All-Time Greatest Games

Calvin Coolidge was in the White House, Franklin Roosevelt an obscure bureaucrat from New York and Babe Ruth a recently converted pitcher.

It was 1920 and Villanova University played its first college basketball contest, a 43-40 victory over Catholic University. Since that occasion the Wildcats have played more than 2,000 games, including several that are regarded as some of the sport's landmarks.

Here are a few of the most meaningful contests, a retrospective compiled by Skip Clayton and former Media Relations Director Karen Frasca in 1996 and updated annually.

February 23, 1952

Villanova 64, Duquesne 62

In one of the many exciting contests played at the famed Palestra, Villanova outlasted No. 4-ranked Duquesne in overtime by a score of 64-62. Larry Hennessy led all scorers with 27 points, while Jim Mooney pitched in with 10 points. Hennessy's performance was so inspiring, that the largest collegiate crowd of the season gave him a standing ovation.

December 11, 1954

Villanova 76, St. Francis (PA) 71

The Wildcats come storming back after falling behind by as many as 17 points in the second half. The Palestra crowd went wild as Villanova finished the game with a scoring barrage, winning 76-71. The Wildcats' great scorer, Bob Schafer, exploded for 37 points, with Jack Devine putting in a fine defensive performance.

January 29, 1955

Villanova 107, N.C. State 96

Villanova defeated the Wolfpack on the road for the second time that season. N.C. State finished the year with a No. 4 ranking, and Ron Shavlik set a single-game record for the most points (49) and most rebounds (35) by a Villanova opponent. The Wildcats were led by Allen Griffith with 23 points, Bob Schafer with 21 and Jack Devine with 20 in the contest.



Hubie White scored 16 points in a 65-63 victory over La Salle during the 1961-62 season.

December 30, 1961

Villanova 69, Iowa 56

The Wildcats won their first-ever regular-season tournament championship with a 69-56 victory over Iowa in the title game of the Quaker City Tournament in the Palestra. George Leftwich paced four Villanova double-figure scorers with 18 points on nine-for-16 shooting, while Hubie White added 17 points and seven rebounds.

February 24, 1962

Villanova 65, LaSalle 63

Villanova wrapped up its first-ever City Series title at the Palestra in a 65-63 win over the Explorers. Wali Jones hit seven-of-12 from the floor to finish the game with 18 points, while Hubie White added 16 points and 11 boards. A crowd of 9,232 in Philadelphia cheered the Wildcats on to victory.

March 3, 1962

Villanova 66, St. Joseph's 59

The Wildcats' 66-59 victory over St. Joseph's that season marked the first time Villanova had defeated the Hawks since the formation of the Big Five. Hubie White was the hero of the contest, posting a game-high 23 points and 17 rebounds, while Jim O'Brien also contributed 17 boards to go with 13 points. Villanova finished the campaign an undefeated 4-0 in City Series games.

March 20, 1971

Villanova 90, Pennsylvania 47

Howard Porter scored 35 points to lead the Wildcats to a 90-47 victory over the Quakers in Raleigh, N.C., to advance to the Final Four. Jack Kraft said following the game that "I don't think we made a mistake in the first half."

March 25, 1971

Villanova 92, Western Ky. 89

Hank Siemiontkowski hit 11-of-20 shots from the field, scoring a game-high 31 points to lead Villanova into the national championship game. Howard Porter added 22 points and 16 rebounds, while Clarence Smith registered 13 points and 11 boards. The Wildcats shot 49 percent from the field and limited Western Kentucky to only 37.1 shooting in the national semi-final that went into double overtime. *(for more information, see page 137)*

December 30, 1971

Villanova 77, South Carolina 76

Tom Ingelsby and Chris Ford proved to be too much for the Gamecocks, as the Wildcats earned a one-point victory, 77-76, to earn the Quaker City Tournament at the Palestra. Ingelsby scored 28 points on 12-for-20 shooting, while Ford posted 18 and Ed Hastings added 13. South Carolina finished the year ranked No. 5 in the Associated Press poll and No. 6 in the UPI poll.

March 4, 1978

Villanova 63, West Virginia 59

Led by 19 points from Alex Bradley, Villanova earned a 63-59 victory over the Mountaineers to win the the EAA Tournament in the Civic Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa. Keith Herron contributed 14 points



and Reggie Robinson 12, while Rory Sparrow dished out seven assists in the game. Villanova shot 52 percent from the field in the game.

January 31, 1983

Villanova 68, Georgetown 67

The Wildcats posted their first-ever Big East Conference victory over Georgetown, 68-67, behind 27 points and 22 rebounds from Ed Pinckney. The Hoyas lost four players to fouls, including Patrick Ewing, who had eight points. David Wingate led Georgetown with 16 points. Villanova did not take the lead until there were only eight seconds remaining in the game.

February 13, 1983

Villanova 56, North Carolina 53

Villanova defeated Michael Jordan and the North Carolina Tar Heels, 56-53, in Chapel Hill, N.C., for its first-ever victory over the No. 1-ranked Tar Heels. John Pinone paced the Wildcats with 14 points and seven rebounds, while Ed Pinckney had 11 points and 11 boards. Jordan recorded a game-high 20 points, while Sam Perkins added 15 points.

January 12, 1984

Villanova 65, Georgetown 63

Villanova defeated Georgetown for the first time on the road in Big East play, upending the Hoyas 65-63 in double overtime in the Capital Centre. Harold Pressley led all scorers with 17 points, while Ed Pinckney registered 16. Patrick Ewing posted 14 points and 15 rebounds in the contest.

April 1, 1985

Villanova 66, Georgetown 64

In what is still one of the greatest NCAA Championship games ever played, Villanova upset Georgetown, 66-64, to win the national title in Lexington, Ky. Dwayne McClain scored 17 points, Ed Pinckney 16, and Harold Jensen 14 to pace Villanova to the legendary win for Rollie Massimino. David Wingate led Georgetown with 16 points.

February 15, 1986

Villanova 90, Georgetown 88

Harold Pressley scored 34 points on 14-of-17 shooting from the field to lead Villanova to a 90-88 double-overtime win over the Hoyas in the Spectrum. Harold Jensen added 16 points and Doug West 15 in the victory, while Reggie Williams posted 26 points for the Hoyas.

February 15, 1994

Villanova 64, Connecticut 63

Villanova defeated the nation's No. 1 team, Connecticut by a 64-63 score in The Pavilion. Kerry Kittles posted 24 points, while Jason Lawson and



Brooks Sales' two free throws with 21 seconds left helped lift Villanova past UCLA in 2002.

Eric Eberz both had 12 points. Donyell Marshall scored 24 points for the Huskies. The Villanova crowd stormed the arena floor after time ran out, signaling the resurgence of Wildcat basketball.

March 30, 1994

Villanova 80, Vanderbilt 73

Villanova captured the NIT championship with an 80-73 win over Vanderbilt in Madison Square Garden. Jonathan Haynes led the Wildcats with 19 points, while Kerry Kittles posted 18 and Eric Eberz 16 in the game. The Wildcats came storming back after falling behind by a 41-26 score at halftime.

February 18, 1995

Villanova 96, Connecticut 73

Kerry Kittles posted 37 points to lead the Wildcats to a 96-73 victory over No. 1-ranked Connecticut in Gampel Pavilion. Eric Eberz scored 23 points, Alvin Williams 12, and Jason Lawson 11. Kittles converted 12-of-18 from the field, including five-of-10 from three-point range to halt the Huskies reign atop the polls.

March 11, 1995

Villanova 94, Connecticut 78

Jason Lawson and Kerry Kittles each scored 27 points to lead Villanova to its first-ever Big East

Tournament Championship. The Wildcats defeated Connecticut 94-78, marking the second-straight time the Wildcats had upended the Huskies that season. Kittles earned Tournament MVP and Lawson a spot on the All-Tournament team in the exciting victory.

February 27, 1999

Villanova 66, St. John's 60

Before a national television audience and vibrant Pavilion crowd on Senior Day, the Wildcats upended No. 8 ranked St. John's and locked up an NCAA Tournament berth. John Celestand scored 18 points and Malik Allen added 14, including two huge baskets after the Red Storm tied the contest at 60 with just over two minutes remaining. At game's end, the crowd charged the floor.

February 9, 2002

Villanova 58, UCLA 57

With the members of the 1971 NCAA Final squad in the Pavilion, Villanova rallied from a four point deficit in the final three minutes to upend the No. 16 rated Bruins. Gary Buchanan drained a pair of huge 3-point field goals in the final three minutes and Brooks Sales calmly sank two free throws with 26 seconds left in regulation to provide the final margin of victory before a CBS national audience.
