**NEW HAMPSHIRE REPORT:** The Wildcats enter play this week ranked No. 1 in all of NCAA Division I-AA football with a 3-0 overall record and a 1-0 Atlantic 10 Conference mark. New Hampshire has beaten UC Davis (16-13), Towson (62-21) and Dartmouth (49-20). In last week's win over Dartmouth, the Wildcats amassed 547 yards of total offense, including 280 yards on the ground and 267 yards in the air. Individually, quarterback Ricky Santos led the way against Dartmouth by completing 24-of-32 for 267 yards and three touchdowns. Junior wideout David Ball made four catches for 64 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, redshirt freshman linebacker Matt Parent had nine tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack.

For the year, Santos has completed 79-of-112 (70.5%) for 1,025 yards to go with seven touchdowns and four interceptions. Ball has been Santos' favorite target with 20 catches for 353 yards and four scores. On the ground, senior John McCoy leads the way with 143 yards on 27 carries (5.3 yards per rush) and two scores. Sophomore safety Jeff Pammer has made a team-best 34 tackles.

In the pre-season Atlantic 10 coaches poll, New Hampshire was picked to finish in a first place tie with Massachusetts in the North Division.

**WILDCAT HEAD COACH SEAN MCDONNELL:** Sean McDonnell is in his seventh season as head coach at New Hampshire, and is with the program for the 14th season overall. He is 36-36 in his career with the Wildcats entering Saturday's game. In 2004, McDonnell's hard work rebuilding the program paid off with a 10-3 record overall and a 6-2 mark in the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. New Hampshire earned the Northern Division title and earned a bid to the NCAA I-AA Championships for the first time since 1994. The Wildcats reached the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals. New Hampshire upset Georgia Southern in the first round, and McDonnell was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award, was selected District Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and was Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year. McDonnell has been the head coach since 1999, when he took over the program he had been an assistant coach under for eight years. McDonnell is also a New Hampshire alum, having graduated in 1978.

**TALLEY'S TENURE:** Currently in his 21st season on the Main Line, head coach Andy Talley can feel responsible for every facet of the Villanova football program, having started it from scratch in 1985. In his Villanova career, Talley has recorded a 140-83-1 mark, making him the all-time winningest coach in Villanova history. Talley's 26-year overall coaching record currently stands at 168-101-2. During his career as the Wildcat mentor, Talley has guided Villanova to six NCAA playoff appearances, four conference titles and two Lambert Meadowlands Trophies. In 1997, Talley garnered the Eddie Robinson Award and the AFCA/GTE National Coach of the Year Award.

**ON THE TUBE:** For the third straight week, Villanova Football can be seen live on television. This Saturday's game at New Hampshire will be televised on CN8 at 12:30 p.m. The Delaware game on Nov. 19 will also be carried by CN8.

**HITTING THE ROAD:** Villanova begins a three-game road trip this Saturday at New Hampshire. Following the New Hampshire game, the Wildcats travel to Richmond on Oct. 8 and Bucknell on Oct. 15. The team returns home on Oct. 22 to host Rhode Island in a homecoming contest.

**PLAYING THE BEST:** Villanova will be playing the number one ranked team in I-AA football this week when the Wildcats travel to New Hampshire. In the latest *Sports Network* poll released on Monday, Sept. 26, New Hampshire owns the top spot with 2,760 points. Southern Illinois is second with 2,603 points. Saturday's game will mark the first time that Villanova has ever played a number one ranked team during the regular season. The last highest rated team that Villanova has played in the regular season was No. 2 Massachusetts on Sept. 18, 1999. In that contest, Villanova tallied a 26-21 victory.

**SERIES MOMENTUM:** Villanova holds a 9-7 advantage in the all-time series against New Hampshire. After New Hampshire won six of the first nine meetings, Villanova has had the upper hand of late, winning six of the last seven in the series. A big reason why Villanova has won six of the last seven versus New Hampshire is due in large part to the play of the Villanova offense. In the last seven games versus New Hampshire, Villanova has averaged 39.1 points per game and have tallied 30 or more points in six of the seven contests.

**SUCCESSFUL STRETCH:** This Saturday, the Wildcats will travel to a place where they have had success recently. Villanova enters play Saturday having won three in a row at New Hampshire's Cowell Stadium. In their last trip to New Hampshire, the Wildcats registered a 48-14 win on Sept. 13, 2003.

**AIR ATTACK:** Sophomore quarterback **Frank Jankowski** posted his first career 300-yard passing game in Saturday's 28-24 win over Penn. In the victory, Jankowski completed 23-of-36 for 345 yards to go with four touchdowns and two interceptions. Jankowski threw three of his four scoring strikes in the second half to help lead the Wildcats back from a 24-7 deficit. After three games, Jankowski has completed 56-of-93 (60.2%) for 795 yards. He also has five touchdowns and three interceptions to his credit.

**TWO FOR 100:** Villanova had two receivers reach the 100-yard receiving mark last Saturday versus Penn. Senior **J.J. Outlaw** led the way with eight receptions for 103 yards and one touchdown, while senior **John Dieser** had five catches for 102 yards and a score. Dieser's 26-yard scoring catch with 2:29 left in the fourth quarter proved to be the game-winner.

**CATCHING ON:** Senior wide receiver **J.J. Outlaw** continues to climb on Villanova's career reception list. Entering play this Saturday at New Hampshire, Outlaw ranks ninth all-time on Villanova's career list and is just four receptions shy of the eighth position. After three games, Outlaw has 21 receptions for 258 yards, and one score. As a junior last year, Outlaw registered a team-high 57 catches for 686 yards and three scores, 28 rushes for 204 yards and one score, 24 punt returns for 247 yards and 16 kickoff returns for 235 yards. All total, Outlaw averaged 124.7 of all-purpose offense per game en route to earning third team All-Atlantic 10 distinction. Outlaw was a first team All-Conference selection as a sophomore in 2003 when he averaged 135.5 yards of all-purpose offense per game.

**400 IN SIGHT:** The Villanova defense was led last week for the third consecutive game by the play of senior linebacker **Brian Hulea**. In the win, Hulea had his third-straight double figure tackle game with 10 total stops. In addition to the 10 tackles, he also had a fumble recovery and a tackle for loss. Entering play on Saturday at New Hampshire, he has 334 career tackles which ranks as the most of any active player in the Atlantic 10. With 66 more tackles, Hulea will become just the third player in Villanova history to record 400 career tackles. Curtis Eller (1989-92) owns the school record for career tackles with 429, while Shaun Lyons is second with 410. After three games this year, Hulea has registered 38 tackles.

**SOLO ACT:** Villanova is led in solo tackles by junior safety **Allyn Bacchus**. In three games this year, Bacchus has tallied a team-high 19 solo tackles. His 32 total tackles ranks him second on the team behind linebacker Brian Hulea. After a nine tackle performance in week one at Rutgers, Bacchus had 13 tackles versus Northeastern and 10 stops last week against Penn. Bacchus, who has started every game of his Villanova career, will be making his 26th consecutive start this Saturday at New Hampshire.

**BIG TARGET:** The most improved player on the Wildcat offense is sophomore tight end **Matt Sherry**. After three games, Sherry has 10 receptions for 109 yards (10.9 yards per catch) and two touchdowns. Both touchdowns came last week versus Penn. His two scoring receptions came on 10 and seven yard receptions. Sherry had eight catches for 74 yards all of last season.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** The 2005 Villanova Wildcats are one of the younger teams that head coach Andy Talley has had during his Main Line career. In last Saturday's win at Penn, Talley used nine true freshmen and seven redshirt freshmen in the game. Of the 16 first-year performers that played, five earned a start in the game.

**POSITIVE RETURNS:** In the Atlantic 10 statistics released on Monday, Sept. 26, Villanova leads the conference in punt returns with a 20.2 yards per return average. Delaware is second with a 14.9 return average. J.J. Outlaw is Villanova's top return threat with four returns for 57 yards (14.2 yards per return).

**CONFERENCE SUPREMACY:** In the latest *Sports Network* poll released on Monday, Sept. 26, six of the 12 Atlantic 10 teams appear in the Top 25. New Hampshire leads the way at No. 1, followed by Delaware at No. 5, James Madison at No. 6, William & Mary at No. 19, Massachusetts at No. 21 and Hofstra at No. 23.

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Senior running back **Moe Gibson** owns three career kickoff returns for touchdowns. Gibson and former Villanova star and current Philadelphia Eagle Brian Westbrook are the only two players in school history to have at least three kickoff returns for a touchdown. Westbrook totaled a school record five during his Villanova career. As a freshman in 2002, Gibson registered a career-long 96 yard return versus Furman in the first round of the NCAA playoffs, while in 2003 he took the opening kickoff at New Hampshire 90 yards for a score. Last season, he began the William & Mary game by taking the opening kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown. For his career, Gibson has returned 86 kickoffs for 2,003 yards (23.2 yards per return) and three scores.





**PAINFUL BEGINNING:** Villanova had a tough start to its year in the season opener at Rutgers. In addition to suffering a 38-6 loss to the Scarlet Knights, the Wildcats lost starting quarterback **Marvin Burroughs** for the year when the junior signal caller broke his left arm on the first possession of the second half. Before the injury, Burroughs completed 16-of-22 for 150 yards and one touchdown. As a sophomore last season, Burroughs completed 209-of-334 for 2,486 yards to go with 20 touchdowns and 12 interceptions.

**CAPTAINS:** Three fifth-year seniors will serve as captains in 2005. Wide receiver **John Dieser**, linebacker **Brian Hulea** and defensive lineman **Darrell Adams** earned their captain status by a vote of Wildcat players.

**OFFENSIVE OUTPUT:** Dating back to the 1996 campaign, Villanova has averaged 30 points or more in eight of the last nine seasons. The only season where the Wildcats did not average 30 points or more was in 2003 when Villanova averaged 28.5 points per game.

**COACHING CHANGES:** Wildcat head coach Andy Talley will have four new assistant coaches in 2005. On defense, secondary coach **Mark Reardon** has been promoted to defensive coordinator. Reardon replaces Joe Trainer who left to become the head coach at Millersville University. Also, on defense, **Sean Spencer** will be the new linebackers coach, **Brendan Daly** will take over as the defensive line coach and **Billy Crocker** will coach the Wildcat cornerbacks. On the offensive side of the ball, **Brian Flinn** will be the new wide receivers coach. Daly, Flinn and Crocker have previously coached at Villanova and all three will be in their second stint on the Main Line.

**WILDCATS PICKED FOURTH:** In the pre-season Atlantic 10 Conference poll, the Villanova Wildcats were picked to finish fourth in the South Division according to a pre-season poll of the league's 12 head coaches and 18 selected media members.

**NOTE:** In 1999, wide receiver Murle Sango was a second team All-American, while in 2004 defensive end Jamil Butler was a second team All-American selection.

**OVERTIME HISTORY:** During head coach Andy Talley's tenure at Villanova, the Wildcats have played in 10 overtime games and in those 10 games the Wildcats are 7-3. With the double overtime win at Temple on Sept. 6, 2003, Villanova has won five of its last six overtime contests. Of the 10 overtime games, seven have been played at Villanova Stadium. Before the 2003 overtime game with Temple, the Wildcats last overtime contest came in 2001 against James Madison in week four when the 'Cats outlasted the Dukes, 45-44, in double overtime. The last overtime game before the James Madison contest came in 2000 when the Wildcats suffered a 48-41 loss to William & Mary. In 1999, Villanova played two overtime games. On Oct. 16, 1999 Villanova defeated UConn, 48-45, in triple overtime in a game played in Storrs, Conn. In the 1999 season finale at Villanova Stadium, the 'Cats rallied from a 45-24 deficit with 8:37 remaining against Delaware to win a 51-45 thriller in one overtime.

**ACTING PROFESSIONAL:** Three former Villanova products are currently on NFL rosters. Wide receiver **Brian Finneran** (Villanova 1994-97) is currently in his sixth season with the Atlanta Falcons as the team's third wide receiver, while running back **Brian Westbrook** (Villanova 1997-2001) is in his fourth season with the Philadelphia Eagles as the franchise's starting running back. Westbrook became the first Wildcat player to be drafted since Howie Long in 1981 when he was selected in the third round of the 2002 NFL Draft. A newcomer to the NFL ranks is safety **Raymond Ventrone** (Villanova 2001-04) who is a member of the New England Patriot practice squad. Westbrook and Finneran both won the Walter Payton Award, given to the top player in NCAA I-AA football, during their senior seasons at Villanova.

**RADIO INFORMATION:** For the ninth-straight season, 990-AM WNTP will be the flagship station of the Villanova Football Radio Network. Play-by-play announcer Joe Eichhorn, who has been broadcasting Villanova football since 1988, returns to anchor the broadcasts. Joining Eichhorn for an 11th consecutive year is Ryan Fannon. All 11 Wildcat gridiron contests will be broadcast live, with a pre-game show airing either 30 or 60 minutes prior to kickoff.

**ATLANTIC 10 FOOTBALL TELECONFERENCE:** Every Monday from August 29-Nov. 21, the Atlantic 10 will conduct a teleconference from 10 a.m.-12:10 p.m. with each of its head coaches. Each coach will have a 10-minute slot to discuss his team and answer questions from the media. Members of the media are strongly encouraged to participate in the questioning. **PISCATAWAY, N.J.(AP--**Ryan Hart completed 16 of 22 passes for 234 yards and a touchdown as Rutgers snapped a six-game losing streak with a 38-6 victory over Villanova.

Brian Leonard scored two touchdowns for Rutgers (1-1), which ended a two-game losing streak to Division I-AA opponents and avenged a 2002 setback to Villanova (0-1). It also was the Scarlet Knights first win since they beat Temple on Oct. 16, 2004.

The defeat was made tougher for the Wildcats, who had won their last two against I-A teams, when junior quarterback Marvin Burroughs left early in the third quarter. Burroughs injured his left shoulder at the end of a 7-yard run and was later found to have broken the humerus bone in his left arm.

Attempting to rebound after blowing a 20-point lead in a loss to Illinois last week, Rutgers got off to a strong start when Willie Foster returned the opening kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown. It was the longest kickoff return for Rutgers since Gary Melton took one back 94 yards against Northwestern on Sept. 21, 1991.

Villanova, which outgained Rutgers 444-327, cut the lead to 7-6 when Burroughs threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to John Dieser. But Val Barnaby blocked the extra point attempt.

The Scarlet Knights scored on their next two possessions, getting a 2-yard run from Leonard and a 44-yard field goal from Jeremy Ito, who missed four of seven last week.

In the third quarter, Villanova tried a fake punt but was stopped, giving Rutgers the ball at midfield. Three plays later, Hart found Clark Harris with a 15-yard touchdown pass to make it 31-6. Leonard's second touchdown later in the quarter capped the scoring.

Burroughs was 16-for-22 for 150 yards and one touchdown before leaving the game. He also ran for 20 yards on six carries. His replacement Frank Jankowski was 17-for-32 for 209 yards in his first collegiate action, and J.J. Outlaw caught nine passes for 91 yards

## 2005 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 2 Villanova 38, Northeastern 20 Sept. 17, 2005 Villanova, Pa.

**Villanova, Pa.**--In a game marked by a rain delay caused by severe lightning in the area, Villanova (1-1, 1-0 Atlantic 10) defeated Northeastern (0-3, 0-1 A-10) 38-20 at Villanova Stadium in its home opener. The Wildcats won their conference opener for the eighth time in the past 10 years.

Villanova led 13-3 late in the first quarter when a heavy thunderstorm moved through the region and forced a stoppage of play. When the game resumed, the Huskies quickly recorded their first touchdown of the game and closed the gap to 13-10. However, Villanova extended its lead with a pair of touchdowns during the remainder of the quarter, and went into halftime with a 26-10 lead.

Senior linebacker Brian Hulea recovered a fumble for a touchdown with 10:40 left in the period, and sophomore running back Matt Dicken rushed in for a two-yard score with 5:00 remaining.

Dicken tallied 15 carries for 28 yards on the evening, but included two touchdowns in that line. Senior running back Martin Gibson also had 15 carries and collected 80 yards. Sophomore quarterback Frank Jankowski made his first career start and was 16-of-25 for 241 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His touchdown pass was to sophomore wide receiver Anton Ridley, who caught the first touchdown reception of his career with a collegiate-best 27-yard reception.

A Northeastern field goal early in the third period made the score 26-13, but the Wildcats put the game out of reach on a 19-yard field goal by senior kicker Adam James with 6:42 left in the quarter and Ridley's touchdown catch with 4:00 remaining.

The Huskies owned a 351-342 edge in total offense for the game. Quarterbacks Anthony Orio and John Sperrazza combined for 214 passing yards, and Cory Parks totaled 129 receiving yards for the game. Running back Maurice Murray collected 80 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the ground.

The Wildcats return to action next Saturday when the play Penn at Franklin Field at 7 p.m. The game is a home game for Villanova.

**NOTES:** The rain delay began with 42.1 seconds left in the first quarter when severe lightning was spotted in the immediate area ... The delay lasted 1 hour and 20 minutes and the game resumed at 9:15 p.m. ... The delay marked the third time in the last nine years that the Wildcats have endured a lightning delay in a home opener ... The other occasions were also night games, coming in 1997 against West Chester and 2001 against Colgate ... Since beginning conference play at the I-AA level in 1988, the Wildcats are now 13-5 in conference openers. The Wildcats have won eight of their last 10 conference openers and have scored 30 or more points in eight of the 10 contests ... Villanova leads the all-time series with Northeastern by a 9-5 tally, including a 6-1 advantage in games played at Villanova Stadium ... The Wildcats have won their last six home games against Northeastern.

## 2005 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### Game 3 Villanova 28, Penn 24 Sept. 24, 2005 Philadelphia, Pa.

**PHILADELPHIA, Pa.--** Frank Jankowski's 31-yard touchdown pass to John Dieser with 2:29 remaining gave Villanova a 28-24 comeback victory over local rival Penn on Saturday.

Villanova (1-1) had trailed 17-0 in the second quarter and 24-21 with 5:20 left in the game and the ball on its own 11-yard line. Jankowski then hit on five of six passes for 89 yards and the winning score.

Penn (1-1) then moved to the Villanova 3-yard line after a 43-yard desperation pass from Pat McDermott to Dan McDonald with five seconds left. However, Villanova linebacker Bryan Adams then sacked McDermott on the game's final play.

Jankowski hit on 23-of-37 passes for 345 yards and four touchdowns, while McDermott was 25-for-37 for 334 yards and one touchdown.

Penn's Joe Sandberg, playing in place of the injured Sam Mathews, rushed for 104 yards in his first start for the Quakers.

This was the 10th meeting between the schools, but only the ninth since the first game was played in 1905. Penn was the victor in the first five games, but the Wildcats have now won five in a row. The game was played at Penn's Franklin Field because of its larger seating capacity.
