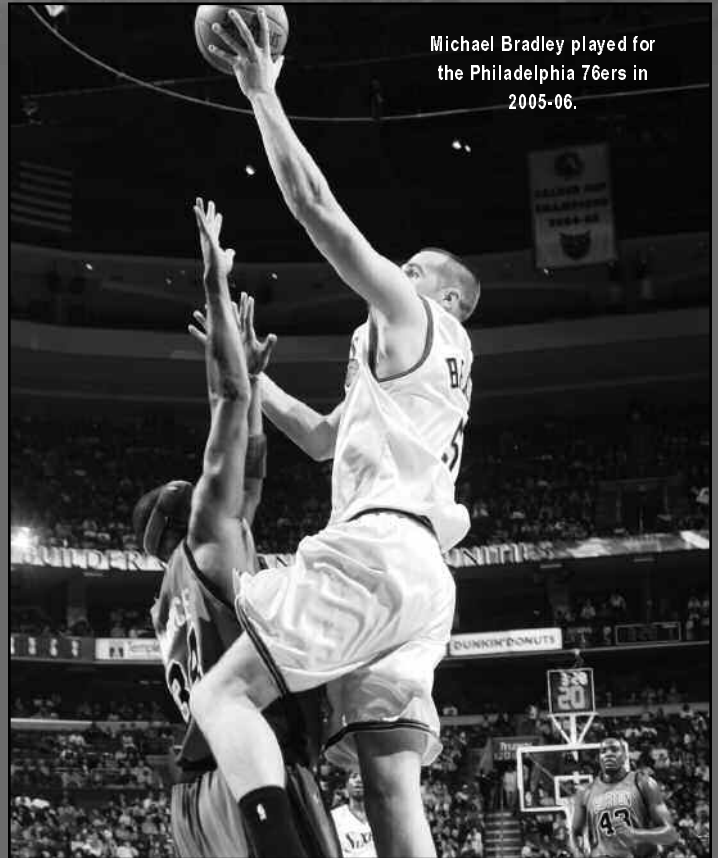

Home Courts: The Pavilion & Wachovia Center

## The Pavilion



Villanova's on-campus home is the Pavilion, a 6,500 seat venue that has been sold out for the Wildcats' last 63 regular season contests in the building.

In addition to being the Wildcats' home for basketball, The Pavilion

also features the Wildcat men's basketball locker room, a Cinema added in 2002, two additional locker rooms, the Villanova men's basketball offices which overlook the facility, an indoor five-lane 200-meter track, additional basketball, tennis and/or volleyball courts, a state of the art media room, and one of the East's finest indoor swimming and diving facilities.

Built at a cost of \$15 million, the Wildcats opened their new home in a grand fashion by upending ACC power Maryland 64-62 on February 1, 1986. In 1999-2000 the Wildcats went past the one million mark for total attendance since the building was opened. More than 1.4 million people have passed through the Pavilion's turnstiles in its history.

In the 21 seasons that the Wildcats have competed in The Pavilion, Villanova has compiled a 181-52 (.777) overall record, and a 79-34 (.699) Big East Conference record.

The facility has truly become one of the most exciting in the league, with winning becoming the norm and paid sellouts a common sight. Since the 1994-95 season, Villanova has compiled a mark of 120-20 overall (.857) in the Pavilion, including a record of 55-16 (.777) in Big East Conference play.

## Wachovia Center

The Wachovia Center was the scene of some of 2005-06's most stirring Villanova memories, including regular season triumphs over No. 1 Connecticut and a pair of NCAA Tournament wins in March. Villanova attracted an average of better than 20,000 fans in its three regular season appearances in its home away from home and twice established the record for the largest crowd to witness a college basketball game in the state of Pennsylvania.

This season, Villanova will host five games in the building: Texas (Jan. 21); Pittsburgh (Jan. 29); Louisville (Feb. 3); Georgetown (Feb. 17) and Syracuse (Mar. 3).

The Wachovia Center is also the home of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers and the NHL's Philadelphia Flyers, and has hosted the largest hockey and basketball crowds in Pennsylvania history. The Center hosted the NBA Finals in the spring of 2001, the NBA All-Star Game in 2002 and the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2006.

The Wachovia Center features 30 concession stands on two separate levels and has 23 ticket windows. The building has a unique oval design which ensures no obstructed views for all 20,456 fans. It is also home to the studios of Comcast Sports Net.

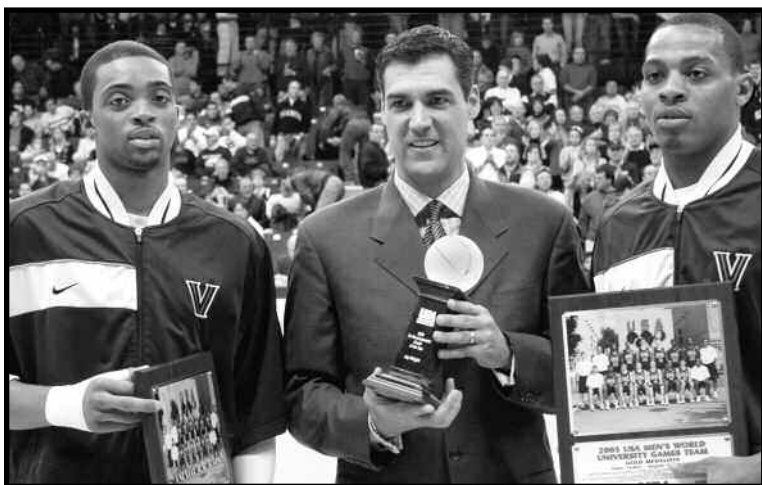

### ***Farewell Seniors***

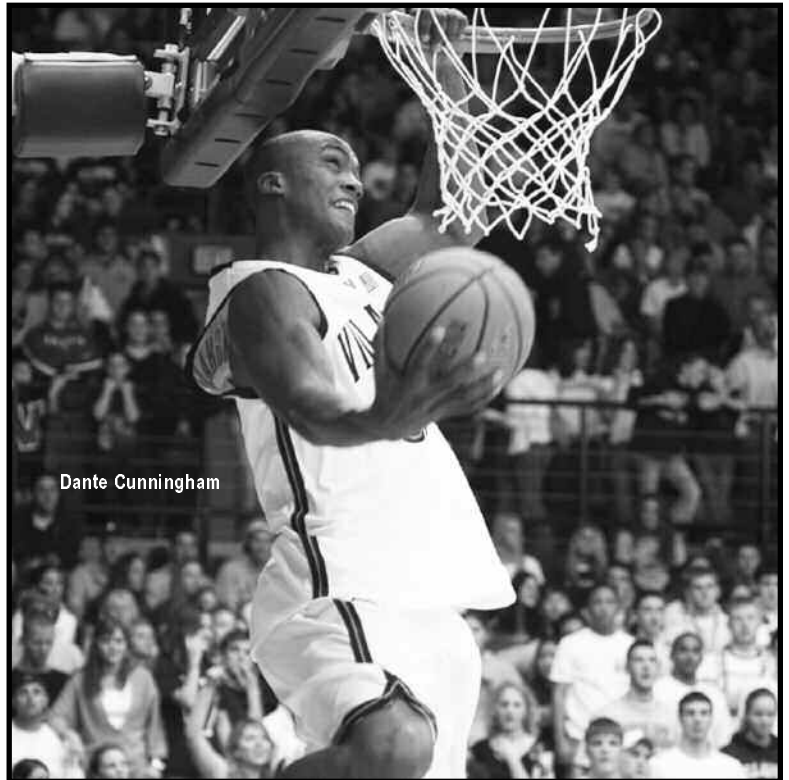

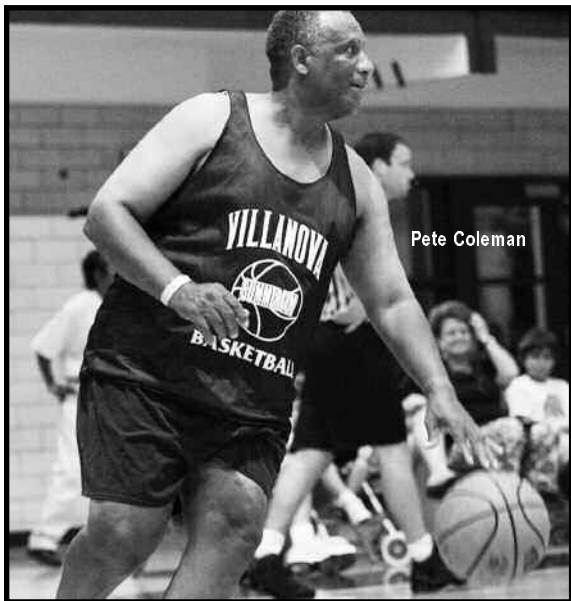

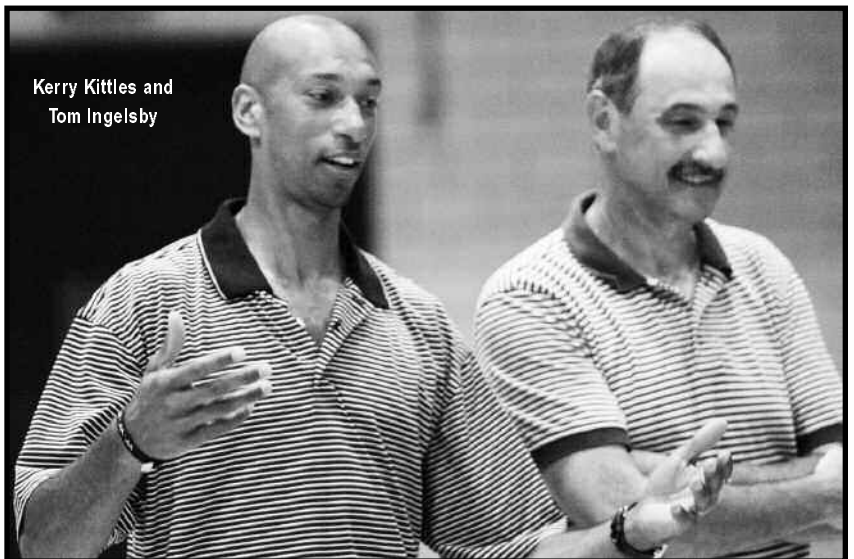
