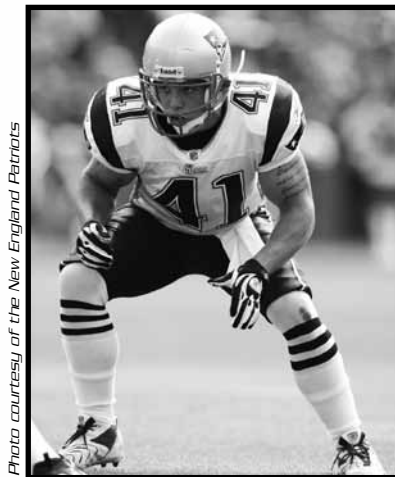

Bowl/Playoff History

1937 Bacardi Bowl

Havana, Cuba • January 1, 1937
 Villanova 7, Auburn 7

Villanova's history in bowl games began in 1937, when the Wildcats were invited to participate in the 1937 contest which eventually became known as the Bacardi Bowl.

Not only was it Villanova's first football bowl game appearance, but it was also the first bowl game to be played outside the United States. The 'Cats opponent, Auburn University, had rolled up an impressive 7-2-2 record and had closed out the regular season with impressive wins over Loyola, 44-0, and Florida, 13-0, their fifth and sixth shutout wins of the season. Villanova, under coaching great Maurice "Clipper" Smith, piled up a sterling 7-2 record, and had earned victories over the likes of Penn State, Boston University, Detroit and South Carolina. Like Auburn, Villanova boasted of an outstanding defense, one that had recorded four shutouts and had not allowed any opponent more than seven points.

Played in Havana, Cuba as the climactic event of Cuba's National Sports Festival, the game almost never came to be because of a bloodless revolution led by Fulgencio Batista, who, over 20 years later, would be overthrown by Fidel Castro.

Yet the game went on, and it was Auburn which flexed its muscles first in the contest. The Tigers mounted an offensive attack that saw the ball pushed to the Villanova 10-yard line. But the 'Cats defense stiffened and took over the ball on downs. Unable to do much offensively, Villanova punted the ball away, and on the ensuing possession, Auburn put together its only scoring drive of the day. The Tigers broke the scoreless tie when halfback Billy Hitchcock broke through the Wildcat defense and rambled 40 yards for a touchdown. The extra point was good, and Auburn had a 7-0 lead.

As expected, the defense of both squads continued to dominate play, and at halftime Auburn still held their lead. Midway through the third period, however, Villanova's offense, behind the direction of Anthony Stopper, drove to Auburn's 12-yard line, but came away scoreless after Auburn's defense rallied to stymie the 'Cats. Late in the fourth quarter, with time running out for the Wildcats, Auburn had possession of the ball inside its own 15-yard line. Facing second down and eight yards to go for a first down, Auburn mentor Jack Meagher called for a quick kick, a play Auburn had used successfully on a couple occasions in the first half. Shifting into the quick kick position at the Auburn goal line, Villanova's John Wysocki and Valentine Rizzo blocked the kick, and lineman Matthew Kuber grabbed the ball at the two-yard line and went in for the touchdown. William Christopher kicked the all-important point after, and the Wildcats had gained a 7-7 tie.

1947 Great Lakes Bowl

Municipal Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio • December 6, 1947
 Kentucky 24, Villanova 14

Under the direction of Wildcat head coach Jordan Olivar, in 1947 the Villanova College football team ventured to Cleveland, Ohio for the inaugural Great Lakes Bowl. Their opponent was the Kentucky Wildcats.

Paul "Bear" Bryant coached the Kentucky squad, who were led on the field by legendary quarterback Jack "George" Blanda.

Villanova missed a golden opportunity to strike early when on the opening kickoff, Villanova's kick rolled around on the Kentucky two-yard line and no Kentucky player seemed eager to grab the loose pigskin. As three Villanova players converged on the ball, Kentucky's Blanda realized just in time that the ball was up for grabs, and quickly dove on the ball. Later in the first quarter, Kentucky moved the ball from Villanova's 46 to the 16, and settled for a 27-yard field goal by Blanda on the last play of the first quarter, giving Kentucky a 3-0 advantage.

The scored remained the same through the second quarter, but midway through the third quarter Kentucky's Jim Howe took a pitch from Blanda and stormed past Villanova's defenders for a 29-yard touchdown. Blanda added the extra point, and Kentucky took a 10-0 advantage.

Yet Villanova, behind the accurate throws of highly-touted quarterback Andy Gordon, marched back. Two plays into the fourth period, Villanova's Ralph Pasquariello, carrying several Kentucky defenders on his back, rambled 11-yards into the endzone. John Siano's conversion pulled Villanova within a field goal, 10-7.

Later in the fourth quarter, Kentucky's Jack Griffin broke through the Villanova line to partially block a punt, giving Kentucky excellent field position at the 25-yard line. Several plays later, Kentucky's Bill Boller raced 25 yards for a touchdown, and after the Blanda extra-point, Kentucky had cushioned its lead to 17-7. With time now against them, Villanova went to the air, but Kentucky's Boller intercepted a Gordon pass and returned it 49 yards for another touchdown. Now trailing 24-7, Gordon returned to the air. First hitting Zip Zehler with a 38-yard strike, Gordon then connected with John Sheehan for a 13-yard touchdown pass. Yet in the end, this battle of the Wildcats was won by Kentucky.

1949 Harbor Bowl

Balboa Stadium, San Diego, Calif. • January 1, 1949
 Villanova 27, Nevada 7

For a second consecutive season, Villanova head coach Jordan Olivar led the Wildcats to a post-season football bowl game. Recording a 7-2-1 regular season, with impressive wins over Texas A&M, Miami, North Carolina State, and a tie with Kentucky, the 'Cats headed west for the Harbor Bowl. Their opponent was Nevada, who was 8-1 and had recorded lopsided wins over Tulsa, Wichita, Fresno State and San Jose during 1948.

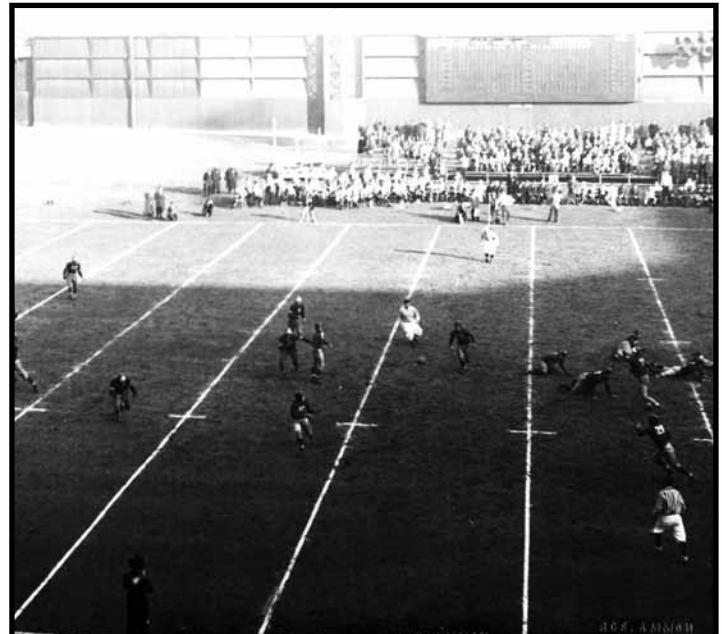
A crowd of over 20,000 on an overcast and rainy New Year's Day witnessed a dominating Villanova defense, and a fast-paced Wildcat offense, overwhelm Nevada, 27-7. The Wildcats got on the scoreboard early, scoring 13 first quarter points. First, Peter D'Alonzo dove the final three yards of a Wildcat drive for the day's first score. Robert Polidor went the final four yards on Villanova's second touchdown in the first quarter, giving the 'Cats a 13-0 advantage.

Neither team managed a score in the second period, but Nevada opened the second half by serving notice they were not about to quit. Tommy Kalmanir raced 66 yards for a touchdown, cutting the Wildcat lead to 13-7. Later in the third quarter, Wildcat end John Geppi drove another nail into Nevada's coffin when he raced 80 yards for another Wildcat touchdown. Geppi would finish the game with 114 yards on six carries. Any remaining Nevada hopes for a comeback ended when D'Alonzo scored his second touchdown of the day on an eight-yard jaunt, giving Villanova a 27-7 lead, and their first bowl game victory.

Before what was then claimed to be the largest national television audience to ever view a football bowl game, Villanova put on an impressive display of rugged defense and potent offense en route to a 17-9 victory over Wichita in the 28th Annual Sun Bowl.

The confidence of the Wildcats was evident from the start. Winning the coin toss, Villanova elected to kickoff, putting its defense, which finished the year ranked seventh in the nation, on the spot. Both teams' defenses dominated the early play, and neither team could mount any kind of offensive threat. Taking control of the ball on Wichita's 43-yard line late in the first quarter, Villanova quarterback Ted Aceto recorded the game's first first down, and four plays later gave the ball to the 'Cats overpowering fullback, Billy Joe. Joe rumbled into the endzone from 19-yards out to cap a seven play touchdown drive. Sam Gruneisen kicked the extra point, giving Villanova a 7-0 lead in the first quarter.

The Wildcat defense continued to stymie Wichita, as the Shockers were kept deep in their own territory. But with five seconds remaining in the first half, Wichita finally got on the scoreboard on a 36-yard field goal. Gaining a 7-3 halftime lead, the Wildcat defense had held Wichita to just 87 total offensive yards.

Kicking off to start the second half, Villanova got a big break when Richie Ross recovered the fumbled kickoff on Wichita's 22-yard line. Seven plays later, Louis Rettino dove over from the two-yard line, Gruneisen kicked the extra point, and Villanova had expanded their lead to 14-3.

The Wildcats weren't through yet. Villanova's defense continued its tough play, and the 'Cats offense, after Wichita was forced to punt four plays later, drove the ball from its own 38 to the Shockers' six-yard line and finally settled for a 26-yard field goal by Gruneisen. Wichita added a touchdown with 45 seconds left, but the two point conversion failed, giving the 'Cats a 17-9 win. Villanova captain Rich Ross was the recipient of the Sun Bowl's Linemen's Trophy Award, while teammate Billy Joe was given the Outstanding Player Award.

1962 Liberty Bowl

Municipal Stadium, Philadelphia, Pa. • December 15, 1962
Oregon State 6, Villanova 0

For Wildcat coach Alex Bell, Villanova University's participation in the fourth annual Liberty Bowl marked the second consecutive year his 'Cat team was invited to a major bowl! Although the game was played in Villanova's backyard, the 'Cats were definitely underdogs.

Oregon State was famed for its passing attack, which was headed by All-American and 1962 Heisman Trophy winner Terry Baker. While not as heralded as the Oregon State squad, Villanova had also enjoyed an outstanding season, compiling a 7-2 record.

The game, telecast nationally in color by NBC to an estimated 27 million viewers, became a defensive struggle, and to the surprise of many, the Wildcats dominated. Villanova seemingly got a big break midway through the first quarter when William Sherlock's 52-yard punt was downed by Larry Glueck on the one-foot line. One play later, disaster struck as Oregon State's Baker got loose around end, and raced to a 99-yard touchdown with 9:24 left in the opening period. Baker tried a two-point conversion, but the Wildcats regrouped to break up his pass, leaving the score 6-0 in Oregon State's favor.

Another tough break doomed Villanova. Taking the ensuing kickoff down to the Beavers' 12-yard line, Villanova seemingly deadlocked the contest when Billy Joe made his way around the left end and romped 12-yards into the endzone. But a holding call nullified the play, and two plays later a Villanova pass was intercepted. The second and third quarters were scoreless, as both teams' defenses remained unbending. In the closing minutes of the fourth quarter, Villanova made one last effort.

Starting on their own 30-yard line, the Wildcats drove to Oregon State's 11-yard line before fumbling away a chance to win the game. For the day, Villanova outgained the Beavers on the ground 246-176, and had nine more first downs, 20-11. However, Oregon State's one big play, coupled with the 'Cats six turnovers, added up to a disappointing loss for Villanova.

Villanova University's football team made their first appearance in post-season play since the program was reinstated in 1985, and were faced with the realization that they would have to play the top ranked team in the nation, Georgia Southern, on the Eagles' home field in Statesboro, Georgia. Though Villanova put up a gallant battle, the Eagles proved to be too much for the Wildcats, and won the first round of the 1989 NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs, 52-36. Georgia Southern went on to win the 1989 NCAA Division I-AA Championship.

The two teams spent the first half trading scores. Following a Georgia Southern touchdown early in the contest, Villanova got on the board with seconds remaining in the first quarter on a 64-yard touchdown pass from Kirk Schulz to Harold Hart, tying the score 7-7. The Eagles scored a field goal in the second quarter, before Villanova went ahead 14-10 on a 15-yard pass from Schulz to Jeff Johnson. Minutes later, following an 83-yard Schulz to Bob Brady pass play, Schulz ran a quarterback sneak up the middle for a 21-10 Wildcat lead. Georgia Southern kicked a field goal with 30 seconds remaining in the half, sending the teams to the locker rooms with the 'Cats leading, 21-13.

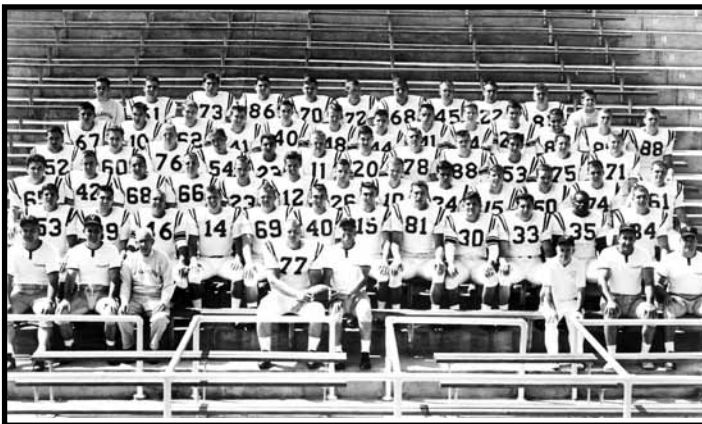
The third quarter proved to be Villanova's downfall, however, as Georgia Southern shutout the 'Cats just as they had shutout all their opponents in the third quarter during 1989. The Eagles scored three touchdowns and a field goal to retake the lead and open the margin 38-21. Villanova got back on the scoreboard in the fourth quarter, narrowing the deficit to 10 points on a five-yard pass from Schulz to wide receiver Scott Thompson.

The Eagles scored two touchdowns in a span of 44 seconds midway through the fourth period to put the game out of Villanova's reach. With a little over two minutes remaining in the contest, Villanova completed the scoring with a one-yard pass from Schulz to Scott Donald. Reserve quarterback Mike Reilly passed to Pat Kennedy for the two point conversion, which made the final score Georgia Southern 52, Villanova 36.

A cold, windy day in Youngstown, Ohio brought a cold end to Villanova's 1991 football season. Playing in only their second NCAA Division I-AA Playoff game in Villanova gridiron history, the No. 7-ranked Wildcats suffered a season-ending 17-16 loss to eventual National Champion Youngstown State University.

An exciting game to watch, it was a heartbreaking game to be a part of. The Wildcats led from the start, after Tom Colombo lofted a 42-yard touchdown strike to Harold Hart to put Villanova on the scoreboard with 8:32 left in the first quarter.

The Penguins evened the tally with their first touchdown, with 14:14 left in the second quarter. Quarterback Ray Isaac connected on a 28-yard pass to Dave Roberts for Youngstown. But the Wildcats marched right back, led by senior tailback Pat Kennedy.

Kennedy, Villanova's leading rusher in 1991, had missed the prior four games with an elbow injury, but made up for lost time quickly. He scored on a three-yard touchdown with 7:14 left in the second period, but Villanova's extra-point attempt by kicker Bill Hoffman was no good.

Hoffman tried again later in the quarter, however, when he connected on a 28-yard field goal with only three seconds left in the half. The Wildcats led at halftime, 16-7.

That's the way it was until the 6:40 mark of the third quarter, when Youngstown's Leo Hawkins scored on a one-yard touchdown run, and the Penguins closed to within two of the Wildcats.

Villanova's vaunted defense stymied Youngstown for much of the fourth quarter, battling away passes and holding the line, but the offense couldn't advance despite two long drives in the final frame.

A tipped pass by Villanova's defense with Youngstown facing fourth and 11 turned into a 41-yard gain for the Penguins with under a minute remaining.

Suddenly Youngstown was in scoring position, and after two quick one-yard gains, Youngstown kicker Jeff Wilkins hit a 33-yard field goal with six seconds remaining to give the Penguins a 17-16 victory, en route to their first National Championship.

In the first round of the I-AA playoffs, the Villanova Wildcats lost at East Tennessee State by a score of 35-29. With the loss, the Cats finish the season at 8-4, while East Tennessee State improves to 10-2. ETSU will now advance to the second round and play at No. 1 seeded Montana.

The first half was all ETSU as the Bucs were dominant in taking a 28-6 lead at halftime. ETSU quarterback Greg Ryan was spectacular in the first half as he threw for three first-half scores. Villanova's six points came from two Mark Kiefer field goals (27-yards, 42-yards).

Villanova came out in the second half and completely took over the game. Senior running back Anthony Cowsette scored three straight touchdowns on runs of one yard, seven yards and two yards. Following Cowsette's third score, Villanova went for two and failed. However, the 'Cats were back in the game and trailed by just two points at 28-26.

After ETSU scored on Ryan's fourth touchdown throw of the afternoon making the score 35-26, Villanova quickly responded with a 14 play drive that ended in a 38-yard Mark Kiefer field goal. Kiefer had a big day as he connected on three field goals.

Villanova's comeback bid came up a bit short when they were stopped just inches from the first down marker on a fourth and 10 at the ETSU 40-yard line. ETSU took over on downs and the Bucs were able to run the clock out and escape with a victory.

Besides Cowsette's three touchdowns and Kiefer three field goals, the Villanova offense also got great play from junior running back Curtis Sifford who gained 120 yards on 24 carries. Defensively, linebacker Stephen Curry and free safety Deon Jackson led the way with 13 tackles each.

Villanova Football made their second-straight visit to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs, and third in four years, but had to go back to Youngstown, Ohio for a rematch with the defending National Champion. A cold, rainy afternoon in Stambaugh Stadium found the Wildcats once again battling down to the wire with the Penguins, only to lose in the final moments, 23-20.

The 'Cats scored first, taking a 6-0 lead on a two-yard run by tailback Kevin Mosley with 6:48 left in the first quarter. Bill Hoffman kicked the extra point to give Villanova a 7-0 margin, but Youngstown State marched right back and scored with 12:41 left in the second period to tie the game.

Hoffman was called upon to kick a 22-yard field goal with 8:56 left in the first half, regaining a 10-7 lead for Villanova. The Penguins scored yet again, however, with 5:43 left when Tamron Smith ran for one yard. Youngstown State's point-after kick failed, so the home squad had a 13-10 lead as they went into the locker room at halftime.

The second half began with Villanova's offense stymied on their first possession. But the second time the 'Cats got the ball, they scored. Hoffman trotted out on to the field once more, with 5:38 left in the third period, to nail a 26-yard field goal and tie the game, 13-13. On their very next possession, however, Youngstown State's Jeff Wilkins got into the act, as he kicked a 23 yard field goal to give the Penguins a 16-13 lead.

That's how the scoreboard looked when the fourth quarter began. The Penguins altered it when Tamron Smith scored his second touchdown of the day, with 11:39 remaining, and Wilkins hit the extra point to give Youngstown State a 23-13 lead. Yet the Wildcats wouldn't die, as they marched right back on the ensuing kickoff. Villanova ran 13 plays and marched 59 yards in a drive which culminated in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Tom Colombo to Harold Hart, and a Hoffman PAT. Now it was 23-20, with 7:24 left in the game.

Yet a Villanova victory was not in the cards on this day. The 'Cats fumble on their next possession, then didn't regain possession until there were 27 seconds left in the game. A valiant effort by Colombo, who hit passes for 11 yards (to Mosley) and Scott Donald (8 yards) got the 'Cats to their own 40 yard line. Then Colombo nailed Straughn Lumpkin with a 47-yard completion as the clock wound down. Villanova players, coaches, and fans thought their was still time left; Youngstown's players, coaches and fans were celebrating victory. The officials walked off the field, the contest, and Villanova's season, was over. Colombo was 16-of-19 for 177 yards in the fourth quarter (23-of-41 for 263 yards on the day), while Mosley had 33 carries for a career-high 133 yards and a touchdown, and Curtis Eller had 22 total tackles, but it was Youngstown State that once again went on to play in the National Championship contest.

The Villanova Wildcats made history, as they won the school's first-ever playoff game with a 49-28 win over Colgate. Trailing 28-27 entering the fourth quarter, Villanova tallied 24 last quarter points to win the game going away. Sophomore quarterback Chris Boden had a strong game, as he completed 21-of-31 for 305 yards and two touchdowns. Boden also ran for two scores.

After Corey Hill caught an 11-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Vena with 30 seconds left in the third quarter, No. 16 seed Colgate owned a 28-27 lead over top seeded Villanova. The Wildcats quickly responded by scoring three touchdowns in 11 minutes to take a commanding 49-28 advantage with 4:03 remaining in regulation. Boden ran in twice from one-yard out and freshman running back Brian Westbrook scored on a four-yard run to account for the three scores.

Westbrook was sensational for the Wildcats, carrying 17 times for 104 yards and a touchdown for his first-ever 100+ yard rushing game. Westbrook would score three touchdowns on the day, as he made a 38-yard scoring catch and he returned an 89-yard kickoff for a score. He would finish the day with 271 yards of all-purpose offense. Senior wide receivers Brad Finneran (six receptions for 107 yards) and Josh Dolbin (six receptions for 92 yards) led the receiving attack, while senior place kicker Mark Kiefer connected on two field goals. On defense, junior Chris Machovina registered a team-high 11 tackles, while junior cornerback Ademole Turner recorded two interceptions.

Villanova received a scare in the first quarter when All-American wide receiver Brian Finneran went down with a sprained ankle. Finneran managed to play half of the second quarter before being forced to leave the game.

Villanova saw its dream season come to a close on Saturday, Dec. 6, as the Wildcats were eliminated from the playoffs with a 37-34 loss to visiting Youngstown State. With the setback, Villanova finishes the 1997 season with a 12-1 mark. Youngstown State went on to capture the NCAA I-AA National Championship.

The Wildcats started the game in fine fashion, scoring the first three touchdowns of the game to take a 21-0 lead just two minutes into the second quarter. On their first possession, Villanova drove straight down the field and scored on a 19-yard pass from sophomore quarterback Chris Boden to senior wide receiver Brian Finneran. Freshman running back Brian Westbrook scored Villanova's second touchdown on an eight-yard scamper. Senior Josh Dolbin registered Villanova's third touchdown when he caught an 11-yard pass from Boden.

Youngstown State battle right back. Adrian Brown ran in from 23-yards for a score, giving the Penguins their first score of the day. Two minutes later, Youngstown State blocked Mark Kiefer's punt and recovered it in the end zone. The teams went to halftime, with Villanova holding a 21-14 lead.

The 'Cats started the second half as they did in the first, driving 80-yards on the first possession and scoring on a 10-yard pass from Boden to Finneran.

However, at this point, Youngstown State took control of the game, recording 23 unanswered points. The big play of the Penguin comeback, occurred at 2:55 of the third quarter when Jauron Dailey returned a Boden fumble nine yards for a score to tie the game at 28-28.

Trailing 37-28 with 2:25 to play in regulation, Westbrook kept Villanova's hopes alive, by catching a seven-yard pass from Boden, to cut the Penguin lead to 37-34. Following a Wildcat defensive stop, Villanova got the ball back with 1:25 on the clock. After an incomplete pass and a sack, Boden's desperation pass on third down was intercepted and Villanova's dreams of a perfect season came to a close.

Despite playing on a sprained ankle, Brian Finneran tied a school record with 16 receptions for 180 yards and two scores. Boden finished the afternoon 29-of-43 for 323 yards and four touchdowns, while Westbrook gained 97 yards on 17 carries and scored one touchdown. Defensively, sophomore linebackers Shaun Lyons and Dave Heckard led the charge with Lyons making 13 stops and Heckard recording 11 total tackles.

The Villanova University football team overcame a 31-14 second half deficit to beat the visiting Furman Paladins, 45-38 in Division I-AA playoff action. Senior quarterback Brett Gordon passed for 250 yards and three touchdowns en route to breaking Chris Boden's single-season record of 3,707 passing yards.

The Wildcats got on the board on their opening drive, when Gordon found senior Cameron Cross for a seven yard touchdown strike.

Furman then broke onto the scoreboard with 5:55 remaining in the first quarter when Dan Marshall booted a 38 yard field goal through the uprights. Villanova then fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Furman took over on the Wildcat 17 yard line. Senior quarterback Billy Napier put the Paladins ahead on a five yard touchdown scamper.

At the start of the second quarter, Napier led Furman 70 yards down the field, resulting in his second touchdown run of the day. On Villanova's next possession, the Wildcats attempted a fake punt, but were held to no gain and Furman took over on Villanova's 27 yard line. Furman would capitalize on their opportunity as Brandon Berry scored on a three yard run, making the score 24-7.

The Wildcats quickly changed the momentum of the game when Mo Gibson ran Brian Kovach's kickoff back 96 yards for the Villanova touchdown. The score would remain 24-14 heading into the locker room.

The Paladins used their opening possession of the second half to drive 79 yards, culminating in a Hindley Brigham four yard touchdown run.

From this point, the Villanova offense would come back to score 17 unanswered points to take a 38-31 lead with just 6:19 to go in the game. Gibson started the offensive attack when he capped off an eight-play, 80 yard drive with an 11 yard run. On the drive, Gordon completed a 15 yard pass to Brian White and an 18 yard strike to tight end Matt Chila to move the 'Cats down the field.

The Wildcats defense received two big plays from Jamison Young to force Furman to punt. Gordon then led the Wildcats 46 yards to set up a 30 yard field goal from Adam James, cutting Furman's lead to 31-24.

Villanova kept its momentum going when Young turned in another fine defensive play, intercepting a Napier pass across the middle and returning it to the Furman 29 yard line. Gordon followed with four completions, culminating in a five yard touchdown strike to White. James' extra point was good, knotting the score at 31-31 with 9 minutes remaining in the game.

On the following kickoff, senior Darnell Greene forced a fumble, which was recovered by Villanova's Gary Johnson. Johnson took the ball 16 yards to the Furman 39 yard line. The Wildcats took advantage of their field position with Gordon completing four of his next five attempts. On first and goal, Gordon rolled out and found Chila in the back of the end zone, putting Villanova ahead for the first time since the first quarter. James' extra point attempt put the Wildcats ahead 38-31 with 6:19 left to play.

Napier then moved the Paladins 74 yards, completing four passes for 50 yards, setting up Torico O'Neal's 16 yard touchdown run. Marshall split the uprights, tying the game at 38.

With 3:58 remaining, the Villanova offense took the field. Terry Butler's 12 yard run gave Villanova a first down at their own 41 yard line. Villanova kept the chains moving when Gordon hit White cutting across the middle for a 30 yard completion. On the next play from scrimmage, Butler took the ball 24 yards up the middle, giving the Wildcats a first down at the Furman five yard line. Butler then gave Villanova the lead with a five yard touchdown run with 3:08 to go.

Leading the way offensively for the Wildcats was Gordon who finished 27 for 40 with 250 yards and three touchdowns. Gibson added two scores, while Butler, White and Chila all added one. Defensively, Young finished with 11 tackles, five of which were for a loss and one interception.

On Saturday, Dec. 7, at Villanova Stadium, senior Brett Gordon completed 26-of-30 passes for 219 yards and two touchdowns, leading Villanova to a 24-10 victory over Fordham in the Division I-AA playoff quarterfinals. With the win, the Wildcats improve to 11-3 overall on the year and advance to the semifinals of the I-AA playoffs for the first time in school history.

Villanova got on the scoreboard first as Adam James kicked a 27-yard field goal with 8:32 remaining in the first quarter.

With 2:58 remaining in the half and the Wildcats still clinging to a 3-0 advantage, Villanova used a little bit of offensive trickery to add to its lead. Gordon hit senior wideout Brian White who lateraled the ball to freshman Mo Gibson. Gibson scampered 25 yards off the hook and ladder for a Villanova touchdown to give the 'Cats a 10-0 halftime lead.

Fordham (10-3) struck first in the second half on a 31-yard field goal by Matt Fordyce to slice the Wildcats' lead to 10-3. Villanova followed with a 14-play, 66-yard scoring drive in a span of 6:39 on the next possession, as Butler took the ball in from four yards out to increase the margin to 17-3.

The Rams caught a break at the beginning of the fourth quarter as Chris Anzano blocked a James' punt which Fordham's Adam Foley recovered and returned to the Villanova one-yard line. Two plays later, Kirwin Watson rushed in from one yard out for a Ram touchdown to cut the lead to 17-10.

The Fordham defense was unable to stop a determined Wildcat offensive attack. Villanova ate up 6:20 of the clock with a 13-play-76yard drive resulting in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Gordon to Butler giving the 'Cats a 24-10 lead with only 3:20 left in the game.

The Rams were unable to capitalize down the stretch on a stingy Villanova defense, as the Wildcats went on for the 24-10 victory.

Gordon, who played most of the game with an injured thumb on his throwing hand, finished the day 26-of-30 for 216 yards and two touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Shaz Brown (50 yard) and junior tight end Matt Chila (44 yards) each caught five passes in the contest.

Villanova used an effective ground game in the win running for 129 yards. Butler rushed for 81 yards on 19 carries and had one score, in addition to catching three passes for 33 yards and one touchdown.

On defense for the 'Cats, Isaiah Harrison and Darnell Greene each posted seven tackles, while senior Jamison Young had six tackles, two tackles for a loss and one sack in his final career home game.

Fordham, which was averaging 34 points per game going into the contest, managed only 193 total yards. Kevin Eakin went 16-for-32 for 115 yards and threw two interceptions.

The Wildcats, making their first semifinal appearance, led 21-7 at halftime before McNeese scored 26 straight points.

After Sams' touchdown catch, Jermaine Martin scored on a 36-yard reverse to make it 33-21. Villanova's Phil DiGiacomo scored on a 6-yard run with 7:43 left to play to cut the Cowboys' lead to 33-28, but Jacob Prim sealed the win for McNeese when he scored on a 14-yard run in the final seconds.

Gordon threw first-half touchdown passes of 5 yards to Matt Chila and 14 yards to Shaz Brown. His 57-yarder to Noble Champen set up Terry Butler's 1-yard run for a 21-7 Wildcat lead.

McNeese's only score in the first half came on Achil Fairchild's 45-yard interception return.

Matt Szczur returned the opening kickoff 91 yards for a score and added two more touchdowns as Villanova cruised to a 55-28 win over Colgate in the first round of the NCAA Division I Championship at Villanova Stadium.

Villanova won its fifth straight game and picked up its first playoff victory since 2002, when it advanced to the semifinals before losing to McNeese State.

Jordan Scott scored three touchdowns for Patriot League champion Colgate, which had its eight-game winning streak snapped. It was Colgate's first loss since falling to Furman, 42-21, on Sept. 13.

Szczur gave the Wildcats a quick 6-0 lead 13 seconds into the game. Before Joe Marcoux's PAT attempt missed wide right, the game was delayed nearly 15 minutes as Villanova safety Darrel Young was carted off the field in an ambulance with a neck sprain. He was taken to University of Pennsylvania Hospital, and after the game Villanova coach Andy Talley said all tests came back negative.

Colgate eventually cut the lead to 13-7 when Scott scored on a 2-yard run with 1:22 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats responded with 28 unanswered points for a commanding 41-7 halftime advantage. Four Villanova players scored in the second quarter.

Aaron Ball's 8-yard touchdown run for Villanova came with 1:41 left for the final score of the first half. Ball also scored from 6 yards in the first.

Szczur added a 4-yard run in the second and a 16-yard touchdown reception on a pass from Chris Whitney early in the third.

Rodney Landers threw for three touchdowns and ran for the go-ahead score with 1:38 to play Saturday as top-seeded James Madison rallied to beat Villanova 31-27 in the Football Championship Subdivision quarterfinals.

Sophomore quarterback Chris Whitney was 13-for-20 for a career-high 213 yards for the Wildcats, and sophomore wide receiver Matt Szczur had a 2-yard touchdown run.

The Dukes trailed only once, after Szczur's 13-yard touchdown pass to Stephen Pimm out of the Wildcat formation with 6:54 left. But Landers drove James Madison 54 yards for the go-ahead touchdown and Marcus Haywood intercepted Whitney to end Villanova's comeback hopes.

The Wildcats finished 10-3, and the Dukes advanced to play Montana, the team they beat to win the 2004 national championship, next weekend.

The game was a rematch of a regular-season contest won 23-19 by James Madison on Landers' 35-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass on the final play.

Landers was the hero again this time around, throwing for 157 yards and three touchdowns and rushing for 143 more, including the winning touchdown.

Whitney brought them within a score with a 26-yard touchdown pass to Brandyn Harvey with 13:51 to play, but a missed extra point left it at 24-20.

After Pimm's touchdown, an excessive celebration penalty forced Villanova to kick off from its 15, and JMU returned the ensuing kickoff to its 46. The Dukes converted a fourth-and-2, getting a 22-yard run by Griff Yancey, and a third-and-4 on the drive before Landers took it in.

Villanova Stadium

Villanova Stadium, home to Wildcat football, field hockey, lacrosse, and track and field teams, has a long and successful tradition. The Wildcats begin their 82nd season of conducting intercollegiate athletic events inside the distinguished on-campus stadium in 2009.

Officially dedicated on October 8, 1927, the Wildcats wasted no time establishing a winning tradition inside their new stadium, winning the opening football contest against Lebanon Valley 32-7. The 'Cats went on to extend their home win streak to 14 games before finally suffering its first football defeat in Villanova Stadium in 1930.

Because this historic site includes two memorials to former Wildcats, alumni and fans often forget that the official name of this complex is Villanova Stadium, as it was originally dedicated back in 1927. The first memorial came soon after Villanova Stadium opened. On October 2, 1928, Leo J. Goodreau, a sophomore on the football team, died as a result of injuries received during football practice. On May 7, 1930, his classmates dedicated the playing field to his memory, with a plaque located at the main entrance to the stadium. On September 27, 1980, the track encircling Goodreau Field was dedicated to longtime Villanova track & field coach James "Jumbo" Elliott. Therefore, the 'Cats play football, lacrosse, and field hockey on Goodreau Field, while the track team runs on the Elliott Track, all within Villanova Stadium.

The stadium was originally completed at a cost of \$500,000 in 1927. Able to seat approximately 5,500 spectators, the stadium was recognized as one of the finest on-campus collegiate stadiums in the country. In 1930, the stadium had its first addition as concrete stands on the north side were added, increasing the Villanova Stadium seating capacity to 12,000. While the Wildcats continued to expand on their success inside Villanova Stadium, the stadium itself remained relatively unchanged until 1958 when the seating capacity was again increased. Extending the seating in both the north and south seating areas, Villanova Stadium capacity was increased to 13,400. A re-configuring of seats, and replacement of the entire seating with new aluminum bleachers in the summer of 1990 reduced the seating capacity of Villanova Stadium to its current 12,000.

In 1980, Villanova undertook a \$1.3 million renovation of the playing surfaces inside the stadium. The old grass playing field and the 'Cats' legendary cinder track were torn up and removed and replaced by an AstroTurf playing field and an eight-lane, Rubaturf 400-meter track. Com-

pleted in August 1980, Villanova's new track was officially dedicated the Jumbo Elliott Track on September 27, 1980 in honor of the Wildcat's legendary track and field coach. Twenty-two former track Olympians from Villanova and a score of other Wildcat track and field greats gathered for the official track dedication during halftime of the sold out Villanova – Boston College homecoming football game, a contest the Wildcats won with an impressive 20-9 showing.

In November of 1980, six 100-foot light towers, three on the north and three on the south sides of Villanova Stadium, were installed giving Villanova's historic stadium the capability of evening and night time use. Prior to 1980, there had been one night football game in Villanova Stadium, a 20-20 tie with the Parris Island Marines on October 31, 1952. It wasn't until November 19, 1987, in front of a national ESPN cable television audience, Villanova faced NCAA I-AA No. 1 ranked Holy Cross in the stadium's first-ever intercollegiate night football game.

New to Villanova Stadium in the fall of 1992 was a fresh AstroTurf-8 playing field, and Rekor-tan-S track. Installed in the summer of 1992, the \$1.25 million project began after Villanova's commencement exercises were concluded in the Stadium on Sunday, May 10. The next day, work began on the refurbishment of the playing field and track. The original AstroTurf and Rubaturf surfaces, installed during the summer of 1980, were torn up, and the new surfaces installed over the course of three months.

Each year, Villanova Stadium plays host to a wide assortment of athletic contests ranging from CYO and club levels to high school and international events. Hosting all-star athletic events as well as high school championships, the Jumbo Elliott Track annually hosts some of the East's top collegiate track and field meets, including 21 of the last 29 Big East Conference outdoor track and field championships. In November, 1991, the Stadium hosted the NCAA Field Hockey

National Championship, won by Old Dominion University. In the fall of 1998, Villanova Stadium was the site of the 1998 Big East Field Hockey Championship.

In the fall of 1999, the Stadium underwent yet another face-lift with the Stadium Renovation Project. Included in this project was a state of the art press box that included a first class facility for both print and radio media to use, in addition to housing an 80-person meeting room for all Villanova Athletic Department personnel to use.

Yet, most of all, Villanova Stadium is known for Wildcat Football. Since making their debut in Villanova Stadium back in 1927, the Wildcats have compiled an impressive 205-85-5 overall won-loss-tie record on their home field, for a .698 winning percentage. Since the revival of Wildcat Football in 1985, Villanova under head coach Andy Talley is 95-37-0 at Villanova Stadium, and 53-29 in home conference contests.

There was a new look to Villanova Stadium in 2002, as the former Astro-turf playing field was replaced during the spring of 2002 with a synthetic grass surface known as AstroPlay.

The Jumbo Elliott Track underwent a remodeling effort in the summer of 2007. Installed was a BSS 1000, 13 mm dual durometer, full pour polyurethane track system. The new track surface will provide the Wildcat Track & Field Program with a first class running venue.
