## WEEKLY WILDCAT NOTES

### WILDCATS SINK THE PIRATES, STAY PERFECT AT HOME

On Wednesday, Oct. 3, at the Villanova Soccer Complex, the Villanova women's soccer team remained perfect at home thus far in 2001 by shutting out Seton Hall, 3-0, behind a balanced offensive and defensive attack. The Wildcats are 4-0 at home this season, and have won six consecutive games overall at the Villanova Soccer Complex dating back to last season. The Wildcats' victory was their first Big East Conference win of the season, improving their record to 7-2-1 overall and 1-2-0 in conference play. Wednesday's win also put head coach Ann Clifton just one win shy of the 50-win plateau, as she currently owns a 49-35-5 record in just her fifth season on the Main Line. The Pirates fell to 3-6-1 overall and 0-4-0 in the Big East.

Villanova came into the game on the offensive, looking to tie up the overall series with Seton Hall at four. The Wildcats scored 5:29 into regulation, as a cross by junior Julie Battista was tipped by fellow junior Quinn Sellers over the head of Pirate goalkeeper Heather Hinton to give Villanova a 1-0 advantage. The goal was Sellers' eighth of the season.

Just 6:16 into the second half, Villanova added to its lead. Sophomore forward Janessa Jeltema fed the ball to Sellers on a breakaway. Sellers took the ball all the way to the net before dishing the ball to a wide-open Regina Villari on the left side of the goal. The freshman found the back of the net for her third goal of the season to give the Wildcats a 2-0 lead. Jeltema and Sellers were both credited with assists on Villari's goal.

Villanova put the game away at the 81:17 mark, as senior Jessica Panchaud got the rebound off a Jeltema shot and beat Hinton to give the 'Cats a 3-0 victory.

Schillig notched her third shutout of the season in net for Villanova, saving seven shots on the afternoon. Hinton stopped a game-high nine shots in the loss.

## GAME-BY-GAME

## Game One

**Villanova 6, St. Bonaventure 0**  
**August 31, 2001**  
**Villanova, Pa.**



VILLANOVA, PA. - In the 2001 season opener for the Villanova University women's soccer team on Friday, Aug. 31, at the Villanova Soccer Complex, the Wildcats used a well balanced attack and got three goals and three assists from their freshman class to cruise past St. Bonaventure by the score of 6-0. The win improved Villanova's record to 1-0-0 on the season, while the Bonnies fell to 0-1-0.

The Wildcats broke open the scoring just 2:24 into regulation when junior Quinn Sellers took a cross from fellow junior Kristen Dunst and beat St. Bonaventure goalkeeper Karen Cunningham to the left to give Villanova an early 1-0 lead. At the 24 minute mark the Wildcats looked to increase their lead, but a blast off the foot of senior Dyane Noonan found the cross bar and a rebound from Sellers was saved by Cunningham.

Villanova would increase its advantage just under two minutes later, as sophomore Candice MacDonald received a pass from freshman Erica Stewart, found an opening, and beat Cunningham from 20 yards out to pad the Wildcat lead to 2-0.

With just under seven minutes left in the first half, Villanova claimed a commanding 3-0 advantage. Freshman Laurie Johnson got a hold of a loose ball and beat Cunningham in the right corner. Senior Jessica Painchaud and junior transfer Alison Bimba were credited with assists on Johnson's goal.

The Wildcat defense was stellar in the first half of play, led by senior Dyane Noonan, junior Jill DiBerardino and redshirt freshman Michelle Biehl. The Villanova backs held the Bonnies to just one shot on goal in the first half as the 'Cats went into the half with a 3-0 lead.

The second half began much like the first, as Villanova scored under 10 minutes into the half. Johnson found Stewart with a touch pass, and Stewart fed freshman Regina Villari who drilled a shot past Cunningham from 10 yards out to increase the Wildcat advantage to four goals.


Five minutes later Villanova capitalized on a corner kick, as Johnson took junior Julie Battista's corner and headed it into the net to make it a 5-0 game. The Wildcats put the finishing touches on St. Bonaventure at the 80:15 mark, as Dunst passed the ball to an open Angela Scialdone right in front of the goal on the left side. Scialdone snuck the ball past Cunningham for her first goal of the season, giving Villanova a 6-0 victory.

Sophomore Chrissy Dolan got the shutout in goal for the Wildcats, saving three shots on the afternoon. Thanks to a tremendous defensive showing by the 'Cats, Villanova outshot the Bonnies by a 28-3 margin.

On the offensive front, Johnson left the Wildcats with two goals and one assist. Stewart and Dunst each tallied a game-high two assists in the contest. In goal for St. Bonaventure in the loss, Cunningham saved a game-high 12 shots.

## Game Two

**Villanova 1, Manhattan 1 (2OT)**  
**September 4, 2001**  
**Riverdale, N.Y.**



RIVERDALE, N.Y. - On Tuesday, Sept. 4, on a warm rainy afternoon in Riverdale, N.Y., the Villanova women's soccer team played Manhattan College to a 1-1 tie as junior forward Quinn Sellers scored the game-tying goal with less than 10 minutes remaining in regulation. With Tuesday's tie, the Wildcats own a 1-0-1 overall record, while the Jaspers of Manhattan stand at 0-2-1.

The two teams were only able to combine for eight first half shots, with Villanova outshooting Manhattan 7-1. Neither squad was able to find the back of the net, however, as the game went into the half scoreless.

At the 69:10 mark of the second half, the Jaspers were finally able to get on the scoreboard. Midfielder Kristin Stroppel fed forward Tina Liedl, who beat Wildcat goalkeeper Chrissy Dolan from 10 yards out to give Manhattan the 1-0 lead.

Refusing to let the game slip away, Villanova staged a rally with just under 10 minutes left in the contest. Sellers sent a looping shot over the head of Jasper goalkeeper Jeanne Gilbert to tie the game at 1-1. Senior Jessica Painchaud and redshirt freshman Michelle Biehl assisted on the Sellers' goal for the 'Cats.

Thanks to an outstanding performance in goal by Gilbert, Manhattan was able to keep the Wildcats from scoring throughout the remainder of regulation despite a decisive lead in total shots by Villanova.

In overtime, both the Wildcats and Jaspers staged off several scoring chances by the opposition to end the contest in a 1-1 tie.

Dolan totaled two saves in goal for Villanova, while Gilbert recorded a game-high nine saves. The Wildcats outshot the Jaspers 28-8 in the game, but were unable to capitalize on Gilbert.

### GAME-BY-GAME

#### Game Three

Villanova 4, Marist 0  
September 7, 2001  
Villanova, Pa.



VILLANOVA, PA. - On Friday, Sept. 7, at the Villanova Soccer Complex, the Villanova University women's soccer team scored four second half scores to break open a scoreless game as the Wildcats went on for a 4-0 victory over Marist College. Two of Villanova's four second half goals came on penalty kicks, including the first collegiate goal by redshirt freshman Michelle Biehl. With Friday's win, the Wildcats improve to 2-0-1 overall on the season, while the Red Foxes fall to 0-3-0.

Villanova dominated play in the first half outshooting Marist 12-2. The Wildcats were unable to get on the scoreboard, however, as Red Fox goalkeeper Mellanie Nai saved seven first half shots.

With the game still scoreless in the second half, Wildcat senior Jessica Painchaud was taken down in front of the net on a scoring chance at the 66:17 mark. Villanova was awarded a penalty kick, which Biehl blasted past Nai for her first Wildcat goal. Less than a minute later, Painchaud was again taken down in front of the net. Given a penalty kick once again, Villanova added to their lead as freshman Erica Stewart beat Nai to the right to increase the Wildcat lead to 2-0.

At the 85:44 mark, the Villanova offense kept plugging away at sophomore Candice MacDonald found fellow sophomore Janessa Jeltema who beat the goalkeeper one-on-one from five yards away. The Wildcats put the game away with 2:08 to go in regulation. Junior forward Quinn Sellers took advantage of a Marist turnover, taking a shot from 10 yards out and beating Nai to her right to cap off a 4-0 victory for the 'Cats.

Getting the shutout in goal for Villanova was sophomore Chrissy Dolan, who saved two shots on the afternoon. Nai took the loss in net for the Red Foxes, despite saving a game-high 16 shots.

#### Game Four

Villanova 5, UMBC 2

VILLANOVA, PA. - In front of 400-plus fans at the Villanova Soccer Complex on Sunday, Sept. 9, the Villanova University women's soccer team rallied from a 2-0 halftime deficit, scoring five unanswered goal in the second half to defeat the University of Maryland Baltimore County by the score of 5-2. With the victory, the Wildcats' record improves to 3-0-1 overall on the season, while the Retrievers of UMBC falls to 1-2-0.

UMBC scored the game's first goal just 3:01 into regulation, as Jessa Karko knocked in a direct kick from teammate Viviana Saraceno. At the 17:05 mark of the first half, the Retrievers added to their lead as Laura Motley deflected in a shot by Missy Moore to give UMBC a 2-0 lead. Despite outshooting the Retrievers 9-6 in the first half, Villanova went into intermission down by two goals. UMBC goalkeeper Becky Hicock had four saves in the first half.

Just over six minutes into the second half, the Wildcats finally got on the scoreboard. Sophomore Candice MacDonald took a shot that struck the crossbar. MacDonald got the rebound off her own shot and took a second attempt at the net that was deflected into the goal by teammate Kristin Dunst for Villanova's first goal.

The Wildcats tied the contest at 2-2 just 5:33 later, as Dunst sent a cross to the left of the goal which junior Quinn Sellers knocked past Hicock. Villanova took its first lead of the game at the 61:24 mark. Dunst sent a crossing pass into the front of the crease. There was a scramble for the ball in front of the net which sophomore Janessa Jeltema got a hold of and put into the goal for her second goal of the season.

The Wildcat offense was not done. Villanova would add two more goals on tallies by freshman Regina Villari and senior Jessica Painchaud, as the Wildcats went on for the 5-2 victory.

Coming into the game at the half in place of sophomore Chrissy Dolan, who started the game in goal, senior Janell Schillig recorded the win making one save. Hicock got the loss in net for UMBC, despite making a game-high 10 saves.

## Game Five

Villanova 2, Virginia Tech 0  
September 17, 2001

BLACKSBURG, VA. - On Monday, Sept. 17, in Blacksburg, Va., the Villanova women's soccer team spoiled what was the first-ever Big East Conference game for Virginia Tech, blanking the Hokies by the score of 2-0. The contest had a number of highlights for the Wildcats, including a shutout in net from senior goalkeeper Janel Schillig, and one goal apiece compliments of freshmen Laura Johnson and Erica Stewart. With the win, Villanova remained unbeaten at 4-0-1 overall, and improved to 1-0-0 in the Big East.

With the game still scoreless and less than 10 minutes remaining in the first half, the Wildcat offense finally broke open the scoring. Johnson scored her third goal of the season for Villanova at the 36:06 mark, giving the 'Cats a 1-0 advantage heading into intermission.

The Villanova defense kept up its tremendous work in the second half, as Dyane Noonan, Jill DiBerardino, Michelle Biehl and company held Virginia Tech (2-2-1) to just three shots after intermission.

The Wildcats put the game away at the 76:22 mark as Stewart scored her second goal of her freshman campaign - a scoring strike that was assisted by fellow freshman Patricia Misciagna and junior Kristin Dunst.




